Local Divers Making a Difference

According to National Geographic, up to 8 million tons of plastic and waste enter our ocean waters every single year. More than 250 million tons of plastic are estimated to make its way into our oceans by 2025, according to projectaware.org.

Everyday trash is entering the sea at an alarming rate, growing rapidly due to our consumer lifestyle.

Marine debris is, simply, the waste that ends up on the bottom of our beautiful Gulf of Mexico. Nearly 80% of it comes from land-based sources and as much as 70% sinks to the ocean floor, according to the Plastic Pollution Coali-

Marine debris is not only unsightly, it's very dangerous to sea life and could be costly for the Destin economy. Marine animals become entangled in debris, and even mistake it for food, many times with fatal results. According to the plastic pollution coalition, plastic bags can look remarkably like jellyfish to turtles, which are a viable food



source. Sadly, turtles consume the plastic, which can cause blockages within their digestive tracts, causing a slow and very painful end. Divers, swimmers and beach goers can also be directly impacted by encounters with marine

But we have a local community of divers fighting back! The Diver's Down Pol-

lution Project (DDPP) is a fast-growing group of locals concerned with the increasing amounts of pollution on our Destin beaches and waterways. In July of 2020, DDPP started with only three members, Marine Scientist Brennan Wehrhahn, President Thomas Larrison and Communications Director Bobby Wagner. Now, DDPP

boasts more than 250 active, local volunteer members. To date, DDPP has picked up over 5,000 pounds of trash from our local beaches and waterways here in Northwest Florida. They not only organize monthly beach cleanups, but also are comprised of volunteer expert pro-divers who sweep 50-100 feet of the Harbor floor, resulting in picking up 300-500 pounds of trash each time, most recently in the area between AJ's and Tailfins.

The majority of this trash on the Harbor floor is comprised of plastic, not only bottles, but cups and straws as well. "To see the entire floor of the Destin Harbor completely covered with plastic as far as the eye can see is completely disheartening, says Bobby. "The sandy bottom with no reefs is just a complete plastic wasteland of a decade of debris."

Bobby says it's just not sustainable to continue to only pick up trash. There has to

The Better Business Bureau (BBB) is one of the nation's oldest non-profit organizations. It provides consumers with business profiles, consumer reviews, consumer information, scam alerts and reviews on charities. It's here to make sure, as consumers, we make wiser decisions about where we spend our money.

I spoke with Tammy Ward, the Communications Director of our local BBB serving Northwest Florida. It covers local businesses and consumer information across 14 counties in the Panhandle. I want to relay how the BBB can help us make

be an agreement made among the locals, visitors and restaurants alike, to come up with a solution to be more eco-friendly. Whether that involves switching from plastic to paper straws, or to even lobby against all things plastic, something needs to be

He goes on to say that Destin has become well known for the beauty of its beaches and the amazing emerald green color of its water, and gains a lot of attention as well as tourism from it, but we're not taking the right steps to protect it. He says our area is home to some of the most

unique and dynamic ecosystems in the world. People come to Destin for the beaches, dune lakes, fishing, and breath-taking scenery—all of which are based on natural resources. It is our responsibility to protect those natural resources by keeping these areas clean while inspiring others to do the same.

While the DDPP is recruiting expert divers to join their organization, as well as organizing various beach cleanups the first Sunday of every month, an hour before sunset, the change really begins with all of us.

Here's some things you can do to help reduce waste and pollution at our beautiful Destin Harbor:

- Refuse single-use plastics whenever possible. Bring your own water bottle and shopping bag with you, and for a day on the water or the beach, use your own reusable containers.
- Become a Gulf advocate. Tell your friends and family about the epidemic that is underwater pollution. Once people are informed, they'll start to make changes to their lifestyles.
- · Recycle everything you cannot refuse, reduce or reuse.
- Divers are ocean heroes. If you love to dive, DDPP invites you to get involved.
- Visit the DDPP Facebook page and ask to join this private organization, and upon approval, they will ask you to pledge to





pick up a bag of trash on your own or with your friends and post a picture on their Facebook

page. Their message is clear: Go on your own to pick up trash to make a difference in our community, as every little bit helps. Be mindful when you're at the beach, and leave only your footprints behind.

The next scheduled beach cleanup is on Sunday, March 7th, at Gulf National Seashore Drive, Ft. Walton Beach, an hour before sunset. Come on out and join this great group of volunteers and protect the natural beauty of our stunning beaches and waterways!!

And, if you find yourself walking down the beach and see plastic, make sure to pick it up and bin it appropriately.

wiser consumer decisions here

If you are looking for a service or product and not sure what company to turn to, you can find a list of BBB accredited businesses on their website. You can look through the list of categories for services, or you can use the search bar to look up a specific business you have in mind, and narrow it down by location.

BBB accredited businesses have gone through a vetting process, which includes making sure their licenses are up to date. They provide information on the business, a list of customer reviews and customer complaints, so you can make an educated guess on which business is best to use. If you are a business owner and you are looking to get your BBB accreditation, you can apply after your business has been open and operating for 6 months.

"I try to make myself available to those outlying counties, because our office is in Pensacola," Tammy said. "For our accredited businesses, or businesses that wish to be accredited, they want to know that somebody is



local to help them. We try to be as flexible as possible."

The BBB also accredits charities. Along the Emerald Coast we are people who like to give back, and there are a lot of great charities looking for help throughout the year. To make sure you are making a wise investment with your donation dollars, you can check out the list of BBB accredited charities.

They look closely at a charity's board activity and effectiveness, whether or not the charity has avoided accumulating funds, their annual reports, and their donor privacy. A charity has to spend at least 65% of funds on program activities and no more than 35% on fundraising. Charities that are BBB accredited have seen an average of 13.5% growth in public support.

'Some BBBs have a local

review process. So, if you have a local nonprofit charity in the area, we can do that locally if it is not on a national level," said Tammy. They can also review local chapters of national organizations to provide local information on the charity.

The BBB is also a useful resource to find out what scams are active in our area. Since 2015, their Scam Tracker (www.bbb.org/Scam-Tracker) has been a place for consumers to research scams and report them. The website allows you to search by scam type, money lost, and geographically. If you've been a victim of a scam, visit the site and report everything you can remember. Although they are not able to retrieve any money lost to you, they use the information to warn others and have helped law enforcement with investiga-

Some of the more active scams going on right now are employment scams, fake check scams, IRS scams, mover scams, social media and trial offers, grandparent scams, online purchases, and Covid -19 related

One of the Covid-19 scams we need to be aware of is a fake

vaccine appointment. Vaccines are free. If someone is asking you to pay or providing you with a "free gift with postage and handling" type of offer, it is fake. "A lot of times they are looking for personal information," stated Tammy. "If you get a call that you can set up an appointment, they'll ask for your Medicare number or ask you to verify everything with your social security number."

Scammers are also using your information when you post a picture of vour vaccine card on social media. "We're cautioning people not to do that," said Tammy. "If you post the card, you're posting personal information." She also said that scammers are using the pictures of the cards to recreate and sell them.

Tammy shares local and urgent scam alerts on the Facebook Page for the Better Business Bureau serving Northwest Florida. Follow them for the latest information on scams and updates on accredited business-

In a time when most of us are trying to save money, we also need to be aware of where we are putting it. The Better Business Bureau serving Northwest Florida can help us be educated consumers who make wiser decisions on who gets it. Magic is just what Niceville native Nicholas Ward has conjured up in New York City! This month's hometown hero and Northwest Florida State College (NWFSC) alumnus, Nicholas Ward is a "true Niceville local made good!" An extraordinarily talented singer as well as captivating performer, Nicholas has carved his career on the big stage – Broadway – now a veteran of four Broadway shows, including two original companies!

Born in Oakland, Ca., Nicholas' family moved to Niceville when he was age 5. So, he has always considered Niceville home. A 2019 NWFSC Distinguished Alumni Award recipient, and currently residing in NYC, Nicholas began his "career" right here in our backyard as a former member of the then Okaloosa Walton Community College Soundsations Show

Choir and the Madrigal Singers in the fall of 1997 until May 1998. Since graduation, he's been up to a little something!

Most recently, after having finished his run with Disney Theatrical's Broadway original cast of the hit Broadway musical Frozen, where he could be seen nightly as Elsa & Anna's loving father, King Agnarr, Nicholas could be seen in another Disney Broadway phenomenon, The Lion King, in the iconic role of Mufasa, Simba's father on various nights.

Nicholas' Broadway debut was in the critically acclaimed revival of On The Town where he opened with a stirring rendition of "I Feel like I'm Not Out Of Bed Yet" by Leonard Bernstein. He was then seen in Broadway's first a cappella musical, In Transit, nominated for the 2011 Drama Desk Award and resulted in his debut at the legendary Carnegie Hall.

Nicholas has shared his talents at a few other iconic venues as well including The Music Man at The Kennedy Center, with Norm Lewis and Jessie Mueller which featured the role of Olin Britt. He also performed at the famed Lincoln Center, where he was a featured

While Broadway has been shut down over the last few months, Nicholas could be seen visiting his old stomping grounds and appearing at places such as The Mattie Kelly Arts Center at NWFSC or down on 30a at the Old Florida Fish House.

Nicholas says to be successful in this business, "it takes determination and patience." That is Nicholas' M.O. and what has led him to success in a tightly, competitive industry.

Spring break 2020 was anything but normal, as the covid-19 pandemic sparked a ban on short-term rentals and limits on bars and restaurants.

This year's spring break runs from March 6th through April 25th, and although Okaloosa County doesn't market itself as a college spring break destination, it's typically a hot spot for students from southern colleges and universities.

So, what does spring break 2021 have in store? Covid could again make things interesting.

"We're hearing that some







colleges are cancelling spring break, but then what we're hearing from the students, because they're doing on-line classes, they're going to come anyway during that time," said Okaloosa County Sheriff's Office (OCSO) Lt. Jason Fulghum.

The OCSO is staffing spring break at the same levels as it traditionally does, with extra beach patrols on tap as well as a boost in the number of deputies on the roads. In addition, many area hotels and condos hire off-duty deputies for added spring break security at their properties.

Of course, Okaloosa County's marketing focuses on families with kids, but the OCSO is ready for whatever comes its

"The vast majority of our visitors come and have a wonderful time, then leave with great memories, and that's what we want for everyone, " said Sheriff Eric Aden. "However, there will be consequences for that small percentage who don't act responsibly, endangering themselves or others."

Locals typically also know what to expect. Patience is always recommended.

"Most of our locals have been here long enough they know what spring break is like. And we'll be out there doing our



best to keep the peace and doing our best to keep everybody safe because ultimately that's our biggest concern, is making sure people enjoy their spring break but they do it lawfully and safely. "

Lt. Fulghum says college students need to be smart in how they conduct themselves so they can have a good time without crossing the line.

For those who don't, the OCSO has a zero-tolerance policy, especially when it comes to underage possession of alcohol.

As far as covid-19 precautions, deputies will continue to wear masks and follow all CDC (Centers for Disease Control) protocols when interacting with the public.

Throughout this past year, amidst a Pandemic, our Destin Team has worked together to create a vision for this City, and this vision became an ambitious strategic plan for 2020, providing

team members the guidance for current and future initiatives and projects that also focused on protecting and enhancing our Destin brand.

The Destin City Council's #1 objective has been an extremely bold beach acquisition initiative. We started with a \$2-million-dollar commitment by our City Council and now have over \$22 million committed, most of the acquisition funding coming from tourist tax dollars. We acquired two beach parcels with a third parcel in the works to expand the Shore at Crystal Beach Park. We continue to work with the Trust for Public Land to acquire additional Gulf-front prop-



erty. Additionally, we continue to seek external funding sources for future acquisitions that will be forever entrusted for public use. I am thankful for the partnerships between the City of Destin, Okaloosa County Board of County Commissioners, Okaloosa County Tourist Development Council and the Trust for Public Land.

The **Information Technol**ogy, Community Development, and Code Compliance departments have been working to implement COMPASS (COMmunity Permitting And Support System). This EnerGov system is on target to go live in early 2021 and will provide operational transparency to customers and the public. COMPASS will allow our customers access to a self-service portal to submit digital applications online and view the status of applications as well as the results of building inspections, thus, eliminating the need for customers to submit paper applications and plan sets.

In March of 2020, we hired a projects/grants/and contracts manager to streamline how we manage city projects by creating a project review team that oversees the city's grants and contracts and will manage roughly \$41 million dollars in external funding the next few years.

Daily, our city clerk staff assists citizens with their needs, responds to a significant number of public records requests and works with IT to allow us to continue to virtually host many of our public meetings in the COVID-19 world.

The Finance Department is building a financial system that will drastically improve how we are able to plan, process and deliver services to our internal and external customers and provide

transparency for our residents. Our finance director and staff are working hard to align our budget process to work in harmony with our strategic goals and objectives.

In 2020, one of **Human Resources** (**HR**)'s greatest challenges was keeping our staff safe during this Pandemic and to keep the City open for business. They accomplished this by developing Business Operations Guidance & Telecommuting policies to assist in preventing workplace risk and exposures due to COVID-19, which helps the City keep our medical costs low and our workforce healthy.

Our IT Department and Public Information Office continues to keep the public informed and have been instrumental in the unveiling of the City's new and improved website.

The **Community Development Staff** accomplished two of the major strategic goals of the City Council. First, they successfully completed the alignment of the City's Comprehensive Plan, Future Land Use Map (FLUM), and Zoning Map. Second, they have completed the preparation of the City's Wayfinding Master Plan – which is the cornerstone of City Council's strategic goal of creating the Destin Brand.

This issue we will be making the distinction between WHAT a nursing home (Skilled Nursing Facility or SNF) is and that of an Assisted Living Community (ALF) and Independent Living/ Senior Apartment Complexes (IL). The vast majority of adults think that Independent Living, Assisted Living Communities and Nursing Homes are the same thing or very similar. However, there are many differences between them.

A **Skilled Nursing Facility** (nursing home or SNF) is usually a place of temporary residence for individuals who require extensive skilled nursing assistance with the activities of daily living (ADL's). Their patients are mainly elderly who

have physical and mental limitations. The offer physical, speech and occupational therapy as rehabilitation services. These are usually focused on short-term recovery using the above listed therapy services.

Some patients may need to stay in the SNF for several weeks or more. They are discharged once the care team and family meet to discuss the progress and prognosis of the patient. This meeting can include the Director of Nurses, therapists, social worker and family. Many times it is determined that returning back to their personal home or previous living arrangement is not a safe or viable option. The social worker/case manager will then recommend a reputable Assisted Living Community that has been operating in the area for several years and one that has a tenured staff.

SNF charges are often covered by Medicare for 20 to 100 days for those who require their services after at least three consecutive days of hospitalization. They are also licensed by the state and are subject to the laws

and regulations of that state. Not all SNF's offer the same services.

Some questions that you may want to ask in regards to selecting the appropriate Skilled Nursing Facility:

- Do they offer both short & long term stays?
- What types of insurance do they accept? Are they Private Pay?
- Do they offer services for those diagnosed with dementia or Alzheimer's and if so, are they house in a secure area?
- How many beds are in each area of care?
- What types of therapy/rehabilitation services do they offer?
- What is the average age of their patients?
- What is the ratio between staff and patients?

An **Assisted Living Community** (ALF) is currently considered the best option for seniors to "age in place." This type of community offers its residents a host of services to make use of as they age or their health and mobility decline over time. Residents have opportunities for planned social engagements, activities, transportation services for shopping, offsite entertainment and dining options, basic services such as all meals, laundry and linen service and housekeeping. They offer assistance when needed for activities of daily living, medication management and more. They usually have a physician on site, 24/7 medical staff and care givers as well as the coordination of services by outside health care providers (therapy, hospice, health aide)

Usually the family members are looking for a safe environment for their parent/loved one to move to where they won't have to move again (age in place). This is where an Assisted Living Community is often suggested because they have the medical staff and license to provide the necessary care while still promoting dignity and independence for as long as possible. When more care is needed, they are able to bring in the services needed as mentioned above.

Often seniors themselves will start their search for an Assisted


Living Community when they are still independent and not in need of any care. However, they know at some time in the future they may or will need that additional medical care/assistance and don't want to be trying to navigate the search then when they are in immediate need of care. The sooner the plans are in place for their forever home, the better. Many residents will live in their apartment for well over a decade. The more the apartment feels like their previous home the better for most folks. There are only a couple Assisted Living Communities in the Panhandle that offer the full apartment experience with their own kitchen, spacious living rooms and bedrooms. There is even a community nearby that offers private screened in patios so the residents can enjoy the lovely weather we have here.

Another option that you will want to look for in a community is its ability to care for seniors with cognitive/memory issues or those diagnosed with Alzheimer's. Unfortunately, residents

may develop memory issues and might no longer be safe in their own apartment in an ALF. When this situation arises, the Health and Wellness Director of that community will discuss with the family that the senior be moved to their "secure community" designed for those with memory issues. The best situation for this transfer is if the Assisted Living Community where they are currently at has an attached secured Memory Care Community to transfer them to. This would be in a separate building that has 24/7 security and monitoring, but yet still in the same complex. This way the resident and family members are simply just "moving down the hall" so to speak and the familiarity with the staff and processes remains intact.

Some questions that you might want to ask in regards to selecting the appropriate Assisted Living Community/Facility:

- How many apartments do you have at your community?
- How many different floorplans do you offer and what are their square footages?
- Do the apartments have full kitchens, private patios and or yards?

- What is your Basic Service Rate and what does that include?


• Who is the owner of the Community and how long have they been in operation?

Your Roof Age and Insurance Challenges!

"This can't be right!" Mark exclaimed. "Please tell me this is a joke."

"I wish I had better news for you," replied Anne. "The insurance market has gone through some significant changes over the past 12 months."

"But I don't understand. This house isn't that old and it's in great condition. Why would the premium be this high? Isn't there another carrier you can try?"

Anne sighed. She had been

doing that a lot lately. She didn't like giving unpleasant news to her customers. Finding the best rates and coverages was her

"Maybe I can shed light on why rates have gone up so much," Anne said.

Anne put on her instructor hat and shared with Mark the factors driving premiums up and what he could do about it. People all across the country dream of living in Florida, the Sunshine State. But as those who actually

live here know, hurricanes are a bit of a pain. Hurricanes Irma and Michael in particular, then Sally last year, caused severe and catastrophic damage to large swaths of the state, which translated to many millions paid out in claims

Whenever large disasters occur, carriers compile new data and make decisions on changes to underwriting guidelines going forward so they can remain solvent and profitable. The reinsurance companies do the same. Even the estimated \$50 billion in storm damage across Texas will impact insurance rates in our

One thing carriers discovered was that roofs, shingle, tile, and metal, didn't hold up as well as was calculated and anticipated. Based on the new data, almost every carrier revised their underwriting guidelines regarding roof age. Shingle roofs older than 10 years, and tile roofs and metal roofs older than 15 years are now ineligible for coverage on new business for the majority of admitted carriers.

Wind mitigation inspection report findings can often help offset some of the hikes by getting credits for recognized characteristics when they're available. For homes built in March 2002 and later, admitted carriers automatically apply several credits, but for older homes, or homes with newer roofs, a wind mitigation inspection report can often make a premium more af-

Wind mits (as they're referred to in the industry), look at six separate items regarding your

- Roof covering and age with roof permit for verification
- Roof deck attachment how close is the nail spacing and length of nails
- Roof to wall attachment hurricane clips, toenails, straps or bolts
- Roof geometry is the shape hip, gable, flat or combination
- Secondary water resistance yes or no to barrier installed before the roof material
- Hurricane opening protection - does it have shutters, impact glass or coverings and if so, what kind

Ideally, you would have all six credits. That would mean your roof is 2002 or newer (FBC



credit), the closest nail spacing/ length of nails, hurricane clips, hip roof style, secondary water resistance, and hurricane opening protection.

The house Mark had gotten a quote for was built in 1999 and still had the original tile roof. The inspector sent Anne a copy of the wind mit, and once she was able to apply two credits, the premium dropped down considerably, although it was still high compared to what it would have been a year ago.

Realtors' offices ask Anne to speak to their agents on occasion about the insurance industry, so she took notes for her upcoming talk to mention these same scenarios. She hoped to encourage her Realtor friends to educate their sellers and buyers so that the selling and buying process would go more smoothly. Making a new roof part of a purchase agreement negotiation could help seal the deal from an insurance standpoint.

If your home's roof is older and you're thinking of selling, you may want to get some estimates for roof replacement. If you're a buyer, keep in mind that the roof age will be a large factor in calculating your insurance premium.

Meet our Local Pro: Byron Beplay with Coastline K9

"The dog thing found me," said Byron Beplay of Coastline K9, a business that trains dogs and also provides world-class protection dogs for family and other needs. "But we're not your average protection dog company," says Byron. to 1797, we would witness John Adams become the 2nd U.S. President, the first ship of the U.S. Navy, the frigate USS United States being commissioned and the first washing machine being invented. Yes, the first washing machine, a simple tub and ridged board was used to wash clothes. Now, fast forward 224 years and some of you knew who our 2nd President was and some of you knew the date of our first commissioned Navy ship. I'm going out on a limb and guessing no one knew when the first washing machine was invented, but we all use one today and it has become an appliance used as often as several days a week or several times a month. So, what do washers and dryers have to do with energy savings? Washers and dryers are among the costliest appliances to operate, so it's worth taking steps to reduce energy use while using them.

Here are some things you can do to save in the laundry room and reduce wear and tear on clothes

Wash with cold water. Using cold water instead of hot can cut a load's energy use by

more than in half. Many detergents clean just as well in cold as they do in warm or hot. So save the hot water for your shower.

Wash full loads. Your washer will use about the same amount of energy no matter the size of the load, so fill it up.

Dry right-sized loads for your machine. If the dryer is too full, it will take longer for the clothes to dry. Loads that are too small can also take longer to dry, plus you spend more per item when running the dryer to only dry a few things.

Use dryer balls. Wool or rubber dryer balls will help separate your clothes and get more air to them, cutting drying time. The wool balls are said to absorb some moisture, further cutting drying time.

Switch loads while the dryer is warm. This allows you to use the remaining heat inside of the dryer for the next cycle.

Clean the lint filter on **the dryer.** The dryer will run more efficiently and safely. If you use dryer sheets, scrub the filter once a month with a toothbrush to remove film buildup that can reduce air circulation.

Use the high-speed or extended spin cycle in the washer. This will remove as much moisture as possible before drying, reducing your drying time and the wear on your clothes from the high heat of the dryer.

Use lower heat settings in the dryer. Even if the drying cycle is longer, you'll use less energy and be less likely to overdry your clothes.

Dry towels and heavier cottons separately from lighter-weight clothes. You'll spend less time drying the lighter-weight clothes.

Check with your utility company on time of use rates. Utility companies offer reduced kWh rates everyday called off peak times, almost by half. Check with your utility company when off peak hours are and use high demand appliances—washers and dryers, pool pumps, dishwashers and sprinkler pumpsduring those times, saving you

Off the Hook: Spring Fishing

Spring has officially arrived and so has Spring fishing season! While many fish bite year-round in our lucky fishing village, three of the most prominent this time of year are Triggerfish, Sheepshead and bull Redfish.

March 1st kicked off Triggerfish season, which many offshore anglers were excited for. In our area, Triggerfish are normally found nearshore and offshore, hanging around artificial reefs and natural bottoms, in depths between 50 to 300 feet. They

share the same habitat as Red Snapper and Gag Grouper. So, catching a Triggerfish is usually a sign that additional species are below as well.

Triggerfish are pretty aggressive feeders; a positive if you've set out to catch them specifically, but a con if you were trying to reach the Red Snapper or

Grouper they hang around with. Shrimp and any sort of cut bait will do the trick as they typically chase anything they perceive as being food, and a small hook is necessary due to the size of their mouth.

Next up are Sheepshead, which some fisherman refer to as convict fish for their striped pat-






tern. They've also been referred to as 'the fish with the human teeth' as if you've ever opened the mouth of a Sheepshead, they look like they stole a pair of sailor's dentures. They move nearshore during late winter/early Spring to spawn, and you can find them near structure like bridges, wrecks or rocks.

The other fish we like to chase in the Spring are the bull Redfish. Sight fishing these monsters is what most anglers prefer as you can find them schooled up nearshore on our beaches or inshore in our Bay, looking for food. Bull Reds can range from 25-40 lbs. and will put up a fight once you get them hooked.

Redfish are a beautiful fish, known for the spots on their tails. Their scales color with their surroundings, ranging from white to golden brown here on our coast. While schooled up, they're known to eat just about anything you put in front of them. Once hooked, they will run, and run, and then run some more, in the other direction. Let them run and tire out, before starting the pull back to your boat. Too much pressure could cause your line to break. So, remember: patience is key.

It's a heart racing, adrenaline pumping experience to feel a Bull Redfish on the end of your line, and one that is easy to get addicted to. If you've never caught one, Destin is the perfect place to start. A flat day on the water and the right gear will get you all hooked up and there is no better time than Spring.





Destin Football Club Grants 12 Youth Scholarships

Destin Football Club (Destin FC) has announced its partnership with the Boys and Girls Club of the Emerald Coast to fund 12 scholarships to support local youth soccer. The donation provides more than \$6,000 in club fees, soccer uniforms and gear to underprivileged youth on the Emerald Coast.

"Our mission is to give players from every socio-economic background a chance to experience a high level of play," says lead athletic director, Guillaume Joyeux, who helped spearhead the club's creation in 2019. "We have a duty to give this sport back to the people, invite more children into the culture of soccer and make playing fun again."

Destin FC has distinguished itself with its European club model, which focuses on technical development, local league play, and fostering a sense of community through soccer. This approach has been a welcome alternative to travel soccer clubs, who often focus on frequent and rigorous tournament play, which is both physically taxing for young players and an expensive commitment for many families.

"I think what we are doing is groundbreaking from the US perspective," says Destin FC president and parent, Vaughn Braeuninger. "We've opted for league play and friendlies instead of tournaments as a way to ensure children's bodies aren't overloaded."



How Is Your Blood Pressure?

know someone who does. Many people accept the fact that, because HBP runs in the family, they will either be diagnosed with it or weren't surprised when they were.

It has been said that heredity loads the gun, but it's our lifestyle that pulls the trigger. This isn't to say that we won't ever be diagnosed with HBP, but it does mean that taking care of ourselves can lessen the impact this common disease has on our health.

What is HBP? It is the pressure of the blood in the circulatory system, often measured for diagnosis since it is closely related to the force and rate of the heartbeat + the diameter + elasticity of the arterial walls. The Systolic (1st) number indicates how much pressure your blood is exerting against the arterial walls when the heart beats. The Diastolic (2nd) number indicates how much pressure your blood is exerting against the arterial walls while the heart is resting between beats.

More attention is given to the Systolic pressure as a major risk factor for those over age 50. This number rises due to an increasing stiffness of the large arteries, long term buildup of plaque and an increased incidence of cardiac and vascular disease. The blood pressure is determined by the amount of blood pumped by the heart and the diameter of arteries.

WebMd states that the exact causes are unknown, but things that can play a role are: smoking, excess weight, lack of physical activity, salt, alcohol (daily),

stress, age or genetics. The primary causes appear to be lifestyle, the environment and how the body ages.

Regulating blood pressure is a complex interplay of many factors stemming from the brain, heart, arteries and kidneys. There are also micronutrients that act on arterial smooth muscles, heart brain and kid-

Calcium and magnesium play a role in muscle contractions and relaxation. If the smooth muscle is relaxed the arteries will open, reducing resistance and normalizing blood pressure. This is just one simple

Here are 13 lifestyle choices that can help maintain a healthy blood pressure (My belief is, if I lead a healthy lifestyle and am diagnosed with HBP at 80 instead of 52, I've beaten the odds. Both of my parents had HBP from their 60s on. I'm in my 60s now and still have a healthy blood pressure. So, the choices I've made are paying

1. Lose weight.

- 2. Exercise regularly.
- 3. Choose healthy foods (read food labels, cut back on sugar).
 - 4. Reduce sodium intake.
 - 5. Limit alcohol.
 - 6. Quit smoking.
 - 7. Cut back on caffeine.
- 8. Reduce stress (change expectations, focus on issues you can control, take time to relax and do activities you enjoy, practice gratitude).
- 9. Monitor your blood pres-
- 10. Get support from family and friends.
- 11. Take a high-grade quality supplement.
 - 12. Get quality sleep.
- 13. Bonus: Eating two ounces of dark chocolate (65%+) a day can lower BP by 10%, practicing Tai Chi has been found to lower BP, and garlic has also been shown to lower BP.

Some patients and doctors ask us about testosterone and its effects on the heart. Many patients (and some doctors) are mistakenly under the impression that testosterone increases the risk of heart problems. This article will hopefully dispel these myths and explain how they came about.

There have been hundreds of studies looking at testosterone's effects on the heart and they are all reassuring. The Mayo Clinic has even reviewed every study to come up with recommendations based on the review of all studies involving testosterone. Their findings agree, testosterone is good for the heart.

Studies show low testosterone is associated with increased mortality from any cause. Low testosterone is associated with increased blood pressure, increased cholesterol, increased heart attacks, increased aggressiveness of prostate cancer, increased Alzheimer's, increased diabetes, and the list goes on.

As we increase testosterone, we can reduce death and disease across the board. So how did testosterone get a bad image. There are a couple reasons.

First, you need to know there are different types of testoster-

one. Testosterone shots are synthetic and because of this they react differently in the body from our natural testosterone. Think of your car. 87 octane, 93 octane and diesel are not the same and putting the wrong one in your car can cause major damage. This physiologic dose reduces the risk of disease across the board and makes patients feel fantastic. Testosterone helps with mood, concentration, libido, decreases depression, anxiety and pain and more. I find it crazy that people are afraid of it

increased risk of prostate cancer with T therapy." They also believe that testosterone therapy can improve "cardiometabolic disease, including diabetes"

Destin High School Reaches Major Milestone

New Location Will Open for the 2021-22 School Year

Destin High School (DHS) reached a major milestone. The \$4.6 million purchase contract with Grace Lutheran Church was officially closed with Greenwich Investment, LLC offering financing through municipal bonds. With the site now in the name of Destin High School, Inc., a 501-C-3 non-profit, DHS is slated for a 2021-22 school year opening to 9th, 10th and 11th graders in its first year.

After a long journey, the DHS Governing Board, comprised of members Prebble Ramswell, Denise Fountain, Myra Williams, Sarah Stone, Heidi LoCicero, Jim Luttrell, Dr. Mitch Silver, Al Gardner, and Drew Palmer have been persistently working over the past few years to bring the project to fruition and bring the community their own high school. The much-anticipated DHS, with a comfortable 350 student capacity in year one, will be a model for innovation providing unique educational opportunities for

both college-bound and vocationally-minded students living in Destin and along Florida's Emerald Coast. The application process is now in process.

DHS's Governing Board president, Prebble Ramswell. commented, "I can't thank the community, area businesses, our Governing Board and our new Head of School, Christine Cruickshank, enough for making the vision of opening Destin High School become a reality now. We had fully intended to open last summer, but because of COVID, everything was delayed. We diligently kept searching for the right site for the campus so we could deliver on our promise of providing a high school and welcome the trailblazing first class of DHS students. It feels so great to see the community's dreams come to fruition."

In addition to the site acquisition and financing, the board has also retained the services of DAG Architects. The local architectural firm, who has designed

schools across the state including Destin Middle School, is designing site plans for the retrofit, and set forth a strategic plan to accomplish the renovation in record time. Lord & Sons will be overseeing the construction/ renovation of the buildings and property.

DHS, a tuition-free public charter school, just held its first Informational Meet & Greets for potential students and their families. The event was a success and well attended. Head of School, Christine Cruickshank will continue to be on hand during the weekdays at the site from 2 to 6 p.m. to accept student applications and answer any questions. She will also be handling many other activities, including the hiring of faculty and staff.

Fundraising is a critical com-

ponent of opening the school. The start-up costs alone are \$400,000 at a minimum. Longterm, the more revenue raised, the less needed to be financed, thus putting additional revenue into student programming, opportunities, and options. Of course, when DHS is fully operational, as with all public educational institutions, the school will receive state and federal government funding.

Are Electric Vehicles in Your Investing Future?

So much is being written and said about electric vehicles. The new administration, investors, environmentalists, car enthusiasts and just about anyone has heard about them of has an opinion on them. What then is the current and future state of electric vehicles from cars to buses, to tractor trailers and even school buses? And what will be the impact on the various forms of energy consumption?

Electric vehicles (EVs) are not new. According to the U.S. Department of Energy, the first electric cars were introduced well over 100 years ago. Early on the likes of Thomas Edison and Henry Ford collaborated on ideas for electric cars as far back as 1914. Ironically, it was Henry Ford's mass production of gasoline powered vehicles that lead to the decline of EVs at the time. Gas powered vehicles proved to be less costly to produce, less costly to run and were more powerful and would go greater distances than EVs. The Energy Department went on to say that the early attraction of EVs was due to their being quieter, cleaner—however they were best suited for short distances. They were also two and half times more costly. It was not until Americans became more mobile that the demand for gas powered vehicles took on added growth. What then are the considerations for investors?

First, break down the components of EVs: There are electric passenger cars, light duty vehicles, and growing development of public transportation buses, school buses and freight vehicles like 18 wheelers. Investors see opportunities in the design, manufacture of all of these through the various companies in America and abroad. There is growing interest in public transportation buses and school buses, since they travel shorter distances on a given day and require less recharging of their batteries. This would also include the suppliers to these firms which include engines, batteries and drive trains. Interested investors can invest directly through these companies in the form of common stock or through several funds (mainly exchange traded funds).

Raymond James recently released its annual report on electric vehicle adoption. It includes a review of the EV industry as well as the potential impact it will have on the fossil fuel industry. That impact remains to be seen and, as of this writing energy stocks have rallied significantly from their 2020 lows. Reasons for this have been pointed out: 1) the economy is seen emerging from the effects of the pandemic, 2) inflation and the history of outperformance that energy stocks have typically enjoyed in times of price inflation 3) energy companies are investing at a rapid pace in to green or renewable energy.

The growth of EVs is going to have an impact on world oil consumption according to the Raymond James report. Today, electric vehicles sales make up 1% in the USA but are substantially higher in China (7%) and Europe (3%). In fact, the USA is a distant third to China and Europe in EV sales EVs on the roads. How significant might that impact be? According to Raymond James, it is having an impact today of approximately .6% of the world's daily oil demand, expressed in millions of barrels per day (BPD).

The world currently consumes about 100 million BPD which is up from about 90 million BPD ten years ago. Expressed in numbers, about 576,000 barrels per day less are being used by autos since those are electric. By 2025 that is expected to have an impact of 1.95 million BPD or about 2% of today's consumption. Where might this be in 2030? The EV leaders profess that it will be substantial. It really depends upon the growth of the EV market. Market share of sales ended 2020 at 6.9% of vehicle sales in December and 4% for the year worldwide. That is a year over year increase of 41%.



It also depends upon recharging infrastructure and battery life as







Choose your words carefully and use language that encourages and builds up instead of offends and tears down.


Take responsibility for what you say and do.

A Pastor's Ponderings: Tension and Prejudice?

"As the time approached for him to be taken up to heaven, Jesus resolutely set out for Jerusalem. And he sent messengers on ahead, who went into a Samaritan village to get things ready for him; but the people there did not welcome him, because he was heading for Jerusalem. When the disciples James and John saw this, they asked, "Lord, do you want us to call fire down from heaven to destroy them?" But Jesus turned and rebuked them, and they went to another village." Luke 9:51-56, NIV.

Jesus saw the disciples returning, chests puffed out and faces swollen with anger. Self-righteous indignation drove their steps. Turns out, the Samaritans were not receptive to Christ and they didn't want Jesus to spend the night in their area. Rejection always stings.

Christ and His disciples left the clamoring crowds in their native region Galilee. The Lord performed many miracles and fed the multitudes there. His popularity caused people to push and shove to be near Jesus. Now, He "resolutely" turns south toward those who oppose Him—the religious centers in Judea and Jerusalem. The transition in Christ's life would prove deadly.

On the way to the Holy City, the disciples encounter the obstinate Samaritans. This rejection was a warm-up for Jerusalem and the unfolding of God's plan.

Samaritans were the descen-

dants of the 10 Hebrew tribes who broke away from what we know as Judaism. They set up their own kingdom and religion. Over the years they intermarried with pagan peoples who diluted their faith further. As Jesus passes through, they are not interested in Him or his brand of religion.

The disciples, sent ahead to prepare accommodations, were denied service in Samaria. Practically, this meant that they would go without dinner and walk many more miles through the night before leaving Samaria. Stung by the Samaritan's racial and religious prejudice, the disciples want Jesus to call down fire from heaven to destroy them all. They are on the road with Christ, but not yet on the same page.

Jesus rebukes the disciple's angry response and moves on.

This passage shouts the question, "How do you react when treated badly?" The disciples

demand vengeance, but Christ pivots away. This rejection was preparation for the cross ahead. It was an opportunity to love the unlovable, and the disciples failed.

Every Christian will travel the road to the cross. This path leads to self-denial. Jesus said that every disciple must pick up their cross and follow Him. Along the way, we will experience rejection. Will we react with anger like the disciples, or will we simply turn and follow Christ?

God loves the rejectors and the angry disciples. Author Brennan Manning wrote, "God has a single relentless stance toward us: He loves us. He is the only God man has ever heard of who loves sinners." Romans 5:8 affirms, "...while we were yet sinners, Christ died for us." All of us.

Rejection challenges our character. So, the question now becomes, "Will you choose to

love people who reject or mistreat you?"

Jesus continues His mission, trudging through the night toward Jerusalem. The disciples follow, quiet as sheep.

How will you act in response to rejection? How will you respond to the bad behavior of others? Prejudice, racial tension, selfishness, rejection and all the unjust events of life are the proving grounds of love. This is the road to the cross. No cross, no crown.

2021 Sundance Film Festival Movies

and Where to See Them

The 2021 Sundance Film Festival was different from all other years. Instead of flying to the snow-covered mountains of Park City, Utah, as I have several times before, I was I able to stream 17 films during the six days it ran (Jan. 28-Feb. 2). I sat on my couch and enjoyed them as I ate popcorn, without anyone coughing on me or talking during the movie.

Below are three of those films (and a fourth I saw at another streaming film festival) and where you can watch them right now.

Judas and the Black Messiah (Shaka King, * * * *)

In 1968, when Bill O'Neal (LaKeith Stanfield) gets arrested for impersonating a federal officer and stealing a car, F.B.I. agent Roy Mitchell (Jesse Plemons) cuts him a deal: you can

face five years in prison or infiltrate the Chicago Black Panthers and get close to Chairman Fred Hampton (Daniel Kaluuya). O'Neal strikes the Judas bargain and chooses the latter. While Hampton's organization is feeding poverty-stricken school children and seeking the means for a new community hospital, Hoover's F.B.I. is carrying out his orders of white supremacy, while backed by corrupt state power. LaKeith Stanfield and Daniel Kaluuya undoubtedly will be nominated for their powder-keg performances. Judas and the Black Messiah resonates with great insight, not only into the systemic racism of the criminal justice system fifty years ago, but into our own system today.

plays Edee, a woman who has gone through an unspeakable trauma, of which she never wants to speak again. She throws her cell phone away and moves to an extremely remote mountain cabin in Alberta, Canada, to isolate herself from other people forever. At one point, as she is close to death, a hunter named Miguel (Demian Bichir) stumbles onto her and nurses her back to life. When she asks why he helped her, he responds, "Because you were in my path." This film is about how compassion and community are what help us to safely land.

The World to Come (Mona Fastvold, * * * ½)

A haunting period love story set in the bleak farming world of upstate NY in 1856. Abigail and Tallie first find solace in each other and then, a deep, meaningful love. But can a love like this abide in such a harsh, patriarchal world?

As they journey through the majestic countryside, they also navigate through Tusker's early-onset dementia. This film tenderly looks at universal themes like love, death and dignity. It is one of the best films I know for getting at the heart of early-onset dementia. If love is based on identity, what happens if the one you love is no longer there, replaced by a different person who looks like

make it happen. Skylar Capri did just that, and continues to.

When I asked Skylar where she wants to be and just what she expects to get out of this musical journey, she seems to have that pretty well laid out, too. Having made several trips to Nashville, and now writing and recording regularly in Music City, she is planning a full time move to Nash this summer, so that she can better collaborate with other creatives and further hone her craft as both a writer and performer. Though I'd say

In fact, that desire has already enabled her to bring others along on her intriguing journey. One such example is her friend, Keno Manwell, who she became friends with in highschool, and now does her music videos, co-creating alongside her vision, and providing his attention to detail filming and editing skills for Skylar's music video productions. There are others she talks about too, excitedly, in a way that you can just feel how much pleasure she gets out of helping other people get where they want to be, while also getting there herself.

In August of 2020, Skylar released her debut single, "Sway," that has now amassed more than 250,000 streams on Spotify alone, and recently was added to an internally created Spotify playlist with hundreds of thousands of subscribers. The video for the song is also moving toward 25,000 views on YouTube. Unfortunately, there's only so much room to talk about the music within the confounds of my word limit given here, but

I could go on and on about how impressive Skylar Capri is as a person, a creative force and a performer. I encourage you to dive into her work yourself, especially watching the videos for "Sway," and her breakup anthem, "Wax Lips." Skylar went on to talk about her new work releasing this spring, including the singles "Road Trip" and "Right About Us." So, be on the look for both of those, too.

They have also been key, along with the City Land Use Attorney, in development of ordinances to include regulating the heights of buildings in the City; and protecting the City's right of ways (ROW) with waterfronts – to preserve and enhance the City's unique waterfront and beach views.

In 2020 they processed a total of: 41 Major Plan Reviews (Development Orders); 2,932 Permits Issued; 1,977 Business Tax Receipts (Active); 4,482 Inspections Performed; Total Valuation of Permits and Projects: \$98,526,951.37

In 2021, the Community Development staff has two important initiatives. First, they will be implementing the automation of

the Community Development Project Review and Permitting Processes, which will help make development processes seamless and user friendly for the development community and residents. Second, the staff will be undertaking a complete update of the City's Land Development Code (LDC) – aimed at updating the City's development standards and requirements, so that they dovetail with the City's development vision in the Comprehensive Plan.

They are are also working hard to implement the City's strategic plan, updating the City's stormwater master plan and the undergrounding of the City's utility lines as well as overseeing the redesign of the Crosstown Connector from a 4-lane to a 2-lane roadway facility.

Code Compliance contin-

ues to strengthen our community outreach and gain voluntary compliance through education of all city ordinances. To provide for the safety, health, and welfare of our citizens, this department has increased staffing; and all are seeking to become dual certified Florida Code Officers and parking enforcement specialists. In 2020, Code Compliance responded to over 13,000 calls for service relating to land use, rental registrations, harbor and waterways, livery vessels, beach management and parking compliance to name a few. In addition to our harbor patrol, Code Compliance added a night shift officer during peak times. Overall, we are maintaining a 90% compliance rate.

The **Public Works Department** act as stewards and promotes the safety of our citizens and visitors though the ongoing maintenance and improvement of our critical infrastructure. Forecasted needed improvements over the next five years include building upgrades, parking improvements, road resurfacing, road restriping and works to fulfill the City's strategic goal of having a walkable and bike-able community by the additions of new and widened pathways.

This department also oversees studies to improve pedestrian safety and traffic flow and coordinate with the Adopt-A-Street program. Public works is instrumental in hurricane preparations and responsible for monitoring water quality.

Regardless of COVID, our **library** has found ways to serve our community. During the summer, the library initiated curbside service where staff curated grab bags of materials, specifically age tailored for patrons to pick-up, they created interactive and self-directed educational programs to help people while social distancing and provided virtual story time. Staff added new online resources such as the Encyclopedia Britannica to make information available 24/7. To improve library operations, staff submitted a grant application to the Institute for Museum and Library Services and was awarded over \$75,000 in funding to update the library's technology. Soon the Library will have kiosks that patrons can use to self-checkout books and Samsung tablets for faster service and to improve social distancing.

Parks and Recreation has been instrumental in providing new recreational components to enhance the City's brand and to maintain our beautiful parks. For many, exercise and being outdoors is a distraction from day-to-day isolation.

As we move forward with our priorities in 2021, we will contin-



ue our ambitious public beach initiative and launch our Compass System to improve customer service. As we see our vision into the future, we will focus on opportunities for a city center, the viability of a City marina and continue to support our amazing City staff. I want to recognize and thank TEAM DESTIN made up of our council, administration, staff, volunteers, and committee members for their dedication to making Destin a better place to live, work and play.

My heartfelt thanks go to our first responders. Whether on the road, on the sand or on the water, they truly are the lifeline for all of us in Destin. Every day they ensure Destin remains a place of peace and unity. They sacrifice weekends, holidays, and time away from their families to protect ours - and for that, I am forever grateful. Thank you to the Okaloosa County Sheriff's Office and the Destin Fire Control District for your partnership, for your friendship, and caring about the citizens we serve.

We have overcome major challenges, and it's all because of Team Destin. We've faced new challenges and overcome them with efficiency and excellence. Through perseverance, teamwork, fresh "out of the box" concepts and ideas, and new technology, Destin is continually striving forward and will be an organization that others will look to as an example.
