are extraordinary; for me, they mainly involve my interactions with genuinely amazing people. We should never take for granted the wonderful people who cross our paths.

Brian and Kathy Haugen asked Sammy Davis to be the keynote speaker in a fundraiser for the Taylor Haugen Foundation. Before that event, I was blessed to attend a private luncheon with Sammy and Dixie Davis, Gen. (Rep.) Patt Maney, Col. Jason Grandy and Col. Brian Haugen. Yes, the conversation was indescribable.

In 1965, after high school graduation, Sammy L. Davis enlisted in the Army and volunteered to go to Vietnam. Because his father had been an artilleryman in World War II,

he volunteered for the same and was assigned to the 4th Artillery. Davis said he did not go to war to kill people but wanted his dad to be proud of him. He went to war because he loved his daddy, his grandpas, and his country.

The United States was involved in Vietnam from 1965 to 1973, with more than 2 million Americans serving in uniform, including my father. I have met several Medal of Honor recipients, including Gary Beikirch and Woody Williams. This story is about Sgt. 1st Class Sammy L. Davis, another Medal of Honor recipient.

A handful of those 2 million servicemen distinguished themselves with acts of valor. Their actions were considered so far above and beyond the call of duty that they received the highest military honor for valor in combat—the Medal of Honor. Only 248 Vietnam soldiers were presented with the medal, making it a highly exclusive award. Davis was one of those 248. More than half of the medals were awarded posthumously.

Because Davis shared a name with the famous entertainer, his fellow soldiers sometimes chided him. Many years after his time in the Army, he would again be attached to another entertainer – Tom Hanks as Forrest Gump. Those familiar with the story of Sammy Davis knew he was the "real" Forrest Gump Medal of Honor recipient portrayed in the movie.

Early on Nov. 18, 1967, Davis's unit was helicoptered into an area west of Cai Lay in the Mekong Delta to set up a forward fire-support base – Firebase Cudgel – offering support for the infantrymen operating in the area. Battery C consisted of 11 guns and 42 men.

The following day, at 2 a.m., Battery C came under heavy mortar attack. Thirty minutes later, a reinforced battalion, estimated at 1,500 Vietcong soldiers, launched an intense ground assault. Fortunately, a

An enemy rocket-propelled grenade scored a direct hit on the howitzer, knocking the crew from the weapon, blowing Davis sideways into a foxhole, and knocking him unconscious. He was later struck by friendly fire, which caused him to regain consciousness, and Davis credits this hit with saving his life.

More than 30 razor-sharp one-inch beehive darts passed through his buttocks. Tom Hanks was superimposed over Davis' head in the footage of President Johnson presenting Davis with the Medal of Honor.

Convinced that the heavily outnumbered Americans couldn't survive the attack, Davis fired off at least one round from the damaged artillery piece before being overrun. He struggled to his feet, rammed a shell into the gun, and fired pointblank at the Vietcong advancing five deep directly in front of the weapon; the beehive round cut them down.

His wounds included a perforated kidney, crushed ribs, a broken vertebra, ripped flesh from the beehive darts and burns all over his body. He ignored his injuries and crossed the river under heavy fire to rescue three wounded American soldiers. He kept fighting the enemy until they retreated. Only 12 of the 42 soldiers survived that battle. His book, "You Don't Lose Until You Quit Trying," chronicles his life.

Later in the day, Davis was shot in the thigh by an enemy AK-47, earning his second purple heart.

When there were no more rounds left, he fired a white phosphorus shell, and then the last round he fired was a "propaganda shell" filled with leaflets.

At this point, he heard yelling from the other side of the river and realized that American soldiers were stranded and needed help. Despite not knowing how to swim, he descended into the water and paddled across on an air mattress, making two trips to bring the three American soldiers to safety. He provided covering fire as another soldier helped the most gravely wounded soldier across the river, then pulled the other two through the water on the air mattress to the fire base.







"Only in America"

Mentor, tech entrepreneur, presidential appointee, philanthropist, visionary, author and our Hometown Hero, Dr. Paul Hsu is a man who will inspire you to have a renewed belief in America's future. Listen to him speak or read his book to find out how visionaries invest in the future. Listening to him describe his American journey is riveting and inspiring, a story of American exceptionalism. He believes that as a first generation immigrant to this country, he became a shepherd of the American dream.

Dr. Hsu was the September RCOC speaker at the Fort Walton Yacht Club. Everyone in the audience was treated to two free books, including "Guardians of the Dream."He is a busy man with family commitments but adheres to the principles he preaches.

Dr. Hsu believes in building relationships and cultivated many on this night. Relationship building is one of the principles that made him a successful entrepreneur and person. In business, he connected dots that did not exist because he was courageous enough never to give up. He did not seek to get rich but to create from his heart. He believes immigrants are successful because they are generally hungrier and greater risk-takers, having overcome hardship, rejection and setbacks. Their unique stressors make them stronger and more adept at accepting and thriving through adversity.

Entrepreneurs have exceptional confidence and strong self-esteem and are visionaries with courage. One of his mentor's advice was to ensure that people will like you because you are likable. He cares about others. The Bible offers the same advice: "A man who has friends must himself be friendly" (Proverbs 18:24a).

Even within the economic instability in a polarized society, he believes an argument needs to be made for optimism. His story provides hope for parents of wayward children. Dr. Hsu grew up disliking being told what to do and hating school; he became defiant. His mom inspired him by telling him always to be able to look into the mirror with no regrets.

He especially liked a quote from Ronald Reagan concerning immigration that went something like this. People who go to live in France don't become Frenchmen. Those who go to live in Germany or Italy can't become German or Italian. Yet, Reagan pointed out that anyone from any corner





of the world can come to live in the United States and become an American. This is true from America's origins because this country was created as an immigrant nation. Dr. Hsu believes that immigrants need to assimilate. He does not think of himself as a Chinese-American but simply as an American. He believes in the ability to dream big and follow through with the determination to reach your dreams.

America remains the most welcoming place for legal immigrants. America is the only country where an immigrant can be embraced as an insider. This unique aspect is not found in any other country. He believes in America's five core values of freedom, ingenuity, integrity, opportunity and inclusion, elements lacking in most other countries. Most countries have widespread bribery as just another aspect of doing business. America has an infrastructure built around fair play and ethics, based on the rule of law and common decency.

Dr. Hsu started his first business in his garage. American children must get interested in math again. He believed he really needed to do something about solving the problem by inspiring youth to consider engineering degrees. He believes Artificial Intelligence (AI) will dominate the next 10 years. Robots will take 80 percent of the workload and 3D printing will dominate manufacturing.

Amanda Negron, Executive director at HSU Educational Foundation, discussed the foundation, whose mission is to encourage excellence in teaching and inspire innovation in the classroom. She said she believes in this community and the education given to our children. "If you like what we are doing, roll up your sleeves," she said. "We create space and get out of the way." A foundation principle involves growing up future talent and filling the void where needed. They do this through the STEM workforce program-Science, Technology, Engineering, and Math (STEM) programs raise interest and inspire students to prepare for careers of future demand. Check things out at www.hsu-foundation. org. It may surprise you what is happening here in Okaloosa County, and it will undoubtedly inspire you and give you hope for future generations.



Every time a storm threatens our state, we are reminded of how many homeowners and business owners either do not carry flood and wind insurance at all, or have inadequate limits to cover their loss. Unfortunately, the 2022 Atlantic hurricane season runs to Nov. 30.

When Hurricane Ian hit our state, the property insurance market was already in peril. The market was the most volatile in the U.S. well before Hurricane

Don't Be a Statistic: Have Adequate Flood and Wind Insurance

Ian formed, and will most likely become even more unstable in the wake of the storm. The market has been strained under billion-dollar losses, insolvencies and skyrocketing premiums. The massive storm barreled into southwest Florida, delivering catastrophic winds, rain and flooding. The majority of the estimated losses in Florida come from wind damage, estimated between \$22 billion and \$32 billion, while insured storm surge losses in the state are expected to be an additional \$6 billion to \$15 billion.

The increasing unpredictability of hurricane threats underscores the need for property owners – especially those close to water – to raise their standard of preparation. The most significant risks for these homeowners are wind and water. Windows are particularly vulnerable points during a hurricane, but any exterior points – including shingles, gutters, and railings – are at risk from wind. Homes, in general, should have window protection in advance. Owners should either board up the windows or install hurricane shutters. This is one of the more important decisions individuals make.

Without adequate reinforcement, windows can be a source of indoor damage during a storm. A home's occupants could also be injured near windows when a hurricane strikes. Similarly, doors could become a weak point, so these entryways should also be secured

Although most standard homeowners and business in-

surance policies can include wind coverage, they do not cover flooding. So it is important to have protection from flooding associated with tropical storms, hurricanes, heavy rains, broken levees, outdated or clogged drainage systems, rapid accumulation of rainfall and other conditions that impact our area. Almost everyone in a participating community of the National Flood Insurance Program (NFIP) can buy flood insurance. Recently, Florida has become the leader in the country in encouraging private markets to respond to our needs with competitive alternatives, but the prevailing market condition will slow down this development.

A flood is defined by FEMA as a general and temporary condition in which two or more properties of normally dry land are inundated by water. Just because you haven't experienced a flood in the past does not mean you won't in the future. Flood risks are based partly on history, but also on rainfall, river-flow and tidal-surge data, topography, fold-control measures and changes due to building and development.

The NFIP's Dwelling Form offers coverage up to a maximum of \$250,000 for building property and up to \$100,000 for contents and the Commercial Form provides up to a maximum of \$500,000 for building and/or contents. Both should be purchased as well as excess flood for limits up to the replacement cost of the dwelling and personal property over the basic limits. Recent storms and predictions of a future with bigger and stronger storms highlight more than ever the importance of flood insurance.

You can buy flood insurance through the NFIP no matter where you live if your community participates, except in Coastal Barrier Resources System (CBRS) areas. For properties in these areas, the private market is available.

We recommend you call an experienced insurance agency with access to the NFIP as well as private markets to help evaluate your flood exposures.

to making a room look bigger. Choose a sofa and chairs with exposed legs. This creates an open airy feeling. Multi-functional furniture, such as a chest that can double as a coffee table, a sofa bed, nesting tables and an expandable dining table are all good choices.

Tip 3: Mirror Mirror on the Wall. I am a huge fan of mirrors. Not only are they decorative, they create a sense of openness. With proper placement they also reflect light and create a view, once again fooling your eye into feeling there's more space.

Emerald Coast Classic Right Around the Corner

The countdown has begun for one of the premier sporting events in the area as the eighth annual Emerald Coast Classic college basketball tournament fast approaches.

Eight teams will compete in the tournament, which will be held at Raider Arena on the campus of Northwest Florida State College Nov. 25-26.

Iowa will face Clemson in a semifinal round game at 6 p.m. on that Friday, while TCU will play Cal at 8:30 p.m. The thirdplace game will be played at 3 p.m. on Saturday Nov. 26 with the championship game scheduled for a 6 p.m. tip off on that Saturday.

Fans can purchase tickets on line by visiting www.emeraldcoastclassic.com clicking on the ticket link. Session tickets gets fans into both games of the session

Both Iowa and TCU played in the 2022 NCAA Tournament with the Horned Frogs beating Seton Hall, 69-42, in the first round. TCU fell to top-seeded Arizona, 85-80, in overtime in the second round.

Iowa captured the 2022 Big Ten Conference Tournament championship, tied for fourth in the conference standings and won 26 overall games, the second most wins in a season in program history.

For the third time in program history, TCU is nationally ranked to start the season. The Horned Frogs appeared at No. 14 in the



Associated Press preseason poll on Monday. Iowa also received votes in several preseason polls as well.

"The reputation of our tournament has allowed us to attract teams from the premier basketball conferences in the country," said tournament director Maury Hanks, chief executive officer of Global Sports. "And this year is no exception with TCU being ranked in the top 20 of several preseason polls. We strive to bring the best college basketball teams possible to the Emerald Coast of Florida. Fans are also going to see some of the top collegiate players in the country this year."

Fran McCaffery has coached Iowa to 20-plus wins eight of the last 10 seasons, including four straight years. The Hawkeyes have competed in the last three NCAA Tournaments and have been ranked in the final Associated Press Poll each of the last three years: No. 16 in 2020, No. 8 in 2021 and No. 25 in 2022.

Iowa's fortunes will be built around forward Kris Murray, named to the Preseason All-Big Ten team, and redshirt junior

forward Patrick McCaffery, who is the leading returning scorer at 10.5 points per game, Murray was Iowa's leading scorer (9.7) and rebounder (4.3) off the bench last season.

The Horned Frogs' second NCAA Tournament bid under coach Jamie Dixon was their fourth postseason appearance in the

five seasons that postseason was held, the best in program history.


The Horned Frogs return all five starters from last season's team. Included in the returners are Preseason Big 12 Player of the Year Mike Miles Jr., and Preseason All-Big 12 Conference forward Emanuel Miller.

Miles is the Big 12's top returning scorer after averaging 15.2 points. He also averaged 3.8 assists to become the Big 12's only player to finish in the top six in points (fifth) and assists (sixth). Miles was named to the 2022

All-Big 12 Tournament Team and the NABC All-District 8 second team and to the USBWA All-Region VII Team.

TCU forward Emanual Miller earned his first preseason honor, as he was selected Preseason All-Big 12 honorable mention. The senior ranked averaged 10.3 points and ranked 10th in the Big 12 with 6.2 rebounds per game.

Fall Recreational Red Snapper Season

The Florida Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission announces the opening of a fall red snapper season for private recreational anglers and state for-hire operations in the Gulf of Mexico on the following weekends: Nov 11-13 Nov. 25-27

During this season, private recreational anglers may harvest red snapper in Gulf state and federal waters. However, state for-hire operations are limited to fishing for red snapper in Gulf state waters only. FWC will continue to monitor harvest relative to Florida's available quota.

These additional days would not be possible without the State Reef Fish Survey (SRFS). The State Reef Fish Survey was developed specifically to provide more robust data for manage-

Off the Hook: It's Time for Winter Flounder Fishing

By Cali Hlavac, To Do In Destin

As colder temps roll in, we are starting to notice different species of fish migrate into our Gulf waters – specifically Flounder and Sheepshead. The cooler weather means the fish will school up in flounder maxing out around 28 inches. One of the best things about targeting Flounder is that they like to come back for your bait if they miss it the first time, so just hold out and wait on them!

Sheepshead actually become

you're in for a fight.

Both these fish are abundant, so the season is open year-round for these species. The limit per angler is 10 flounder per day, and 15 sheepshead per day. Many anglers will tell you they love catching these fish and bringing them home for dinner. Both species are considered prime seafood, with a delicious white meat that's never oily or

"fishy" in taste. Before it gets too cold, we recommend getting out and hitting the waters to stock up while they're easy to find!





one area, making them easier to catch once you track them down.

Flounder and Sheepshead are two popular winter/spring fish that anglers will be targeting in this area. Flounder will start to school up in October as they prepare to migrate during winter with the cooler water, usually heading out into the nearshore gulf areas. The move allows them to settle on natural and artificial reefs to spawn at this time.

Because of their shape, flounder are typically always found on the bottom, where they can burrow into sand to await prey. They hang within 200 yards off the beach, typically at depths of 20 to 60 feet. Common flounder species in the Gulf of Mexico are the gulf flounder and the southern flounder, and odds are the latter will be a much larger fish – with the female southern more active with the colder water and are usually found hanging near structures like jetties and bridges, where oysters and barnacles grow. Sheepshead can be a little trickier to catch, as they like to steal your bait and leave the hook exposed. It's a really subtle bite you're looking for and once you hook them,



Antioxidants become the most effective antidote for further progression of the disease. I grew up believing emotions were inefficient and to be avoided. Emotions, even the "good" ones, were not to be trusted. They were to be overcome by being tough and powering through. So, I learned how to ignore emotions for the sake of efficiency. While this approach enabled me to perform and accomplish many tasks, it didn't allow me to enjoy those accomplishments. It also left me feeling disconnected from myself and others, including my wife and boys. When I avoided emotions, I lived with low-grade anger and discontentment that, ironically, demanded more of my time and energy than the original emotions I was avoiding.

Maybe you, too, were taught feelings aren't safe and should be suppressed. But, what if that isn't true? What if there is a purpose to emotions? What if ac-

knowledging them is a pathway to growth and progress? What if there is a depth of life and relationship to be experienced through emotional awareness? What if emotions aren't something to escape but the path to the life, relationships and influence you have been searching for?

Four Steps to Allow Emotions to Work for You: Slow down to speed up

The speed and busyness of life is one way we are taught emotions are to be ignored. There is simply no time for emotions. We pursue more work or activities as a means of escaping or numbing emotions. However, if emotions have purpose and can provide important information about the abundant life path we desire, we must slow down and create space to experience and acknowledge them. When we create space for emotions, we bring them to the light instead of allowing them to drain our energy while operating in the shadows. Next time you sense an emotion, whether comfortable or uncomfortable, pause and take three to four deep breaths, allow yourself some space to experience the emotion, and then move on to the next step.

The Efficiency of Emotions

Name the emotion

At first glance, naming the emotion appears to be simple. However, this can be difficult without a strong emotional vocabulary. When asked how we are feeling, we often have two or three go-to answers such as "fine," "good," "frustrated," or a favorite of my son's, "meh." If moving beyond words like these is difficult, you are not alone. A simple hack is finding and printing an emotion word bank. We have a printable "Feeling Word List" available in the Resources tab at Journeybravely.com. Keep a picture of this on your phone or fridge. When you are tempted to use words like good, fine, or meh, look at the word bank and find words like thankful, valued, respected, overwhelmed, relaxed, betrayed.

What's the story

After naming the emotion, consider the narrative behind the emotion. How are your beliefs shaping your emotional interpretation. If you are feeling rejected when your friend turned you down for lunch, try investigating your story about your friend's intentions. Are you believing you aren't important to your friend? When you identify your emotional story, it is important to test the story with three questions. Is the story true? Is it kind? Is it helpful? If the answer to any of these questions is "no," it's time to adopt a new narrative. Try challenging the original story with a version that gives your friend the benefit of the doubt. Perhaps he would like to get together another time because your friendship is important to him.

What are your action steps?

Now that you understand your emotion, how will it guide your actions? Maybe it's time to replace old thought patterns that are no longer serving you. Maybe there are relational boundaries you need to establish. Maybe it's time to set boundaries with news, social media or other cultural input. Maybe it's time to start saying "no" so you can slow down and be present with yourself and others in more meaningful ways. Remember, you are ridiculously in charge. You largely get to make your own decisions as well as what and who you allow in your life. Emotions can help make these decisions more efficient if we give them the space to do so.

I cannot believe the holiday season is here. It has been nice getting a break from the high humidity and I am especially enjoying those attic inspections this time of year. With the holiday season comes more energy use. Here are a few holiday energy savings tips to help brighten your nights and lower your energy bills.

Switch to LED lights when decorating and in general. LED lights use 80 to 90 percent less energy than incandescent lights. It is estimated that four strands of LED lights will save \$30 this month, compared to four strands of the traditional lighting. When I changed out my landscape lighting bulbs to LED, they were brighter, looked great, will last longer and use less energy. It is also a clever idea to use timers to reduce the amount of time holiday lighting stays on.

When cooking the holiday feast, do not forget about the smaller appliances. Microwaves, slow cookers and multi-use smart appliances all use less energy and give off less heat than ovens and stoves. Also consider co-cooking. If one dish needs to bake at 400 degrees and the



other at 350 degrees, consider sharing the baking time and set your oven at 375 degrees to bake both dishes.

We typically use our common appliances more during the holidays. Many of our water heaters are set to 140 degrees from the manufacturer. Lowering the setting to 120 degrees will save energy and money. When showering, many of us will start with the hot water turned all the way up and then add cold water for a comfortable temperature. By doing this, you are cooling the hot water which you spent energy and money to heat.

Do not run dishwashers when they are half full; this wastes

> energy. Fill up those baskets and try adding a drying agent. These agents help lower the surface tension of water, causing it to sheet off dishes, use less drying time and save you money. Also, use cold water in your clothes washer. Most new clothes washers and detergents are designed for cold water and get your clothes just as clean. When drying clothes, throw a few dryer balls into the dryer with your load. This will reduce drying time by preventing laundry from clumping, allowing the warm air to circulate better. If your dryer has an auto dry option (moisture sensing), use that option instead of timed dry and clean the lint trap between loads this improves air circulation

- this improves air circulation and increases the efficiency of the dryer.

If you plan to leave this holiday season, think about automating your home. Put exterior and interior lighting on timers to avoid being on all day and night. Add a thermostat that you can control via Wi-Fi and your smart phone, so, in the event we get a cold streak or heat wave during the time you are away, you can control your home's temperature. Also remember to unplug those energy vampire electronics which use energy even when turned off.

There are incentives as well: Potentially lower taxes, managing their wealth and guidance on estate planning. Giving can be as straightforward as a cash, check or even stock donation. Other assets might qualify as well. This can be cumbersome, however, if you have several nonprofits you want to support.

An idea growing in popularity is the Donor Advised Fund or DAF. Raymond James calls it "the new face of giving' and it is the fastest growing charitable vehicle in America. DAFs are public charities and qualify under IRS section 501(c)3. They take in contributions from the giver by way of cash (or check) but also securities (stocks and bonds, for example). Depending on someone's situation, a tax deduction might even apply. The DAF in turn invests the contributions into mutual funds for growth or income or preservation of capital.

Note the wording of "donor advised." That means that the donor can directly ask the DAF to periodically, or when they would like to, send contributions on to another charity. That charity could be educational (a college, university or any educational nonprofit), religious (church), human services or foundations (educational, athletic as example). In the meantime, any amounts not given can be left to grow and accumulate over time, for many years.

In the end, giving is simpler - one contribution to one charity, which can then be dispersed as you request or advise. Many firms allow you to do this online or even delegate it to your adviser, at your direction. You can title or name the account as well. These accounts also allow you to name successor donor advisers or a final recipient charity of

the value of the account at your death. Many people appreciate having this available for making donations to their schools, churches, hospitals and various local or national/international causes.

Donors are urged to consult their attorneys, accountants or tax advisers with respect to questions relating to the deductibility of various types of contributions to a Donor-Advised Fund for federal and state tax purposes.

It's organizations like these that need our support too.

Children in Crisis, Inc. is a non-profit organization of "caring people, working togeth-

er to provide homes and keep brothers and sisters together. It gives a home to the abused, neglected, and abandoned children of our community. Before Children in Crisis, there was no emergency shelter in Circuit One (which includes Okaloosa, Walton, Escambia, and Santa Rosa counties) for young children removed from an unsafe environment on short notice. Without CIC and the stability it brings, many foster children would be moved from home to home, some as many as 10 times per year. It has given a safe, loving home to more than 995 children since 2008."

The beginnings of Emerald Coast Children's Advocacy Center is one of grassroots support from the communities it serves. The motivation for establishing a Children's Advocacy Center using a multidisciplinary team response to child abuse in Okaloosa and Walton counties grew out of a high-profile case in the early 1990s. Together, the Department of Children and Families and the State Attorney's Office formed a Child Abuse Task Force in 1992. That group recommended a Children's Advocacy Center be built and the ECCAC was incorporated in July 1997 and in In June of 2007 and has received its reaccreditation from the National Children's Alliance.

"I have been young, and now am old; Yet I have not seen the righteous forsaken,

There I stood in Capernaum, where Jesus once provided bread for the multitudes and healed the sick. The weather was perfect. The full moon lit up the night and three hours of unadulterated worship rocked the hillsides.

Praising God with gusto came easily with the great throng of pilgrims gathered on the north shore of the Sea of Galilee. Two thousand Christians assembled

from all over the world in ancient Capernaum to kick off the Feast of Tabernacles and walk in the footsteps of Christ. Faith was on full display.

Similar to our Thanksgiving celebration, the Feast of Tabernacles is an annual holiday in Israel that commemorates the Israelites' 40-year journey out of Egypt. God provided manna to eat and water for them in the wilderness. They slept in tents, called "succots," or temporary dwellings. This holiday is a time of joy for the Jews and the Christians who visit. Jesus wants to tabernacle among us today if we invite him.

While in Nazareth, the minimalism of Christ's life struck me in Joseph's workshop, literally a cave. Questions probed my mind. Do we adorn our faith with so much pomp and ceremony that we miss the power of his love and the simplicity of His teachings?

Shifting to southern Israel, we explored Hebron, where Abraham received the promise that God would bless his family. Recent excavations reveal stone pathways traveled by Abraham 4,000 years ago. While offering his son Isaac as a sacrifice, God interrupted him with a ram caught in a thicket and taught Abraham that God will provide Himself a sacrifice. I thanked God for sending Christ as our eternal sacrifice.

Landing more than 6,000 miles to the west of Israel, we arrived in South Carolina. Our grandson, Josiah, was about to graduate from Marine boot camp on Parris Island. The family gathered to celebrate his achievement. Fourteen of us stood at rapt attention among thousands of family members of the 374 graduating Marines. The Marine Corps band played in the shadow of the statue commemorating the battle of Iwo Jima.

My family cheered them on, along with hundreds of other families representing every walk of life in our pluralistic culture, every one of them proud of their Marine and their country. My daughter and the mother of our Marine is fiercely loyal and unyielding as iron. She whooped and hollered, shouting above the din, "I love you Josiah!"

Waves of pride and patriotism washed over me as I watched my grandson march in strict formation with his company. The innocent baby-faced toddler I once knew stood as a strong, disciplined United States Marine willing to lay down his life for his faith, family and country. That's when stark, raving fear ruined the parade.

Will the Corps send my grandson into battle in some far-off desert or jungle? Will an enemy's weapon tear through his flesh and bone? Will he come home in a body bag? These thoughts tormented me while the band played on.

Only God knows these answers. Moses showed us that even in the wilderness, God is good and always provides. I learned from Father Abraham to place my family in God's hands because he is so faithful. I learned from my savior Jesus that God is truly with us through the battles of life. Like King David of old, I have learned to be thankful for my God, my family, and my country. Happy Thanksgiving.


