A Ray of Hope to Save a Child

"For I know the plans I have for you," declares the Lord, "plans to prosper you and not to harm you, plans to give you hope and a future." Jeremiah 29:11

On a typical day at her job as a nurse, Holley Moseley, an area local, met a small, captivating blue-eyed, blonde-haired toddler named RayAnn, who would change her life forever!

RayAnn had been removed from her biological parents due to neglect, had become a medical shelter patient, and was diagnosed with cerebral palsy and epilepsy. Holley fell hard for RayAnn. Capturing their hearts, Holley and her husband, Peyton, ended up adopting her.

But they soon found themselves fighting to save their daughter's life.

Though RayAnn is now age 16, from the time the Moseleys adopted her at age 2, they have been working with varied and exhausting treatments to help diminish and cure her symptoms, most to no avail. When RayAnn was age 5, it seemed as though



they spent their entire lives either in the emergency room or at the neurologist's office, and still weren't making headway. Many times RayAnn has been on so much medication that she became listless and withdrawn. Her physician, Paul R. Carney, MD, Professor of Neurology and Pediatrics Department of Neurology, University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill, says, "Not only were they no longer working, they were taking away the

very essence of Ray-

Ann." It seemed no matter what the Moseleys tried, they couldn't get control of the seizures. By the time RayAnn was age 10, the Moseley's felt like they had tried everything modern medicine had to offer.

Holley was desperate for answers and not giving up. And then, there was a ray of hope! Peyton happened to be watching a documentary featuring

Dr. Sanjay Gupta called Weed. "And for the first time in what felt like 10 lifetimes, we had a ray of hope again," says Holley. She began researching the use of CBD-rich oil and wondered if it would be an answer, determined to find a better solution and HOPE for RayAnn. "I have found there are few forces more powerful than a mother's will to fight on behalf of her sick child," said Dr. Carney. And together they pursued this path, becoming deeply informed on the subject.

But the "legal" road hasn't been easy. Once Holley knew regulated, medical marijuana could be a miracle for Ray-Ann, it was not yet legal in Florida. Holley had to make some agonizing decisions, traveling to Colorado specifically to help RayAnn. "As a Florida resident, I was told I couldn't legally help Ray-Ann through this method of treatment. I had a decision to make. A mom's desperation kicked in and I decided to pursue the BEST possible treatment for my daughter."

Holley, her physician and others have fought hard to legalize this "ray of hope" in Florida, advocating tirelessly and winning remarkable victories. Most notable was in 2014 when the Compassionate Medical Cannabis Act of 2014 was passed in the state. Though it would be two years before Florida patients would have legal access to the treatment, Gov. Rick Scott signed the bill which made the high CBD, low-THC cannabis oil treatment legal. "It seemed as though at every turn, God was providing the guidance and support we needed to make this happen," says Holley.

and no longer suffers from the debilitating side effects of highpowered medications she once depended on. She is an active teenager, full of life and personality. Last month, she participated in the Special Olympics state tennis tournament in Orlando and placed second in her division. In July, she will attend the Florida Youth Leadership Forum in Tallahassee. And Holley? She has become a resource and support for others, directing folks on the best products to use and helping them feel at peace about pursuing this unorthodox and highly controversial path. Holley and her physician are somewhat pioneers, helping to lead the way for others-children and adults—who are suffering. Not only has RayAnn changed the Moseley family's lives, but she has been the catalyst for imparting hope in others' lives.

Holley's story, told through her newly published book, A Ray of Hope, chronicles in detail the events that have unfolded the past few years. Not only does it convey the emotional and physical journey of their family's quest, but contains valuable information for parents and patients that will help them to navigate their own journeys. In Dr. Carney's eyes, Holley is a hero. "Her diligence and refusal to give up led to a solution for RayAnn and paved the way for countless other families to have the same. She has inspired me, and I hope she inspires you, too," he says.

"It's often the times your life goes the furthest off script that the best moments happen: the surprises, the unexpected, the miracles," says Holley. "And one day, when you look back on the story that's been written in the days and weeks that follow, you see how it all fell into place despite the things you thought you were planning for at the time."

Summertime in Destin is all about beautiful beach days, fishing voyages, great seafood, boating, and entertainment. But summer in a busy tourist town does not come without its risks.

One area of concern for the Okaloosa County Sheriff's Office, the City of Destin, and the Florida Department of Transportation is pedestrian safety along Highway 98.

The issue is real. In February 2018, a Pensacola man was

struck by a car and killed while crossing Highway 98 near Stahlman Ave. A month later, another individual suffered the same fate as he tried to cross from one side of the highway to the other. In August, a man died after stepping out in front of a car. In all three cases, the fatalities happened at night, and were not at any of the city's designated crosswalks.

The Okaloosa County Sheriff's Office wants to encourage all our residents and visitors to take advantage of the five clearly marked, well-lit crosswalks available along Highway 98 from just east of the Marler Bridge to just west of the Silver Dunes Condominium's driveway.

For pedestrians, it's imperative you push the button to activate the traffic signal. Don't enter the crosswalk while the light is yellow. Wait until it is red at all traffic stops, and be sure to remain alert and scan for approaching cars as you cross.

It's just as important that



drivers along Highway 98 stay vigilant. When that signal turns yellow, prepare to stop. When it turns red, you should stop behind the stop bar and stay there until the signal turns green and any pedestrians have moved out of the crosswalk.

Keep in mind, the term "pedestrian" includes persons in a



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Destin's American Flag Mural Honors Our Hometown Heroes

Our hometown American flag mural painted on the roof of Legendary Marine has been confirmed by Guinness World Records to be the largest flag mural in the world and honors our hometown heroes— our military men and women, veterans, police officers, sheriffs, firefighters, coast guard, EMTs and all of our first responders.

"I got the idea really to do the flag," said world-renowned artist Robert Wyland, or to most just 'Wyland,' because an officer here, Bill Myers, was murdered serving a warrant and the officer was retired, just trying to earn a little bit of money to take his grandchildren to Disney World and it broke my heart. So, I said I want to honor this officer and all the officers across America,"

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he says on WorldRecordAcademy.com.

Along with our first responders, police officers, EMTs, firefighters and others, the Emerald Coast is home to several military bases from Panama City to Pensacola—seven large bases! Eglin Airforce Base in Fort Walton/Valparaiso, 463,128 acres, is right around the corner and considered one of the largest air force installations in the world. These heroes are the inspiration that moved Wyland to paint the largest American Flag mural. "We have 300 million people in the U.S. One hundred percent of them should support our military, our vets, our police, our firemen, our coast guards, all our first responders," said Artist, Wyland. "One hundred percent. Are you guys with me?"

The most recent mural, which

measures 554 feet by 299 feet – an impressive 3.8 acres in size, was dedicated as a "THANK YOU" to the United States Military and first responders in April of 2016. The strong military presence in this area creates pride in the community for our country and appreciation for the ones who serve and dedicate their lives to protect and defend us every day."

Artist Wyland is best known for his life-sized and life-like marine murals, part of a 25-year 100 "Whaling Wall" project, where he has painted phenomenal eye-catching renderings of whales, dolphins and other ocean scenery on the sides of buildings and places all over the world. As one of the largest marinas around, Legendary Marine was the perfect canvas for one of his most spectacular whaling walls, #88 finished in 2001. That's when Wyland added the original mural of a big American Flag to the rooftop as sort of a secret surprise to "catch your eye" while in the air.





Learn to Talk "Dog"

To help keep dogs out of shelters, nonprofit Dog-Harmony Inc. will host three workshops this summer led by local trainer Debbie Revell.

Revell, owner of Pets Behave in Niceville, is a Certified Dog Behavior Consultant (CDBC), Associate Certified Cat Behavior Consultant $\left(ACCBC\right)$ and has a diploma of Companion Animal Behavior and Training (Dip. CABT).

The first workshop is "Learn to Talk Dog" on June 8. It covers how dogs give cues and signals with their body language all the time. However, most of the time

humans don't recognize those signals. Participants will learn how to listen with their eyes and steps to better communication.

The second is "Calming Dog Reactivity" on July 13. It covers canines that bark, lunge and growl at other dogs. These dogs are reactive for a variety of reasons, including fear, overstimulation, frustration and excitement. Participants will learn strategies to help calm a reactive dog.

The third workshop is "Fears and Phobias" on Aug. 10. It teaches techniques and therapies to help dogs with anxiety about common issues, such as car rides, vet visits, children, fireworks, thunderstorms and nail trims.

and Certified Professional Dog Trainer - Knowledge Assessed (CPDT - KA). Bown can help over the phone, or better yet, after meeting the pet, at Dog-Harmony headquarters, 237 Market St., off Walton County Road 393 North. No shock collars or choke collars are used. Bown is a force-free trainer, and was recently named a regional director for the Shock-Free Coalition, a national organization working to eliminate shock methods to train and manage pets.

"Training is important," Bown says. "But it's crucial to have the correct type of training." Pet problems, mainly undesirable behaviors and aggression, are the most common reason owners rehome their pet, according to the ASPCA's 2015 National Rehoming Survey. For dogs, nearly half are relinquished for that reason (47 percent). While most dogs are rehomed to a friend or family member (41 percent), the survey found, the second-highest place where they end up is a shelter (34 percent). What might have helped keep them in their homes, according to the survey? The second-most requested service was low-cost training or behavior help (34 percent). The free training advice is by appointment only, and aggressive dogs are not eligible for the program. Call (850) 376-4190 to reserve a spot.

What in the?...who was playing a song in the middle of the night? Luke's brain finally kicked - it was his cell phone. 2 a.m. and his phone was ringing. That was not a good sign. He cleared his throat and groggily croaked, "Hello?" A firm and capable voice said, "Mr. Pierson? This is ADT calling. We've received an alarm from your business location and have alerted the authorities. It looks like the fire alarm went off."

Luke couldn't remember how he got to his office. The smoke was thick and black and the fire department and police were already on site. He stood there with his mouth hanging open, eyes wide in disbelief.

As soon as it was light, Luke called his insurance agent, who calmed his fears by reminding him he had a good BOP (Business Owners Policy) covering his physical therapy business. In the end, the damage wasn't too severe, but his office wouldn't be taking care of any patients for a few weeks at least, if not longer.

He was concerned about not just the building repairs and replacement of damaged or destroyed equipment, but what would his employees do? They needed their paychecks. For small to medium-sized businesses, **Business Owners Policies or BOPs** as they're referred to, are a great product combining protection from major property and liability risks in one package, similar to your homeowners policy. They cover things such as:

1 - Property insurance for both the building and contents owned by the company. This includes furniture, fixtures, and inventory. Your policy should always be written on the Special Form which is broader coverage, changing the policy from a named peril to an open peril policy.

2 - Business Income & Extra Expense insurance, which covers the loss of income resulting from a fire or other catastrophe that disrupts the businesses operation. It can also include the extra expense of operating out of a temporary location.

3 - Liability coverage which protects your company's legal responsibility for the harm done to others. It also covers the cost of your defense as businesses can be sued even if they are not negligent or did nothing wrong.

Business Auto coverage to protect your owned business vehicles, hired and non-owned auto and your employees when they drive on company time.

Crime Insurance to protect your business against burglary, forgery, computer fraud, employee dishonesty and other crimes.

Cyber Liability coverage for computer attacks and damage to electronic data and computer systems.

Employee Practices Liability Insurance (EPLI) to protect against employee lawsuits.

Professional Liability insurance (E&O) to protect against lawsuits for negligent acts, errors and omissions that result in financial losses during business activities.

Inland Marine coverage to protect property, goods or equipment in transit and over water or land.

Umbrella coverage to obtain higher limits over underlying policies you have in place.

Workers' Compensation

Over the years, the name progressed to "Distinguished Young Women" and has grown today to be the largest and oldest scholarship program of its kind. 
I witnessed how this program can make an impact through my daughter Natalie's journey. She won the Distinguished Young Woman of Okaloosa county.

Locals Care Through Coastal Cleanup



ance and the City of Destin, the clean-up targeted the small, hard-to-gather items that often litter our beaches and confuse wildlife species that think the tiny pieces are food.

Hitting the sand with garbage bags as well as plastic buckets, of plastic across the world's oceans. How can we reduce this immense burden not only on ecosystem health, but ours too?

In addition to participating in local cleanups, coastal citizens can reduce the amount of plastic they use on a daily basis by utilizing County Tourist Development Department to gather pollution and trash at three locations on Okaloosa Island. 


the volunteers scoured the edge of the newly restored dune, the shoreline edges, and within the rock groins themselves. All together, the volunteers collected over 170 cigarette butts, over 550 tiny trash pieces, as well as fishing line, wire, treated wood pieces, and fireworks.

Across the world, plastic pollution remains a large and growing problem. According to the Center for Biological Diversity, there are up to 50 trillion pieces cloth grocery bags, reusable mugs and metal beverage containers. Recycle what you can, properly dispose of what you can't.

In our community, clean-ups are a way to not only remove marine debris from our shorelines, but also educate future beach stewards about the items that can wash up on our shores.

Earlier in the month, the Boys and Girls Club joined forces with CBA, the Crab Trap, United Way, and the Okaloosa



addition to a plethora of other items. As in other locations within the International Coastal Cleanup movement, the cigarette refuse remains our most commonly recorded item.

"It was a pleasure for United Way to partner with Boys & Girls Club of the Emerald Coast as they hosted Florida Youth of the Year participants," says Cindy Holmes, Resource Development Director for United Way of Okaloosa and Walton Counties, "It's always a joy to see young people care about the environment and to participate in programs like the beach cleanup.'

"People who live near and visit the coast can participate in their own cleanups year round," says Alison McDowell, Director of CBA. "Bring a bag with you and pick up whatever you find while on walks or fishing."

"Additionally," she continues, "CBA collects fishing line from multiple, artistically decorated receptacles in Destin Harbor, on the Okaloosa Island Fishing Pier, and within Ross Marler and Veterans Park. Together we can reduce the amount of plastic entering our waterways."

There is a video on YouTube about what's inside a YETI and has more than 7.2 million views. That's more views than the entire population of Tennessee and that's just one video. It's no secret we care about insulating things and pay a little more for quality and efficiency. So, why when it comes to our biggest investment, our homes, we fall short of upgrading our home's efficiency and insulation?

A Former U.S. President once said during a press conference on renewable energy that Insulation is sexy stuff and that if you haven't upgraded your home yet, it's not just heat or cool air escaping. That's an impressive number and a positive impact on our environment.

Hurricane Michael: A Time to Remember

to forget... October 4, 2018: What is now officially characterized as a "system" continues northeast toward the Yucatan Peninsula.

October 7, 2018: By morning "the system" was officially a Tropical Depression; becomes Tropical Storm Michael at 4:55 p.m. that day.

October 8, 2018: Reconnaissance aircraft reports Tropical Storm Michael to become Hurricane Michael officially - a nearly 35 nautical mile wide system was reported to be forming perfectly.

October 9, 2018: 9:00 pm: Michael becomes a major hurricane. In the span of only six hours, the central pressure within the eye had dropped rapidly to 20mb.

October 10, 2018: Rapid intensification along with a well-defined eye appeared making Michael's strength peak by the end of the day sitting just below a Category 5.

As Hurricane Michael chugged along at 13 mph, it made landfall on the Gulf Coast of the United States in Mexico Beach, Fla., later that day. Ranking by pressure makes Hurricane Michael the third most intense Atlantic Hurricane to ever make landfall in the United States. Most recent data now indicates that Michael made landfall as a Category 5the first storm to make landfall as a Cat. 5 in the U.S. since Andrew struck southern Florida in August 1992. (Andrew was also upgraded from a Cat. 4 to a 5 in post-storm analysis.) Michael was blamed for 49 deaths and more than \$5.5 billion in damage.

PRESENT DAY: It's one of those things...you remember where you were, watching, listening, waiting it out. Not sure if that "system" was going to wobble this way or veer off that way. You never really know until it's right on top of you...or not... exhale. I almost stayed - thought to myself - self, we're smart; self, we're educated; self, you know what you're doing; self, we're staying - me, my wife, our kids and the dog. Why not...it's soooo far away and there ain't no way that thing is moving over here and you know what...remember those guys on TV, always hyping up the storms...yeah...definitely staying.

But later that day, reason sounded its still small voice in the back of my brain. Remember, Hurricane Hermine made landfall as a Cat 1, on high tide with a super moon; you met a man who was bedbound, a paraplegic who had to endure the storm alone on his bed with no electricity. Being unable to move, he endured the sound of water rising only to find a small relief with the water just stopping at the top of his mattress. Exhale.

You gonna be a hypocrite – or are you leaving?! Man – I had to open my big mouth and speak now I have to leave. I have to err on the side of caution...have to err on the side of protecting my family...have to take what I've come to know and understand what these "systems" can do and do what I know is the right thing to do. When animals sense trouble, they listen to their guts and do what they were intended to do: SURVIVE. I was beginning to think I had some special sense of power - TECHNOL-OGY! But, remember what that tech got that man lying in bed.

In the wake of this tragedy let us listen to reason and sound advice in the upcoming seasons of our lives.

As I've said before, prepare: • Have an emergency pre-

paredness evacuation plan. • Keep things elevated. (Get storage shelves and keep valu-

ables at least 4'off the ground.) • Keep records and valuable


documents sealed in water tight containers.

• Photograph your property annually or semi-annually to make sure you can report damages accurately.

• Make sure you have the right insurance for any disaster.



Off the Hook Red Snapper Season

BY CALI HLAVAC, TO DO IN DESTIN

There is one fish that some people wait all year for the chance to keep, and this year open season falls right in line with Father's Day. Red Snapper season is open for federally-licensed charters from June 1-August 1, with open season for recreational fishing and state licensed charters following close behind from June 11-July 12. There is a two-per person limit, with 16" minimum size for all waters.

We dug around to find out why Red Snapper is a highly soughtafter fish, mostly to discover the taste is what draws people in. The white meat is lean, has a gentle, sweet, nutty flavor with a firm texture. Whether baked, broiled, grilled or fried, this mild-flavored fish always delivers a great taste while also being a very healthy food source. Four ounces of uncooked Red Snapper contain just 110 calories and 1 gram of fat.

They are also a fun catch. Large Red Snappers will swim



in circles and pull, making it quite the fight. For those fishing for them on their own, it is recommended that a fluorocarbon leader be used as Red Snapper have excellent eyesight and sharp teeth. So, the line needs to be invisible in the water. Find them in depths of 50-60 ft. and most Red Snappers prefer live bait; they can be caught on dead Cigar Minnows, squid or cut fish by a simple drop in the water. You can also try chumming them up to the surface with chunked fish. This

also bring them far away from the structures that they might pull you into to cut your line.

If you can't make it to fish during Red Snapper season, you're still in luck. The snapper family boasts a variety of fish that are equally as tasty, with limits yearround. Vermillion snappers for example are just as tasty, and though they are smaller in size, a limit of 10 per person will guarantee you still come home with plenty to eat. Mangrove Snapper, White Snapper and Black Snapper are also

Keeping Anglers on the Water and Out of the Clinic Avoid Injury from Fishing this Summer

Fishing is often thought of as one of the most relaxing outdoor sports, but often at fault. People imagine quiet, calm waters, while enjoying the sunrise over the horizon. Rarely do people (who don't fish regularly) imagine rough, 7-foot waters crashing over the bow, or a lengthy battle with a deep-water giant.

Statistics show that fishing continues to grow in popularity. Along with those earning a living on the water and its resources, recreational fishing is one of the most popular activities in the world. But, as with other sports, it's not without its risks.

As an avid angler and tournament fisherman in my free time, but a chiropractic professional passionate about evidence-based chiropractic and rehabilitation, I want to bring awareness to ways anglers can protect their bodies and avoid injury in this fun and popular sport this summer.

Common Fishing Injuries: Overuse Injuries

Most anglers are careful to avoid the obvious and most dramatic of fishing dangers (dehydration, hooking a finger, boat motor fires, accidental drowning, etc.). However, to stay in top

fishing shape, one must protect themselves from more mundane fishing hazards - overuse injuries.

Common injuries include: low back pain, muscle tightness, knee pain, and overuse syndromes in the shoulders, elbows and wrists. These overuse injuries often come in cycles during the fishing season, and they are common in the Destin area due to the popularity of the sport and the number of local anglers we have. Often, these injuries can be traced back to when a person learned their fishing techniques. Many people aren't taught proper techniques to minimize the risk of injury.

Stay On The Water and Out of The Clinic: How to Avoid **Overuse Injuries**

1.Condition

Like any trained athlete, I recommend pre-season conditioning, and even some pre-fishing stretching to loosen up before grabbing a rod and cranking after a fish. That's especially good advice for older and de-conditioned anglers alike, who are more prone to injuries due to diminished elasticity and flexibility.

2. Fishing Gear

Along with keeping their bod-



ies in shape, I also recommend utilizing fishing gear that's specific to the type of fishing being done as well as what's best for the angler's body. Smaller, lighter reels can reduce strain. Also, ensure equipment is in good condition so anglers are not fighting the equipment while also fighting a fish.

3. Protective Gear

Outdoor giants of fishing tackle are now taking notice of fishing-related injuries. Protective gear like thermal wrist support braces, pelvic rod support and holders, ergonomically-designed boat shoes, and fighting chairs vs. stand up gear can, and do, aide in any lengthy battle. If used correctly, these can help to prevent injury.

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4. Take Advantage of Professional Recommendation

I know it's my profession, but I highly recommend anglers utilizing the education of a chiropractic and/or rehab specialist. Not only is the education invaluable, but these professionals can provide training and prevention strategies as well as treatment strategies if injury occurs before it worsens or keeps them off the water.

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
Let Them Be Bored this Summer!


ance is so you can correct your form or else you lose it. Most of the time you catch it but every now and then you don't... but no worries... falling in is part of the fun! We don't have to be so


second that you won't succeed in living life to the fullest and fulfill your destiny.

For some of us, our fathers weren't able to give us a father's




enly Father feel any different about me?"





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Destin Homegrown Reporter Receives National Honor for Hurricane Michael Coverage

WMBB News 13 reporter Peyton LoCicero, a Destin native, was named as the 2019 recipient of the prestigious Dick Fletcher Excellence in Media Award. The award was given for her coverage of Hurricane Irma and Tropical Storm Nate, but most importantly, her coverage of catastrophic Hurricane Michael before, during and after the storm devastated the majority of WMBB's viewing area, along Florida's Panhandle. These efforts, along with her ability to "rally" and motivate the surrounding communities to help those in need after the storm, provided critical help and resources to those hit hardest. Pevton was nominated by Walton County Emergency Management Director Jeff Goldberg and Public Information Officer Louis E. Svehla. The award was recently presented to her at the National Governor's Hurricane Conference in Palm Beach.

"Meteorologists, newscasters and news organizations from across the nation were nominated for this honor making the entire WMBB news team proud that our own, Okaloosa/ Walton County reporter, Peyton LoCicero WMBB, was chosen as the 2019 Dick Fletcher Excellence in Media award winner. Peyton single-handedly represented WMBB during Hurricane Michael when we physically couldn't," said Tom Lewis, WMBB News Director.

The award is presented annually to one newscaster or one news team in the nation. Peyton, who has been a reporter covering Walton, Okaloosa and Bay counties since 2016, was selected for her dedication to providing the public with timely, honest emergency management information. "During the most recent weather event, Hurricane Michael, she made it her priority to push out information specific to Walton and Bay counties and the surrounding areas. During Hurricane Michael, WMBB in Panama City took a direct hit from the storm and was knocked off the air. She made it her mission to continue to provide information to the public without much communication from the station. She continued to provide live news feeds via social media which was one of the few ways residents in impacted areas were able to still receive

information. Her dedication and willingness to put herself in harm's way to provide information to the public was honorable. Following the storm, she played a crucial role, providing information on what people could do to get assistance through channels that had been set up from shelter to food. It has been evident over the years that Peyton has dedicated herself to assisting the public in news and weather event preparedness, event coverage and event recovery.

In the nomination, Svehla and Godlberg commended Peyton for her "exceptional collaboration and partnership with the Walton County Department of Emergency Management in educating the public about hurricanes and hurricane preparedness, response and recovery in the state of Florida. Peyton demonstrated exceptional skills as a broadcast journalist by communicating information during a catastrophic national weather event, by making it understandable to the layperson



with an on air persona that exudes confidence and creates an atmosphere of trust with all of her audience while providing life-saving information."

"I am deeply grateful to be recognized with this award. More importantly, I want to pay tribute to those who were impacted by the storm, to those who continue to put their lives and homes back in order and to those in our surrounding communities who gave of their time, talent and financial resources to help those in need after Hurricane Michael. It has been a community effort to rebuild and recover and I'm honored that you trusted me to provide information to prepare you for the storm's arrival and allowed me to share your stories with our viewers, post storm," Peyton said.



were diagnosed and treated by medical teams, the psychological trauma takes more time. Trained service dogs have shown to be effective in aiding in medical crises and alleviating the physical and emotional symptoms our veterans continue struggling with long after returning from the battlefield. The veterans were matched with their K9 partners after being rescued from local shelters.
