F-15EX Eagle II:

Unveiled and Ready for Testing at Eglin Air Force Base!

Recently, the name and the official role of the Air Force's newest fighter was unveiled at Eglin Air Force Base. Lt. Gen. Duke Richardson, Office of the Assistant Secretary of the Air Force for Acquisition, Technology, and Logistics military deputy, presented the F-15EX Eagle ll during an unveiling and naming ceremony on April 7 to celebrate the historic arrival of the dynamic new fighter aircraft.

"Undefeated in aerial combat, the F-15 Eagle epitomized air superiority in the minds of our enemies,

allies and the American people for over 45 years, but it was not meant to fly forever," says Lt. Gen. Richardson. "At an average age of more than 37 years, the F-15C/D fleet is fast approaching the end of its useful life and operating on the margins of structural integrity. The F-15EX provides a cost-effective and expedient solution to refresh the F-15C/D fleet and augment the F-15E fleet to meet National Defense Strategy capability and capacity requirements well into the 2040s, while preserving aircraft availability from significant impacts that service life extension and modernization programs would have on the F-15C/D fleet. We heard the demand signal from our warfighters. I'm pleased to say we've responded boldly and decisively, with a proven platform that's modernized and optimized to maintain air superiority now and into the future."

The U.S. Air Force officially accepted the first F-15EX from the Boeing Co. March 10 at the company's St. Louis facility. But the process began several years ago as a combined Air Force effort to bring the best in response capability. "It has taken a team effort to get to this point," says Col. Sean Dorey, F-15EX program manager with the Air Force

Life Cycle Management Center's Fighters and Advanced Aircraft Directorate, responsible for the acquisition, modernization and sustainment of the aircraft. "I'm extremely proud of the team, to include members of the Propulsion Directorate, Simulators Program Office, Air Combat Command, Air National Guard, Air Force Materiel Command, Defense Contract Management Agency, the Air Staff, and our industry partners for achieving this first milestone."

The EX provides a unique opportunity for the test enterprise as it is the first Air Force aircraft to be completely tested and fielded through combined developmental and operational test efforts. Its official role is to meet capacity requirements while bringing diverse technology ensuring the platform's relevance for decades to come. The 96th TW and the 53rd Wing are set to begin test and evaluation efforts. The 85th Test and Evaluation Squadron will work closely with the 40th Flight Test Squadron to integrate testing, from start to finish. "Team Eglin and the 96th Test Wing are proud to be a part of the rich history of this legendary aircraft," says Brig. Gen. Scott Cain, 96th Test Wing commander.

The new fighter is a two-seat aircraft—though operable by a single pilot-with fly-by-wire flight controls, digital cockpit displays, and advanced avionics systems, to include the Eagle Passive/Active Warning and Survivability System, an electronic warfare upgrade also being fielded on F-15E Strike Eagle models. The Air Force will procure up to 144 F-15EXs from Boeing, to replace F-15C/D models with a goal of increasing the F-15 fleet fighter readiness. "With its large weapons capacity, digital backbone, and open architecture, the F-15EX will be a key element of our tactical fighter fleet and complement 5th-generation assets. In addition, it's capable of carrying hypersonic weapons, giving it a niche role in future near-peer conflicts," says Col. Dorey.

The other six Lot 1 aircraft will be delivered to Eglin AFB in fiscal year 2023 and will undergo operational testing. To expedite the testing needed to declare the F-15EX ready for operations, the team will use previous testing data from F-15 foreign military sales variants and U.S.-only subsystems and Operational Flight Program software.

"Since 1985 the F-15 has had a home in the Guard and Guard Airmen have flown these amazing aircraft both in the defense of the homeland and in

every major international conflict since the first Gulf War in 1991," says Lt. Gen. Michael Loh, ANG director. "Now that is the battle-tested legacy of Guard F-15s – first to the fight, always ready and always there."

Lights Out, Stash the Trash.

It's Sea Turtle Nesting Season!

Life Media's own "Theo," Emerald Coast Turtle Watch and the Florida Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission (FWC) remind locals and visitors they can help protect nesting sea turtles by practicing some simple tips.

Each year, thousands of sea turtles nest on Florida's beaches. Florida beaches are the No. 1 place for sea turtle nests in North America from May to October. Northwest Florida beaches attract many endangered species including Green, Loggerhead, Leatherback and Kemps Ridley. A female will return to the beach where she was born to lay her eggs. "If you're lucky enough to see it, it's incredible to watch a 300-400 lb. Loggerhead sea turtle crawl up the beach which is no easy task, dig an 18-20-inch hole with only her back flippers, deposit her eggs, and then cover them back up with sand and pat it all down (all with only her back flippers)," says Sara Gray of Emerald Coast Turtle Watch. The whole process takes 30 to 60 minutes.

There are many hazards and further complications if a sea turtle hatches during the daytime. For example, a sea gulls' favorite snack is a baby sea turtle. The nest, also, is at risk of predation by animals as well as of high tides during storms, which can wash out and drown nests. Once hatched, they must make it to the water without becoming disoriented by artificial light or killed by predators. Finally, they arrive to their home in the Gulf where they are at risk of sharks, fish, fishing lines, ingesting debris and trash, boats and pollution. For the females who survive and return to shore to nest, it is a great victory. By the way, once she lays her eggs on the beach, the sea turtle mama never returns.

Because our state is so important to these special animals, beachgoers can help keep our beaches clean and dark, so sea turtles nest successfully. Everyone benefits from clean beaches and, since most of Florida's sea turtles nest at night, it is important to keep our beaches dark because bright lights can disorient nesting turtles.

Stash the trash! Obsta-

cles on the beach can prevent sea turtles from nesting as they crawl from the water, across the sand, to lay their eggs. They can also prevent sea turtle hatchlings from reaching the water once they emerge from their nests. Beachgoers can help sea turtles by properly disposing of all trash, filling in holes in the sand and putting away boats, beach toys and furniture. Fishing line can be deadly to sea turtles and other wildlife, so be sure to dispose of it properly. To find a monofilament recycling station near you, visit mrrp.myfwc.com.

Lights out! Bright lighting can misdirect and disturb nesting sea turtles and their hatchlings, leading them away from the ocean and toward potential danger. So, beachgoers should avoid using flashlights or cellphones on the beach at night. Anyone living along or visiting Florida beaches can do their part by turning out lights or closing curtains after dark to ensure nesting turtles are not disturbed as they come ashore and hatchlings will not become disoriented when they emerge from their nests. If lighting could still be visible from the beach, be sure it is long, low and shielded. And use turtle safe flashlights or flashlight covers when on the beach at night.

Fill in any holes you dig and smooth out sandcastles when you leave the beach each day.

"As beachgoers, we can all do our part to help sea turtles survive," said Dr. Robbin Trindell, who heads the FWC's sea turtle management program. "By keeping beaches dark and clearing the way at the end of the day, we can help ensure that these amazing animals keep returning to our beautiful state."

What's the most important thing to remember if you see a mama sea turtle on the beach? Sara says, "Be respectful, stay quiet and stay back at least 50 feet. Don't get excited or be loud or take pictures with the flash on your cell phone which disorient the turtles and stress them out. They return to the water unable to lay their eggs."





With Laurie at the helm,



ing State Director for Florida for Animal Wellness Action; Founding Board Member of The E.O. She has served as the Vice Chair for the Committee to Protect Greyhounds in Florida and the

Advisory Board for The Restore Act for Walton County.

Moving into a New Home? What Do You Do NOW?

You have just completed one of the biggest financial transactions of your life and can now call yourself a "homeowner." With the help of a realtor, like me, you purchased your first home, you've signed all the necessary paperwork and are about to walk up to your new front door, keys in hand.

As you walk through your new house, you are probably thinking, now what? This is a common question that new homeowners ask themselves when the time comes to settling into a new home. With all the excitement and work involved in finding a property, buyers might not have a transition plan or a

checklist for the first few days of ownership.

Some checklist items are as simple as steam cleaning the carpets and doing a deep clean while others involve familiarizing yourself with your home's circuit breakers and water valves, and some might include finding out about the homeowners' association rules. Having a game plan for your new property will give you peace of mind and allow you to settle in quickly and stress free. **Here's a few to focus on:**

Set-up service. This may not sound like a top priority, but it is important to contact local utilities and service providers to set-up a new account and avoid disruption. Use your home inspection. This is a great tool to use to plan future upgrades and improvements. Make a list of what items the inspector noted as needing attention or are close to


needing to be replaced i.e., roof, HVAC system, water heater, etc. For big ticket items, you can start your plan to be able to cover the

Benefits of a Customized Condo Unit Owners Policy

The current condo laws in Florida places fiduciary responsibilities on Unit Owners and Board Members. It is very important to understand the requirements and design your policy to maximize your condo insurance program protection whether used as your primary, secondary residence or rental. And make sure your packages include Hurricane/Wind coverages and flood insurance as well.

Because the association is responsible for maintaining and insuring the exterior of the building (shell), condo owners need coverage for the replacement cost of Structural Elements Within - from the paint in, including flooring, fixtures, cabinets, built-in appliances and more. This coverage amount is arrived at by calculating the cost per square foot to rebuild multiplied by the square footage of the unit. Sometimes the developer will provide this number and typically the range starts at \$60 per square foot, and depending on the quality of construction, that can go up significantly. Your condo policy should always include Special Coverage A. This is broader coverage, changing the policy from a named peril to an open peril policy.

Another important coverage to consider is Personal Property coverage which is replacement cost on furniture, accessories, clothing, appliances, electronics and other valuables, basically anything that's not attached. Replacement cost insurance is defined as the cost to replace and/or repair the building with materials of like kind and quality following a loss. If policyholders have replacement cost insurance, they may receive advance payments for the depreciated value for furniture, televisions, clothing and other household

Loss of Use/Loss of Rents is an important feature as well. Depending on the carrier, they may offer loss of use, but not loss of rent. If your unit is damaged and you can't use it for a period of time, you may be able to collect under loss of use if it's your primary or secondary residence. If you're losing out on rental income, check your policy to see if you have the Loss of Rents coverage. You should

always make sure you have the correct policy for the right risk.

Loss Assessment is another important coverage on condo policies that Florida law requires. Its purpose is to pay up to your loss assessment coverage amount (typically \$2,000) for an assessment levied by the association for covered losses to the common elements. An example of this coverage coming into play was when Hurricane Michael knocked down most of the fencing and damaged the roofs of an administration building and conference center that was covered under the master policy. Because these perils were covered under the association's policy, they had the option to assess each condo owner to help re-coup their out-of-pocket expense.

Flood coverage, which is typically a separate policy is also crucial. The unit owner should carry flood insurance even if their unit is not on the ground floor. Some condo associations purchase a master program through the National Flood Insurance Program called the RCBAP (residential condominium building association policy). This policy does cover many of the interior build-out items for a unit owner, but it does not cover the personal property. So, does the unit owner still need their

own condo flood policy? David Thompson with the FAIA (Florida Association of Insurance Agents) says this: "If there is no RCBAP in place the unit owner needs his own primary flood coverage. If the RCBAP has a large deductible and the unit owner sustained building damage, then their [flood] policy will respond. Should the unit owner be assessed by the association for a flood loss, the unit owner's policy will cover the loss assess-

ment up to their building limit with no deductible. This alone is a compelling reason for all condo unit owners to have their own building flood coverage."

Liability and Mold and Water Backup, which are also important coverages on condo policies, should be properly structured. And if you rent your unit, always consider excess of higher limits of liability protection. The bottom line is this - when it

ECWR Receives \$10,000 to Support Pelican Rehabilitation Center

Saltwater Restaurants, Inc. has donated \$10,000 to cover the rehabilitation costs for pelicans that have become injured or orphaned along the Destin-Fort Walton Beach area. The funds will assist with the treatment costs at Emerald Coast Wildlife Refuge (ECWR) where trained specialists work to help the pelicans heal with their injury and be returned back to their environment.

"Our refuge center treats



over 200 seabirds annually and the average cost for rehabilitation for one of these birds' can be up to \$75 a day for up to 14-days depending on their injuries and care. The support from Saltwater Restaurants will help fund the medications and professional veterinary attention needed specifically for our brown pelicans, which make up more than half of the seabirds brought to our center each year."

Modern threats to brown pelicans include oil spills and pollution, human disturbance of nesting colonies, entanglement in fishing gear, swallowing fishing hooks or debris. The partnership will include signage along local piers with a rescue hotline and helpful instructions for when people come across an injured or entangled seabird or animal.

The donation is a part of Saltwater Restaurant's ongo-

ing S.E.A. initiative that assists in programs that support beach conservation and welfare campaigns along the Emerald Coast. The restaurants include Surf Hut, Rockin Tacos, Floyd's Shrimp House, Al's Beach Club, and the three Crab Trap locations in Destin, Fort Walton Beach, and Perdido Key.

When an asset of any kind starts appreciating quickly, it gets a lot of people's attention. Such has been the case with crypto currency. Many refer to it as Bitcoin. Bitcoin, of course, is just one of several crypto currencies available, but it has nonetheless become the vernacular when someone is referring to it. There are other crypto currencies such as Ethereum, dogecoin and they continue to grow. We think investors and savers alike should take caution with regards to crypto currency as a store of value (an asset class) or as a transaction medium.

The total market value of just Bitcoin in the world is believed to be at or close to \$1 trillion dollars. As a basis of comparison, the market value

of all the gold in the world is believed to be at or close to about \$3 trillion dollars. What is it that is driving some investors to it? Is it demand, supply, the new currency, an inflation hedge? There is some validity to all of these.

First, let us look at Bitcoin as a (potential) addition to or replacement of the dollar. It is gaining more acceptance in trade and even Tesla has decided to accept Bitcoin as payment for a vehicle. One Bitcoin is worth about \$56,000 and that could help someone purchase a new electric vehicle from the automaker. There are a few important details that we have

Janet Yellen, the U.S. Treasury Secretary, as reported by CNBC in February sees it as "an extremely inefficient way to conduct monetary transactions." (Her comments also to the "legitimacy and stability" of cryptocurrencies.)

Currently, several major U.S. investment firms are moving forward with programs making the investment in crypto currency available to clients who meet



certain net worth minimums they set out.

How are crypto currency transactions taxed? Investors should consult with a tax advisor and they can also see the IRS guidance on Crypto taxation. Forbes also (in 2019) published information on how crypto currency is taxed. Forbes also, in its February/March issue has a feature on Crypto Currency.

Another consideration is the amount of power it consumes. Research from the International Energy Agency (IEA) among others is replete with data that point this out. Digiconomist.net estimates on its website that one Bitcoin transaction leaves the carbon footprint of more than 1 million Visa transactions, or 78,000 hours of watching You-Tube. It also estimates that the same transaction uses the equivalent of 34 days of electricity for the average U.S. household. Given this, it is hard to see that crypto currency is an efficient method of payment.

Some investors (more likely professional investors) see Bitcoin as a replacement of or in addition to precious metals (like gold) as a hedge against inflation. This past year central banks the world over released trillions of additional monies into the worldwide financial system. The more something is available as the saying goes, the less it is worth. In other words, that could mean price inflation (brought on by monetary poli-

What are other central banks in the world currently doing? CNBC reported recently that China is proceeding with a digital currency and with that, could that have implications for the strength of the U.S. dollar?

Inflation can erode purchasing power as well as eat into the return on an asset. While savings rates are near 0%, once inflation is factored in, is the saver or investor losing purchasing

Inflation fears continue to grow with so much stimulus having been released and with economic growth starting to emerge from the pandemic. If cryptocurrency is in limited supply, that in and of itself can also help drive the price. Cryptocurrency (wherever is comes from) must be mined online, with computing power. It is not easily created. That adds to the attraction and the speculation.

Reports are now emerging that many recipients of stimulus payments (as many as 40% as recently cited in a report from Mizuho Securities) intend to put at least a portion of their stimulus checks in to crypto or Bitcoin. Speculation is a driver of an asset's appreciation, because it creates momentum. Does this suggest that the appreciated asset has risen in value? The price of any asset is always determined by what someone is willing to pay for it.

The world of cryptocurrency, like any investment is subject to regulation little of which currently exists. It is difficult to determine at this point what that regulation might be and just how much of it is coming.

Investors are encouraged to work with their financial services firms to get the research and the insight they need to make informed decisions if they are considering venturing in the world of cryptocurrency. Knowing what you own, why you own,

how you own and where you on it are all critical elements of that discovery process.

Cryptocurrency issuers are not registered with the SEC, and the cryptocurrency marketplace is currently unregulated. Bitcoin and other cryptocurrencies are a very speculative investment and involves a high degree of risk. 

2021 Expected to Be Active Hurricane Season

Last year was a record-breaking hurricane season and forecasters are expecting another overactive season in 2021.

Colorado State University's Tropical Meteorology Project is predicting a total of 17 named storms, eight hurricanes and four major hurricanes Category 3 or above this season. This is above the 30-year average of 14 named storms, seven hurricanes and three major hurricanes according to NOAA. AccuWeather is predicting 16 to 20 named storms, seven to 10 hurricanes and three to five of which are Category 3 or even higher.

Off the Hook: 64th Annual Blessing of the Fleet

the Fleet brings out locals and tourists each year for a ceremony unlike any other on the Destin Harbor. It has become one that many locals and visitors look forward to attending this time of year, as we kick off our summer season.

The Blessing of the Fleet is an annual tradition honoring the men and women who utilize the resources of the sea as a means of survival. As a centuries-old ritual, these types of fleet blessings are common in ports in other countries.

Fleet blessings worldwide have long been established as a time of prayer and faith—a tradition where locals and churches come together to pray over each fleet vessel, the captains and crew members, and their families for safe passages, bountiful catches and prosperity.

Locally, on Ascension Day each year, local pastors gather behind Brotula's on the Harbor to bless commercial charter fishing boats, boat captains, crews and passengers for a safe and bountiful busy season. Many captains attribute the success of their season not to luck, but to these blessings—a tradition that has held for many years, even as Destin evolved from a small fishing community to the World's Luckiest Little Fishing Village it is today. The fleet has continued to grow and now the Destin Harbor is recognized as home to the largest fishing fleet, perhaps, in the country.

The Blessing of the Fleet began in May 1957 with about 20 boats and has since grown to some years over 150 boats. Numbers like this make it the largest Blessing of the Fleet in the country. Commercial boats line up in a parade like fashion and take turns stopping in front of the barge where Destin's pastors call them up by name to be blessed and prayed over. Any boat or captain that makes their living on the water is encouraged to participate, and will be welcomed. Here we are reminded of the significant role fishermen and their families, both past and present, have played in building and strengthening our Destin community.

Over the years, it's easy to see Destin's fleet has been prosperous and protected. It seems God continues to watch over and bless the fishermen of Destin's Harbor.

Ascension Day this year falls on May 13, 2021, and the "blessings" will begin at 4 p.m. on the docks behind Brotula's Restaurant with a Captains' Worship and Prayer Service. Following the service, local clergy will process to the dock to bless those vessels which have pre-registered.

A community fish fry will follow the Blessing around 5:30 p.m. at Brotulas. The public is encouraged to join in and support the local sponsors who make the Blessing of the Fleet possible, including Aerial Sea-

Trying to return to the game too soon can exacerbate an injury and leave the body vulnerable to other injuries.

Pain Management That Works

Pain affects different athletes in a variety of ways depending on the sport and the person. That said, there are a few tried and true methods that work for most athletes trying to recover from an injury or manage pain. These include:

• Infrared Sauna and Cryotherapy – Elasticity of temperature from 140 degrees to negative 140 degrees pulls inflammation.



- **Yoga** particularly for athletes who struggle with chronic pain in the neck or back.
- Massage and Physical Therapy increases muscle strength and ease of motion for acute and chronic injuries.

How to Prevent Injuries



How to Respect Your Emotions and the Emotions of Others

Do you find it complicated balancing your emotions while emotionally supporting others? Maybe you're struggling with infertility and a sibling just had a baby. Maybe you're grieving a heart-breaking loss/ending and a friend is celebrating a new beginning.

You want to be compassionate and caring toward those you love and, at the same time, you have your own, unique emotional experience to manage. This tension may leave you wondering: Is it okay for me to feel stressed about my problems when others' problems are so much bigger? Is it okay for me to be happy when someone else is so deeply sad? Is it okay for me to feel sad when someone else wishes I was celebrating with them?

While navigating emotions in community with others can feel very complicated, emotional connection to others is essential to your emotional health. So, how can you respect both your emotional experience and the emotional experience of others?

5 Ways to Respect Both Your Emotions and the **Emotions of Others:**

Remember all feelings are normal. You are human and every human has a range of small, medium and large feelings. Different people have different emotional responses to various circumstances. Being a compassionate person does not require you to sync your emotional responses to anyone else. You can feel happy, sad, angry, humiliated, disappointed, ashamed, exhausted, guilty, jealous, etc., and all of these are 100% normal even if someone around you is experiencing different feelings. You are normal. They are normal. No judgment necessary!

Remember feelings are not true or false. Feelings are biological messengers designed to draw attention to what's happening in your environment or in your thought life. You might hear a friend's great news as you're walking through pain and initially think, "I wish that was my news instead of theirs." Immediately guilt and shame follow as you judge yourself for feeling jealous. Instead of judging, remember jealousy is not telling you the truth that you are a terrible person, because you didn't immediately feel happy for your friends. Jealousy is drawing attention to your desire to see positivity in your life which is normal. Sit with your emotion without judging and you'll find you can be both happy for someone else and sad for yourself at the same time.

Give pain it's proper



space. Avoid comparing/ranking your suffering with that of others. "My problems aren't real problems, because we aren't living in poverty." All pain hurts. Your pain is valid even if it doesn't seem as catastrophic.

Be compassionate, not codependent. Compassion is when you care about what others are experiencing and come alongside them in their joy and pain in loving support. Compassion looks like a kind note, providing meals, listening, praying, feeling sad with a friend while also feeling freedom to celebrate the joys in your life. Codependency is when you take on someone else's emotions as if they are your own leading you to abandon your own feelings and responsibility for yourself. Codependency looks like "I'm not okay if you're not okay," feeling guilty for the good things in your life, hiding positive events in your life, because you're afraid it will make your friend feel bad, being preoccupied with the problems and feelings of others.

Validate the emotions of yourself and others. When people are in emotional pain, they don't want advice, a silver lining platitude or someone to fix it. Most people want to feel seen, heard and understood. They want to know they aren't crazy or alone. Instead of trying to solve pain, try saying to yourself and others, "You're normal for feeling how you feel. That's so painful. I see how you would be feeling hurt, sad, depressed, overwhelmed..." Validate, then remember there is no quick fix to emotional pain. It comes and goes in life. It won't last at a high intensity forever. Being present is much more helpful than adopting someone else's emotions.

Feelings are normal and healthy. Having your own feelings that are separate and distinct from the feelings of others is normal and healthy. Be patient with yourself as you take steps to honor your emotions while also showing up emotionally for your loved ones. Are You Convinced Your Marketing Strategy Is the One to Bet On?

More than 50% of marketers agree that inbound marketing gives them more return on investment (ROI) than outbound marketing. Yet, 60% of polled respondents indicate that billboards (a mainstay of outbound marketing) are an excellent way for them to learn about brands. Such statistics have led to marketers wondering what the right mix is for inbound and outbound marketing strategies. Here is a look at both strategies to help you navigate the inbound vs. outbound marketing question profitably.

What is Inbound Marketing?

Inbound marketing refers to the kind of digital marketing strategy that relies on quality content you create to draw customers to your business. In es-



sence, inbound marketing (also known as content marketing) plays on your aligning your content with what the customer desires. As a result, your target audience comes across the content that seems just right for their needs, naturally drawing them to your business. When you turn to inbound marketing, you recognize that it's not enough to only sell. You need to continue delivering solutions and value to your customers after they buy from you. That way, you can ensure the long-term benefits of building a relationship through content marketing.

What is Outbound Marketing?

Outbound marketing, on the other hand, is the more traditional form of marketing that relays your messaging to customers at large. With outbound marketing, you talk about your brand, product or service, leveraging a large swatch of the audience. You rely on mass marketing tools to help you reach as many people as possible. It is from this large number that you will attract people interested in what you have to offer.

Inbound vs. Outbound Marketing

By their very nature, inbound and outbound marketing differ, even though they both drive your sales. It is that difference that can help you understand which strategy can best work for your business before settling on which to deploy:

Outbound marketing utilizes many mediums from which to choose when reaching a target audience—some of these include radio, television (TV), sponsorships, print, billboards and direct mail. Here you begin by determining which mediums best work for your target audience. Once you rate each medium with the potential impact it can deliver, you then roll out your strategy while ticking each box. That helps you to distribute your funding from most to least effective. When done, or even ongoing, you can assess the performance data for each medium and shift your funding accordingly.

Outbound marketing develops material that attracts at any cost, but you can't entirely confirm if the message you are sending out will resonate with the audience or not. With inbound marketing, you focus on meeting the customer where they are. Since the messaging in inbound marketing campaigns is personalized to meet the audience's needs, it stands a higher

chance of resonating with them. Thus, you gain a higher level of control over the relationship with them.

Outbound marketing relies on mass marketing media; in stark contrast, inbound marketing gives you ways to distribute your messaging that can deliver compounding benefits.

In your marketing strategy, it's the metrics that tell you how close or far you are from hitting your target. With outbound marketing, you're bound to make some assumptions. In comparison, with inbound marketing, you have more ways to track your progress as well as connect with customers who are already into what you have to

An outbound marketing strategy focuses on leveraging a medium that has a large following to deliver the messaging—once you study your demographics and plan things out carefully, you can attract a portion of the masses. Inbound, content-driven marketing is permission-based; that is, a customer discovers your content organically and chooses to find your site and learn more. As you communicate through the medium that a customer has pro-

vided you permission to, there is a more significant chance of them converting.

Outbound marketing aims to reach everyone. Inbound marketing flows towards leads interested in what is on offer. Once you tailor-make the content to speak to your persona's need, you then disseminate it to the world. It is the audience that searches for and comes upon the information you put out. As a result, leads end up chasing you.

Outbound marketing seeks to be indiscriminate in the audience—your ads reaching the target audience at any time. Therefore, in certain circumstances outbound marketing can create a need that a client did not know existed. Inbound marketing focuses only on those who have shown an interest in the subject at hand.

Inbound vs. Outbound Marketing: Which Way to

You are only as good as your last marketing campaign results. In the quest for success, it is essential to weigh the inbound vs outbound marketing question in light of your objectives to find out which approach can best give you the ROI you crave.

Business is no different—what has our attention is where our energy and focus will go.





I hadn't spoken with my father for some time. I had no intention of calling him, so I was certainly surprised when he called me. I answered the phone, ready to receive his judgment, but it never came. Instead, my father came to my rescue. He paid for it all, but I had to come home, to him.

Had the roles suddenly changed? Or had I been seeing it wrong all these years? Was this man I saw as judge and executioner actually a father that longed for his child? Maybe it was the shock or maybe it was something else, a quiet voice inside me leading me to my father. That Spring, I found myself setting up my bedroom in his

What Ever Happened to Touch?





Covid 19 has changed so much of our world and how it functions. But, one of the most devastating changes has been how it has so drastically impacted human-to-human interaction.

It seems that face-to-face interaction, close connection and contact had already started to diminish even before Covid. So, many people were already using smart devices, emails or social media to communicate, rather than face-to-face interaction.

From a warm handshake, to a loving hug, to a congratulatory pat on the back, people have developed a variety of means of communication and emotional expression through physical contact. But, in this tech-saturated world, appropriate, non-sexual touch is in danger of becoming rare. Despite some of the benefits of technology, it is vital to preserve human touch for people to be able to truly thrive.

There have been many studies done on the importance of human touch. The science of touch and how it affects people began to gather more interest in the mid-1990s, when two scientists traveled to Romania to examine the sensory depriva-



tion of children in understaffed orphanages. These touch-deprived children had much lower cortisol and lower growth development levels compared to other children in their age group. Many other studies have found a correlation between touch and healthy development as well as the ability to fight diseases.

Tiffany Field, head of the Touch Research Institute at the University of Miami's Miller School of Medicine, has studied touch for over four decades. When asked what has been the most surprising findings from her research, she said, "We found that massage actually increases natural killer cells. Natural killer cells are the front lines of the immune system. They kill viral cells and bacteria cells."

When researching for this article, I found another study that was done to test the positive effects of hugging. A cold germ was injected into a study group and those who had more hugs had a better immune response to the cold virus than those who were isolated.

From the time we are in the womb through our elderly years, appropriate touch plays a very important role in our development as well as our physical and mental well-being.

This last year, people have been continuously warned against close contact and touch. Social distancing has become a common word. People have been isolated and indoctrinated with fear of contact. We've been told that we must wear a mask; that we must stay six feet apart. Hardly anyone greets with a hand shake or hug any more. I am a hugger and I really miss it. I am sorry, but fist bumps or elbow bumps just don't work the same for me!

There are a large number of people in our society that live alone. This last year of isolation has kept them from much of their normal means of interaction. People were not created to live in isolation. At the very beginning of God's Word in Genesis 2:18, we read, "The Lord God said, 'It is not good that man should be alone." Medical

News Today reported on the results of a study associating lack of human contact or living alone as a contributing factor to mood disorders, anxiety and depression.

If appropriate touch is so important to both a person's physical and mental well-being, then what will be the long-term effects of this new norm of social distancing? We already see many people experiencing depression, mental health issues and increased suicides among all ages. I believe, if all of the research on the importance of touch is accurate, then we will see more physical repercussions from this period of social distancing also. In fact, could we have prolonged the period of physical recovery and immunity by the mandate of social distancing and isolation?

I in no way want to advocate behavior that is unwise or unsafe, nor do I mean to treat lightly or demean the real fear and devastating effects of this virus. However, I believe we need to start thinking more about how we can begin to interact with others again in such a way that incorporates the important element of touch. We need to reach out to the elderly, to the lonely and to the isolated and make sure they are safely experiencing the love and interaction needed with others.

Be Aware:

Be aware of your fears concerning close contact with others

Think about how you are interacting with others after this year of isolation.

Understand your own, as well as others', need for human contact.

Be alert for those who might need help with depression or fear.

Be Intentional:

Make sure those in your family are feeling loved and cared for.

Find ways to start having more contact with others.

If you feel safe, start giving more hugs.

Get out more, interact more and show more appropriate affection.

Let faith replace fear and interaction replace isolation!

"She's the most beautiful girl in the world with the prettiest voice I've ever heard," mused my seven-year-old boy brain as Mom sat at the piano singing 'What a Friend We have in Jesus."

Tragic events, two failed marriages, and alcohol battered Mom's life, but I never lost that boyhood wonder of my mother. Such a mysterious creature—so loving and nurturing yet possessing words that could cut you to shreds in moments. I remember her with sentimental awe

mingled with a tinge of fear.

The Bible describes the first mother, "Adam named his wife Eve, because she would become the mother of all the living," -Genesis 3:20, NIV. Eve's name means "life-giver, to breathe, to live or to give life." Every mother since Eve has served as the epicenter of a life-giving cycle.

Cause now I'm talking to Jesus She got me talking to Jesus.

It is godly to honor your mother. Showing gratitude is good for her and for you. When the doctors called to inform us mother had only hours left to live, my brother, sister and I rushed to her side. She improved

immediately as she basked in our attention. Ultimately, she lingered for over a week before she went to be with Jesus. We shared our favorite memories mingled with funny stories that you just can't make up.

From the foundation of our lives, Mom was the source of our character, pains and joys. She holds a central place in our lives and in our hearts. Happy Mother's Day.



 - Take your keys with you.
- Remove (Hide) valuables or place them in the trunk of your auto- mobile.
- Remove "pull-out" style radio face plates (if equipped.)
- Park in well-lit areas when
- Park where your car will be easily & frequently viewed.
- Park in your garage if you have one.
- Use a car alarm, it will alert anyone nearby.
