Destin's Week of Blessings

Have you ever stopped to ponder why Destin is called the "World's Luckiest Fishing Village?" Though there are many amazing stories of big catches and mighty fishing from the Destin Harbor, there are still those rough times...times for fisherman when hope is dim and times are tough.

For many captains in Destin's fishing fleet, their success doesn't ride on luck-it rides on prayer. They know they're not promised a happy, go-lucky ride all the time. In fact, most will tell you that uncertainty lies around every corner.



For Destin fisherman, as well as locals and area professionals, success has nothing to do with luck and everything to do with blessings. That is what makes continuing the "blessing" tradition so special.

But like the words in Laura Story's song, Blessings, success and blessings are sometimes disguised in the challenges and hardships we encounter, where we learn to trust, lean on our faith, and grow, though

unpleasant at the time. And challenging circumstances remind us just how dependent we are on the bestowment of blessings. It's when we reach the other side, that we know we've arrived through faith, prayer and, yes, being blessed!

More than a half century ago, Destin's fishing fleet, then a tiny fleet of perhaps four to five boats, began a Blessing of the Fleet. From only a handful of small boats, the fleet has

grown and prospered into the largest fishing fleet in North America, with more than 125 charter-fishing boats. The impact has been far reaching says Captain Mike Parker. "Who knew a small little city like Destin would influence towns overseas in Australia and New Zealand, as well as closer ones like Sebring, Florida? But it has, and I'm sure, will continue," he says.

Captain Mike has been involved in the annual Blessing of the Fleet since he moved to the area years ago and was asked to pray, along with other clergy, during the ceremony. "These pastors make up the 'Church of Destin' formed a few years ago as a symbol of unity, crossing denominational barriers," says Captain Mike. "Where there is unity, there is blessing," he

woman heard the heavy words from her doctor that she has "stage four breast cancer" that has metastasized to her liver and bones. At first there is disbelief. Then fear... not only fear of what will happen, but questioning the strength it takes to fight the fight. Tami has way too much to live for and even more people depending on her leadership and laughter. In friend Autumn Ussery's words: Tami is one of the most beautiful and caring souls that has ever been placed on this earth. She is someone who embodies the word "COMMUNITY," doing way more for others than she does for herself, and going out of her way to make sure that no person or family goes without. But Tami doesn't do this alone. Her family

selflessly cheers her on every single moment she gives to others, by giving up their own personal time with her so that she can, in turn, pay it forward.

Advice from the Vacuum Center

If you've got a few minutes, stop into the Vacuum Center in Destin and say hello to the owner, Bob Weichman. The man knows his vacuums and loves to talk about them. Recently Bob spent a few minutes with me sharing some insights on vacuum cleaner service. Most people overlook servicing a vacuum cleaner. "Ok, if you have a car, most people change their oil," Bob said and I nodded in agreement. "We are all trained to service our vehicles regularly. But changing the oil and filter doesn't make the car better; it just merely maintains the performance. But, when you service a vacuum cleaner, the vacuum cleans better and lasts longer!"

I said, "Really? Why is that?" "The enemy of a vacuum cleaner is dirt," Bob said. "Dirt gets into the belts, gears and motor and reduces performance. An oil filter keeps the dirt out of the engine; changing the filter and oil maintains performance, but does not enhance performance. So, don't you think you should have your vacuum serviced?" Bob said, "Come in to get the rest of the story."

 \mathbf{O}_{ullet} I am taking a cruise this summer and am wondering if Medicare will cover any medical care expenses I might have while outside of the United States? - Bill

A. In most cases, Medicare will not pay for medical services outside of the United States and its territories. However, there are exceptions. Medicare will pay for services in an emergency if you are admitted to a hospital. In addition, any doctor and ambulance service associated with an emergency hospital admittance would be covered. The key to getting Medicare to cover services is that you must be admitted as an in-patient to a foreign hospital. If you receive any other medical treatment or go to a hospital on an out-patient basis, Medicare will not pay. Also, medical treatment on the cruise ship itself will not be covered if you are more than six hours from a U.S. port. We strongly recommend that people engaging in foreign travel purchase a temporary travel medical policy before each trip. The policies are easy to qualify for and will cover most medical services you would need. Many policies also include trip cancellation coverage. Benefits of a Customized Condo Unit Owners Policy

She had been searching for months. As soon as Stacy walked in, she fell in love with the condo's floor plan and the glorious view of the Gulf of Mexico. Stacy's closing was fast approaching, and she was anxious to spend some time there before she placed the condo with the management company for renting.

The day before Stacy's closing her realtor asked her if she had her insurance in place. "What do you mean?" she asked him. "I thought the association covered all that." She immediately talked with an insurance agent who told her, "I talk to many customers who are under the impression they only need to purchase contents coverage, thinking the association covers everything else. But their exposures and responsibilities extend much further."

Stacy sat down with her agent, answered questions and made good decisions regarding her Condo Unit Owners Insurance Program.

Because the association is responsible for maintaining and insuring the exterior of the building (shell), condo owners need coverage for the replacement cost of Structural Elements Within - from the paint in, including flooring, fixtures, cabinets, built-in appliances, and more. This coverage amount is arrived at by calculating the cost per square foot to rebuild multiplied by the square footage of the unit. Sometimes the developer will provide this number and typically the range starts at \$60 per square foot, and depending on the quality of construction, that can go up significantly. Your condo policy should always include Special Coverage A. This is broader coverage, changing the policy from a named peril to an open peril policy.

The next thing to consider is Personal Property coverage which is replacement cost on furniture, accessories, clothing, appliances, electronics, and other valuables, basically anything that's not attached. Replacement cost is always recommended and gives you new for old, with likekind and quality.

Loss of Use/Loss of Rents is an important feature as well. Depending on the carrier, they may offer loss of use but not loss of rent. If your unit is damaged and you can't use it for a period of time, you may be able to collect under loss of use if it's your primary or secondary residence. If you're losing out on rental income, check your policy to see if you have the Loss of Rents coverage. You should always make sure you have the correct policy for the right risk.

Loss Assessment is another important coverage on condo policies that Florida law requires. Its purpose is to pay up to your loss assessment coverage amount (typically \$2,000) for an assessment levied by the association for covered losses to the common elements. For example: this past October 10th, Hurricane Michael knocked down most of the fencing and damaged the roofs of the administration building and conference center in my complex. Because these perils were covered under the association's policy, they had the option to assess each condo owner to help recoup their out-of-pocket expense.

Then there's Flood coverage, which is typically a separate policy. The unit owner should carrie flood insurance even if their unit is not on the ground floor. Some condo associations purchase a master program through the National Flood Insurance Program called the RCBAP (residential condominium building association policy). This policy does covers many of the interior build-out items for a unit owner but it does not cover the personal property. So does the unit owner still need their own condo flood policy? David Thompson, with the FAIA (Florida Association of Insurance Agents) says this: "If there is no RCBAP in place the unit owner needs his own primary flood coverage. If the RCBAP has a large deductible and the unit owner sustained building damage, then their [flood] policy will respond. Should the unit owner be assessed by the association for a flood loss, the unit owner's policy will cover the loss assessment up

to their building limit with no deductible. This alone is a compelling reason for all condo unit owners to have their own building flood coverage."

We haven't even mentioned Liability and Mold and Water Backup, which are also important coverages on condo policies. And if you rent your unit, always consider excess of higher limits of liability protection. The bottom line is this - when it comes to condo insurance policies the

average consumer isn't aware of their exposures and responsibilities. You should always talk to an experienced insurance agent so you can make the best coverage decisions for your situation.

Hope through Pawsitive Love

Pawsitive Love Foundation (PLF) is leading the way to help give our veterans their lives back. A 501(c)3 corp. founded locally by Steve Kotowski, Pawsitive Love Foundation is dedicated to providing properly trained service dogs to children

Steve's passion is to always improve and that launched his new charity PLF right here on the Emerald Coast. Twenty-two veterans take their own lives every day because of depression and hopelessness, and there just aren't enough dogs available to help combat this issue. This statistic hits home, as we locals live among the greatest population of veterans in the U.S. Steve and his wife Wendy, along with their children, agreed they could do more to help. They know the needs of veterans are far greater than any available solution, as they are looking for hope. Their family vision soon developed in ways they only dreamed about. They were going to not only assist veterans, but also children with epilepsy and autism. Many of these traits are similar to post traumatic stress (PTSD) and traumatic brain Injury.

They named their first recipient of a service dog and benefactors began to join their mission. As word spread, they acquired more dogs, and commenced training for others in need. They select each dog individually for the handler, and train it uniquely to fit their needs. Training can take 6 to 18 months depending on the dog, the handler and the tasks required. PLF supplies all of the training (free of charge) until the dog is ready to do its job. Then, they train the handler. The process begins by learning how to handle many different dogs. To have a highlytrained dog, you must know how to handle it, for the most benefit. A similar analogy would be if you bought a Ferrari for your first car, and didn't completely understand how to drive it. You probably would need to learn how to drive another car first. PLF has the facility to put the dog handlers through the rigors of training in a setting that is fun and exhilarating, but also safe. There's no doubt it is hard work

for the handlers. But the end result is a team that functions autonomously, which provides the handler a new furry family member, as well as freedom to regain part of their independence.

has lofty goals, for certain. Steve small businesses and individual sponsors they already have, the number of life-saving dogs to match those in need could easily be doubled or tripled. There is currently no state or federal support for service dogs, although PLF has petitioned the state to support its efforts.

Military structure rarely seems to escape you when you retire, according to many veterans; everyone is looking for a "chief" to lend a hand or solve

a problem.

sess hidden triggers or issues that many shelter dogs do. To rescue every dog is a beautiful idea, but real service dogs must be more than just an emotional support animal, they have a crucial job to perform. Without performing at the highest level, they are just companions that don't truly afford freedom for the handler. The handler should not be focused on the dog's behavior, instead the dog should be focused on its handler's behavior and their surroundings. Not all dogs are capable of doing this effectively—some trainers say just 1 in 100, and that rate decreases drastically to nearly 1 in 300 for shelter dogs. There just isn't a large enough selection of dogs in our area to accommodate the many in need like PLF can provide.

Last year, in their first year in operation, PLF provided 11 dogs for veterans and children. This is more than any single provider in our area has accomplished in the last several years combined. They placed dogs locally and nationwide. One family in California received two dogs; they were connected through a local veteran and put in touch with PLF. The family has a daughter Hailey with Epilepsy, and her father suffers from chronic PTSD and a back injury. Hailey has returned to high school with her PLF-K9 Finley, while her father is tackling the world around him with PLF-K9 Cedar. Steve says, "When a family can have hope restored, it is a beautiful thing, it is actually life-giving, and cre-

Hurricane Michael Officially Upgraded to Cat 5

In the final report published recently by the National Hurricane Center, Hurricane Michael was officially upgraded to a Category 5 hurricane!

The National Weather Service does a fantastic job measuring, tracking, and modeling hurricanes. Their full report on Hurricane Michael was published on April 19th and the final wind speed at landfall was confirmed at 160mph, granting it Cat 5 status, the 4th EVER Cat 5 landfall

in the continental United States.

Since 1851, there have been over 900 hurricanes, but only four have made landfall in the continental U.S. as a Category 5: the Labor Day hurricane (1935), Hurricane Camille (1969), Hurricane Andrew (1992), and now Hurricane Michael. Other than Camille, they have all hit Florida.

A storm's category is based purely on wind speed. Cat 3 starts at 111 mph, Cat 4 at 130, and Cat 5 is anything over 157mph. This number has a fairly wide margin of error, making the difference between categories more blurred than we may be accustomed to. It's a simplistic category that omits vital information such as pressure, storm surge, inundation, width, forward motion, rainfall, and tells you little about the threat it really poses. After all, the two costliest storms on record, Harvey and Katrina, were both Cat 3 at landfall.

Twenty-four hours before Michael made landfall as a Cat 5 with 160 mph winds, it was a Category 2 storm with 100mph winds. Storms commonly weaken as they approach land, making Michael's intensification overnight even more surprising and catching many off-guard.

Over the next day, it strengthened to become the third most intense storm landfall on record, behind only Labor Day and Camille. It struck near Tyndall AFB around 5:30 p.m. on October 10, produced 16 known tornadoes and directly caused 16 deaths. USGS storm surge sensors at Mexico Beach pier recorded a 15-foot surge. On the north side of Hwy. 98, water reached 11 feet above the base of a building (aka inundation). That's above the first floor!

By the numbers: Damages from Hurricane Michael are estimated at roughly \$25 billion.

According to the Florida Office of Insurance Regulation, the estimated insured losses is \$6.2 billion from around 145,000 claims. More than 70,000 homeowners filed claims and 80% have already been settled. Commercial property is further behind, only 61% of 10,000+ claims have been settled.

As of April 9th 2019, FEMA has approved \$141million for individual assistance applications, over \$200 million for National Flood Insurance claims, and \$629 million in SBA loans. Total FEMA assistance tops out just over \$1billion. If you are doing the math you will realize that the amount paid by these sources is far too little to reach the estimated total loss. That is because much of it may never be recovered, such as \$1 billion agricultural losses, \$1 billion timber losses, clean-up expenses, future economic losses from lost revenue, uninsured losses, and city and county facilities.

Our state legislators have been pushing to get the storm recategorized to a Cat 5 ever since it happened, hoping to increase awareness of its impact. Now is the time to contact our senators and ask for more money to be allocated to disaster relief from the federal level.

ates hope in others they come in contact with." He went on to say, "Both of those dogs will be reevaluated this month. It is a long trip to California, but it is neces-



sary to make certain the teams are working up to par." All of the PLF teams must be re-evaluated after the first six months as a team; then again each year, as a part of Steve's commitment to training real service dogs.

PLF has a nationwide reach, and places dogs from coast to coast. The foundation has even welcomed their first Canadian service member, Cindy Weir. She is a veteran of the Royal Canadian Air Force, and served on Tyndall AFB for 4 years. Cindy has PTSD and mobility

impairment. Since the Canadian troops fight alongside our American Heroes, PLF jumped to assist Cindy on her road to healing. She will soon introduce

her new service dog to the great white north. Currently, Canadian veterans are on a five-year waiting list to receive service dogs due to a lack of trainers. Because of the incredible work PLF has accomplished right here on the Emerald Coast, Steve has been invited to help the national effort in Canada. He takes little credit though, rather, he deflects and talks about his team of trainers and caregiving staff at What's Up

Dog. He holds them in high re-

gard, for obvious good reasons.



Community Rallies to Bring Back Children's Volunteer Health Network's Mobile Dental Clinic

This May, Children's Volunteer Health Network (CVHN) will unveil a new and improved mobile dental clinic, allowing the organization to more efficiently serve students in Okaloosa and Walton County Schools. In 2018, CVHN was forced to retire its beloved mobile dental clinic, Just for Grins, after it sustained previously undetected water damage.

"The loss of our Mobile Dental Clinic was disappointing," said Brian Lowe, Executive Director of CVHN. "Although it made our outreach in the schools more challenging, our determined team served more than 650 kids while performing 2,856 procedures during the 2017-2018 school year."

In order to continue reaching under-resourced children in our community, the CVHN team has been transporting the dental equipment and supplies in personal vehicles to set up temporary clinics in the schools. Having a new bus will enable the CVHN team to increase the ca-

pacity to serve additional students in the upcoming school year.

"A generous grant from the Dugas Family Foundation made the purchase of this bus possible," Lowe said. "Once the bus arrives, we will need the help of the community to ensure we can keep it stocked and running from school-to-

school." For the last 10 months, CVHN has been securing the funding, designing, and coordinating the manufacturing of a brand new 37' long and 12' 6" tall mobile dental clinic bus. The bus is equipped with two treatment bays to facilitate both preventative and restorative dental services, an area to educate children on appropriate dental hygiene, and plenty of space to recognize the donors who passionately support CVHN's programs to the most vulnerable children in both counties.

This summer, the CVHN mobile dental clinic will be going



on tour, visiting businesses and churches in Walton and Okaloosa Counties to spread awareness about the programs CVHN offers. "The Bus Tour will give our community a chance to step onto our new mobile dental clinic and learn more about the services we are able to provide to low-income families in our community," Lowe said.

Additionally, on April 22, CVHN launched a social media campaign to name the bus! Community members can submit their suggestions on Facebook and Instagram. The person who submits the winning name will



win a beach bonfire from Beach Life Vacation Company.

The new mobile dental clinic, and its new name, will be unveiled to the community at CVHN's 3rd Annual Smile Mile & 5k on May 11 in the scenic community of WaterColor. Register here. This CVHN signature event is fun for all ages, stroller-friendly, and will help raise funds that will be used to improve the health and well-being of kids in Walton and Okaloosa Counties.

The participation fee for the 5K is \$35, and the Smile Mile is \$20. Participants will receive a commemorative shirt and enjoy

live music and food before the awards presentation. Event participants will have the opportunity to tour the bus and learn more about what takes place on it as it travels around from school-to-school.

With Bond Yields at 50 Year Lows, Where Might Investors Be Turning?

Depending upon which type of bond you are looking at, it is painfully obvious that bond yields are at or near their lowest levels since 1969. Institutional investors around the globe continue to buy bonds which in turn drives the prices for the bonds up and the yields down. What options or alternatives do individual investors have? Individual investors use bonds or interestbearing securities mainly for two reasons: The first is portfolio diversification (asset allocation between stocks, bonds and cash) in order to reduce risk and potentially lower volatility. The second would be for an income stream. Many of those folks are in retirement and need income to supplement social security, pensions and savings in order to maintain their lifestyles.

Money market mutual funds, in the most conservative asset class of cash, are now seeing yields above 2% for the first time in over a decade. Bonds and bond mutual funds (or the fixed income class) have higher yields but also can fluctuate in price (increasing when yields decline and decreasing when yields go up). There are also fixed rate annuities as well. And for those investors with a higher risk tolerance (moderately aggressive) there are dividend paying stocks that they can consider. First take note that the yield for the S&P 500, as a group, is currently approximately 2%. Utility stocks (which as a group have an average yield of about 3%) are one area investors can look to with some individual utility stocks of those yielding 4-5%. The appeal (again for the moderately aggressive investor) is not only the dividend yield but that, as a sector, utilities are considered defensive when it comes to stocks.

And they might experience share value growth as well. "Defensive" stocks are those companies which are usually not as volatile to negative economic influences. Buying individual stocks carries more risk so an individual investor should do their research - as well as consider spreading out their investment.

Other dividend paying alternatives can be found in consumer staple stocks, which is also considered a defensive sector. Consumer staple stocks are usually the stocks of those companies that do not experience as much volatility when the market moves drastically (as it can). The yield for the unmanaged index of consumer staples stocks approximates 2.7% but an investor would need to look over these stocks if they are in search of higher yields than the average. Lastly, health care stocks are a defensive sector as well. Many investors consider health care stocks to have resiliency in demand and that unmanaged index has a yield that approximates 1.7% so investors, if seeking higher yields, would need to do further research. Energy stocks, while not defensive (the energy sector is cyclical) have an average yield of over 3% and again there are individual companies that pay higher dividends than the average.

Time frame and risk tolerance play an important role in managing your portfolio. If you are seeking higher yielding alternatives, be sure to work with your advisor or do your own research before making decisions.



As children, some of us had places which scared us: the space under the bed, a cracked closet door or shadows in the dark which drove our imaginations wild. the insulation from falling down. Some of us who have this type of insulation have witnessed our wild native friends: beach mice, squirrels, birds, and even geckos. Yes, geckos, the small chiefly tropical and nocturnal insectivorous lizards, also like this space and will rip the netting to gain access to the insulation and become non paying roommates under our homes.

At ECES, fixing crawl spaces was not always a service we provided, because there was not really a great solution other than spray foam or replace the rolled insulation and netting which would once again become a playground for our wild friends and would need replacing in a few years.

40 Days and Nights and the Flood Waters Kept Rising

So, you've heard the stories, watched the news, shaken your head in disbelief, thought about the tragedies and wondered, "What would I do if that happened to me or my family?" If you've never been in that situation, all you've really experienced is someone else's loss and how they dealt with it.

Some people come away from flood loss forever changed and others come away from flood damage like it was just another day. Everyone deals with it differently. Unfortunately, what tends to happen is that those who are prepared mentally, physically and financially always seem to be on the end of the scale tipping towards working through flood loss better than others. Over the last 18 months or so, historical flooding across the country wreaked havoc in Texas, Florida and the Carolinas. So much water dropped in Texas that it measurably compressed the earth! With boots on the ground, I talked to countless people and heard the same stories over and over again. "We don't live in a flood zone. We didn't think we needed flood insurance." And with that, all their energy, life savings and future hopes of living in their homes and working on their businesses came into question. People were crying in their driveways, wringing their hands, going through the motions of where to get food, where to find water, where to sleep, where to find cloths; more that 70% of recent flood victims affected didn't have flood insurance.

According to a survey just re-

leased by CoreLogic, 29 million people are at risk of flood damage even though they are outside historical flood maps:

Nationally, 29,437,151 properties, or 23 percent, are outside a designated SFHA despite being at what CoreLogic rates as high or moderate risk of flooding.

At the state level:

Florida has the highest number of properties in this category at 5,055,821 or 54 percent of total properties.

Texas has 3,292,082 properties, or 31 percent, and California has 3,114,462 properties or 29 percent.

Looking at only the percentage of properties outside an SFHA, which are at high or moderate risk, Arizona has the highest at 68 percent, followed by Florida at 54 percent and Louisiana at 49 percent.

Flood loss happens quickly, but you can take steps today to prepare:

- Keep things elevated. (Get storage shelves and keep valuables at least 4' off the ground.)
- Keep records and valuable documents sealed in water tight containers.
- Photograph your property annually or semi-annually to make sure you can report damages accurately.
- Have an emergency preparedness evacuation plan.
- Make sure you have the right insurance for any disaster.

Most importantly – if you have questions about your policy or coverage, contact your local insurance agent or other insurance professional to help you understand what you're covered for.



It's Almost Time for the Blessing of the Fleet!

This year marks the 62nd year for one unique Destin tradition - one that many locals look forward to before the busyness of summer sets in. The Blessing of the Fleet is one of Destin's longest standing traditions, and it brings out locals and tourists for a ceremony unlike any other on the Destin Harbor.

On Ascension Day every year, local pastors gather behind Brotula's on the Harbor to bless charter fishing boats, boat captains, crews and passengers for a safe and bountiful busy season. Many captains attribute the success of their season not to luck, but to these blessings. This tradition has held for many years, even as Destin evolved from a small fishing community to the World's Luckiest Little Fishing Village it is today.

The Blessing of the Fleet began in May 1958 with about 12 boats and has since grown to over 150 boats in 2018. Numbers like this make it the largest Blessing of the Fleet in the country, with families making it tradition and participating every year.

"We started participating in the Blessing of the Fleet on my father-in-law's charter boat in 1995," says Heather Thomas of Destin Vacation Boat Rentals. "Destin has changed a lot since then, so we really enjoy this part of Destin tradition that celebrates the faith and sense of community that our little fishing village was built on. When you line up with all of the other boats on the Harbor waiting to be blessed, there's this sense of togetherness... it's really special."

While it was started by the Episcopal church, it has since evolved into a community of pastors and all churches banning together for the greater good, and the Blessing of the Fleet is open to all believers and nonbelievers alike. The hope is that any commercial vessel and its captain will feel welcome on the water. Any vessel with a crew that makes its living on the sea that wishes to be blessed can line up and wait its turn in a parade-like fashion. Boats can register by calling 850.837.6324 or by visiting immanuel@iacdestin.org.

The "blessing" will happen this year on May 30, 2019, on the water behind Brotula's in Destin. A short church service precedes the blessing beginning at 4 p.m., with the actual blessing starting at 5 p.m. Come one, come all and celebrate the kick off of summer and wishing all the boat captains well!

Digestion by Design: Part 3

It might come as a surprise to learn that the number one trigger of daytime fatigue and poor performance is actually not sleep, stress or even food related - it's dehydration. So, before we move on to the stomach, let's talk about how to hydrate properly. Your

goal is to consume half your body weight in ounces of water daily. More if you workout and sweat! However, one of the worst things you can do is drown your meal with a lot of liquid!

To enhance digestion it is better to hydrate BETWEEN meals. When we over-drink with our meal we actually hinder digestion by diluting the gastric juices, making them less effective at breaking down food properly. As a result, nutrient absorption is compromised and symptoms of indigestion may increase. You are better off drinking a large glass of water 15 to 30 minutes BEFORE you plan to eat. This will not only help you stay hydrated; it also helps to curb your hunger, making you less likely to over eat.

On a side note, did you know

that water consumption increases the rate at which you burn calories? Even more so if it's cold. However, if you are a fan of cold or iced drinks, it is essential that you consume them on an empty stomach ONLY, no less than 30 minutes before you eat. Drinking iced or cold liquids with a meal will not only delay the digestive function, it also solidifies fats making them harder to digest. On an empty stomach, cold liquids help curb your hunger and raise your metabolism.

To achieve your goal, try this schedule:

• 2 glasses upon arising helps to activate internal organs and improves regular bowel function.

1 glass 15 - 30 minutes BE-FORE breakfast or one hour after

- 1 glass 15 30 minutes BE-FORE lunch
- 1 glass mid afternoon
- 1 glass 15 30 minutes BE-FORE dinner
- 1 glass before your shower helps to prevent dehydration

• 1 glass before bed helps prevent heart attack and stroke

So what can you drink with your meal? Sipping coffee, hot tea, red wine or room temperature water with your meal is okay. Since you are hydrating between meals thirst should not be an issue. You just need enough liquid to help you swallow.

All forms of soda or flavored drinks should be eliminated if they contain refined sugar or artificial sweeteners, both a weight loss nightmare that offer zero positive contributions! Pure, fresh water has the added bonus of helping to detoxify, making your digestive system more efficient. For variety, try adding some cranberry juice, citrus, mint, cucumber, ginger, strawberry or basil to vour water.

Here's a simple recipe you can try with some amazing health benefits:

Pour 8 ounces of pure organic cranberry juice (not cranberry juice cocktail!) into a one gallon glass container. Add the juice (and pulp for more fiber and bioflavonoids) of 4 lemons. Fill with good clean filtered water. Add Stevia to taste (optional)





Pastor's Ponderings: Go Fish

When he had finished speaking, he said to Simon, "Put out into deep water, and let down the nets for a catch." Luke 5:1-11

Ever had a hard day at work and all you can think of is getting home? You finally walk through the door of your house and all you can think about is getting into something comfortable, sitting in your favorite chair and relaxing. Jesus calls at such a time as this.

Luke invites us to see how Christ speaks to people. He calls us in our vulnerable moments; He beckons us when it is not convenient. His love often demands sacrifice. Peter and the boys were tired and probably frustrated at their failure to catch fish. They were probably deep inside their heads when the Rabbi asked to use their boat. They were unprepared for a Carpenter/Rabbi to tell them to fish where they had just failed.

The Lord is teaching multitudes of people who crowd in close to hear him. He suddenly conscripts Peter and his boat to use as a makeshift pulpit. You never know when Jesus is going to get into your boat.

Peter and the boys had just come back from a long night of frustrating, fruitless fishing. They had to be thinking about how they wouldn't make any money and probably wouldn't eat. Amid their weariness, Jesus says, "let's go fish!"

Peter to come out with his next response though, "BUT, if you say so, we'll try again." I'm sure there Peter wanted to know how they were possibly going to catch fish in the middle of the day. Yet, he chooses to obey. Peter and the fishermen soon saw the miracle of a huge catch. Doing what God

asks doesn't always make sense, and it's not always logical, it takes trust and faith. These guys put their nets in the boat; they go where Jesus instructs and cast their nets in the water

- again. Their nets come up bursting with fish!

Obedience requires determination. You must choose to listen to Jesus. Many priorities will tug for your attention, but you must decide to focus on Jesus. Trust that following His direction will be the most effective, important, and wisest decision you can make. The disciples learned


rope. Her first works were water colors, but the last 20 years she has preferred using acrylics. Painting is like therapy for her. She says she "smiles during the whole painting process."
