Keeping the Destin Harbor Beautiful:

Destin Harbor Pump Ready for Operation

Did you know that Destin's Harbor Pump System is capable of moving almost 50,000 gallons per minute? So for perspective, it would take 17 days only to completely replace the water in the Harbor if it ran for 12 hours a day.

The Harbor in Destin, home of Florida's largest commercial fishing fleet as well as hundreds of other types of watercraft, is a functionally closed, 240-acre waterbody with water-quality issues that include nitrogen and phosphorous loading. Nutrients like these, commonly found in fertilizers along with warmer water temperatures, can lead to algal blooms, fish kills, cloudy water and odor complaints if they are allowed to accumulate over time. To combat the effects of urbanization and the water quality issues it can create, the pump system, in operation since 1992, brings low-nutrient water into the Harbor to flush out pollutants and raise the dissolved oxygen levels for fish and other aquatic life.



The system mainly runs continually during the warmer season from April until about November, when more storms and greater storm water runoff problems challenge the area. Heavier boating activity and sun-blocking algae and bacteria are also contributing factors that can harm fish, plants and other types of marine life. The pump system works to allow the needed fresh sea water to flow in to

help sustain the Harbor's health. Regular flow of Gulf water into the harbor via the pump system contribute to the Harbor water's clarity, oxygen level and salinity.

Members of Public Services recently rebuilt the facility's 200 HP motor, painted and reinstalled it. It has been tested to ensure our Harbor will remain beautiful as ever during the 2019 season. The Harbor Pump System con-

sists of an 84-inch diameter pipe (1600 feet long) that extends into the Gulf of Mexico connecting an intake box to a 200–HP motor and pump assembly located at the city's facility on Gulf Shore Drive. It will operate in the evenings from Spring until sometime in the Fall. After Fall, when the pump isn't running, Gulf

CBA Offers Spring Break Alternative

Every March, the Florida Panhandle hosts thousands of spring break students of all ages and from all areas of the country. While most come to our state to enjoy the surf and sand, other spring breakers arrive to volunteer. In March, multiple groups worked with the Choctawhatchee Basin Alliance (CBA) to build reef breakwaters and living shorelines to make our watershed a better place.

Living shorelines are green infrastructure projects that reduce erosion while creating habitat. Reef breakwaters placed a few yards from the shoreline reduce wave energy, while the planted marsh grass holds the sediment in place. In addition to the oysters that thrive on the reef breakwaters, fish, crustaceans, and more use both the reef and the newly planted grasses for critical habitat.

In just one week, three spring break groups worked as part of CBA's restoration program. On a misty, cloudy day along the Choctawhatchee Bay, eight students and

Letter from the Mayor



I've been an engaged member of the Destin community for over 40 years, and it has been an honor and privilege to serve as your mayor this past year. Now I want to begin the process to help establish a vision for what Destin will look like in 2025, 30 and beyond.

Due to the leadership of our City Council, we continue to keep taxes low for Destin residents, while providing a high level of service to all those we serve. Below are 2018 highlights:

In order to preserve public beaches for future generations, residents and visitors, the City Council prioritized an initiative to seek out and acquire more Gulf front property for public recreational use utilizing several potential funding sources including our reserves, TDC funding, state/federal grants and Triumph funding.

The Council is in negotiations with Gulf Power to develop a purchase agreement or a new franchise agreement to ensure Destin's residents and businesses will receive reliable and low-cost electrical service.

To improve green space, parking, building heights and densities, the Council has revised sections of the City's Comprehensive Plan, including an ordinance to regulate commercial activity in public parks and maintain green space.

The pilot program adopted by the Council for "pay-forparking" had over 15,000 parking transactions in 2018 and is designed to be its own funding source for the expansion and improvement of public parking. Parking fees help to offset the costs of city services and programs, so the cost is not attached to the City's millage rate.

With the adoption of the livery vessel registration, the City is holding operators accountable to guidelines that create a safer environment on the water as well as adequate land-based facilities for their customers.

The City has adopted an ordinance to set standards for the short-term rental industry to create well-established structure where there was none before—ensuring viability and maintaining the economic benefit. Our Council has established procedures that register and identify the properties, identify management responsibility and establish guidelines to facilitate and improve code enforcement. These guidelines and their enforcement will improve quality of life

issues for visitors to Destin and full-time residents who live in short-term rental areas.

Phase I and II of the Norriego Point restoration is complete. Phase III - Recreational Components is scheduled to begin in the fall of 2019. This multi-million project is a well needed addition to the protection of the Destin Harbor and its fishing fleet and provides public recreational access to city and state-owned recreational beach areas along Destin's East Pass.

Progress continues on Captain Leonard Destin Park off Calhoun Avenue and completion is projected in early 2020. This future park will be a 10 million-dollar project funded by the state using oil spill restitution money. The new park will provide the residents and visitors with a family friendly waterfront park with scenic views of the East Pass, Crab Island and Choctawhatchee Bay.

Thanks to funding through FDOT's Local Agency Program, we were able to complete the design phase of the Calhoun Ave. and Zerbe St. Pathway Improvements Project. We are working on continued funding so that this pedestrian pathway can connect Clement Taylor Park to the boardwalk under the Marler Bridge to help achieve pedestrian-friendly walking pathways throughout the city.

The Florida Department of Transportation's 3R Project is in progress. The city council was able to provide input into the project, ultimately suggesting 10-foot travel lanes and a 4-foot bike path on the roadway. This project includes roadway resurfacing from the Marler Bridge to Airport Rd., improvements to the right-of-way, landscaping and updated traffic signs.

staff from the Embry-Riddle Aeronautical University moved 10 tons of limestone rock to create new segments of reef breakwater in Florida Park—that's more than a ton per person!

Determined to compete, middle schoolers participating in the Appleseed Expeditions/ Sea Life Discovery Center program made 511 oyster shell bags. Recycled from local restaurants, these oyster shells will replace those historically mined



from the bay, allowing brand new oysters to grow on their hard surface.

Finally, a dozen students from the Rochester Institute of Technology returned to the bay for their second year to build a living shoreline. Thanks to these three groups, the reef at Florida Park is nearly complete, and the bagged oyster shells will create a new breakwater at a homeowner site.

"I'm always so impressed that students want to volunteer on their week off," says Rachel Gwin, Restoration Coordinator for the Choctawhatchee Basin Alliance. "We team up with volunteers to build much of our living shorelines, and these three groups worked hard and had a great attitude."

In 2018, CBA built nearly a mile of living shoreline, in addition to restoring over four coastal acres. "Each year CBA

works with hundreds of reefbuilding volunteers," explains Alison McDowell, CBA Director, "Like the students during alternative spring break, reef building projects teach everyone that individuals can restore the Choctawhatchee Bay with their own two hands."

CBA is not alone in offering alternative spring break trips for students who want to volunteer. Habitat for Humanity, United Way and more provide short-term volunteer opportunities for interested universities, colleges and K-12 schools.

CBA is a non-profit organization responsible for sustaining healthy local waterways through monitoring, education, restoration and research. CBA offers volunteer opportunities for all ages, throughout the year. For more information, visit basinalliance.org.

water still flows through because the gates are always open—but the water simply flows through much slower. The pipe that runs from the pump station juts out into the Gulf from Holiday Isle, though most people never see the section that operates under water.

The synergy between robotics and navigation represents the future of computerized planning and execution in spine surgery. The Spine Center of Excellence at Sacred Heart Hospital on the Emerald Coast (SHHEC) recently upgraded to the most advanced Mazor X Stealth Edition technology for robotic spine surgery, featuring computerized surgical planning, 3D assessment of spine anatomy, robotic guidance and live navigation feedback de-



signed to provide a higher degree of accuracy throughout the surgical procedure. This revolutionizes both the operation and the patient's post-op experience.

Orthopedic and neurological spine surgeon, Kornelis Poelstra, MD, PhD, is the founder of The Spine Center of Excellence at SHHEC and is a world-renowned expert in robotic-assisted, spinal surgery. Dr. Poelstra has been at the forefront of surgical robotics in spine and was a crucial contributor to the development of

the Mazor X Technology. Now, with the new Mazor X Stealth Edition, surgeons receive a fullyintegrated procedural solution for surgical planning, workflow, execution and confirmation.

"I perform 60 cases per month on average, which include lumbar reconstructive fusions, cervical reconstructions, non-fusion cases such as disc replacements and decompressions," said Poelstra. "Our research has clearly shown evidence of robotically assisted cases consistently providing improved surgical outcomes, greater patient safety, shorter operating times and faster recovery for our patients. Collaboratively, we look forward to continuing to provide premier patient care with this state of the art technology," he added.

Yes, You Probably Need An Umbrella

Jonathan was singing at the top of his lungs to his favorite song on his way home from work at dusk, when a bicyclist suddenly appeared, seemingly out of nowhere, stopping him in mid-chorus. He slammed on his brakes, but the impact was inevitable. He struck the young man who flew into the air and landed in a ditch. Adrenaline pumping and shaking uncontrollably, he managed to grab his phone as he launched himself out of his car, sprinting to the injured bicyclist.

As the ambulance took off for the hospital with its sirens blaring and lights flashing, two police officers took down Jonathan's statement and several bystanders' statements as well. Jonathan just kept saying, "Why didn't he see me? Do you think he'll be ok?" Jonathan spent a sleepless night tossing and turning. Was he not paying enough attention? Was it his fault?

That next morning after a reviving cup of coffee, he called his insurance agent who, after inquiring after Jonathan's health and that of the bicyclist, confirmed the coverage limits on his auto policy and umbrella policy.

After spending 90 days in the hospital, and needing an additional six months of rehabilitation, Mark, the injured bicyclist sued Jonathan. Eventually, a judge ruled that Jonathan had sufficient time to react, and his umbrella policy paid out almost \$700,000 to Mark, the Plaintiff, on top of his auto policy bodily injury limits of \$250,000.

Living in such a litigious society, you don't have to be rich to be sued. Jurys can award huge amounts to Plaintiffs, and with a large judgment against you, you could lose everything you've worked for. You could potentially lose your home, savings, investments, and have your income garnished for years to come.

Umbrella policies are designed to give you added liability protection above and beyond the limits on your homeowners, auto and watercraft insurance policies. They're considered a type of excess liability coverage because they kick in once your underlying coverage limits have been exhausted. The liability coverage portion of your policy pays for expenses such as medical bills, rehabilitative therapy, and lost wages due to negligence or fault. For most insureds, the amount of liability coverage on their homeowners or auto policies are not enough to cover them in the event of a lawsuit.

Umbrella policies are surprisingly affordable, and usually very easy to put into place. As their name implies, an umbrella policy 'floats' over your underlying policies such as your home, any rental properties or secondary residences you own, autos, motorcycles, and watercraft. You have coverage options ranging from \$1 million to \$12 million or more depending on the carrier and your needs.

Umbrella policies aren't just for your personal policies. There are umbrella policies for businesses as well. Commercial umbrella policies provide businesses with additional liability coverage to help protect them against the potential harmful cost of claims. Business assets can be exposed when hit with lawsuits. If the amount of the settlement exceeds the limits of the business's underlying policies, the commercial umbrella provides an additional layer or higher limits to further protect business resources. Businesses who do not have commercial umbrella insurance could be obligated to pay out of pocket for legal bills, and damages that exceed the limits of their underlying primary business coverages.

So remember, a personal and commercial umbrella policy serves two distinct purposes. First, it increases the liability limit that you or your company already have in existing, or underlying, liability policies. And second, it broadens coverage for things that your underlying policies may not cover. For instance, an umbrella policy could expand the coverage territory and it may also cover things like slander, libel, false arrest, malicious prosecution and other sorts of personal and business liability situations.

Most carriers max out their liability options at \$300,000. One day you might get a call that your weekend renter took a nasty fall, incurring an injury with a long-term recovery. Looking at the Roth IRA For Kids

Many people might wonder how their retirement savings would have been impacted had they had the opportunity, as a child, or a minor, to invest in a retirement account that would grow free of taxes, even when taken out or withdrawn. It is often heard and written that time is one of the most significant factors when investing. The longer the time the greater the potential impact on returns. That is due to compounding interest as well as being invested and not miss opportunities by being in the market on up days or when it's rallying. Of course, that means being in the market when there's a sell off as well. And don't forget the potential impact of dollar cost averaging over time as well (systematic, periodic investing). Consider the influence of tax-free investing on an investment. This is what the Roth IRA potentially offers.

In the investing world there are usually three keys regarding tax efficiency: Tax reduction, tax deferral and tax free. Tax reduction strategies include tax deductible items like charitable contributions, tax deductible IRAs (or tax reduction through contributions to 401ks) or tax loss harvesting (selling certain at a loss to pair them with assets you realize a gain on). Tax deferral is often obtained through vehicles like retirement savings accounts and annuities. You pay taxes only upon withdrawals. Tax free investing can be achieved through things like municipal bonds and with the advent of the Roth IRA, a retirement account. Now consider that Roth IRAs are available to minors, Americans under the age of 18. For those who qualify, they can put money in to a Roth and have it grow tax free if held

to retirement. Early withdrawals typically have a penalty but that can be waived in certain instances such as a first-time home purchase and some educational expenses. So, the thing to think about is the combination of long term investing with tax free investing. To qualify, a minor would have to have earned income and have a parent or guardian have authority over the account until they reach majority. Many investment and or brokerage firms make this available today.

Destin High School Update





The anterior approach has some additional benefits that many patients enjoy when they choose this method of hip replacement. These include:

Less Major Muscle Damage: Because the anterior approach avoids cutting through muscle, this allows for less damage to occur as a result of the surgery. It also means surgeons don't have to make repairs to these muscles once the operation is complete.

Less Pain: Patients typically don't experience as much pain because the surgeon doesn't have to cut through muscle.

Quicker Recovery: After the surgery is complete, patients are encouraged to move and bear weight as soon as it's comfortable. This is often not possible with posterior hip replacements.

Decreased Risk of Hip Dislocation: The muscles and soft tissue around the hip naturally prevent it from dislocating. When these are cut, as with the posterior method, there is

egory of quality awarded by the Society of Thoracic Surgeons for this procedure. In 2018, only 10-15% of hospitals in the nation received the "3 star" rating. In the current analysis of national data covering the period from January 2018 through December 2018, the Coronary Artery Bypass surgery performance at Fort Walton Beach Medical Center occupies a position in this highest quality tier, thereby receiving a STS 3 - star rating.

The Society of Thoracic Surgeons (STS) is a national database of heart surgery operations. For each of the four measures, STS compares a group's performance with the average performance of all the groups in the database. For survival and complications, the results are adjusted for the overall health of a group's patients, since some surgical groups treat older or sicker patients than others. The overall heart bypass rating combines the scores from those four measures. For each individual performance measure, as well as the overall rating, groups that score significantly above average get three stars, average performers get two stars, and those that score significantly below average get one star.

Not Your Typical Window Film

No one would dispute having the beauty of soft natural light shining through our windows puts a smile on our face and warms our hearts. We have windows to let in light and give us views into our world, whether its lake front, ocean front, pool front or simply a view of the outside. For a time when I worked in cubical, I often dreamt of having a view, even if it was of the parking lot, something to let in natural sunlight. Now, I am finding that many of us have windows that are letting in much more than soft natural light and have become a sore spot. We hunt for blinds and curtains or just quarantine the area from 1 to 7 p.m. We search for dark or mirrored tint to help against the heat while maintaining some of our view. We place towels and blankets over our furniture and wood floors to protect from fading and cracking. We even go to the extreme of replacing our windows with expensive new ones.

There is a solution, ERF (energy reflective film). I know what you are thinking—another tint—great, tried that, didn't work or my HOA won't allow it. ERF is not your typical window tint; in fact, it has some of the most technological advances. Most tints use dyes and aluminum. ERF uses a proprietary technology to sputter gold and silver allowing the film to be virtually clear and highly energy efficient.

A client of ours in Inlet Beach built their home in 2017, but they still struggled with trying to keep their master suite cool due

flood your dog too heavily at first, rather keep your trips short and sweet. Go to your local warehouse store to practice for 15 minutes. There are a lot of noises and distractions at those stores. Do everyone a favor and give your dog a bathroom break before going into the store. Then, do your dog a favor and give them another break when you leave. Some

dogs can become stressed by the idea of even a short trip. They might not even show signs of the stress, but it is best to offer the opportunity. Loose stools are indicative of stress. Be sure to bring supplies to clean your mess

Start taking your dog to lunch or dinner. Your relationship should be built on doing things together, not just dragging your dog out for a walk. If your dog is unruly, don't make excuses – excuse yourself. My rule is to



always proof a behavior in the parking lot, then upon entering an establishment. A simple sit to a release is all that is needed. This sets the stage for obedience while at the store or restaurant. It really is a critical piece of the puzzle for most dogs. They need to know that obedience is expected everywhere.

Lastly, go to a professional. Find the one that works for you and your dog. There are many training styles and a lot of opinions. Your dog is an individual

with individual drives, wants and desires. It is also individual in its opinion of your leadership ability. Just because your last dog was perfect doesn't mean this one will toe the line with you. An experienced, professional trainer will understand many methods to relate to dogs. A good trainer won't stop with just one motivator — individual dogs are moti-



Off the Hook

Best Places to Fish on Okaloosa Island

Out of all the exciting things to do in our area, fishing tops the list for many locals (and visitors.) Okaloosa Island in Fort Walton Beach provides a prime location for all different types of fishing.

Beaches, piers, bridges and our charter fishing industry nearby offer more than just one way to catch that prized fish you've been waiting for. From minnows to mackerel, anglers can expect to reel in a wide variety of game fish and table fare on Okaloosa Island. Finding the top fishing spots can be tricky even for locals sometimes.

Spread across Okaloosa Island are some of the region's top fishing destinations where you can enjoy your fishing year-round:

Okaloosa Island Pier

The first favorite for many local, avid fishermen is the Okaloosa Island Pier. This 1,262-foot pier is located on the west end of Okaloosa Island, at the heart of the Okaloosa Island Boardwalk. The pier provides everything you would need for a day of fishing



including licenses, equipment (for

pect to catch practically any kind of Gulf fish off the massive pier. Most commonly encountered are Redfish, Tarpon, Mackerel, Ladyfish, and Hard-Tails. But through the year, Blowfish, Sharks, Sailfish and many more exotic species have been pulled out of the water. From mid-March through October, the Pier is open 24 hours, with the times changing to 5 a.m. through 9 p.m. October through March. Admission rates vary, but the price for an adult ticket is \$7 and includes a fishing license.

On the east end of Okaloosa Island lies the Marler Bridge. This famous Emerald Coast bridge connects Okaloosa Island to Destin and overlooks the Choctawhatchee Bay, Destin Harbor and the Destin Pass. Throw a line off this structure and you're bound to catch something good. Sheepshead, Black Snapper and Redfish are going to be your main targets, but plenty of desirable fish are waiting to be hooked! Fishing on the bridge is free and legal providing you stay within the posted locations. And as long as the fish is within the required limits, it's good to keep!

Surf Fishing (Gulf Side)

There's nothing like rigging up a surf rod, wading out to the drop off, and casting a deep line! Surf fishing, or beach fishing, allows some of the freedoms that bridges and piers do not. You need only avoid the swimmers, and you'll

location free to cast anywhere, set up a chair, and chill out while waiting for the big one to bite! Most of the public surf fishing goes down to the beaches behind Santa Rosa



Boulevard Condos and the Okaloosa Island Boardwalk. But if you drive towards the east end of the island, you'll find patches of public beach that are more secluded, a local's favorite and prime for surf fishing. It's almost impossible to predict what you'll catch from the beach, but Pompano, Redfish, Kingfish, and Catfish are some of the usual suspects!

Surf Fishing (Bay Side)

Surf Fishing in the bay as opposed to the Gulf isn't quite as popular, but provides a whole different experience. Park along Highway 98 on the north side of Okaloosa Island along the long stretch of public beach and set up shop. Find Speckled Trout, Redfish, Flounder, Ladyfish, and Bluefish while surf fishing in the Choctawhatchee Bay! Anglers opt for lighter gear when fishing the bay, and live bait including finger mullet, shrimp, and pinfish are sure to attract quality catches. If the northside beaches aren't yielding the desired results, try fishing the waters in the area under the Marler Bridge. Here you'll find free public parking, and easy access to quality seaweed beds and drop offs.

West Jetties

The giant rock piles known as the "East and West Jetties" border the Destin Pass. The East Jetties lie in Destin, and the West Jetties are part of Okaloosa Island. Fishing off the West Jetties is a perfect example of "extra risk, extra reward." The Jetties are accessible to you, but take a little extra effort to reach. Packing light is encouraged, and the right footwear will go a long way when climbing massive boulders to reach the best fishing spot. Snag various Gulf fishes including Grouper, Snap-



per and Spanish Mackerel fishing from the West Jetties, and make

sure to steer clear of snorkelers, surfers and passing watercraft.

Flyfishing Film Tour



Tame the Tantrum: Part 2

Last month we talked about how to prevent your child from throwing a tantrum. Some of you might have read that article and thought, "That's great, but what do I do in the midst of a melt down?" (See March Destin Life at MyDestinLife.com.) You've already gone back to basics and made sure your child has been fed and had plenty of sleep. You provided your child with age appropriate control and decision-making power. You've even ensured daily one-on-one attention, yet he is still laying spread eagle on the kitchen floor in hysterics! Don't worry, we've got you covered this month, too.

When your child is in the midst of a temper tantrum, the first person to focus on is you. That's right—you. It can be very frustrating (annoying, embarrassing, etc.) when your child loses control of his emotions. In that moment it's tempting to lose your cool as well. The last thing an out-of-control child needs, however, is an out-ofcontrol parent. Before you react to your child, take a moment to gut check yourself. Take a few slow, deep breaths to ease your own angst. Count to 10 before responding. If neither of those tricks work, step away for a minute (provided your child cannot get hurt in the location she is having her tantrum).

The second step is to identify what kind of tantrum this really is. Sometimes children have realized that a tantrum is the perfect trick to get mom or dad to give in to whatever demand she presents. If this is a tantrum that would stop immediately if you give in, then you know you have a manipulative tantrum on your hands. In this case, it is important to provide clear, loving boundaries in a firm, but calm, tone. It might sound something like this,

"I know you are angry that you can't have that toy, but I don't like the way you are behaving. If you don't stop now, you won't get that toy and you will not be able to play with Suzy tonight." Here is the difficult part—you MUST follow through with the consequence you have stated will happen. When you provide that firm, consistent boundary during a manipulative tantrum, your child learns that it is ineffective and even detrimental to her wants (she didn't get the toy AND she couldn't play with her friend) to behave that way. It might take a few tries at these tantrums, but she will eventually cease using this tactic to get what he wants, as long as you remain consistent and do not give in.

If this is a tantrum where your child has genuinely lost the ability to regain control of his emotions (not a manipulative power play), then the next step is to meet your child with empathy. All behavior is communication, and when a child is having a tantrum, he is communicating that he is emotionally overloaded. Identify the emotion that your child is expressing and give him that feeling word that he is unable to verbalize. This step would sound something like this, "I know you are so angry that you can't play with your friend right now. It's really hard to not get to do what you want..." Providing empathy should be used low to the ground where your child is. Make eye contact if possible. Some children will allow you to touch them, while others will scream, "Stay away from me!" Whatever he needs in that moment (touch or no touch) is okay. The purpose of providing empathy is to begin to de-escalate the situation. A child who is understood and whose parents "get" him will be more likely to begin to calm down. If a child feels unheard or misunderstood in his time of difficulty, he will ratchet it up a notch until heard. In their book, "The Whole-Brain Child" by Dr.'s Siegel and Bryson, they call this the "Connect and Redirect Technique." The goal is to connect with your child by using soothing tone and touch (the right side of your own brain) to help him begin to better regulate his emotions (his right side of his brain). Once your child has calmed down, you can begin to discuss his behavior and alternatives to that behavior or consequences if necessary.

Sometimes, you can catch a tantrum before it becomes a full-blown meltdown. In a situation where you feel your child is about to lose it, try implementing humor or physical movement. If you do something silly to catch your child's attention, it might distract her from the meltdown. Or if you can get your child moving her body prior to tantrum, the movement can actually help relieve the pent-up emotion and reintegrate the body and brain for optimal functioning.

Digestion by Design: Part 2

Ghandi gave some really good advice when he suggested that we drink our food and chew our drink. As we continue our digestive journey (please see Part 1, Destin Life January 2019 p. 12 at MyDestin-Life.com), we arrive at our favorite organ of digestion - the mouth - where we get to taste all of our delicious foods! Mother Nature is certainly generous in providing us with an amazing variety of whole natural foods, each with a unique set of healing assets, vital nutrients and fiber, all of which contribute to positive health.

Beyond deliciousness, though, quality foods are needed to provide the raw materials to build and run our system. These include the elements needed to make units for energy production, the raw materials (amino acids, fatty acids, glucose) to build structures like

enzymes or cell membranes, the chemical components (vitamins, minerals, antioxidants etc.) necessary for good heath, and the fuel for the bacteria in our microbiome which provides assistance in nutrient absorption.

Most importantly, food is the form in which our surroundings penetrate into our bodies in rough, big quantities giving us information about the world around us and influencing genetic learning. In fact, as the foundation for the environment for our cells, food is more influential than our genes because it influences which genes express and which don't. Therefore, food can be our greatest health asset or our greatest health foe.

One of the most important facts of positive health is that it is dependent on an alkaline environment, while disease states thrive in an acid environment. To achieve an alkaline system, we need LIVE foods that are nutrient dense, enzymatically active and energizing. LIVE foods include fresh fruits and vegetables, fermented foods like kefir, sauerkraut, or miso, and raw foods. Other alkalizing foods include peas, beans, lentils, spices, herbs, seasonings and healthy fats.

Your goal is to consume a minimum of 50% LIVE foods daily, working your way up to 75%.

DEAD foods, on the other hand, are devoid of enzymes and thus rely on our bodies to provide the enzymes necessary for their break-down. With the exception of cooked proteins, which provide amino acids, they are typically devoid of nutrients, harder to digest and are acidifying. As a result, they can drive disease, destroy our system and can even lead to cell mutation and death. Many processed and packaged foods fall into this category as well as all high sugar or refined foods, junk foods and most fast foods.

However, no matter what you are choosing to eat, the primary purpose of your mouth is not just to taste but to chew your food. Chewing well does major things for us that you might not have considered:

- 1 Enhancing digestion and nutrient absorption. The more we chew the more surface area we expose on our food. The more surface area we expose, the easier it is for the small intestine to access those vital nutrients.
- **2** Slowing us down, allowing us to enjoy our meal.
- **3** Preventing over-eating. When we eat slowly we give our brain the opportunity to notice when we are satisfied.
- **4** Making us more attractive because, well, stuffing our face and gulping down huge bites of food is generally not very attractive! But also, when we give our stomach a

more liquefied food, rather than large chunks, we reduce the risk of suffering symptoms of digestive distress including indigestion, cramping, bloating, belching and gas, NONE of which are attractive!

5 – Best of all, chewing, well, can potentially save your life! Not just by reducing the risk of choking, but by stimulating the parotid glands which signal the immune tissue in your gut to turn on. Why? Because food can kill you! Not just the garbage foods that are DEAD and are killing us too, but any food can harbor bacteria or other foreign matter that can hurt us. Get a C.L.U.E.: Facts about Insurance Claim Reporting



So, after being gone for the day, you finally pull in the drive-way, walk into your house and find water on the floor coming from a small leak from the ice-maker. You grab your phone, look up a local plumber and start to get things repaired. But what do you do next? Do you file an

insurance claim or pay out of pocket for the repairs?

For most people, filing an insurance claim can seem daunting. The claims process can be overwhelming and intimidating for some. The most important thing to understand is the difference between filing a claim and gathering information prior to filing. Once a claim is reported, it's cataloged in a data base called the Comprehensive Loss Underwriting Exchange or C.L.U.E. for short.

There is a lot of information that comes out of the C.L.U.E. report and, most importantly, a lot of information that can lead to adverse information negatively affecting how consumers go about trying to obtain an insurance policy in the future.

C.L.U.E. (Comprehensive Loss Underwriting Exchange), is a claims history database created by ChoicePoint that enables insurance companies to access consumer claims information when they are underwriting or rating an insurance policy. ChoicePoint was started by the parent company NexisLexis, a database for legal and public records related information; the information is placed on a platform to be exchanged within different companies and organizations who pay for their data mining reporting services. How this relates to consumers is that this information is collected, saved, shared and stored up to seven years and used to calculate the risk of any person or entity.

How this relates to the insured is that all past claims history is saved on this database and can be used to see who many claims a person has filed, the likely hood of filing additional claims, how may claims a particular property has had and the likelihood of more claims being filed on that property, too. What is doesn't take into consideration is the nature of how the information was reported or if it was reported in error (unless corrected at a later time). The problem is, most consumers are not aware that even

fact finding about a potential claim can be reported and affect their reports negatively.

In short, the most important thing to know when reporting a claim or if you are thinking of reporting property damage to your insurance company, is to take the time to talk to a licensed insurance professional to assess the damage prior to reporting. As a wise person once said, "Knowing is half the battle."


