Keeping Military Families Together During Times of Medical Need

Publisher's Note: Our area is blessed with several military installations, serving thousands of military personnel and possessing a significant deployment commitment. Consequently, our family and friends in the military are continuously placed in harm's way. Fortunately, we have Fisher House, which provides a home away from home with no fee, where our military and their families from throughout the U.S. receive caring, unconditional support.

Fisher House of the Emerald Coast is a tangible "thank you" for those who have served in the military. Located on Eglin Air Force Base, across the street from the hospital and VA Clinic, this nearly 11,000 square foot five-star facility includes 12 private suites, a large common kitchen and areas where guests can rest and renew. Any time a military member or family member is being treated at any local medical facility, they are eligible to use the Fisher House.



The idea of Fisher House first started in the 1970s when Pauline Trost, the wife of Admiral Trost, saw an injured combat veteran return home and wondered where the family would stay during this time of crisis. She knew high-priced hotels would only add a financial burden to an

already difficult time. This thought never left her and it led to a critical partnership. Pauline brought the need for housing to her husband, and he reached out to Zachary and Elizabeth Fisher who were builders, philanthropists and patriots. They caught the vision immediately and went

to work. Since then, the Fishers have donated more than \$20 million in the building of homes that receive families of hospitalized military personnel, free of charge. Today, the number of homes has grown

to 92 throughout the U.S. Fisher House of the Emerald Coast, our area's own, was built in 2010 and was number 48.

In 2019, Fisher House of the Emerald Coast hosted more than 1,100 guests and provided 2,900 bed nights, saving military families over \$290,000 in lodging.

It is the goal of Mia Hughes, our local Fisher House's Executive Director, for Fisher House of the Emerald Coast to be a home away from home when our military members need it the most. "If it's the birth of a baby and grandma doesn't live here but wants to come, she can stay at Fisher House. We've also had babies that were delivered, but mom got ill and couldn't be around the baby," Mia says. "They've stayed at our house so they could be close. On the other end of the spectrum, we've also had guests who were dealing with end-of-life situations



and were in their last stages. During the pandemic, however, because it's a military installation, they restricted some of the access. Life-ending scenarios were given higher priority."

"Many of our guests will only stay a few days, but our record is 13 months," Mia continued. "One family had a member going through oncology treatments and they were able to stay here. Before that, a guest of 11 months was blinded during the battle in Afghanistan, and he used our home for therapy. Fisher House was built to help lighten their load."

Fisher House of the Emer-



ald Coast serves every branch of the military from Pensacola to Panama City. So, guests will not be more than an hour from the therapies and services they require.

Fundraising efforts are continual; monies raised provide much needed funding to the house to support the operation and the maintenance of the home, and to provide the families with any necessary items needed during their stay. Are you interested in partnering with Fisher House? Mark your calendar to attend the Fisher House gala on October 27th with guest speaker Joey Jones,

Fox News Contributor and former marine who lost both his legs in combat.

There are additional unique ways you can help as well. "We've had corporate teams come for one week in the spring and fall to help clean the house," says Mia. "They do it for team building and we're always so grateful for the extra help. It's their way of giving back."

"We also have a young guy who lives in Birmingham, and his mom, who was a volunteer, passed away in 2016. On the anniversary of her passing, he comes to the Fisher House and makes her recipe for Cornish

Hens for those there at the time. It's his memorial tribute to his mom and he does it every year he can," she says.

Fisher House accepts meal donations, enough for eight to 12 people, on Tuesdays, Wednesdays and Thursdays. Because Covid protocols are still in place, the food needs to come from local restaurants. Although the fridge is always fully stocked, these needed donations bridge the gap. If guests have specific dietary needs or desires, the staff does their best to accommodate them as well to make the stay easier. As Mia says, "We love making people happy and want this to feel like home.'

past the fact that our beaches continue to be a major Spring Break hot spot for college and high school students, families and locals. The influx brings an economic boost to local businesses, but also the stereotypical crowded beaches and roadways.

The primary goal of the Okaloosa County Sheriff's Office (OCSO) during the time span that runs February 26th through April 24th this year is simple – keep people safe. "To a large extent, that involves putting the brakes on underage drinking, which often leads to binge drinking and all the related safety issues that can follow," said Sheriff Eric Aden. "As always, we have a zero-tolerance policy for underage possession of alcohol."

Last year over a 51-day peri-

od, the OCSO made 700 Spring Break arrests, the vast majority for underage possession of alcohol. 518 of those arrests were in Destin and 182 took place on Okaloosa Island. Members of the OCSO Beach Unit initiated 422 of the 700 total arrests. In addition, 125 of those arrests involved juveniles.

If caught with alcohol, juveniles ages 17 and under are issued a notice to appear and released to an adult.

Individuals 18, 19 or 20 years of age in possession of an alcoholic beverage are arrested and given a notice to appear before a judge.

Our public safety efforts are part of a partnership with the Tourist Development Council, the City of Destin and other first responder partners to include Fire, EMS, Florida Fish and Wildlife and the Florida Highway Patrol.



Property owners and managers also play a big role. We recommend they take preventative safety measures as well. Good strategies are to have your security disperse larger groups loitering on your property before the situation gets out of hand, monitor for law violations and report those promptly, evict guests who won't comply with the rules and, of course, contact us with any questions.

The OCSO will have extra beach patrols alongside an en-

hanced number of deputies on the roads. In addition, many area hotels and condos hire off-duty deputies for added Spring Break security.

"As we've said in the past, the vast majority of our visitors come down, have a wonderful time, and cause no problems. They get to leave here with great memories," said Sheriff Aden. "For that small percentage, how-

ever, who don't follow the rules and act responsibly, there will be consequences."

In the meantime, whether they love it or just tolerate it, most locals know what to expect during the Spring Break season.

"Stay vigilant on the roadways and exercise patience. Our deputies will be out there doing our best to keep the peace and keep everybody safe, because ultimately that's our biggest concern."

Amvets Set Ride To Fight Autism

There is no cure for Autism Spectrum Disorder. And the expenses for families with a member who has autism are steep. The Centers for Disease Control estimates that, in addition to medical costs, intensive behavioral interventions for children with autism cost \$40,000 to \$60,000 per child per year.

Amvets Post 78 of Valparaiso is there to help.

On April 2, the veteran's organization will sponsor the third annual Amvets 4 Autism All Wheels Poker Run, to benefit the Autism Spectrum on the Emerald Coast.

This is the third such event the Amvets have held, according to Geno Teichert, a member of the board of trustees. And its growth has been phenomenal.

"Last year, we had at least 75 entrants," Teichert said. "We

have a bunch. A lot of people go to the stops and don't make it back to the post."

The poker run will feature five stops. Leaving at 10:30 a.m. from the Amvets post, riders will stop at Nick's Seafood in Freeport, Amvets Post 178 in DeFuniak Springs, Amvets Post 35 in Crestview and return to the local post about 3:30 p.m., where they'll receive a meal and enjoy live entertainment. The cost is \$25 per rider and \$15 per passenger. The first 100 registrants receive a free T-shirt. Registration kicks off at 9 a.m. and coffee and donuts will be available.

"It's over by 5 or 6, Teichert said. "It's a long day, but we do it for the kids. We just want a bunch of riders. The more the better, the more money it makes.'

The first year of the event garnered about \$4,000. Last year, it brought in about \$9,000.

Numerous valuable prizes will be awarded, such as a \$500 gift certificate for Jamie's Gun Shop. "We're getting sponsors," Teichert said. "A lot of grocery stores give us gift certificates'



In Memory of 'Chappie': 1st U.S. Black 4-Star General

There are numerous Black American service members who broke barriers and could be highlighted during Black History Month. On Feb. 11 however, it is the 101st birthday of Gen. Daniel "Chappie" James Jr., the first Black man to become a four-star general in any U.S. military branch.

James died shortly after he left service in 1978, but his accomplishments are worth celebration. As an African American Airman who served in three wars, James overcame extreme poverty, racism and segregation—including in the military—to become a skilled tactician in

combat and a steady-handed leader whose speeches on patriotism and the American way were highly regarded.

Humble beginnings

James was born Feb. 11, 1920, in Pensacola, Florida, and was the youngest of 17 children. His dad was a laborer at a gas company and his mother was a teacher.

When James was young, his mother decided she would teach her own children because she wasn't impressed with the quality of education at the local segregated public school, according to an Air Force Magazine article. She started her own school,

which gradually attracted other neighborhood kids. She ran the school for 52 years until she died at the age of 82.

One of the most memorable things she taught her pupils was to never quit. Clearly, her youngest son took that to heart.

From dreams to reality

As a Black child in the segregated South, James wasn't sure what type of job he would one day be able to get, but he grew up watching the takeoffs and landings at nearby Pensacola Naval Air Station, Florida, which gave him the dream of being a pilot.

Chappie, as they called him

— a nickname that was his brother Charles' until Charles passed it down to James – graduated high school in 1937. At 6 feet, 4 inches tall and 250 pounds, the athletic teen earned himself a football scholarship to the famed Tuskegee Institute in Alabama

James was expelled from his academic studies at Tuskegee during his senior year for going on too many "escapades" that were frowned upon by the institution, said Howard E. Halvorsen, Air Force historian. However, he was still able to attend the Civilian Pilot Training Program offered through Tuskegee. It was one of the first training opportunities offered to minorities.

He graduated from the program in March 1942 with his civilian pilot certification. He eventually earned a bachelor's degree from Tuskegee too, Halvorsen said, but he didn't get that until 1969 when the school

awarded him the degree based on the credit hours he'd earned during his military career.

James met his wife, Dorothy Watkins, while they were both enrolled at Tuskegee. They married on the campus in November 1942 and had a daughter and two sons. The oldest of the two sons, Daniel James III, went on to have his own illustrious Air Force career.

James stayed at Tuskegee as a civilian instructor pilot for the Army Air Corps Aviation Cadet Program until January 1943, when he joined the program himself.

He was commissioned into the Army Air Corps the following July. He was never sent overseas to fight in World War II after he completed his fighter pilot combat training. Instead, he spent the next several years training cadets in the U.S.

Combat capable

When the Air Force began implementing its desegregation plan in 1949, James was finally sent overseas. He was assigned to the 18th Fighter Wing's 12th Fighter-Bomber Squadron, an integrated unit in the Philippines. James later told his son that very few white service members initially talked to him, but he persisted anyway.

James was sent to Korea in July 1950 as part of the Korean War and completed 101 combat missions during his deployment. A year later, he was back in the U.S. and working his way up the ranks, including a stint at the Pentagon.

By the time the Vietnam War began, he was a colonel. In June 1967, James deployed to Ubon Royal Thai Air Force Base, Thailand, where he was named vice commander of the 8th Tactical Fighter Wing. The unit was under the command of then-Col. Robin Olds, who James knew from working at the Pentagon.

James flew 78 combat missions into North Vietnam and helped Olds plan and lead the famed Operation Bolo in January 1967.

In what's often considered the greatest air battle of the war, U.S. fighters destroyed seven enemy MiG-21 aircraft during Operation Bolo, which was the



highest total kill of any air mission during Vietnam. The mission, which saw no U.S. losses, is how the 8th TFW earned its nickname "The Wolf Pack" — because Olds told his pilots they would be "wolves in sheep's clothing."

Steady under pressure

After returning to the U.S., James served as vice commander of the 33rd Tactical Fighter Wing at Eglin Air Force Base, Florida.

He was persistent, tactically skillful and seen as a steady

combat leader — attributes that earned him his next role as the commander of the 7272nd Fighter Training Wing at Wheelus Air Base in Libya. It was August of 1969, and Muammar Gadhafi had just successfully overthrown the Libyan king.

The U.S. had agreed to turn Wheelus AB over to the Libyans prior to the coup, and James was responsible for the withdrawal. He kept a cool head despite the tensions, which led to a successful and conflict-free drawdown.

"James' leadership and diplomatic skills were put to full use in that delicate situation in which the new anti-Western, radical Libyan leader sought to expel the Air Force," Halvorsen said. "Back home, James' speeches on Americanism and patriotism were so well regarded, many were read into the Congressional Record."

Military officials had begun to take notice of his public speaking skills when James was at Eglin AFB. After Libya, he was tapped to be a deputy assistant secretary of defense for public affairs. When he took the job in March 1970, he was also promoted to brigadier general, making him the first Black general in the Air Force.

In September 1974, James took over as vice commander of

the Military Airlift Command based at Scott Air Force Base, Illinois. He had been promoted twice by this time, attaining his third star as lieutenant general.

Making history ... again

On Sept. 1, 1975, James was officially promoted to the rank of four-star general, becoming the first Black man to attain the rank in the U.S. military.

"If my making an advancement can serve as some kind of spark to some young Black or other minority, it will be worth all the years, all the blood and sweat it took in getting here," {-James said upon earning a fourth star.}

Along with the promotion came the position of commander in chief of North American Aerospace Defense Command, which gave him operational command of all U.S. and Canadian strategic aerospace defense forces.

In December 1977, James took over as special assistant to the U.S. Air Force chief of staff,

but he retired two months later on Feb. 1, 1978, for health reasons. Sadly, James died in late February 1978 of a heart attack. The 58-year-old was buried in Arlington National Cemetery.

Legacy

James' successes earned him numerous military and national accolades throughout his career, including the George Washington Freedom Foundation Medal in 1967 and 1968. He was also awarded honorary Juris Doctor degrees from at least five higher-education institutions – along with his Tuskegee degree.

James' name lives on across the military, but perhaps most notably at the institution at which his career started.

In May 1987, Tuskegee University dedicated the Gen. Daniel "Chappie" James Jr. Center for Aerospace Science and Health Education to the general. The center includes the James Center Arena, where the school's basketball teams currently play.

Trey Gowdy: Beyond a Reasonable Doubt

Northwest Florida State College President Devin Stephenson is a visionary with purposeful determination. His caliber of speakers for the "President's Speaker Series" reflects his keen leadership and focus. I consider Dr. Stephenson to be a persuasive communicator in his own right.

Most people have heard the cliché that "You get what you pay for." Frequently, a true statement indeed, unless someone else foots the bill and invites you to come. This speaker series is FREE to the public, and Trey Gowdy packed the Mattie Kelly Arts Center with an eager, enthusiastic crowd.

When someone mentions Trey Gowdy, people tend to have opinions of him at opposite ends of an ever-widening spectrum. They generally admire him greatly or vociferously criticize him. Unfortunately, this is the political climate of twenty-first-century America. No matter, Trey poured out his heart, humbly baring his soul to a spellbound audience.

Trey started his message with amusing quips and stories that ingratiated him to his audience, but his innate passion showed as things turned serious. The audience sat on the edge of their seats, wondering what was coming next. Trey revealed himself as someone not ready to yank America's life support from its socket. Instead, he believes that America needs to rediscover who we are, where we are going, and how to get where we need to be.

Granted, we are a politically divided country with red and blue sides more willing to shout things out than attempt to understand what drives the passions of the other side. Trey pointed out that every day carries the sense of it being like election day. So few people are forging relationships outside their sphere of fellow cheerleaders. He urged his audience to display an uncommon form of grace to bring us closer together.

Trey frequently transitioned to talk about his family and good friend and co-author, Senator Tim Scott. They developed

a close bond as they spent many eating opportunities together at the Capitol Hill Club. Trey told the audience of Senator Scott's upbringing with his grandfather, who picked cotton and never learned to read. Yet, his grandfather believed in the power of knowledge and the magic of education, and he thought these things would make a difference in his grandson's future. His grandfather raised a grandson who became a U.S. Senator and author of a New York Times #1 Best Seller.

Trey mentioned meeting his wife through a church youth group and traveling and the importance of faith, sometimes shaken by his life experiences. His early career included prosecuting the worst criminals and how these interactions took their toll mentally, spiritually and physically. Like many politicians, Trey Gowdy left his hometown of Spartanburg, South Carolina, for our country's capital to make a difference.

If you watch his famous social media sound bites, he comes across as a skilled prosecutor interrogating political adversaries. In person, he also comes across as genuine and caring.

After one hour of clearly articulating his thought-provoking speech, the last question pinpointed how this master of persuasion had moved many juries to agree with him beyond a reasonable doubt. He was asked why he was advocating compromise, although he never alluded to compromising with whom you disagree. Absent a court reporter to retrace his words; interrogator Gowdy kicked into overdrive to reiterate that he promoted dialogue—persuasion over argument. He encouraged

sincere communication with empathy, not a win-at-any-costs methodology.

Trey never alluded to compromising one's beliefs. Instead, he pleaded for people to search for common ground. He encouraged practicing the art of persuasion rather than using insults as a means of self-validation. His appeal: we all should make an effort to listen to the "other side." Insults make others determined not to give up any ground, and the mentality of crushing your opposition has eroded our society's fabric.

Trey encouraged talking responsibly and ending the bitter feuding and fussing with neither side desiring to listen and learn from the other. His point was to be fair-minded yet encourage people to think for themselves.

If you are one of those folks that needs neither, bully for you! However, even you should still take this time to conduct further research into whether the doctors, hospitals and pharmacies you favor are included in your network at a reasonable cost. One point of note: If you have already made a change during this Open Enrollment Period, you have used your last bite at the apple for the year. Changes made during this period are final and cannot be changed. If you have yet to use this last chance opportunity then, you still have that one chance available.

Call people local and knowledgeable to get the details that matter to you. Once you make that final call for the Open Enrollment Period, you can sit back and relax in the comfort of knowing you did the very best for you. Happy 2022!

John Farrow Has Construction In His Blood

John Farrow was born to be a contractor.

He said he became interested in construction "probably about the time I was 4 and started playing with Legos and building blocks. In summers in high school, I'd actually go work on construction sites." He also put himself through school by working construction.

"I decided I love this, this is what I want to do and I went for my contractor's license," he said.







Today, John is owner of Farrow Commercial Construction, handling residential, commercial and fire and disaster recovery, founded and headquartered in Sonoma County, Calif.

In Destin, John has opened Farrow Contracting, Inc.

"We'd been coming to Destin for 20 years," the San Francisco native said. "We have family here. We love the governor of Florida, we love the area and we love the people."

John, 55, and his wife, J.K, have lived in Destin for about five years. But they soon will become landed gentry as they're in escrow and are about to close on a ranch in Laurel Hill. There, they can enjoy Florida, Okaloosa County and their horses. They have two daughters, Montana, 24, and Peyton, 21 and a Son, Clayton, 19. John said Montana will soon join the firm as project manager.

"I've had the personal benefit of working with folks here and I believe the way I do construction will be a huge benefit to the folks here in Florida," John said. "We think we can make a difference and one of my slogans is that I like to do things differently."

That penchant for innovation has come in handy in several Farrow Commercial Construction jobs.

The most challenging commercial job took place at the Magnolia Hotel in downtown Denver.

Fun Drivers You Can Still Buy with a Manual

If you're an automotive junky like me, and anywhere north of age 30, you can probably remember a day when all the cool cars had stick shifts and three pedals. It just seemed like a part of driving; that feeling of being at one with the car often associated with effortlesslyand oftentimes aggressivelyshifting through the gears, while feeling a big smile come across your face that made you feel as if you could race cars for a liv-

Over the past 20 years, however, increased technology brought the end of manual transmission cars being quicker than their auto shifting counterparts of the same model. This led to less manuals being produced, until such time that many people under 30 never even learned to drive one. Nowadays, making a stick-shift about the best automobile theft deterrent device you can have. With only 27 new cars even available in manual formats for the 2022 year, here are some of the sportier ones that can still put that big smile on your face as you run through the gears.

BMW M 3, M 4 and 2 Series

As someone who loves the responsive drive of a BMW, I'm encouraged that the brand decided to continue offering a manual trans in at least some models. My wife and I own a classic M Roadster as a weekend/fun car, and as cool as it is with the top down and that quad exhaust roaring, I can't imagine that car being even half as much fun if it was an automatic.

All M3 cars since the original E30 offered a manual, and BMW has chosen to keep that an option in their new M 2, 3 and 4 cars also. I mean who'd want 473 hp in a new M3 and not be able to clutch and shift? To be fair, I had a 4 Series coupe a few daily drivers ago, and I did enjoy that automatic with its paddle shifters. In addition to the M3 and M4 variants, reardrive 230i, M240i, M2 Competition, and M2 CS can all be had with a stick.

Chevy Camaro

The brand with the blue bowtie might not offer a manual in the new mid-engine Corvette, but you can still get a six-speed stick in every version of the Camaro. So, whether you choose



the base turbo 2.0, the ZL1 or 1LE with the rambunctious supercharged 6.2-liter V-8, you can still show your muscle car's muscle while flexing your own a little, too.

Ford Mustang

I get that a lot of people probably haven't been opting for manuals in their pony cars for decades. But, the fact that you can is cool. Every 2022 model other than the range-topping Shelby GT500—offers a manual option, whether you choose the turbo-four, 5.0 GT, the 480hp Bullitt (probably my favorite current Stang) or the Mach 1.

Contrary to what some may think about a Miata, it's regarded by most true auto aficionados to be one of the purest back-tobasic sportscars you can own. Pretty much what owning an early 70's Lotus Elise was five decades ago... but with reliable mechanicals in the Miata.

Ever since the first generation car hit the U.S. market in 1990, the Miata has offered a manual transmission to accompany the little rear-drive's sporty handling, peppy high-revving four, and well-balanced suspension. Driving a Miata at half its potential is often more fun than driving most cars... and the manual trans certainly plays a big part in that equation.

Toyota 86 and Subaru BRZ

I'm grouping these fun little sportscars together since the Toyota 86 and Subaru BRZ have been co-developed from beginning—back when the 86 was originally badged as a Scion FRS. Both of these well-balanced 2+2s were reworked offering new designs, in and out, for 2022. Though each car offers a different engine based on its individual brand, they're very much alike in every other way; including the fact that both can be had with a sixspeed manual.

Porsche 911, 718 Boxster, and 718 Cayman

I hope we never see a time when you can't get a new Porsche sportscar with a manual trans. Though having owned seven Porsches over the years, I understand why some people who buy them as daily drivers choose the ultra-convenient, and fast shifting, dual-clutch automatics.

For 2022, every variation of Porsche's mid-engine Boxster and Cayman comes with a stick as standard equipment, while the automatic is an option. In fact, the six-speed remains the only transmission available in the ultra-cool Boxster Spyder and race-bred Cayman GT4 iterations.

As for the iconic 911, every model comes standard with a manual, with the dual-clutch automatic available as the noextra-cost option. Personally, I can't imagine buying a 500 hp 911 GT3 and not being able to dump the clutch and sling the rear-end out while laying black marks through first, second and third. Different strokes for different folks though.





"Boat Yard" Artificial Reef Site Expands

For those who dive, the wait is over for the county's most recent expansion of its artificial reef program. Okaloosa County Tourist Development Department (TDD) Destin-Fort Walton Beach Tourism expanded fishing and diving opportunities with the deployment of a decommissioned tugboat— MISS JOANN). The 64-foot vessel is an addition to nearly 400 artificial reef sites offshore Okaloosa County.

Morgan Marine deployed MISS JOANN with oversight from the Destin-Fort Walton Beach Coastal Resource team on March 2. "We are fortunate to have a Coastal Resource Team dedicated to the continued growth of the artificial reef program," said Okaloosa County Board of County Commissioners Chairman Mel Ponder. "Fishing and diving are important coastal activities to our county and reefs like this offer such a unique underwater experience for divers and snorkelers, not to mention an excellent opportunity for anglers."

In 2021, Morgan Marine was notified by the U.S. Coast Guard that its tugboat would require significant retrofits to bring it into compliance. Rather than invest significant funds in an older vessel, Morgan Marine donated the vessel to Okaloosa County to deploy as an artificial reef. Okaloosa County funded the remaining preparations and costs associated with the deployment. "Artificial reefs are essential to our community that depends heavily on fishing and diving as a recreational activity and tourism product. We lack the offshore natural reef habitat; therefore, artificial reefs are even more important here. The MISS JOANN will be a great addition to our artificial reef program and we hope it will be visited by divers and fisherman for years to come," said Alex

MISS JOANN will accompany two previously deployed vessels, the DYLAN (61 ft.) and the BRANNON (65 ft.). Due to the smaller sizes of these existing artificial reefs, the MISS JOANN was deployed in close proximity to the existing vessels in 119 feet of water, but with 40 feet of relief, will provide a shallower option to the site if visitors don't wish to dive the deeper wrecks. The additional relief also provides habitat that supports prized fish species such as Amberjack and Cobia. The vessels are secured to each other for increased stability and to provide additional complexity to the site that has been named the "Boat Yard."

MISS JOANN was deployed 16.43nm SE of Destin Pass in the Okaloosa County Large Area Artificial Reef Site A (LAARS A).

For those who don't know, artificial reefs are man-made structures built to promote marine life and, in some cases, improve surfing. The reef struc-

paddleboards and kayaks out to our local reefs and enjoy the wildlife scenery such as turtles, stingrays and more. While they are free to visit, remember you are accessing them at your own risk. Always remember to heed the tides and the local beach flag system for safety.

A donation, by a private party, to Coastal Conservation Association Florida (CCA Florida) leads to the first redfish restocking initiative in Choctawhatchee Bay.

Help FWC Report Horseshoe Crabs

It's almost spring and that means it's peak mating season for horseshoe crabs. Help biologists with the Florida Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission (FWC) gather valuable information about these ancient creatures by reporting sightings on the online survey at https://survey123.arcgis.com.

Horseshoe crabs have blue blood which is very expensive, but with numerous medical benefits. Due to this coveted resource, it's become vulnerable to extinction. But, this highly-valuable resource worth protecting.

Horseshoe crabs mate by pairing up, with the smaller male attached to the larger female. They then crawl onto the beach up to the high tide line where the female digs a nest and lays her eggs, all while the male is attached and fertilizing the freshly laid eggs. They mate year-round, but it is most common to see

mating groups along the shore of sandy, lower wave action beaches from March through October. Each season, usually May or June in our area, just one female crab can lay as many as 80,000 eggs!

Unlike other crabs, horseshoe crabs aren't actually crustaceans



- they don't have antennae and they have multiple eyes. They are an arachnid (in the spider family).

You will have the most luck spotting horseshoe crabs around high tide within a few days of a new or full moon. If you see a horseshoe crab on its back, you can help it flip back over by gently picking it up (holding both sides of the shell), turning it over and releasing it back into the water. Simple actions such as this help conserve this species and the many other species that depend on it.

Reporting horseshoe crab sightings provides valuable information about habitat use, population distribution and environmental conditions for nesting to the FWC. Although horseshoe crabs have existed for more than 450 million years, scientists are still learning about Florida populations. Public sighting information helps FWC researchers target nesting beaches for the Florida Horseshoe Crab Watch Program, a citizen science based initiative to collect data throughout the state.

You can report sightings by visiting MyFWC.com/research and clicking on "Crustaceans" then "Horseshoe Crabs" and selecting "Report Your Nesting Horseshoe Crab Sighting."

Gopher Tortoise Day is April 10!

Since its founding six years ago, Gopher Tortoise Day has been celebrated annually to raise awareness for Florida's only native tortoise. April 10 is approaching quickly, and now is the time to begin prepping festivities for this yearly event.

Ways to prepare for and celebrate Gopher Tortoise Day

Urge your local government to adopt a resolution proclaiming April 10 as Gopher Tortoise Day.

Get involved! Host or attend an event to raise awareness for gopher tortoises.

Spread the news on social media using #FWC and #GopherTortoiseDay.

Plan local events, such as invasive plant pulls or greenspace litter pickups, to help improve gopher tortoise habitat. Be sure to get proper approvals.

The gopher tortoise plays a significant role in many of Florida's ecosystems and deserves our recognition. Gopher tortoises are considered a keystone species, as their burrows provide refuge for over 350 different species of wildlife. Burrow associates range from common animals such as opossums and rat snakes, to rarer and lesser-known species such as the punctuate gopher tortoise onthophagus beetle and the Eastern indigo snake. Without gopher tortoises and their burrows, there would be fewer of these species. Some species could even go extinct! By raising awareness for this threat-



ened species, we can all help to make sure gopher tortoises and all the other important species





We eat it to celebrate, comfort our souls and give as gifts. Enjoying special moments is a good thing. But even if you're an occasional sweet eater, you might be eating much more than you think. Sugar is more addictive than cocaine and causes inflammation which is the root cause of most diseases.

Sugar is in almost everything we eat: fruits, vegetables, breads, dairy (lactose), sweets, boxed, canned and frozen foods and the list goes on. Did you know that manufacturers add sugar to 74% of all packaged foods? There are currently 61 names for sugar not counting artificial sweeteners. Regarding the latter, these have been associated with headaches, depression, fatigue, memory loss, gastrointestinal problems, etc.

Both sugar and inflammation can rob our cells of the required nutrients they need to function at their optimal levels. And since sugar has no nutritional value, it has to 'borrow' nutrients to digest it. It depletes the body of vitamins C and E and is particularly draining to the B vitamin complex. It also leeches minerals such as calcium and magnesium from your bones and teeth.

Added to this list are refined carbohydrates such as pasta and breads. The body turns these into sugar for energy. However, the body doesn't recognize these as 'real foods' and processes them differently than it would a whole grain bread or gluten free

Breast Cancer

Breast cancer is the leading cause of cancer in women and the second leading cause of death from cancer in women. Metastatic breast cancer tends to invade the bone causing intense pain and invades the brain causing dementia and memory loss. It is not a pleasant way to finish your days. Breast cancer

survivors will tell you that the return of breast cancer is something that weighs on their mind anytime something seems different. A catch in your back, a weird cough, or any number of minor issues can trigger that fear that the cancer might be returning. In addition, cancer treatments are invasive, painful and life altering. Prevention is really the key to survival.

But what is the likelihood of a woman getting breast cancer? When you look at all women, the risk seems relatively low. The rate of breast cancer in women is about 2.6%, but this number is deceptive because this is the risk for all women. What is my risk of breast cancer? This is the question women really want to know the answer to. There are many factors involved, but ad-

vancing age is a major factor and the risk of breast cancer with advancing age can be as high as 16%.

The Women's Health Initiative was a study started in 1991 and stopped in 2005. It originally reported that giving estrogen to postmenopausal women increased their risk of breast cancer. Unfortunately, this report was not entirely accurate. What this study showed was that women who received synthetic estrogen (estrins) have a higher incidence of breast cancer while women who received bio-identical estrogen (estradiol) actually had a lower risk of breast cancer. This change has been published, but was not reported with the fervor of the original reports. As well, not only did these women have a lower risk of breast cancer, but also a lower risk of strokes and heart attacks as well.

A recent study was published in 2019 which looked at breast cancer risk in women who received testosterone pellet therapy. Yes, testosterone. Women have an idea that they don't need testosterone, but this is not true. In fact, women make testosterone in the ovaries and much of this testosterone gets converted to estrogen. So, women make more testosterone than estrogen. Anyway, the women in this study were followed for over 10 years. It turns out that the incidence of breast cancer in the women who received testosterone therapy was 40% lower than the women who did not receive testosterone.

So, now you see that both bio-identical estrogen and bio-identical testosterone reduce the risk of breast cancer. This doesn't even touch on the benefits to bone density, heart health, prevention of depression and anxiety, increases in libido and the many other proven benefits of both estrogen and testosterone therapy.




Joseph goes on to not only interpret the dreams for Pharaoh,

Thoughts for Investors So Far This Year

As bond yields have risen for most of this new year (The bell-weather 10-year U.S. Treasury is at 1.92% as of this writing), and that has had an impact on equity and bond markets. For equities, the NASDAQ, S&P and Dow are all negative YTD with the NASDAQ the most affected. The NASDAQ represents over 3500 stocks while the Dow represents 30 stocks, and the S&P represents 500 stocks. It is significant to take note that S&P 500 makes up over 70% of the value of all U.S. traded stocks.

Why have the markets seen negative performance for most of this year? Take note that

certain "sectors" – the eleven subsets of the market are not all equally weighted. The S&P 500 has 28% of its value in technology (TEC) stocks yet only about 3% in Energy Stocks. The TEC sector is down over 9% so far this year, while the ENE sector is up over 23%. If there is almost 10 times the value of TEC stocks vs. ENE stocks, it might make sense to see that that is what has driven a lot of the volatility and performance. Most of the household name TEC stocks are negative for the year. The main reason that TEC stocks have been more volatile is that when bond yields rise, investors (large institutional investors) historically have sold lower dividend stocks and rotated to higher dividend or so-called value stocks (TEC representing socalled growth stocks).

So, when you see money coming out of one sector and wonder where it may be going or rotating to, the above is one significant, and recent example. That may be leaving individual (as opposed to institutional) investors wondering what to do now. It is important to note that diversification, patience along

with staying informed and aware have served investors well. The Wall Street Journal recently had an article that quoted the legendary value investor Benjamin Graham. Graham was quoted to have said, "I don't know, (after many years of experience) what the market is going to do, but I do know what investors are likely to do." In other words. We tend to see that as investors being reactive vs. being proactive. A proactive strategy to us is one where goals, time lines and risk tolerance are well known and thought through and then a strategy is adapted and followed over time. Human nature and instinct are motivated by survival and, hence, investors might give up hope at the worst possible time. And timing is a key. When markets move, they move swiftly up or down. It is next to impossible to know when those movements are going to happen. Have a look at this excerpt from Raymond James' Weekly Headings on January 28th. It highlights the significance of time in the market vs. timing the market. The numbers are based upon the annualized rate of return of the S&P 500 over the past 20 years, which was approximately 5033 trading days:

- Average return for staying invested over the past 20 years: 7.3%
- \bullet Missed the best 5 days and your return would have averaged 4.9%
- Missed the best 10 days and your return would have averaged 3.2%
- \bullet Missed the best 15 days and your return would have averaged 1.8%
- \bullet Missed the best 20 days and your return would have averaged .6%
- On the other hand, what if you'd "known" which days to be "out" of the market:
- Missed the worst 20 days and your return would have averaged 15.2%
- Missed the worst 15 days and your return would have averaged 13.7%
- \bullet Missed the worst 10 days and your return would have averaged 12.1%
- Missed the worst 5 days and your return would have averaged 10.1%

The challenge is, who knows when those days will be? As the legendary Peter Lynch once said: "They don't ring a bell at the top and they don't ring a bell at the bottom." Again, market rallies and sell offs happen if a noticeably brief period making it almost impossible to predict.

We also encourage our clients to think about emerging trends which might be worth considering in their long-term strategy. We will start with semiconductors or computer chips. We have seen and heard a lot about the disruption that chip supply shortages have brought about. Chip production capability, advanced chips, have crimped revenues of many firms and contributed significantly to inflation. We note that advanced chip design is mainly in the U.S. and yet the advanced chips are manufactured overseas (Taiwan is the leader). Take note of the foundries (chip manufacturing plants) that are under construction or being planned in the U.S. Two of note are the multibillion-dollar facility that Taiwan Semiconductor is building in Arizona and the recently announced multi-billion-dollar facility to be built in Ohio by Intel. These are just two examples, but nonetheless, a trend we think is important. The U.S. sees the economic and strategic need to have these foundries in the U.S. vs. overseas.

The same can be said for battery production (for electric vehicles – EVs). The U.S. is a world leader in possessing the natural resources that go into these batteries, yet is the world's laggard when it comes to refining the minerals and manufacturing the batteries. That, too, is changing as seen in the focus of the U.S. government and the commensurate activity in building the production capability.

How impactful could this be? Look at liquified natural gas (LNG). The U.S. now leads the world in the export of this high in demand, cleaner burning fuel. It is used to create electric at power plants and to heat homes and power natural gas fueled vehicles. Many years ago, the multi-billion-dollar investment in the infrastructure that was needed, started to take shape. Many wondered why so much money was going in to liquification and export facilities as the world demand was not seen. Fast forward to today and you can see China's demand

has grown 50% which adds to the already resilient demand from Taiwan, South Korea and Japan. And now the U.S. has come to the aid of western Europe as countless ships are making their way there now loaded with LNG. The result has added to the earnings of ENE companies which are experiencing record revenues and hence cash flow and profitability.

Wrapping it all up we see that while the markets remain more unstable than they have been in the recent past, investors can continue to position their investments to participate in the ever-growing areas of opportunities represented in the world today and tomorrow.

Those childhood dreams were shattered when Liberia entered a civil war in 1989. Zhalman traded dreaming and childhood innocence for survival amidst random executions, famine, air strikes, cross fires and even escaping death during the gruesome war. Witnessing random executions and atrocities, Zhalman, in most ways still a child, emerges a resilient young man, with hopes and the ability to turn the darkest time of his life into something positive

Orphaned, but with extended family, Zhalman escaped his homeland, relocating to Ghana as a refugee. For 10 years on the



refugee camp, he waits... waits for comfort... waits for peace... and waits for a place to call home

The day Zhalman left Africa in the summer of 2000, he vowed never to go back, because of what he had seen and endured. Little did he know he would be overwhelmed with the urge to go back to Liberia 10 years later to help under-privileged children and educational needs.

Four years later in Destin, he met someone at a dinner party, who jointly set things in motion to go to Liberia. They





would start a foundation called Aletha's Hope in honor of his mother who was killed during that civil war in Liberia. A year later, Zhalman established Aletha's Legacy to focus on his commitment to meeting the educational needs of Liberia's orphaned children.

This story mesmerized and captured the hearts of Destin Rotarians and several community businesses. With the passion of several members of The Rotary Club of Destin and area community leaders, we stepped forward to lend humanitarian and financial support to Aletha's Legacy.

The scene is a setup. As Jesus approached Jerusalem, the power-center of Israel, He stops to rest for the Sabbath. The Pharisees have hatched a plot to catch Jesus violating the law of the Sabbath so they can condemn Him in the court of the Sanhedrin.

A Pharisee invited Jesus to his home for the Sabbath meal and it's no accident he also invited a man with "dropsy." This affliction disfigures the victim, causing them to swell with edema in their arms, legs, and abdomen. Everyone present would see the victim's need for healing. The Pharisee set the trap for the renowned Healer.

Jesus asks his hosts if it is legal to heal on the Sabbath, and

A Pastor's Ponderings: Nothing to Say

One Sabbath, when Jesus went to eat in the house of a prominent Pharisee, he was being carefully watched. There in front of him was a man suffering from dropsy. Jesus asked the Pharisees and experts in the law, "Is it lawful to heal on the Sabbath or not?" But they remained silent. So, taking hold of the man, he healed him and sent him away.

Then he asked them, "If one of you has a son or an ox that falls into a well on the Sabbath day, will you not immediately pull him out?" And they had nothing to say. Luke 14:1-6

they have no answer. He heals the man immediately, because that's who Christ is.

As the Pharisees gasp in outrage, Jesus poses the question, "If one of you has a son or an ox that falls into a well on the Sabbath day, will you not immediately pull him out?" (Luke 14:5) Of course you would. So would I. If my son fell into a well, I would go in after him or die trying. So would the Pharisees. Yet, they remained silent.

With one sentence of divine insight, He dispelled the Pharisee's argument and foiled their trap. They would leave off condemning Jesus to another day.

Christ healed the man on the Sabbath, and the Pharisees were not happy because He broke their rules. They had no compassion for the swollen man. To the man with dropsy, healing meant relief from his pain and a new beginning.

"Dropsy" is a common illness today. Edema can be life threatening, but usually it's just irritating. Jesus feels our pain and will not turn away from us. The love of God seeks to restore the lost, hurting and afflicted!

When my daughter was a gangly third grader, she was running through the dining room, and she tripped. Falling headlong into our heat radiator, she caught it square on the cheekbone. Her eye swelled so much her eyelids lifted off her bloodied eye. The meanest black eye you ever saw shadowed her beautiful face for a month. The night after her fall, I prayed for her at bedtime, and I asked her if it still hurt. Crying, she said, "Not my eye so much, but when people look at me, they wince and turn away like I'm ugly."

My heart broke. How could anyone think my precious child was ugly?

Jesus felt the same way for the swollen man and healed his condition and his heart. Instead of a freakish display for the Pharisees to use as a trap for Christ, Jesus saw a person made in God's image. Our Father sees us, and His heart breaks every time we suffer from hurt, pain,or even swollenness.

How do you feel when you see someone suffering? Do they look gross? Sound whiny? Do their scabs, swollenness, or disfiguredness make you feel queasy? Invite the compassion of Christ to fill your heart. That's normal for a genuine believer, even if it causes criticism.

I wonder how many times we have seen people who were suffering, and we remained silent like the Pharisees? Do we wince and turn away with nothing to say? Or will we allow the compassion of God to move us to feel the pain of others?

Jesus has something to say, and His words brought healing. May we answer with Christ—it is always right to do good. It is God's will to heal and ease the suffering of others, no matter what day it is.






Classical Connections:
