Help Feed Young Minds with Food for Thought

In addition to providing meals and snacks for the 3,400 food insecure children in their backpack program, Food for Thought has been gearing up for the holidays. They recently delivered 700 turkeys and 33,000 food items over five service locations to reach more than 3,000 children across Okaloosa and Walton Counties for Thanksgiving.

If you are unfamiliar with their work, Food for Thought is a nonprofit organization which families still struggling to make ends meet.

Covid has also had a two-fold effect on Food for Thought. In addition to seeing a 40% increase in the cost of food from distributors and brokers, they experienced a decline in volunteers. "Prior to Covid we saw about 250 individual volunteers a week to help us provide our services, and right now we are struggling to get to 100," stated Tiffanie

Despite the setbacks, Food for Thought is committed, and

to our holiday services," stated Tiffanie. "We spread out through the community to make those pick ups easy for the families and we have a variety of times, and we communicate directly with the families."

When asked what Food for Thought needs most, Tiffanie

said that volunteers and donors are both important, because one doesn't work without the other. "We need donors to help support our work, and we need volunteers to help us distribute. They are both extremely valuable to us."

If you are interested in help-

ing Food for Thought, keep in mind that it only costs \$5 to fill a backpack to support a child for a week; one to two hours a month of your time spent volunteering can really make a difference. For more information on how you can get involved, please visit the website, fftfl.org.






provides meals and snacks to children who are dependent on free or reduced school meals, bridging meal gaps that might occur on the weekends or during holidays, so kids can focus less on where they are going to get their next meal and more on their schoolwork. They literally provide food for thought.

Due to the economic impact of Covid, Food for Thought has seen an increase in demand. "Last year we saw a 38% increase in our pick-ups for the holidays, and this year we are planning on a 10% increase over that," said Tiffanie Nelson, founder of Food for Thought. In 2020, most people were struggling with unemployment or reduced hours; this year inflation has had an effect on the cost of groceries, gas and general cost of living, leaving some

is meeting their weekly deliveries. They are grateful for the volunteers they currently have, and regardless of how social media looks, they are still in need of more volunteers to make the drops easier. "There aren't enough hands and feet on our team of five to provide all these services to over 3,000 kids a week," said Tiffanie, referring to the 34 school drops they make across Okaloosa and Walton counties.

In addition to these services, they are getting prepared for another holiday drop for Christmas break, providing snacks and meals for children during their two-weeks off of school, a time when food insecurity may be high. A child can miss around 20 meals over Christmas break. "Children who are already enrolled in our services get access



An increasing number of children are at home with no adult care or supervision. Yet, young people need to know that someone cares about them. Boys & Girls Clubs of the Emerald Coast (BGCEC) offer that and more. Club programs and services promote and enhance the development of boys and girls by instilling a sense of competence, usefulness, belonging and influence all in a safe place to learn, grow and have fun.

Our local BGCEC has taken members from the Clubhouse to the White House; from the game room to the corporate boardroom; from the high school football field to the NFL; from a band room to Carnegie Hall. And from the streets to guidance, friendship and a place to belong.

Boys & Girls Clubs Emerald Coast offers programs that are addressing today's most pressing youth issues. "Our programs teach young people the skills they need to succeed in life, while providing a safe place for hundreds of Northwest Florida children to go after school and during the summer," says C.E.O. Shervin Rassa.

Local area programs basically focus on three priorities: Academic Success where members are provided with tools to graduate from high school with a plan for their future; Good Character and Citizenship through a variety of programs such as Keystone Club, Torch Club, Youth of the Year, Youth for Unity and Netsmartz; and Healthy Lifestyles where members learn to adopt and maintain positive behaviors about life, nutrition and self.

In order to support all of its valuable programs, BGCEC hosts several events throughout the year. Harbor Pump Back in Business

The City of Destin recently had its Harbor Pump completely rebuilt, an arduous process that has taken over six months. Parts original to the former pump configuration include the pump housing and one drive short shaft with the remainder being brand new. The pump's re-installation began November 18th with the arrival of a crane and support staff from Gilbert Pump (Fort Walton Beach). With the subsequent reinstallation of the primary components and restoration of power, the pump should be back in full operation by Thanksgiving. City Staff is also awaiting the arrival and installation of a Variable Frequency Drive (VFD) for the system. In its former configu-

ration, the Harbor Pump was either off or on. The VFD will allow staff to tune the motor's rotations per minute to optimize output whilst minimizing the effects of cavitation and/or air entrainment which can damage any pump over time. Once online, the City will operate the pump using the regular summer schedule for a few weeks and will then begin operations on a reduced off-season schedule.

Additionally, city staff recently performed a dive to inspect and clean the Harbor Pump's intake structure located in the Gulf of Mexico. Staff removed biological growth (primarily plant) from the intake grates.

What is the Purpose of the Harbor Pump?

The Harbor in Destin, home of Florida's largest commercial fishing fleet, is a functionally closed 240-acre waterbody with water-quality issues that include nitrogen and phosphorous loading. Nutrients like these, com-



monly found in fertilizers along with warmer water temperatures, can lead to algal blooms, reduced dissolved oxygen levels, fish kills, cloudy water and odor complaints if allowed to accumulate over time. To combat the effects of urbanization and the water quality issues it can create, the pump system, in operation since 1992, brings low-nutrient water into the Harbor to flush out pollutants and raise the dissolved oxygen levels for fish and other aquatic life.

City of Destin Receives Two Dewatering Pumps

After Hurricane Sally, City Staff approached State Representative Patt Maney's office with a request for assistance in purchasing pumping equipment to support our Emergency Management Response efforts. Rep. Maney's office followed through and submitted an appropriations request to the State of Florida which was granted. Originally, the grant award requested that the City provide a 50% match, but when the

grant award was received, the State's Department of Emergency Management provided the City with almost \$100,000 in funding to purchase pumping equipment with no match requirement.

City staff is proud to announce that we received our two new 6" Thompson dewatering pumps along with hoses and related equipment. These pumps are a much-appreciated addition to our Emergency Management toolbox.

Impact100 Awards \$418,000 to Local Nonprofits

The votes are in and four local non-profit groups in Okaloosa and Walton Counties will receive \$104,500 each from Impact100 of Northwest Florida, Inc., an organization designed to financially support nonprofit organizations in Okaloosa and Walton Counties.

Grant recipients were selected from the following five categories: Arts & Culture; Education; Environment, Recreation and Preservation; Family; and Health and Wellness. Since its conception in 2012, Impact100 NWF has now awarded 3.6 million dollars to nonprofits in Okaloosa and Walton counties.

For **Education**, it's United for a Good Cause for Hope Squad's Peer-to-Peer Prevention Expansion. Suicide is the second leading cause of death among kids 10-18. There were 36 youth suicides ages 10-24 between Okaloosa and Walton Counties in 2015-2019. The goal of United for a Good Cause is to save our kids by having a Hope Squad Peer-to-Peer Suicide Prevention Program in every school in our region from Escambia to

Walton Counties. Grant dollars will support more than 51,000 students in both Okaloosa and Walton Counties.

For Environment, Recreation & Preservation, the Panhandle Animal Welfare Society (PAWS) will receive funds for new Clinic Medical Equipment. PAWS' goal is to reopen the only low-cost animal clinic in Okaloosa/Walton counties, to provide diagnostics and surgery for injured animals and reduce the unwanted and unhealthy animal populations. To do this they need equipment. Funds will quickly restore on-site medical access for abused/abandoned shelter animals (7k+ annually) and serve the public need for locally accessible and affordable vet care, thereby reducing pet populations (domestic and feral) through more than 30k annual spay/neuter surgeries. The clinic has a 20-year history (\$200k annual profit) using old equipment and a semi-retired vet. New and additional equipment will allow vets to perform at 6x rate and offer more clinic services.

For the **Family** category, Fresh Start for Children and Families won the grant award for its Sell More = Help More ~ Fresh Start Takes Aim at More Capacity program. Fresh Start is a housing/education program for families with children who are homeless. Their clients come from all walks of life, face many problems including abuse, divorce, generational poverty and more. This project is to purchase a box truck with lift, which would increase their capacity. The program provides a furnished apartment, food pantry, weekly life skills classes, one-on-one budgeting and goal meetings. The Repeat Street thrift store is a revenue source covering more than 50% of the program's bills, furnishing apartments, and with only two employees and volunteers. A dependable truck will save money on repairs, increase funds with less trips to unload, less pickups missed and appear more professional. Families who graduate from the program leave self-sufficient with savings.

For the **Health and Well-ness** category, Sharing and





Caring of Okaloosa County will use the funds for Building Expansion. The organization desperately needs a facility expansion and renovation. Since 1990, it has operated its food pantry in a small 1,485 sq. ft. building using a tiny pantry of just 409 sq. ft. This year, they finally saved enough to purchase this building. Their 960 sq. ft. expansion will extend their rectangular building by 30 ft. It will more than double the pantry for food storage and cooling equipment, add a prescription interviewer room, increase the reception lobby by 75%, make the entrance, walkways and client restroom more functional and handicap compliant. The organization's mission is to improve the health and





independence of clients by providing nutritious food, personal care items and medicine vouchers. Additionally, partnerships with Shelter House, Fresh Start and other agencies to synergize the local transformational movement will be expanded, thereby doubling the number of clients supported to all demographics.





FWBHS Students Lead by Giving

Christmas Connection Has Lasting Impact

A Hometown Hero comes in many forms, even young students! Each year this season, leadership students from Fort Walton Beach High School (FWBHS) become "heroes" for many parents in our community who have no way to provide a joyful Christmas for their children.

The Leadership Program is a student-led cooperation which heads several annual projects ranging from community publicity, to natural disaster relief, mentoring children, community outreach, feeding the homeless and even appealing to the state legislature for new resolutions. Their acts have been recognized by district, state and national organizations as well as government institutions. The primary goal of the Leadership Program is to challenge 9-12 grade students in both their academic and personal lives along with teaching them the importance of giving back to the community. Roughly 300 students generate as much as \$30,000 each year overall to plug back into the community.

While FWBHS Leadership student's projects are vast, they are best known for their Christmas Connection project. The project's goal is to provide a Christmas or holiday celebration to less fortunate families in Okaloosa County. Families are selected on recommendations and applications from local elementary, middle and high school guidance counselors.

Last year, through sponsorships and monetary donations attained from local businesses and individuals, this county-wide public service provided more than 47 families and 165 children with a comprehensive Christmas. To break it down, that's meals for up to 14 days including breakfast, lunch and dinner, as well as decorations, wrapped gifts valued at \$100 for each child, and when needed, support for the families with





lodging, utility bills and additional expenses.

Each leadership student is involved in the planning, fundraising, purchasing and delivering meals and gifts for each family.

Most of the leadership students say the fun really happens this month where they begin to meet and get to know the families in which they've been assigned. "Through the "meetand-greets" with the families," says Bella Larabee, one of the Christmas Connection program leaders, "we gain information on the children's toys and clothes preferences, and the needs of their parents." They then plan how to ensure the family is lifted of many of their worries by Dec. 25th. Groups of five to six students help one to four families at a time. Overall, the most needed item is food. "Over the past two months, we've been collecting bags upon bags of non-perishable food items and will purchase, with the donation dollars, milk, eggs, butter and hams and turkeys for the families' Christmas dinner and the weeks ahead," says Bella."Then comes the shop 'till we drop day, where we buy hundreds of dollars' worth of gifts and toys for our assigned family's children." Toys are brought to FWBHS and wrapped, assembled and made ready to be delivered usually on the 20th.

You can join these amazing hometown heroes by making a monetary donation; \$100 provides a holiday package for one child. You can send a check to Fort Walton Beach High School with "Christmas Connection" written in the memo section. Students are taking donations through the new year and can provide a tax receipt by request.

"Tears of joy pour from both the eyes of the giver and of the receiver throughout this experience," says former leadership student and FWBHS alumna, Savannah Smith. "These Leadership students truly make an impact on the lives of these children and parents." But could it be that the very lives they're impacting have a long-lasting reverse effect? "I believe," says Savannah, "my life has never been the same."

Okaloosa County Unveils Women Veterans Monuments

This past Veteran's Day, November 11, Okaloosa County unveiled Women Veterans Monuments, honoring women who have served and made significant contributions in the U.S. Military throughout history. The life-size, bronze monuments are arranged along a picturesque trail of the 17.5-acre Veterans' Park on Okaloosa Island and have been sculpted in honor of women who sacrificed for our country as true patriots. Each represents a woman veteran who made a significant military contribution during one of many major conflicts throughout U.S. history, from the Revolutionary War to the War in Afghanistan.

Home to native wildlife and vegetation, the park is situated on the Choctawhatchee Bay coastline and pays homage to the military, which has played an integral role in forming our community. Second only to Washington, D.C., Florida is home to one of the largest populations of women veterans in the nation.

Honorees chosen by the Women Veterans Monument Advisory Committee and approved by the Board include the following:

Margaret Corbin - Revolutionary War, Army

Cathay Williams - Civil War, Army

Lenah Higbee - World War I, Navy

Jacqueline Cochran - World War II, Air Force Reserves Jonita Ruth Bonham -

Bovée, Korean War, Army Air Corps / Air Force

Sharon Ann Lane - Vietnam War, US Army Nurse Corps Reserve

Leigh Ann Hester - Persian Gulf War, Army National Guard

Naseema - War in Afghanistan, US Air Force

Like the men and women in uniform—past and present—the honored women veterans "kept their promise to bear any burden and endure any hardship for the cause of freedom," said



Air Force Colonel Allison Black, 24th SOW Vice Commander, Hurlbert Field, speaking during the Veterans Day ceremony. "The nation will be proud and residents along with guests will embrace the detail, quality and effort that has gone into honoring women who have given such dedication to our country," said Okaloosa Board of County Commissioners Chairman Carolyn Ketchel.

When you visit, you arrive at a dedication plaza where a path encircles a flying U.S. flag, a POW-MIA flag, Florida and county flags. Military and Coast Guard flags fly from poles on the perimeter. The first statue you encounter is representative of Revolutionary War hero Margaret Corbin. In November of 1776, while defending Fort Washington in New York, her husband, a soldier in the Continental Army, was killed by a Hessian musket ball. With

no time to grieve, she continued loading and firing a canon by herself.

The journey continues along the trail where visitors experience the seven additional women memorialized by statues chosen by the Women's Veteran Memorial Advisory Committee, approved by the Board of County Commissioners and crafted by Sculptor Jon Hair, who hopes visitors will feel a connection with each of the heroes through his sculptures. The Memorial Park includes a dedication plaza, ADA sidewalks, parking, landscape with

irrigation and the eight statues, funded entirely from Okaloosa County Tourism Development.

A Living Shoreline, funded by a RESTORE grant, National Fish and Wildlife Foundation and matching funds from Tourism Development, will be constructed to protect 2,200 linear feet of shoreline by reducing the impact of wave energy and providing an oyster habitat, a seagrass recruitment area and a salt marsh shelf. There is a boardwalk planned along with an education component.

"Every one of us has a story," said Col. Black. "And while we walk on the trail outside and remember these specific eight brave and selfless women, many more stories will come to light, and those stories will become inspiration for the next generation as they find their way in the world." 1,400 women serve on active duty currently at Eglin Air Force Base in every role. Buying a Car During the Current Diminished Inventory Market

By this point, most everyone who drives, or keeps up with current economic and supply chain trends, is well aware that the current automobile market in our country (and most others) is facing a problem we haven't seen to this degree in our lifetimes.

In a nutshell, the current lack of new and used vehicle inventory is partly due to supply chain issues first affected by the pandemic, and later catapulted into more problems with a fire in a major supplier facility in China, leading to a worldwide shortage of microchips used in the new car manufacturing process.

This new car shortage is, by association, also responsible for the diminished number of used cars on the market, since dealers depend on new car trade-ins for much of their used inventory, that then flows down the chain to supply the major auto auction houses, local wholesale dealers, and the smaller non-dealer pre-owned car lots. Meaning right now, the demand for new and used cars is far outweighing the availability. Thus, making it harder to find the particular new or used vehicle you may be looking for, and increasingly difficult to get a good deal on the pre-owned automobiles you do find to purchase.

So, what do you do if you find yourself in need—or want—of a vehicle during these tumultuous times?

We all know that anytime supply for anything is less than the demand for the same tangible product —be it real estate, automobiles, building supplies or high-end watches—the result is usually a temporary adjustment-repeat after me, "inflation"—in the said commodity. Read that again, "temporary." Meaning that If we pay too much for something just because there is less of that something in a current market, we often still paid too much! That's basic economics, but it's surprising how many people get caught up thinking they have to have something and let their emo-





tions talk them into paying too much for it.

In the case of used cars especially, we are seeing a number of vehicles selling at retail establishments for a good percentage



over what the true retail value for that same vehicle is. Remember, this shortage is real, and the supply of vehicles available may not catch up with normal auto purchasing demand for up to another two years (once the chip shortage is overcome and new manufacturing resumes to a normal pace), however (the BIG "HOWEVER") this doesn't mean it's smart to pay over the retail book value for any car or truck you are considering buying.

If you are paying over the NADA (National Auto Dealer's Association) or KBB (Kelly Blue Book) retail value for the vehicle, you are simply paying too much. And, that will come back to haunt buyers who do this. As the vehicle you purchase is only worth what the books say it is worth when it comes time to sell or trade it in later on. And that time will come. You can do a simple internet search to find those values for any car you are thinking about buying, keeping in mind that dealers still want to sell cars, perhaps needing to more now than ever. So, push for that best deal or walk away.

So far, the "real" values of the used (or new) vehicles on the market hasn't changed much at all in the real world, even though some dealers are asking more, and some consumers seem willing to pay more than the book values. This means some people (a lot of people) are likely to find themselves way upside down when they try to sell or trade that car or truck they paid thousands over value for, just to get it. Remember, like most consumer goods, the majority of cars and trucks (other than particular collectible, rare, and antique ones) are depreciating assets. So, unlike the home or condo you buy that generally will continue to go up in value, the car you buy -even at fair market price—will almost always go down in value from the day you buy it. That's why it's so important to buy it right in the first place.

One way to buy smart is to really educate yourself on the real value of any vehicle you are considering. Just because lot A is selling their vehicle \$2,000 less than lot B doesn't mean either one is a good deal. Use the NADA and KBB book values and make it a rule not to pay over the retail book value, no matter what the dealership or

seller may tell you about supply and demand, or current values. If you pay too much today, you will most definitely owe way too much tomorrow.

The good news is that reputable dealers know this supply issue will even out in time, and they also know that the book value is the real value. Make it

a point to do business with those dealers and sellers only. In fact, being sort of auto aficionado myself, having owned over 35 various cars, trucks and SUV's over the years, my hard rule when purchasing anything (Yes, even in this current market.) is to never pay one dollar over the NADA clean trade-in book value for anything. Whether on a car lot or from an individual, I stick to that rule. This way I al-

ways know that I can drive most of those cars for even a year or less, keep the mileage at or below the national average, and still be able to trade or sell the vehicle for what I owe on it or more. The good news is, I have even been able to do this twice (for my pre-owned BMW and my fiancée's Mercedes) in the past few months, even during the current automobile market. So, just know you can do

it; it just might take a little more shopping around and tougher negotiating skills to make this happen.

In 2020, during the months

Under Florida law, DUI is one offense, proved by impairment of normal faculties by any substance or unlawful blood alcohol or breath alcohol level of .08 or above.

"The holiday season is a time to visit with friends and family, near and far. It is also one of the busiest times of the year to travel," said Florida Department of Transportation Secretary Kevin J. Thibault, P.E. "On average, motor vehicle crashes occur in much higher numbers than normal at this time of year. Remember to prioritize safety by never driving impaired, wearing your seatbelt, and planning your route to ensure safe speeds on the roads. Together, we can ensure all of Florida's travelers have a happy and safe holiday season."

The Florida Police Chiefs Association also reminds you that Florida law enforcement offi-

cers will be on the roadways to ensure your safety. "We ask that our residents and visitors be vigilant on the roadways and highways which are busier than ever during this time of year."



11 a.m. – 3:30 p.m. There's also a pizza bar and inside reservation only dining.





Faithful crews decorate, dress in theme costumes and entertain using all things that assault the senses from a visual and sound standpoint. "It's just as much about the boat community as watchers and bystanders gather in the many restaurants and docks along the Destin Harbor," says Mary Ann Windes, Destin Fishing Fleet, Party Boat Destin Princess and Party Boat Destiny. "It's a good excuse to go boating in the winter and celebrate the holidays. You'll see elaborate light displays choreographed to Christmas music while other boats sport famous passengers like Santa and the Grinch. 


Emerald Grande) ending near the Destin Bridge and East Pass area. You can view the boat parade anywhere from Boshamps

Manatees are in Motion!

This is the time of year for migrating Manatees! So, slow down and look out for them. As water temperatures cool, manatees naturally migrate to warmer waters, generally warmer than 68 degrees to survive the winter. So, in the fall they travel to Florida springs, power plant discharges and other warm-water sites.

Manatees can be difficult to see, especially when you travel in a boat on the water. You may see a swirl on the surface caused by the manatee when it dives; see an animal's back, snout, tail or flipper break the surface of the water; or you may only hear the manatee when it surfaces to breathe. In all of these instances, keeping your distance and passive observation are the best ways to view manatees. Boat slow and look out below to allow them to swim safely.

While manatees are large, they can be difficult to see in the water. The West Indian manatee is an imperiled species and is protected by state and federal law. Please avoid harassing or disturbing manatees whenever you discover that manatees are in the water near you. Harassment is defined as any activity that alters the animal's natural behavior. By altering the manatee's natural behavior, you may create the likelihood of danger that is bad for the animal and against the law.

That's why it is important to

follow guidelines and follow all manatee protection zones; look

out while boating; wear polarized glasses and always give them space. Manatee protection zones are marked by waterway signs and maps of manatee protection zones are available online at My-FWC.com/Manatee by clicking on "Data and Maps." Disturbing manatees at warm-water sites can cause them to swim out of those protected areas and into potentially life-threatening cold water

During the colder months, Slow down in certain areas to prevent manatees from being injured or killed by motorboats or personal watercrafts. Boat strikes continue to be a major threat to Florida manatees.

Being Near Manatees

Look, but don't touch manatees. Also, don't feed manatees or give them water. If manatees become accustomed to being around people, they can alter their behavior in the wild, perhaps causing them to lose their natural fear of boats and humans, which can make them more susceptible to harm.

Do not pursue or chase a manatee if you see one while you are swimming, snorkeling, diving, paddling or operating a boat.

Never poke, prod or stab a manatee with your hands, feet or any object.

If a manatee avoids you, do not chase the animal for a closer view.

Give manatees space to move. Avoid isolating or singling out an individual manatee from its group and do not separate a cow and her calf.

Keep hands and objects to yourself. Don't attempt to snag, hook, hold, grab, pinch, hit or ride a manatee.

Avoid excessive noise and splashing if a manatee appears nearby. The manatee may be resting and may surface without

The Florida Black Bear Receives a New Home

Northwest Florida boasts the second largest bear population in the state. But, due to a high level of development in the region, the black bear population is being pushed out of their homes at alarming rates, which increases bear sightings and injuries to bears.

Alaqua Animal Refuge wanted to help solve the challenge. When local philanthropists Raven and Ryan Jumonville learned of Alaqua's plans, they wanted to know how they could get involved. And they did with a special gift to Alaqua Animal Refuge to build a bear sanctuary. Their gift, a 2008 Cruisers Yachts 460 Express yacht, will be sold with proceeds going towards building a portion of a new sanctuary to house unreleasable Florida Black Bears and educate the public about their plight.

The bear sanctuary will be located at Alaqua's new 100acre home in Freeport and will include educational aspects that will teach our community and others how to live with them safely. "When wild animals are rehabilitated and deemed unreleasable by the Florida Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission (FWC), their fate is often euthanasia. There are not enough sanctuaries to help all of the animals in need, especially for larger native species like bears," says Alaqua Founder Laurie Hood.



to give these animals a place to live out their lives and become ambassadors for their species."

"The more our community and visitors know about them, the safer it will be for humans and bears alike," iterates Hood. "It was a dream come true to receive such a generous gift earmarked for a project that will be one of the first of its kind in the state. We look forward to teaching our community what a treasure these animals are and help some of the ones in need at the same time."

Alaqua Wildlife Director Shelby Proie adds, "As our native fauna continue to get displaced and in turn have more unavoidable interactions with humans, we are grateful to have the space to facilitate such a large project for this charismatic megafauna. Black bears are such an integral part of North Florida's ecosystem and not only do we want to offer them a second chance of life through developing a wildlife rehabilitation center that meets their needs, but we will be able to go beyond that and have a space where they can live out their lives in an expansive natural environment if they are deemed non-releasable.

The Jumonville family has been loyal donors to Alaqua for a number of years, gifting one million dollars towards the Refuge's capital campaign to help build the new Welcome Center and Adoption Building at its new facility. The donation of the yacht to help with the bear sanctuary was the idea of their daughter, Jayden. "I like animals more than I like boats," said Jayden.

being aware of your presence. Noise and activity may startle the animal awake, which may put it in harm's way if it is frightened and leaves the area.

If the site you visit allows in-water activities near mana-

tees, use snorkel gear and float at the surface of the water to passively observe manatees. The sound of bubbles from SCUBA gear or other devices may cause manatees to leave the area.

Physically handling a distressed or stranded manatee might cause more harm. Instead, report injured, distressed, sick

or dead manatees to the FWC's Wildlife Alert Hotline at 888-404-FWCC (3922) or dialing #FWC or *FWC on a cellphone so trained responders can assist.

Are You Getting Your Best Sleep?

As we age, it seems like it's more difficult to get a good night's sleep. For some of us, it's harder to fall asleep and others have difficulty staying asleep. Then there are those who have difficulty with both falling asleep and staying asleep. A lack of sleep leads to daytime sleepiness, an inability to concentrate, emotional instability, poor decision making and a decrease in mood. A lack of sleep is also associated with increases in disease such as Alzheimer's, diabetes, heart disease, depression and more. It's easy to see how important a good night's sleep is.

It should not be a surprise that the main reason sleep problems occur as we age is from dysfunction in our hormones. After age 40, the amount of sleep problems that occur from a lack of hormones increases rapidly. Progesterone plays a



The Risks of Sanitizing

While looking at the overuse of antibiotics, I came across some information that bares our attention.

Antibiotics are used to treat bacterial infections and have been successful in treating these illnesses. However, because antibiotics are not bacteria specific, they kill the good bacteria along with the bad.

Most of us know that we need to maintain a healthy gut microbiome in order to keep our immune system strong. (The majority of our immune system is located in the gut.) Put the two together and you have a gut void of bacteria after using antibiotics which makes our bodies more susceptible to bacteria and viruses to attack.

Enter anti-bacterial soaps, hand sanitizers, sprays, etc. These products are also not bacteria specific and kill the good and the bad, thereby weakening our body's defenses. But unlike antibiotics, there are additional dangers.

The FDA warns that symptoms such as headaches, nausea and dizziness can occur after applying alcohol-based sanitizers to the skin. Vapors can be inhaled and the alcohol is absorbed into the skin. Repeated use can result in skin becoming dry, flaky and sensitive to touch. Dry skin actually increases our chances of picking up germs.

Some sanitizers contain Triclasan which is intended to kill bacteria and has been used in



products from toothpaste to body wash (Seriously!). High exposures can disrupt natural hormone cycles and even impact fertility. Triclasan has been banned from several types of products.

The CDC notes the risks in children. Younger children (under 12) are more susceptible to adverse effects, because their livers lack the adult amounts of glycogen. Between these products being scented and kids being kids, their tendency is to sniff and/or put their hand in their mouths.

Doctors warn about the risks well: Eczema, skin irritation, formulations that affect fertility, resistance to antibiotics, hormone problems, immune system issues, impact on body development, contracting a skin disorder and alcohol poisoning.

Lastly, disinfecting or sanitizing counters and cutting boards land in this category. These products don't dissipate and can end up on your hands and in your food.

Washing our hands with soap and water, cleaning counters with a clean cloth (you can use water with a touch of vinegar), and focusing on keeping our immune system healthy is a great routine for health.

Go Lightly, Enjoy Greatly

By now, most of us have heard a lot about the destruction overindulging can do to our bodies, both visibly and silently. So, why do we keep allowing ourselves to do it? Does the magnitude of fun make it worth it? On that note, does it have to be all or nothing? The answer is NO. I think it's more fun to feel light and comfortable, instead of lethargic, achy and bloated.

Remember these few suggestions during Christmas and New Years that, I think, will help you enjoy the holidays much more:

Portion size is so important! Your body can only process only so much at a time. If it can't process the amount of calories you consume, it will have no choice but to store them. Sugars process fast, while

fats and protein process slowly. You will absorb and burn sugars almost immediately, which will raise your blood sugar, and leave your fat cells vulnerable to suck up the excess calories—predominantly from fats. (Note: Fats are the highest calories at 9 cal/gm vs 4 cal/gm for sugars and proteins). Therefore, if you eat sugary, fatty foods, you're most likely going to max out how much you can burn at that one meal--and the rest will be stored! If this cycle happens over and over again for several meals, you will gain weight like lightning. Plus, your liver and other organs have to work harder also. It's really hard on your body. How much muscle you have, your energy level, your choice and quantity of foods, are the pieces of the puzzle we have control over. Genetics plays a part, but we don't have control over that.

There are ways to boost your ability to become a more efficient calorie burning machine. If processing your food intake is the issue, but you still want to partake in all the goodies, you still can. Just keep your portions smaller, spread them out throughout the day. Give your body enough time to "catch up" with the amounts you put in. The higher the calories, the smaller the portion should be.

Fats should be very small portions/amounts, but simple sugars should be monitored the most because of the ability to spike blood sugar and insulin which paralyzes the barrier of the fat cells leaving them unprotected. Plus, there's other detrimental issues for your brain, heart, immune system and energy system.

Exercise requires your body to use energy to move and perform. Anything you can do to get yourself moving will help use those extra calories your body can't burn on its own. During the holidays, while party hopping, commit to walking either before or after. Walking after a meal is incredibly beneficial to keeping blood sugar balanced and utilizing some calories before they get stored. If you choose to exercise before you eat, a workout that's intense, like interval training, will be most beneficial because research shows we continue to burn calories for many hours after we stop exercising, conducive to the level of intensity.

Keep your muscle tone. Use it or lose it! Having and keeping muscle will raise your resting metabolism which will burn more calories at rest. Even daily activities such as shopping, cooking, playing with the kids

are beneficial anytime—just move. The more muscle you have the more calories you burn.

Go ahead and enjoy everything that is presented to you this holiday season. Be smart; don't overthink it; focus on your family, friends and all that Christmas is about. It's a beautiful time of year and we are all blessed to live in one of the most beautiful areas in the world.

5 Self-Assessment Questions for Mapping Better Self-Care:

How are you tending to your energy level? Maybe you're exhausted, lacking sleep, noticing in your face/body that you're pushing too hard. Take 10 minutes to reflect and write your observations about your energy level. Note activities you're doing that create positive energy you'd like to continue or increase. Note energy draining activities that you'd like to let go. Try sorting these activities into categories of "must keep" (be careful that you aren't putting everything into this category) and "could let go." Write one shift you could make to improve tending to your energy level.

How are you tending to your spirit? Maybe you've prioritized other important things over taking care of yourself spiritually. Maybe past emotional baggage makes it hard to prioritize spiritual practices. Engaging spiritually often results in increased connection, hope, and joy in life. Take 10 minutes to reflect and write about past spiritual activities that have helped you. Reflect on how you felt when you engaged those activities. Reflect on why you stopped doing those activities. Write one shift you could make to improve tending to your spirit.

How are you tending to your physical body? If you will listen, your body will provide you with valuable information about your well-being. Maybe you've been putting off going to the doctor. Maybe you're avoiding moving your body. Maybe your relationship with food has become unbalanced in some way. Maybe you're using substances to self-medicate and your body is paying the price. Take 10 minutes to reflect and write about physical practices that create balance for you. Reflect on the barriers you have to engaging in these practices regularly. Write one shift you'd like to make to tend better to your physical body.

How are you tending to your emotions? Your mood and management of emotions can make or break your daily life experience. Allowing space for emotion and having effective strategies to cope and calm when emotions get large can completely revolutionize your emotional landscape. Take 10 minutes to reflect on which feelings create the most discomfort for you. Note unhealthy coping skills you currently use to suppress or avoid feelings (drinking, shopping, eating, raging, avoiding). Note healthy ways you've coped and calmed in the past that have worked for you without causing extra problems in your life (walk, talk to friend, art, deep breathing, podcast, ocean). Write one coping shift you'd like to make to tend better to your

you find yourself being defensive, not listening well, or pushing away those you love. Take 10 minutes to reflect on how you are experiencing and showing up in your most important relationships. Note relationships that feel unhealthy and why. Note relationships that feel pos-

itive/supportive and why. Note your behavior patterns that are causing problems in your relationships. Write one shift you'd like to make to tend better to your relationships.

Making changes to prioritize caring for yourself can feel challenging. Try remembering that you must take care of yourself consistently to show up well in your family, work and community life. All aspects of your life suffer when you are at the bottom of your life "to do" list. Switch to LED lights when decorating. LED lights use 80 to 90% less energy than incandescent lights. Electronics are always a popular gift. You can get those electronics and save energy. When choosing electronics: TV's, computers, gaming consoles, etc., always look for Energy Star qualified electronics. These qualified electronics use less energy and save energy. Rechargeable batteries and LED lighting might not be on top of anyone's list, but they make great stocking stuffers and save energy. Also, consider using smart power strips and turn off the electronics completely. Many electronics, even when powered off, still use energy. I call them energy vamnires

If you plan to leave this holiday season, think about automating your home. Put exterior and interior lighting on timers to avoid being on all day and night. Add a thermostat which you can control via Wi-Fi and your smart phone, in the event we get a cold streak or heat wave during the time you are away, you can control your home's temperature. Also, remember to unplug those energy vampire electronics which use energy even when turned off.

When shopping for groceries, buying local foods and goods not only supports our community, but saves energy by reducing transportation-related energy costs.

Thanksgiving week brought encouraging news (according to the Wall Street Journal) that supply chain logjams might be loosening. The administration, in trying to give some relief to gas prices, was set to make releases from the Strategic Petroleum Reserve (SPR). Bill Gates' TerraPower (according to CNBC) is planning to build a nuclear plant in a Wyoming coal town. According to the Nuclear Energy Institute, nuclear energy's avoidance of CO2 emissions in 2019 was the equivalent of removing 100 million cars from the road. We are beginning to think that nuclear is re-emerging as a source of clean alternative energy for electricity and that investors should take note.

The first of perhaps two infrastructure bills has been passed and signed by the president. Inflation is running at its highest reported levels in over 30 years. The Federal Reserve is prepared to start scaling back its asset purchases which might slow the growth of the money supply. We think that means that mortgage rates might begin a (very slow) ascent. That could impact home builders and suppliers as well.

The labor shortage continues. We understand this has been fueled by early retirements, women leaving the workforce to care for children, the elderly and those that have chosen to step out of the workforce temporarily. The labor participation rate is at a record low of 61.6% of the eligible working population. It was at about 67% at the beginning of the century. The implication for investors is that companies will be accelerating their demand for innovations from artificial intelligence and automation. While productivity in the American workplace remains high it will be challenged as the cost of labor is going up at an increasing rate. Low revenue industries, such as hospitality and restaurants, will

need to look at ways to maintain their productivity. We took note recently while dining at a fast-food establishment, that the ordering and paying process was all automated. It was fast and efficient, and our food was delivered swiftly by a smiling kitchen worker. The sign of more things like this to come. We think investors should consider those tech firms that are leaders in AI and automation.

Might AI and automation have an impact on carbon sequestration efforts? According to The Economist, while deforestation has generally decreased across the globe (with exceptions in a few key areas of the world that have been relied upon as carbon sinks such as the Brazilian rain forest), the rate of reforestation has decreased as well. The use of nuclear energy to power AI might help companies and countries satisfy their energy demands – and at the same time address climate issues as nuclear burns cleaner than carbon. Investors might consider utility stocks that have nuclear as part of their energy production mix.

The President has re-nominated current Fed chairman Jerome Powell as well as nominated Lael Brainard as Vice Chair. The belief in the media is that these two leaders have a track record favoring an expanding money supply despite the current Fed concerns about inflation. We think investors should therefore look at what that might mean: 1) Higher yields in the bond market (typically that is favorable for banks) 2) greater focus on materials, commodities, and 3) all kinds of real estate.

An additional word about banks. They are increasingly looking for ways to participate in the cryptocurrency markets. They are doing this by either creating whole departments to accommodate their clients for investing and/or utilizing crypto as a means for transactions.

Electric vehicles (EV's) continue to grow investor interest. More companies, in addition to established manufacturers, are getting into the business and initiating public offerings. Our concern is that many of these have low to no revenues or low to no production and their valuations are quite high. We think back to the dot.com era in the early 2000s and are left wondering if this time things are once again not different. We encourage our clients to recognize the opportunity that EVs bring but to exercise caution with those companies that have recently gone public. We also appreciate that although EVs are growing, there will still be considerable demand for gasoline in the world. We also wonder, can green energy grow fast enough to keep up with increasing demand? Nonetheless, we think investors should also be on the lookout for stocks of firms that are engaged in the extraction and production of those materials needed for batteries to run those EVs. Investors should also watch the legislation that might increase the tax credit for

While all of this is going on, today's retirees and many investors report they want and/ or need income/yield. Add to that, the real rate of return is declining as inflation is increasing. Traditionally, CDs, bonds, and perhaps pensions or annuities would have provided for that. Increasingly, people are turning to dividend paying stocks. Take note, that does however increase the risk to the investor. We suggest that clients looking at stocks for dividends examine three areas: 1) Dividend aristocrat stocks. What makes a stock a dividend aristocrat? Our understanding is that it must be in the S&P 500 and have increased its dividend for the past 25 years. 2) Real Estate Income Trusts. There are a variety of REITs, and many invest in apartment communities, warehouses, data (cloud) centers, cell towers, shopping malls and housing developments. Investors can scrutinize for income as well as growth potential. 3) Enhanced dividend and income strategies through mutual funds, ETFs or Separately Managed Accounts (SMAs) that invest in dividend stocks, but also earn premium income from options. Each has its own risks and potential benefits, and investors should scrutinize those carefully.

Be Intentional:


Fill your mind with words that encourage and lift you or others up as a person.

I think that level of input and feedback I gained from the judges that first year, really pushed me to get even better, and work on the aspects of my performance that I could best control to my advantage."

After her first attempt, and what she had learned from that tryout, Emily was determined to go back the following year, where did much better in front of the judges. Though she didn't make the final cut, she did get to perform live in front of all of The Voice's millions of television viewers two years in a row, and says the time she spent with the other artists and the judges has been very valuable in continuing her musical quest.

In addition to her performances – most recently opening for Cole Swindell this November – Emily writes and co-writes many of her own songs, and had just returned from recording in Los Angeles the day before we sat down at The Wave in Destin for this interview. Additionally, she's made recent trips to Nashville where she is recording to work for future releases with other artists, as well as working on plans for more upcoming performances in the new year, both locally and throughout the country. "I've been writing a lot and really love the creative aspect of songwriting, both for myself and with other writers,' Emily told me.

"Dear Emily," her breakup song about giving advice to her ex boyfriend's new love interest, is definitely an intriguing and well-written lyrical piece that gets even better when her passion for the self-written tune shows in her presentation. When you hear her lyrical composition, it really takes you by surprise that she's only 18 years old, yet has all this life experience to pull and write from. It's very akin to what people thought about Taylor Swift's first few albums of work. The same can be said for her single, "Sometimes," featuring her friend Michael Williams.

Emily says she is currently working on a new EP coming in the next six months, with one of her new singles "I'll Just Not" dropping on all platforms on January 21st. 
