
The 26th Annual Festival of the Arts **Serves Our Community**

Mattie May Kelly (1912-1992), a member of one of Destin's pioneer families, wanted to leave a legacy. So, a handful of visionaries established a new non-profit in 1995 in her honor, the Mattie Kelly Arts Foundation (MKAF), to provide resources for the promotion of the Arts in Okaloosa and Walton Counties through cultural events and educational opportunities. Mattie Kelly had bequeathed a 52-acre parcel of property reserved for the future development of a cultural and educational facility for the residents and visitors of the community which now features the Cultural Arts Village on a portion of the land. Annual Concerts in the Village are held here as well as the upcoming 26th Annual Festival of the Arts, the largest juried fine art festival in our area!

Known as one of Northwest Florida's premier fine

arts shows and one of the most anticipated cultural events of the year, the MKAF Festival of the Arts is happening Oct. 30-31 at the Cultural Arts Village in Destin. "The festival is a celebration of the wonder of arts and culture," says Deb Nissley, MKAF Director of Operations and Festival Producer. "We will feature new surprises this year including free entrance to all festival-goers! I encourage everyone to stop by to enjoy beautiful art, live music and great food!"

During the festival, more than 100 artists convene each year from throughout the U.S., who offer up their original artwork in the form of oil, watercolor, acrylic and glass paintings; photography, sculpture, pottery, wood, paper, fiber, mosaics, mixed media, jewelry designs and more. They compete for \$10,000

in cash prizes in 29 award categories, including the coveted "Best in Show" and "People's Choice Award" which is selected by festival fans. The festival will also feature a Collaborative Art Exhibit, which showcases select artwork of more than 60 community adult and student artists.

Hosting the annual festival is one of the most significant ways MKAF is able to continue its commitment to provide inclusive arts education programs for children and adults of diverse abilities and backgrounds. These include an array of high-quality visual and performing arts programs such as Arts for All Abilities, Arts Empower and Warrior Arts. Arts for All Abilities is a

program committed to helping people with disabilities learn a variety of art programs. Arts Empower, led by accomplished artists, serves K-12 students, at-risk youth, and children and adults with special needs. Warrior Arts seeks to offer therapeutic art classes for veterans/active duty military in order to heal both visible and invisible injuries. Warrior Arts' signature program

is the Zentangle, an open-ended drawing activity that increases focus and creativity, while alleviating stress and anxiety. MKAF's outreach program has been recognized by The Florida Department of Education with the Award of Distinction.

MKAF also offers a comprehensive model of artist residences, hands-on workshops and public education events featuring music, theatre and the visual arts. Programs are offered free of charge to participants made possible by grants, private and corporate gifts; and supported by MKAF event fundraising. For signature events, a portion of profits from Concerts in the Village and Festival of the Arts help to fund these community outreach initiatives.

Now in its 26th year, MKAF bridges the gap to those who either lack access to the arts or could uniquely benefit from the experience. Since 1995, these outreach programs have inspired more than 337,800 children and adults in over 75 schools and partner agencies in Okaloosa and Walton counties.

October 11, Ringing of the Bell on October 16 and Halloween on the Harbor on October 31.


The weigh-ins happen on the docks behind AJ's Seafood and Oyster bar located on the Destin Harbor and this year's Miss Des-



tin, Kaylie Sparks, is right there alongside long-time weigh-master Bruce Cheves. They are free to the public and are open daily from 10 a.m.-7 p.m. To participate, charter boats and private boats must be registered at least 24 hours prior to weighing in a fish. There is no fee for anglers fishing on a registered vessel (pri-

vate or charter) and shore fishermen can participate by simply bringing their catch to the scales. You can fish by kayak, paddle board, pier, bridge, jetty, shoreline and surf — whichever you prefer. When a shark or a big grouper or tuna is on the scale,

Our Hometown Hero: Destin's American Legion!

More than a century ago, men coming home from a declared war joined their neighborhood American Legion Post. It was a place to tell war stories and find camaraderie.

Times have changed, but the mission hasn't. The non-profit American Legion exists to help veterans in need as well as people in the community—its motto: Veterans Strengthening America.

A local landmark, and perhaps hidden treasure, Destin's Davis-Sikes American Legion Post 296 brings this same spirit to our piece of paradise. Chartered in 1955, Post 296 was named after two of our fallen World War II American Heroes-Elborn M. Davis and Rolen C. Sikes. Elborn M. Davis was born on September 4, 1912, in Point Washington and was killed in action on July 17, 1944, at the invasion of Normandy, France. Rolen C. Sikes Jr., a Purple Heart and Bronze Star recipient, was born in 1959 in Destin. He was listed as killed in action on June 11, 1944, at the Invasion of Normandy.

Post 296 has a membership of more than 200s. "Service is our mission," says Corlene Ziegler, the Post's Commander and a Marine Corps veteran. "We're here to serve our veterans, military and families in several ways." For example, our Legion sponsors Boys and Girls State (where high school juniors learn how our form of government works) and Blood Drives.

Recently, the Destin Post's ballroom was upgraded aesthetically and is available to rent for parties of all kinds. "Walls have been repainted with two tones gray and bright white trim in the ballroom," says Commander Ziegler. "There's a big screen TV, private entrance, parking and two bathrooms. The rentals help us achieve our goals of providing service."

Recent ballroom rentals have included a 50th anniversary party, several quinceaneras, birthdays, retirement, family reunions and other celebrations. Numerous memorial services



for veterans and family members happen frequently. "You can bring your own caterer and food," says Commander Ziegler. "No outside alcohol is allowed, but you can hire a bartender." Member and non-member pricing are very affordable at \$450 for four hours."

Commander Ziegler invites the community to participate in the Legion's events also. One of the most cherished is the Wreaths Across America ceremony where wreaths are placed at every veteran's grave in the Destin Memorial cemetery. This year slated for Dec. 18 at 1 p.m., "If you have a veteran you'd like

to have recognized, contact me or the Post," she says. Additional upcoming events include a Chili Cook Off, Oct. 17 and Breakfast with Santa Dec. 25.

And there's always fun and camaraderie to be had with ongoing activities held weekly:

Monday is Bingo night; Friday is Karoake night. On Saturdays, there's five TVs for college Game Day

watching and Sunday's Pro Ball in the Lounge, noon to 7 p.m. There's Sunday Breakfast from 8:15-11 a.m. "One of our Sunday chefs, Ray Castro, is an Army veteran and my grandson helps with the dishes; his daughter is a server," says Commander Ziegler. In fact, several of the employees' children work at the Legion. "We hope this will teach them to serve and give." The Destin Post also "properly retires flags to the cleansing flames" four times per year.

Commander Ziegler wants the Destin post to increase its reach in the community, especially to the youth. "You don't have to be a member to participate in karaoke, steak night or other activities," she says. "All of the Post's happenings are open to the public. We also hope that community service and veterans helping veterans will appeal to younger people, too. We hope to expose them to American ideals...help them get to know the ones that paved the way for what we have today, have fun and hear the stories. It's time to teach the next generation."

Nationally, the American Legion has nearly two million members in roughly 12,000 Posts. There are many member benefits for \$40 per year. Please consider joining. "If you become a member now when you don't need us, we'll be here when you do," says Commander Ziegler. "If it dies out with this generation, then the next generation doesn't have it. We invite you to visit and enjoy all the features and events in a friendly and patriotic atmosphere," she says.

FREE Flashlights to Help Protect Sea Turtles

From the City of Destin

To help with education and awareness during turtle nesting season (May 1st to October 31st), the City of Destin is giving out FREE turtle-friendly flashlights. Use these flashlights when you look for ghost crabs or go for a stroll on the beach at night. The red light helps keep sea turtles from becoming disoriented when they come ashore to lay their eggs.

A couple of years ago, the city embarked on a "beach experience" survey. The research showed that one of the things that people were very passionate about is the education on sea turtles and using the right type of flashlight. There are a lot of people who use their cell phone or a bright white flashlight while walking the beach at night. "We came up with the idea of promoting our Leave No Trace campaign, but also promoting the right type of colored flashlight that you're supposed to be using on the beaches at night," said Catherine Card, Public Information Manager, City of Destin.

The city is sponsoring this initiative and has ordered over 500 flashlights with more to come. The Destin Chamber of Commerce, Destin History & Fishing Museum, Emerald Coast Science Center, Henderson Beach State Park and the Gulfarium Marine Adventure Park are all partnering with the city and will have flashlights available to the public along with Destin City Hall.

This effort combines two important initiatives for the city: Leave No Trace and the education of our sea turtles. Catherine stated, "This is another element of our Leave No Trace initiative. We want to be good stewards and we want to protect our natural resources as well as protect our other beach patrons, our sea turtles."





Inspect What You Expect.

Home Inspections—Buyer or a Seller?

Home inspections are one of the privileges that a home buyer has when purchasing a home and are initiated once you have a contract in place. There are two purposes to have them done: one is to let you know what you are buying and the second is to find out if there are any issues that need to be addressed before you close and take possession of the home. There are many types of inspections. The two most common when purchasing a

home are a Property Inspection and a WDO inspection:

Property inspection – the inspector conducts a thorough review of the home's most important components i.e., structure, HVAC, plumbing, roof, electrical system. If they find any issues, they will point them out or recommend that a licensed professional do further investigation. They can also do a wind mitigation report which gives more detail about how the roof was installed and constructed; consequently, the wind mitigation report may result in some homeowner's insurance benefits. My recommendation: DO NOT WAIVE THE PROPERTY INSPECTION. even if the home is newly built. Keep in mind that if you're buying a "used" home, the inspector will most likely find items that are not up to today's building codes. That's normal. Also, know every item on the inspection report does not always contractually need to be repaired or replaced.

WDO Inspection – Wood working order, etc. Destroying Organisms, i.e., termites. We want your home to be pest free (and if financing, so does your lender!).

Mold inspection – Checks for water intrusion and mold. Particularly important if there's been water intrusion, if mold remediation has taken place, if there are cracks in stucco, if something came up in the property inspection that warrants further investigation, etc.

Septic inspection – Sometimes buyers get a septic system inspection, sometimes not. It's recommended if the property has a system that's older and hasn't been inspected in several years, and/or if there's a problem flushing commodes or running water.

Foundation inspection definitely recommended if you or the property inspector suspects an issue with the founda-

Pool inspection – To make sure there's no evidence of leaks, if all the equipment is in

Why should Sellers get an inspection done? Sellers often lose out, because things could have been prevented that either delayed or jeopardized the sale of their home. So, I recommend that you get a Property Inspection to mitigate what you can as early as you can in the sales process. If you have a home that you are putting on the market for sale, then get an inspection done beforehand. First, it allows you to know up front what needs to be repaired or replaced. Second, if you're handy, you just might be able to fix some of the items yourself which can save you money. Once you go under contract, anything that needs to be repaired/replaced by you now, contractually, has to be completed by a "licensed professional" (electrician, plumber,

Besides the list above, there are other inspections you can have done and the inspections you should consider having done all depend on the house





Once sprouted, the gardener works to protect this new life. We fight off the bugs, pull competing weeds, water and make sure there are plenty of nutrients to make these little seedlings healthy. When everything works, the seedlings mature and you harvest something wonderful. There is nothing better than a home grown tomato!

I try to spend a little part of every day in our community garden. It has become part of my routine and makes me feel grounded. I'm not saying I work in the garden every day. I don't. September and October Have Historically Been the Most Volatile for the Stock Market

We often get the question or the comment regarding a market correction or worse, a bear market. We also take note that, historically, many corrections have been made in September and October. Why that is so is the subject of speculation. Most folks are focused on now vs. the past of course and with the market having rallied for over a year now and multiples at historical highs, people are beginning to wonder.

While market corrections can happen at any time, we would even suggest that by the end of the day this article is being written, a correction could take place. Investors, understandably so, want to know if a market selloff is about to happen. The problem, at least in our experience, is that they don't ring a bell at the top, signaling people to get out and they don't ring a bell at the bottom signaling for people to get back in.

We feel investors should pay close attention to key drivers in asset valuations:

First, The Federal Reserve balance sheet. It has more than doubled in the past year and a half and is up tenfold since 2008. The current amount is \$8.357 trillion as of September 8th (see federalreserve.gov/ monetarypolicy).

The Fed's balance sheet is made up on the asset side of Treasuries and mortgage type securities that it has purchased on the open market. The more The Fed buys, the more money or monetary stimulus, is released into the U.S. financial system. Where does The Fed get the funds for those purchases? Typically, it is through creating or "printing" more money. There are several factors that drive

asset prices, and we feel that in this environment, the key driver is the growth of the balance sheet. So, as investors' worry grows over market corrections, keeping an eye on the balance sheet is a good indication of the amount of liquidity that exists in the financial system. The greater the liquidity, the greater the support for asset prices. If liquidity is withdrawn (through tapering as an example) that, in theory, means less stimulus and potentially less liquidity. That might mean asset prices could become more volatile.

Second is the yields on the benchmark U.S. Treasury as another significant factor that drives markets and or adds to or lessens volatility. We suggest that our clients pay most attention to the yield on the 10-year U.S. Treasury bond. Why? That is what most professional investors and market followers focus on. The yield right now is approximately 1.35%. Note the yield on the S&P 500 is very close to that. So, if the yield climbs significantly, we think (from what we have researched and concluded) to approximately double the yield of the S&P 500, that in and of itself would be a trigger or drag on stock prices.

Third, we continue to be wary of bonds and the implications yields can have on them and potentially the stock market. Should clients desire to invest in that area, we express caution as we feel that climbing yields (because of inflation, an increase in the supply of Treasuries for sale as examples) would continue to put pressure on investment grade bond prices. Inflation's most recent reading is 5.3% year over year (it was 5.4% when reported last month). We would suggest investors consider high yield bonds or floating rate bonds in an economic environment such as this. While those carry greater quality risk, they might fare better than their investment grade counterparts.

Finally, and always, at The First Wealth Management, we encourage our clients to 1) concentrate to accumulate and then diversify to preserve 2) to monitor and make changes to their strategies over time vs overnight 3) consider the impacts that tax-



es can have on their savings and investments.

When I conduct insulation inspections in attics, I normally come out with sweat on my forehead and sometimes, depending

on the inspection and time of year, I am completely drenched. This is normal and we all sweat to keep our bodies cool. When our home sweats, that's normally an indication of a problem.

homeowners about sweating vents and equipment is common at ECES. There can be many factors which cause condensation in the home; ultimately it is the dew point in the home and our attics. Dew point defines the point at which air will become saturated and condense. Simply, the air can't hold any more moisture and creates dew. So, why do I have moisture on my vents? Ductwork is a system or network of ducts which bring cool air to the different rooms and living areas of our homes. When heating and cooling companies install the air ducts in a home, the contractors are working with many separate pieces. While the workers strive to con-

nect each piece as tightly and

securely as possible, leaks and

gaps in the ducts might still oc-

cur. This can happen in new and

older homes. When these gaps

and leaks occur, the conditioned

Receiving calls from concerned

air leaks out into our attics. A typical home can experience close to 20% of conditioned air loss from leaking ducts. If the leaks are big enough, even more loss can occur costing you money and comfort. One common problem when ducts and vents are not sealed properly is condensation or sweating. These tiny drops build up around and on the vents causing issues, like mold.

Another problem we come across is cracked seals and loose boots. Maybe you had a security system installed or needed cable ran into a room which wasn't wired. Most of the time you need a technician to go in the attic and navigate in a hot, hard to walk around, dark area while performing these services. Ductwork tends to run in the same places these wires need to be ran and sometimes ductwork is used as railing or support by the technician so they don't end up putting their foot through the ceiling. Putting pressure on ductwork can cause loose boots around vents and cracked seams. These are less common, but do happen and unfortunately are unseen because they happen in the attic. More common is that over time, our seams,

connectors, tape and vent boxes fail over time due to the harsh environment they are in. Failing tape is most common. The duct tape, which was used, becomes brittle and can no longer keep a tight seal. Good news is that repairing these leaks is a simple one. Foil tape, expandable foam and mastic (which are a type of paste applied to seams when foil tape can't seal) is used to reseal these leaks keeping the conditioned air flowing for years to come. We tend to forget how important these systems really are and how important it is to maintain them. It is always a great idea to schedule an inspection and improve the efficiency of our largest investment, our homes

Catch The Health Benefits Eating Gulf of Mexico Fish

In light of the Destin Fishing Rodeo season, here's great news for our area about the health benefits of our Gulf fish! So, we've all read or heard that fish is healthy for you. But cold water fish such as salmon make the healthy headlines. It's primarily because of their scientifically known Omega-3 fatty acid profile. But good news for us Gulf Coast residents... warm water fish in the Gulf of Mexico has high Omega- 3s also. Omega-3 and Omega-6 fatty acids are essential to good health. Essential means that our bodies don't produce it so therefore, we must get it through our diet. They are essential for normal growth and development of every aspect of human health. These fatty acids are similar in structure, but their functions are very different.

Americans typically consume

up to 20 times more Omega-6 then they do Omega-3. This causes an imbalance in our bodies which are linked to a long list of diseases including atherosclerosis, rheumatoid arthritis, asthma, colitis, Crohn's disease, type-2 diabetes, heart disease, various cancers, Alzheimer's, Lupus, allergies and multiple sclerosis. Medical research has found that a diet must include NO MORE than FOUR times as much Omega-6 as Omega-3 for optimal health. Eating Gulf fish will help raise your intake of Omega-3 fatty acids to help with the balance between not only Omega-6, but also total fats in the body consumed by the average American. This is why it's important to eat foods high in Omega-3.

Dr. Julia S. Lytle, Ph.D & Dr. Thomas F. Lytle, Professors Emeritus, Department of Coastal Sciences, states in a brochure;

Marine fish oils are the primary source of Omega-3 fatty acids while the plant oils corn, soy, peanut, cotton, sunflower and safflower are the major sources of Omega-6. All marine fish, whether caught in warm water or cold water, contain Omega-3 fatty acids. Fatty fish such as salmon, sardines, mackerel and young tunas are rich in Omega-3s, but they are also higher in total fats than leaner fish such as flounder, redfish, snapper and tilefish. Recent research indicates that most Gulf fish contain less than 5% total fat, and their fat is enriched in Omega-3s. Dr. Julia says, "Since warm water fish are lean, you can eat larger portions to increase your intake of Omega-3 and still keep total fat calories moderated." I'd like to note though, be careful in its preparation if you are watching total fat calories. Fat is nine calories per gram, while protein and carbohydrates BOTH are four calories per gram. If you add creamy (fatty) rich sauces, extra oil, or breading while cooking, you could double the amount of calories for that portion of fish.

Achieving the right balance of Omega-3 and Omega-6 helps with the following:

- fight inflammation
- reduce the risks of heart attacks and strokes
 - boost immune system
 - reduce cancer risk
 - slow aging
- reduce risk of macular degeneration
 - lower triglycerides

Make a healthy change by eating MORE: Gulf fish at least twice weekly, dark green leafy vegetables, add flaxseeds and walnuts to salads; LESS: processed foods, avoid deepfried foods, REDUCE TOTAL FATS. Use olive and canola oils for salads and cooking.



This information came from a study done by the professors above through The University of Southern Mississippi, Dept. of Coastal Sciences. The basis for their conclusion was through analysis of almost 50 species of Gulf fishes.

Regardless of season, age, size or sexual maturation, Gulf fish are valuable sources of Omega-3 and they have charted the fatty acid, cholesterol and total fat in 44 species.



the weigh-in watching crowd reaches "standing-room-only." The Rodeo has also become a very popular "spectator sport" in October.

If you're planning to make a trip down to the docks, expect to see a broad spectrum of fish being weighed in. From Sharks to Amberjacks, Grouper to King Mackerel, Tunas to Marlin, the rodeo has it all. According to the Destin Rodeo website, "Virtually every gamefish is recognized with awards during the Rodeo." Rodeo anglers are competing for more than \$100,000 in cash and prizes, awarded for both daily and overall catches, sponsored in good part by area businesses. Other awards are paid for by the Rodeo through entry fees and merchandise sales.

Even if you're not a fisherman, the energy level and excitement that comes from being at the docks for weigh-ins is like



nothing else you've ever experienced. Boats back into the scales, pull the fish from their boats while the announcer hypes up the crowd. Fish are strung up on the scale while the crowds cheer and applaud the boats and their teams. For the best seat in the house, get there early, grab a few beers and snag a seat on the bleachers by the leaderboard or above on AJ's upper deck.

The Destin Fishing Rodeo has a significant economic impact on Destin. In 2019 an es-

timated 36,518 anglers from 33 states and two countries, including 13,421 locals participated in the Rodeo.

Halloween on the Harbor will signify the end of weigh-ins on Wednesday, Oct. 31, when the captains, anglers, volunteers and even Miss Destin will be dressed in their favorite costume. Everyone is invited to partake in the fun!





Deep Sea Fishing Options

If I had to put my finger on the "one thing" that makes Destin so popular, it would be the quick access to deep water for deep sea fishing in the Gulf of Mexico. Typically, Mom loves the shopping, the kids love the beach, Dad wants to fish, and everyone loves to eat fresh seafood. Destin has it all, and everyone is a winner!

So, the decision is made to make plans to go fishing, but there's more to it than that. Will you fish in the Gulf or the Bay, do you want a private charter or a party boat, and how many people are in your group?

Deep sea fishing is different from fishing in the Bay, going to Crab Island, or renting a pontoon or jet ski. Those are inexpensive, but they're not "Bucket List" activities nor do you bring back hundreds of dollars' worth of fish. Deep sea fishing is what put Destin on the map. We're called the "Luckiest Fishing Village in the World." The "luck" doesn't come from finding the fish; the luck comes from fishing in an area where the fish are plentiful. Destin captains KNOW where the fish live and they catch them daily.

There are three distinct types of deep-sea fishing: charter boat, party boat or a hybrid of the two with a grouped trip through a charter service. Destin Fishing Marina and others offer all three.

A private charter is the best, but also the most expensive. Most boats charge a base price like \$200 or more per hour for the first six passengers. Trips can range from four hours to 36-hours depending on your skill level and courage. Some charter boats carry only six passengers. We call them six-packs. Larger boats that meet more stringent U.S. Coast Guard regulations are licensed to carry more than six. They often charge an additional fee, like 10% of the base price per passenger, for passengers over the number of six. The only people on a private charter other than your group is a captain and a mate (or two).

A party boat is a boat that charges a "per person" fee to go fishing. They often carry 35 or more passengers at a time, many of whom don't know another soul on the boat, and

many of them have never been fishing before in their life. The party boats are less expensive than a charter boat and highly recommended for people who have never fished before. That being said, the party boats also have customers who are avid fishermen who go almost every day. You just have to be okay fishing alongside people from all over the country who may or may not know what they're doing...which can lead to tangles and such. Listening to the crew will help with all that, and party boats are great about teaching you how to fish.

The third type of trip is a hybrid called a grouped charter. If you only have one to four people but want to split the cost of a charter boat with some other people, you can ask the charter service to set up a group (usually up to 8 people). They then charter the boat for you. The price is a little higher than a party boat, but you can split the cost of the charter boat. By the way, you can also charter a boat through the charter service, and since they know which boats are open, they can save you literally a hundred calls to find an open boat during the season.

Most of these boats have air-conditioned cabins, bathrooms, bunks and tables. The

boats generally provide the bait, ice, tackle and fishing licenses, and you bring whatever you want to eat or drink in a cooler. The empty cooler can then be later used at the end of the day to take home your fish.

The tournament will come full circle this Thanksgiving weekend Nov. 26-27 with Forbes returning as the second-year head coach at Wake Forest. "Northwest Florida State is a very special place to me and my family. I can't think of a better place to spend Thanksgiving with our team and our fans than Niceville and Destin while playing in such a prestigious event."

The semifinal round games on Nov. 26 will feature LSU playing Penn State at 6 p.m. Central Time, followed by Oregon State facing Wake Forest at 8:30 p.m. Central Time.

The championship game on Nov. 27 will tip off at 6 p.m. at The Arena at Northwest Florida State College with the thirdplace game set for 3 p.m.

The 2019 Emerald Coast Classic sold out within 48 hours after tickets went on sale as local fan favorite Florida State appeared along with Purdue, Tennessee and VCU. All four teams competed in the 2019 NCAA Tournament with Tennessee and Florida State advancing to the Sweet 16 while Purdue advanced to the Elite Eight.

"This is a first-class national level event unparalleled in quality as far as the teams it brings in and the competition level," said Dan Shugart, longtime sports director at WEAR TV. "I think it's obviously the premier collegiate sporting event around."

The eight-team tournament has gained a reputation as one of the best in the NCAA showcasing top talent that annually attracts several NBA scouts. The tournament also draws national media exposure to the Emerald Coast with CBS Sports Network televising both the semifinal and championship rounds. "The showing by these teams (LSU, Oregon State, Wake Forest, Penn State) last year has generated a lot of enthusiasm for our tournament from local area fans," said Hanks.






programs initiated by the Monique Burr Foundation For Children, based in Florida.

Use smaller plates. Fifty years ago, plates were 8-1/2"; in the 50's they were 10-1/2"; and today we use 12" and restaurants use 13" plates. Smaller plates mean smaller portions. If you don't have smaller plates, use one plate for salad and dinner items

Consider having a healthy snack before the big meal and go for a walk before you eat; no one feels much like walking after

Lastly, serve healthy beverages. Get rid of the soda and mix unsweetened fruit juice with plain or carbonated water. Serve tea unsweetened or sweeten with honey (also consider using an herbal iced tea). Drink water before you eat.

You aren't powerless and you don't have to live believing you're a victim to others or your circumstances without hope.

Sort responsibility and control. Notice what is out of your control, accept it and stop wasting your energy trying to control it. Notice what is within your healthy self-control, accept it and take healthy responsibility where you need to change direction.

Remember your history of enduring hard things.

Keep a list of hard times you've survived, what you learned and how you experienced growth. Return to your list as an encouraging reminder that with connection and support, you can do hard things again.


My day of reckoning had come.



The Discipline of Planning for Business Success

I am thankful for 2020.

Yes, you read that right. As difficult as last year was and as tragic as the pandemic has been, we learned much in 2020 and it is that for which I am thankful. We learned a lot about the strengths and weaknesses of our society, our culture, our government, our infrastructure, our businesses and ourselves.

While some businesses, about 26% nationally, failed because of the shutdown and subsequent economic slowing, others thrived during the pandemic. Especially those in the trades who enjoyed a boom in home and property improvement contracts. People sitting at home decided to upgrade flooring, roofs, repaint walls and improve landscaping. Owners of commercial buildings including government took advantage of the lockdown to renovate and improve facilities.

Then, there are the businesses that did not enjoy these windfalls but managed to survive. How did they do it? Most pivoted. They found a new way to sell such as restaurants that upgraded their drive throughs and take out capability. Some businesses added product lines; others found new avenues to sell their products. Regardless of the pivot made, business leaders found that the ability to pivot, and to do so quickly, was often the difference between success and mediocrity. Or failure.

I know two business owners in the medical supply field. Their products, distribution and manufacturing sources and

sales forces were similar. Both businesses were established and reputable but small. When the pandemic struck one of these owners called distributors and purchased masks, hand sanitizer and similar products, added SKUs to their website and pivoted to selling these new (for them) products to high demand. By August of 2020, they had sold more than \$1,000,000 of these products. They had pivoted and did so with speed and vision.

The second business could have easily done the same thing. But they did not. Their leaders basically put their heads in the sand and hoped the pandemic would end soon. How successful do you think they were last year?

Why did one pivot and achieve great success when the other, with almost identical infrastructure, did not? Planning. The former of the two businesses practiced regular planning, and no other discipline prepares you to pivot more than planning.

Through regular planning you learn to be more analytical, you develop your sense of


vision, you hone creativity and adopt the skills of process. In Japan, they have a strong business culture built around planning. In fact, almost all Japanese businesses conduct annual strategic planning, every year. What is the value of that? More than half of the world's businesses that are more than 200 years old are based in Japan. One Thing We've Come to Know for Sure

For over a decade now we have been working with employers that have sought help stewarding their businesses. One of their highest demands has been to attract, retain and provide for their employees. Since COVID, we've seen greater demand for better solutions and advice.

It is nothing less than an answer to prayer to be connected with who we are.





Recently someone came to me and asked if there was anything that could be done for a family member who had been involved in a very serious auto accident. As she began to explain the situation, it became clear the accident not only affected the young adult involved, but the parent

who was relaying the story, too. As the story unfolded about that terrible day, the mom began to describe the impact being so severe that the woman's daughter was rushed away unconscious in an ambulance to the ER. Alone and being worked on by hospital staff, the daughter regained consciousness to find herself face to face with a Sheriff. And who, after answering questions as they were fired off one after another, was left in such a state that college had to be put on hold.

Here's the facts:

- It was raining and the roads were slick
- A truck pulled out in front of her daughter.

An Accident's Mission



- Her daughter hit the vehicle in front.
- "Full Coverage" was in place for the daughter's car.

After things settled down a bit, the daughter's insurance company proceeded to pay for damages to the vehicle and driver in front, but then failed to compensate the insured daughter for her losses as believed covered in the policy. After going around and around with the carrier, the daughter was left with expenses and the carrier stood by their position,

"NO, we won't pay for that." So, what's a person to do and how do you protect yourself in a situation like this?

Here's some basic "Insurance Rules of Engagement:"

Know what type of policy you have – most people assume they're covered only to find out too late they're not.

Keep Your Auto Id Cards, Registration, Emergency Contact Information together so those that need to know about an accident can be notified quickly.

Be Your Own Defense – take photos, gather as much information as you can – speak to witnesses who might be around. (If this can't be done at the time, you can ask the police or sheriff's office to send a copy of the report which might identify witnesses to the event.)

When speaking to investigators of any kind, know that you can wait until you feel safe, secure and of sound mind to answer questions. You might want to have an attorney present.

Don't take no for an answer – just because the insurance company says "NO, we won't pay for that" doesn't mean "NO, we won't pay for that." What that means is, "NO, we won't pay for that until you prove to us why we should."

Although the story of this daughter hasn't turned out too well so far, perhaps a good that can come from this tragedy now is that it can be shared to better prepare and help those who could find themselves in a similar situation now or in the future. Sometimes, the good that can come from a tragedy is being able to help others suffering the same. This writing is dedicated to the tragedy this family has experienced, so that their experience might not be in vain, but used to help someone else in need.

Perhaps this accident was no accident at all...

JOHN—My angel story takes place when my wife was dying, and I watched everything go downhill in a matter of months. And every night, I would hear a voice tell me "You can get through this, John."

On the night she died, I heard that voice again. And this time it was my wife's voice saying, "John, I'm okay. Don't quit believing."

LYNN—When I was a young woman someone tried to attack me during a home invasion, but the man was never able to touch me. I screamed for help and something prevented the man's hands from physically touching me, like he was paralyzed. I know it was an angel that saved me.

BARBARA—A few weeks after my husband's death, in a fitful sleep state, I heard my husband's words spoken gently: "Honey, remember Psalm 30:11." Then the voice went away.

The first thing the next morning, I looked up the verse. I found these words:

"Thou has turned for me my mourning into dancing; thou has put off my sackcloth, and girded me with gladness."

KATHY—It was 1977 and we had traveled from Alabama to North Dakota for my grand-parents' 50th anniversary. I had twin girls—a daughter, a son, and another son on the way.

On the day we were loading the car, after the reunion, my sister asked one of the twins (Angie) to tell us about a dream she had.

Angie said, "Angels from heaven came down and brought me to heaven and I saw Jesus."

I worried about it all the way home and for quite a while after that. But the memory of my daughter's dream eventually faded

Flash forward to 1978, the girls were almost 7 years old. It was a sunny day, unseasonably warm, and the girls went to play outside with friends.

Suddenly, I had an overwhelming need to look out the window. It was as though the world was standing still. The children were just standing, not moving. And there, in the street, lay my daughter, Angie. I rushed to call 911 but in my heart I knew.

She had chased a ball across the street. An accident happened. She had a closed-head injury. I had been given a great gift of nearly 7 years with my "Angel" Angie.

SALETA—I was a hospice social worker, traveling to visit a patient. I had one hand on the wheel, watching the road and getting ready to merge onto a major overpass.

Suddenly, I heard a voice, so clearly, as if it were sitting next to me.

"Both hands on the wheel," the voice said.

I was confused, but I put both hands on the wheel tightly.

A large van with a metal ladder on top came flying up from behind me and cut me off at the overpass exit. As they passed me, doing well over 80, the ladder flew off and landed in front of me. I was able to avoid it with inches to spare because I was somehow prepared. I've never forgotten that day.

KRISTEN—My sister was 8 in 1979 when she was diagnosed with a spinal cord tumor. After several unsuccessful surgeries my parents were told there's nothing that could be done. My sister's body began wilting away as she lost her ability to walk and use her arms.

She was 11 when a friend gave my dad a "Reader's Digest" issue about a pediatric neurosurgeon doing experimental procedures for terminally ill children.

After a call to New York City, Dr. Fred Epstein invited my sis for a consultation. We live in rural North Carolina, and it was quite the undertaking to travel that far, but this was our only hope.

Dr. Epstein agreed to try the procedure but, of course, laid out all the possible opportunities for what could go wrong. My family flew home to make the decision and my parents had very differing opinions.

But as soon as my mom stepped off the plane in Charlotte, something, an angel, began tugging on her. It was constant, relentless tugging, an invisible being working overtime on her. Mom had this feeling that we should do the surgery.

Three days later, Mom convinced everyone that the surgery should happen. Mom didn't tell anyone for years about the angel. But it was the angel's tug that gave us an extra 30 years with my "Sissy." She was the 60th patient to try this experimental procedure, and it worked. And now my "Sissy" is an angel herself.

LEANNE—I had been visiting my mom as she had made the decision to not continue cancer treatments. I had been with her for two weeks and we spent hours talking about life, family, and faith. That was how we connected—long talks over the kitchen table, or on the phone across two thousand miles. We talked daily.

During one of our last conversations, we were talking about faith. I asked her, "So, Mom, when the time comes, and you are in heaven, please give me some kind of a sign to let me know that you're there."

In her own spunky way, she said, "Okay, honey, I'll trip you."

The following Sunday, as I was walking to my room, I had a misstep and went into a full

frontal fall. I remember thinking, "Oh, how embarrassing."

Thankfully, I caught myself before I hit the ground. But the moment I walked into my room, my phone rang, and my dad said through tears, "Mom's gone, honey."

When I realized the timing of the moment of my trip, I called my dad to tell him about it. To this day, we talk about "the trip," and we are both so grateful to God for letting us know that she made it home.

LISA—One day when my twins were napping, I was out mowing. I noticed a yellow jacket nest in the ground. So I got some wasp spray and proceeded to spray it.

Then, a neighbor I had never seen before was standing in the backyard next door and telling me to get away from the dangerous nest and run inside the house.

When my husband got home I told him about the wasp nest and about the neighbor who told me to get away.

My husband just looked at me and told me that no one lived in that house next door.

Then, when my husband went out to kill the nest and dig it up, we realized the nest was layers deep with thousands of wasps.



BRAD—Sean, I have an angel story. We were newlyweds. My mother-in-law was my wife's best friend. They talked every day.

My mother-in-law taught high-school English and had a brain aneurysm in class. We rushed from Birmingham to Tupelo to the hospital to see her.

We stopped for gas where my wife went into the store and we accidentally locked ourselves out of the car. Frantic, I prayed for help.

Next, a bearded guy in a Led Zeppelin T-shirt asked if we needed help. He jimmied the door open. And when we turned to thank him, he was gone. We made it to the hospital and my mother-in-law squeezed my wife's hand before she passed.

I'm like you, sometimes a skeptic, but I know what I saw with my own eyes that day.

ME—Don't quit believing.



to help me. But now, O Lord, I see my wrong, heal my heart and show Yourself strong; And in my eyes and with my song, O Lord be magnified."

The young man I formerly disdained now sang with the voice of God speaking to my heart. The Lord tenderly reminded me, "Wake up to the God who loves you more than you can imagine. He is restoring you in your innermost being."

Leave No Trace: 49 Divers Cleaned Up 284.3 Pounds of Trash from The Pier

In September, nearly 50 divers from all over the area embarked on a sunrise cleanup at The Pier on Okaloosa Island. Many of the divers on Sunday were involved with the cleanup that happened at the Pier back in August as well. "There's a lot

of people that come to fish here filament and hooks, a lot of at The Pier," said Alex Fogg, Coastal Resource Manager for Okaloosa County. "Unfortunately, they lose lead, they lose hooks, they lose monofilament. Every once in a while, we need to get out there to make sure that we keep it clean up."

When fishermen lose mono-

times it's on accident. In many cases, the debris can become an entanglement hazard for the creatures that hangout underneath the pier. It can also become a magnet for a lot of other monofilament and hooks to become tangled in, according



"We need to make sure we get out there every six months or so with a bunch of help from the community and other partners to make it happen," he continued. "With the Leave No Trace initiative, you want to try and take everything out that you brought in, but unfortunately at the pier, in some cases you have to leave some monofilament and led hooks behind."

Alex says that their job is to get out there and remove those items so that there is no trace of humans being there.

The divers went out with blue and yellow bags to collect the trash. These bags were donated by 'Keep Florida Beautiful' and the Florida Department of Environmental Protection, which were huge partners for this cleanup.

Trash cleanups at the Okaloosa Island Fishing Pier have been happening for the last six years or so. This has mainly

been spearheaded by the Gulfarium, Anglers and The Pier, that do about four dives each

Now that the event is becoming more of a public event, Alex says that they are getting partners from all over the area, along with community partners from as far away as Mobile, Ala.

In total, 284.3 lbs. of trash were removed. A few notable items included:

- A few tires
- Construction fence
- Car keys
- Wedding ring
- 4 fishing poles

After the event, all the participants enjoyed free beer from Destin Brewery!
