The entire Destin Seafood Festival is a two-mile stretch, beginning at Harborwalk Village and stretching all the way to Heron Harbor, with stages on each end. The 2022 Festival included more than 110 food and craft vendors in addition to local restaurants, and this year is expected to be even bigger.

Happening Friday through Sunday, Oct. 6-8, the festival kicks off October's monthlong Destin Fishing Rodeo. You need no ticket to attend cluding beer and wine, are and you'll get the opportunity to take in some of the best local and coastal musicians at the beach with four stages beckoning you to a variety of live rock, reggae, country, tropical tunes and more. men. It has always been held in conjunction with the Destin Fishing Rodeo. Proceeds are donated back to the community, including the Destin Charter Boat Association which works to maintain the fishery our community was built on, the Miss Destin scholarships, Destin Fisherman's Fund to help those in need and more.

This year's musical entertainment, with four different stages, will feature local bands playing throughout the festival. Meet our Hometown Hero Judah Claire Pierce

Persistence Through the Pain

Publisher Note: It is always an honor to write about a Hometown Hero. For many, the word hero brings a particular image or personality to mind. Yet, our heroes vary in age and are as unique and special as the life they have lived and the inspiration they are for each of us. They come from all walks of life, and their occupations, ambitions and accomplishments motivate us to embrace our own life's challenges with determination and hope. As we listen to them share the trials and triumphs of their life journey, our heart is awakened to the reality of exactly how fragile and precious life is. The truths they communicate are a solemn reminder we should strive daily to cherish every moment and celebrate the ones who make our life beautiful in every way. Niceville local Judah Claire Pierce is one such non-assuming hero. Her story is one of resilience, persistence and zeal to maintain a sense of normalcy through soul-crushing pain.

At age 10, Judah Claire Pierce experienced an ordinary day at summer camp nestled in the foothills of Georgia. A spontaneous dash down a hill strewn with large tree roots resulted in a minor fracture in her left foot an incident now three years past. Reflecting on that moment, Judah remarked, "Little did I know that this seemingly innocent act would lead me down a path I never could have imagined."

Her path is one etched with unrelenting pain. Each morning, Judah awakens to a world filled with stabbing, searing and crushing sensations—a chronic condition she vividly describes as "feeling like I am being burned alive. No matter what I do, the

pain persists relentlessly. It affects even the simplest tasks like going to school, tidying my room, or just trying to live a normal life... making me feel as though I'm wearing a mask of happiness," shared Judah.

Initially deemed a minor injury, her condition baffled doctors as her relentless suffering defied relief. Through an array of medical interventions and rigorous physical therapy, she eventually received a rare but life-altering diagnosis: Complex Regional Pain Syndrome (CRPS), a neurological anomaly casting her into a realm of chronic, intense pain to her left leg.

Termed the "Suicide Disease" from the relentless pain it induces, CRPS stems from autonomic nervous system imbalances and dysfunction. As Judah's parents, Blake and Candace Pierce, describe it, "CRPS is one of the most excruciatingly painful diseases known to humankind, surpassing even childbirth and amputation without anesthesia on the McGill Pain Index." Highlighted as one of the top 20 most agonizing conditions, many instances follow forceful traumas to limbs or ankles, among other triggers. However, the mechanism behind why these injuries provoke CRPS remains elusive.

"Working with the doctors was a challenge, because Judah's pain never matched her injury. She would scream in pain," recounted Candace, Judah's mother. She continued, "As a mom, it's so hard to watch your daughter crying in pain every day, just trying to live her life and you can't fix it. With all these healthcare



degrees, I still can't stop my daughter's suffering."

During the summer of 2022, the Pierces found their way to a distinguished CRPS program at the Children's Hospital of Philadelphia where she relearned how to walk and run barefoot, revitalizing mobility in her left leg. "Unfortunately, unlike others who completed the program, my pain did not go into remission and has only intensified since then," said

While CRPS often leads many affected children to wheelchairs and eventual bed confinement, her father, Blake, proudly stated, "Yet, Judah refuses to let this awful disease steal her childhood." Despite enduring countless hurdles, she persistently greets each new day with a smile, striving to maintain a semblance of normalcy amidst the emotionally draining and physically relentless

"I believe it's Judah's faith that fuels her with such resilience," commented Candace. "She identifies closely with Paul in the Bible who was given a thorn. 'Therefore, so that I would not become

arrogant, a thorn in the flesh was given to me, a messenger of Satan to trouble me—so that I would not become arrogant. I asked the Lord three times about this, that it would depart from me. But he said to me, 'My grace is enough for you, for my power is made perfect in weakness. So then, I will boast most gladly about my weaknesses, so that the power of Christ may reside in me.' ~ 2 Corinthians 12: 7-9, New English *Translation.*" "It's that we all want it to go away; and even though it sucks, it's not the end," said Can-

Now approaching age 13, Judah embraces her challenges. Her recent academic feats are noteworthy, encompassing top grades at Okaloosa STEMM Academy, securing 1st Place in the Regional Science Fair, participating in the State Science Fair, being a Thermo Fisher Jr. Nominee, winning the NASA Earth Systems Science Project Award, achieving recognition as a regional History Project winner and participating in the state National History Day. Judah excels in math, enjoys Cotillion, passed the Python certification exam, and is active in piano, violin, tennis, and as VP of the Hope Squad. She's also into acting, singing and leads worship for her church youth group.

Home for the Pierces is Niceville, where Blake is stationed at Hurlburt AFB. Candace revealed Judah's goal is to graduate at age 15 and explore aviation, possibly joining the military to fly or pursuing engineering.

However, her pain has escalated, prompting the Pierces to urgently seek relief for their daughter. "We recently discovered the

Spero Clinic, a unique medical center in Arkansas offering a 12week Neurologic Rehabilitation program that approaches CRPS treatment differently," said Candace. "This clinic has achieved remarkable success in achieving remission for CRPS patients worldwide. Our aim is to have her begin treatment after Christmas. Unfortunately, due to the limited understanding and rarity of CRPS, insurance doesn't cover her 3- to 4-month stay or treatment plan."

Judah and her family have partnered with the Burning Limb Foundation, a 501c3 non-profit, to raise funds for her Spero Clinic treatment. "...the reality is that CRPS has consumed my life for the past three years," said Judah. "It has forced me to grow up faster than my peers, confronting challenges that no child should have to face. Yet, in the midst of it all, I remain resilient and hopeful, believing that with your support, I can conquer this pain and reclaim my childhood."





been vocal, loyal and ready for this for years. Where will the courts be located?

BW: Pickleball talks in Destin have been going on since early 2018. Since being on council 18 months ago, I have been putting countless hours into researching where our pickleball facility should be located. So, with the latest vote in August, I am very excited to announce we have chosen to place our city Pickleball facility next to the Destin City Annex building and dog park.

TY: Great location! I've had a blast playing pickleball at the Destin Community Center, and I know there are a few other places in town offering chances



to play sporadically as physical surroundings allow, but it will be nice to have dedicated space to this. How many courts will there be, and when do you reasonably except them to be ready?

BW: Yes, we have had hybrid pickleball courts in Destin for a few years now, and with continuous community support, we are excited to build a permanent facility designated for the sport of pickleball. For those who do not

know, this land had originally been designed for a tennis complex back in the 2000s but was shelved. So now in 2023, we are converting these plans to pickleball courts with a budget of \$400,000 that was earmarked in the 2021 fiscal year. With this money, our goal is to build four USA Pickleball-approved courts, with shade covering, and a bathroom facility to support both the pickleball players and


the dog park patrons right next door. Our timeline is to have this facility open and ready by spring 2024.

TY: This is one of those City wins for both locals and visitors, with potentials that go far beyond even new, great pickleball courts. What do you envision?

BW: I believe projects that grow organically from the citizens always turn into a huge win-win for everyone in our community. Also included in our budget is the prep work for the future expansion of this area. With over 2.5 acres of land, I encourage our residents to dream big to make this area a one-of-a-kind sports facility! We could expand the pickleball facility and look for other sports and recreation ideas missing in Destin. Personally, I am biased toward building a beginner skate park for our kids, as I grew up skating in Destin. But, I want to hear everyone's ideas. Because, if we plan right we should have the room to fit more pickleball courts, a skate park, food trucks and some green space for everyone to enjoy!









Estuary Program Brings Bay's Importance to Coastal Residents

The average human body contains about 60 percent water. And we die after about three days without ingesting liquids.

Yet, most of us take water, the most crucial element in the world, for granted.

The Choctawhatchee Bay Estuary Program is designed to create awareness of that body of water and how its values include environmental, economic and social benefits.

"We are a grant-based program funded from the BP oil spill settlement and EPA," says Sabina Pennington, Public Outreach Specialist. The RE-STORE Act, or "Resources and Ecosystems Sustainability, Tourist Opportunities, and Revived Economies of the Gulf Coast States Act," provides financing in response to the Deepwater Horizon oil spill that took place April 20, 2010.

In 2019, the Choctawhatchee Bay Estuary Coalition was established to provide a regional program for the management, restoration and protection of the Choctawhatchee Bay and watershed. It comprises 10 counties in Alabama and four in Florida, each of which is a source of water flowing into the Bay.


"It's important for everybody to work to bring awareness of the importance of watersheds and the environmental and economic impact to our communities," Sabina says. "It's wonderful to work collaboratively to benefit the estuary program with a common goal. I think of it as "Connecting our Waters to People."

An estuary, she said, is any body of water that meets the

The watershed has a surface area of 5,400 square miles, with an average daily fresh water inflow of 63,665 gallons.

It's also the home of a diverse group of wildlife, from blue herons to turtles. The Coalition members include Holmes, Walton, Okaloosa and Washington counties in Florida, the Air Force, the Choctawhatchee Basin Alliance and the Choctawhatchee, Pea and Yellow Rivers Watershed Management Authority in Alabama.

"The Coalition works with the public to share and educate the importance to our communities, not just environmentally, but economically and socially,"

Sabina says. In the future, she says, a comprehensive conservation management plan will be developed to bring together five focus areas. "I kind of call it a to-do list," she says.

The coalition seems to be made to order for Sabina, who emigrated from Czechoslovakia at age 3. She saw her position advertised on the Okaloosa County website and showed it to one of her sons, who told her, "Mom, it's perfect for you." She holds a bachelor of science in environmental science from the University of Massachusetts and a master of science from Johns Hopkins University in environmental management and planning. She moved to the Emerald Coast with her husband, Allen, a retired Air Force major

and has three sons: AJ, 22, a recent Florida State University graduate, Alex, 17, a senior at Niceville High School and Adrian, 15, a sophomore at NHS.

"The coolest thing is I engage with the public," Sabina says. "Education and outreach are the most important and pivotal part of any program. It's very important to our community to bring awareness to the local economy to the betterment of the beautiful area we have here. We are so blessed. It's important to the life we enjoy here. It's about empowering each citizen to know and understand that they make a difference."

A Citizens Advisory Committee meets every other month. "The CAC is pivotal to help us better understand the needs of

our communities and to provide input on the best ways to manage and preserve our estuary," Sabina says. "It's so important to have people in our communities share in the decision-making processes related to the estuary program. The CAC is the bridge between the estuary program managers and the public, ensuring that community concerns and priorities are taken into account. The CAC members include residents, business owners, environmental advocates, scientists, educators, recreational users and other people who have a vested interest in the health and well-being of the estuary. The next CAC meeting is Oct. 26. If anyone wants to participate they can email me for the zoom link at spennington@ myokaloosa.com.

Sabina said she is also looking for kids in middle and high school ages who are interested in being future stewards. The group is called TEACH (Teen Environmental Advisors for a Cleaner Habitat). Anyone who is interested can email her.

In celebration of National Estuaries Week, which takes place Sept. 16-23, the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Ad-



A Life Worth Remembering

From the moment she entered the world, Tatissa Zunguze was memorable. A twin, she and her brother, Pimissa, were born two weeks apart. It's an extremely rare and special phenomenon. Rare and special, like Tatissa.

Friends and family used words such as "go-getter," "responsible," "overachiever" and "wanting to make a difference" to describe her.

Valedictorian of her high school, a STEM school in Salt Lake City, she addressed her graduating classmates with the challenge to explore the world around them in order to leave their mark. She undertook a public health internship at Johns Hopkins University immediately after high school, and went on to attend Scripps College, a liberal arts college in Claremont, Calif. "Hell would freeze over if she got a 'B' on an assignment," joked Sabina.

Not only with her intellectual gift and the multiple scholarships she received, Tatissa stood out in everything she did, according to her teachers and her father, Louis, Community Development Director for the City of Destin, and her mother, Sabina, an entrepreneurial spirit involved with many leadership positions throughout Destin.

"Tatissa loved pets," said Sabina. "She'd go to shelters and always be asking her dad for a dog. She loved doing things for families in need, especially kids,



and she worked with a Rotary Club in high school to get Christmas gifts for those who couldn't afford them. Those were her type of things."

Then in March 2017 there was a knock on the door around 2 a.m. Even after hearing the news from the police officer, Louis and Sabina couldn't process it. Tatissa had taken her own life. "The school had sent the officer to come over. We kept saying 'No, there's no way.' We had spoken to her the day before. Louis wanted to call her again, because he said it just can't be."

But reality soon set in, and it was torture. After months of barely eating, barely surviving, said Sabina, she and Louis knew they had to do something. They

couldn't save their daughter, but they had to try to help others. "We could cry and keep going down a dark hole, or we could do something to make Tatissa proud," said Sabina.

What they did was create The Tatissa Zunguze Foundation for Suicide Prevention and Social Justice. The Foundation envisions a world free from the social stigmas surrounding mental health. As part of its efforts, the Foundation has established the Okaloosa Suicide Prevention and Support (SPS) group. It strives to showcase the need for broader outreach and suicide prevention activities, and it is dedicated to raising awareness about suicide and its effects on everyone in the county.

"Because Tatissa loved activism and given how she passed, we thought suicide prevention should be the focus," said Sabina. "Nobody should go through what we have gone through and continue to experience. As such, we want to honor and celebrate her life by continuing to work on the things and issues she loved. With social justice, we work to talk about mental illness. So, it doesn't matter who you are or what economic status you have, you deserve to have access to mental illness resources."

Like many cases you hear about when a suicide is involved, nobody around her had any idea Tatissa was suffering. "She was suffering in silence," said Sabina. "She left a letter. Nobody did anything wrong. She just said she couldn't take it anymore, and that she was done."

"Her school was elite. So, we know there were pressures, but nothing indicating that she was not able to handle it or that anything was terribly wrong in her life."

Sabina said that's why the (www.thetatissa-Foundation foundation.org) and its mission are so important. People don't know where to go or how to get help. And it's not just that folks don't know about the resources. She often hears how expensive the resources can be. "Parents tell me they cannot afford to take their kids to therapy. You don't just go to counseling once if you're in trouble," she said, "and that's one reason why the Okaloosa program is working on a directory of appropriate, valuable resources."

The Foundation collaborates with other agencies and school systems to help teachers, staff and students know how to help each other and recognize signs of distress. They help certify people to be suicide prevention gatekeepers through sessions and trainings. "We use the QPR format - Question, Persuade, Refer. Knowing how to recognize the signs, to know the right questions to ask someone who is struggling, to persuade them to find help, and then refer them to an appropriate source. It's an evidence-based program."

Certified in trainings, Sabina is also a board member for the Florida Suicide Prevention Coalition. "It's important to talk about this difficult topic. There's a stigma. It needs to stop." This month alone, she'll speak at a Kiwanis gathering, PFLAG, and at several sessions for the Greater Fort Walton Beach Chamber of Commerce. The Foundation is part of collaboration globally and locally with End Child Marriage, Hope Squad and more. Sometimes she and Louis present together, such as at a Florida Suicide Prevention Conference

Her twin, now 26 years old, said, "We're on a mission to connect Tatissa's cause" to the people it can help.

Tatissa was one month from college graduation when she took her life. She was awarded a posthumous undergraduate degree from Scripps College in May 2018. Years later, through the memories of those who loved her and the Foundation she inspired, she continues to leave her mark.



Five Things To Do Before a Storm

It's the middle of summer, and you just heard on the radio that a Category 4 storm is about to hit in your area. What should you do to prepare? Stocking up on non-perishable food and bottled water is a given and also batteries. Those are both good preventative measures. But, what will you do if the storm hits your house? How can you minimize damage to your home and to your other possessions?

The first thing you should do is call your insurance agent and ask for a copy of both your declarations page and your policy jacket. You should do this both for your home and for your vehicles. If you have boats, motorcycles, an RV or any other contrivance or dwellings, get all of your policy documents together in one place. Familiarize yourself with your deductibles, coverages and any exclusions or limitations. You should do this regularly anyway, because once a storm is in the box, no coverage can be changed, altered or reinstated. If there is a payment due, pay it. You might be unable to do so later, if the timing of the storm coincides with a cancellation or the expiration of your policy.

The second thing you should do is take pictures and videos of the inside and outside of your home and email them to yourself. This is to show what your house looked like BEFORE anything happened. If you recently purchased big ticket items like new furniture or an entertainment center, email yourself any receipts you might have for the more expensive items in your home. In the event of a loss, receipts, photos and videos will aid the adjusters in processing your claim in a fair and timely manner.

The third thing to do is go out into your yard, front and back, and think about anything that can become a projectile. Winds upwards of 120 miles per hour can turn even a 6 oz. can of soup into a weapon. The more things that you can bring into the garage or a shed, the less they will be likely to fly into one of your windows or the side of your house. The things that you are unable to bring into your garage, lay them on their side as close to the back of the house as possible, or the shed. Try to tie them down with rope so it is less likely to fly away and either damage your home or hurt someone. Anything on your patio? Bring it into the house or into your garage, if you have one.

If you have hurricane shutters or windows, you are already ahead of the game. But, if you do not, boarding up your windows is a good close second. You might need to go to Home Depot or Lowe's where they have both the lumber and the clips/screws to board up the windows tightly. Do some research before you do this, because there is a right and wrong way to board

up your house against the possibility of storm damage.

The last thing to do is make sure you have a battery-operated charger for your phone, so that in the event you do get hit, you can communicate with your family, and call the agent and insurance company for help in putting in your claim. Get gas before the storm. Don't just top it off. If you have three vehicles, take them to the station one by one and fill them all up. The first thing that happens after a hurricane is a localized shortage



of goods, and you don't want to have to scramble around at the last minute and go without. If you prepare yourself, your home and your vehicles well in ad-

vance of the upcoming storm, you can breathe a sigh of relief that even if the storm hits, you have done everything you can to prevent against further loss.

Insights for Investors: Trends

What drove inflation down over the past year?

Inflation, by many official accounts, peaked at over 9% about this time a year ago. Most recently, we have been informed that inflation, based upon CPI, is approaching 3% (currently around 3.2%). The question on many investors' minds is who, or what, has made it happen? According to the Associated Press, it is not one thing, but rather a combination of things.

First, the drop in energy = mainly oil and gas prices. After spiking over 60%, gas prices came down as did a barrel of oil. Next was aggressive action in raising rates on the part of the Federal Reserve. One year ago, the Federal Funds rate was .25%. Today it is 5.33%. That is one of the fastest rises in U.S. history. When the Fed raises rates, savers and buyers of short-term investments see higher rates in money market funds, CDs and the like. That rate does have an intended effect on slowing borrowing and, thus, slowing the economy = adding to the decline of inflation. Lastly, there is the supply chain. The pandemic caused significant disruption in the development and distribution along the national and international supply chains. Many of those disruptions no longer exist and that, too, has helped bring prices down.

Home prices and mortgage rates are higher for sure. Many "would be" homeowners can no longer afford the note now that mortgage rates are near their highest levels in over 20 years (close to 7% after bottoming at less than 3% in 2020). Housing makes up a significant portion of CPI and, when that slows down, it brings inflation down.

What is The Phillips Curve?

According to the Corporate Financial Institute, the Phillips Curve suggests that when inflation is down, unemployment is up. Put another way, it suggests that when inflation is up, unemployment is down. Something strange is happening right now: Inflation is down, and unemployment is down (or employment is up, remains high). Why might this be so? There are a couple of points of view we have heard lately. One is from Professor Jeremy Siegel of the Wharton School (University of Pennsylvania). He stated recently on CNBC and notes that productivity is getting stronger, and the economy is growing. Rick Rieder, who is the CIO of Global Fixed Income at Blackrock, said on Wall Street Week recently that with an economy that is 70% services and 70% consumption (consumers), the historical levers of higher rates have not hurt the economy as they have in the past. Also, when it comes to long-term borrowing, Reider points out that a lot of high-tech companies' self-fund versus borrow for their cap ex (capital expenditures budgets). He notes that for sure there have been some parts of the economy hurt (commercial real estate, regional and small banks, some parts of the manufacturing economy), but for the most part, there has not been widespread pain. Hence, we have the cost of living going down, employment remaining resilient and the economy grow-

Is this a trend or a short-term thing?

Is this just a short term thing or is this a trend? We think the answers are multifold: 1) Strides in technology with AI and other innovations continue to bolster growth. 2) Liquidity remains high – a.k.a. there is still a lot of money in the economy in checking and savings accounts. 3) The labor shortage keeps unemployment low. It also looks like - depending upon what you read and believe = that the labor shortage may be here to stay for a while. According to the U.S. Census Bureau, the population growth rate of the U.S. was 0.4% for the 12-month period ending in July 2022. This means that approximately 1.3 million people were added to the U.S.

population during that period. Put another way, the U.S. population is growing at over 100k people per month. That is a key driver of consumption. However, according to a report by the Federal Reserve Bank of St. Louis, there will be around 10,000 people turning 65 each day for the next two decades. This means that approximately 300,000 people are retiring each month in the U.S.

Is the labor shortage here to stay or here just for a while?

We went back in time, and reviewed an article written in 2005 in the ERE newsletter (a newsletter for human resource professionals) that predicted the labor shortages starting in 2010 and going well beyond 2020. They, of course, had no idea that a pandemic was coming. The net result is that baby boomers did retire as predicted, but at an accelerated rate in recent years. Add to that, many companies have demonstrated they encourage employees to retire early at 55. There is also a coming shortage across many employment sectors: Airline pilots and air traffic controllers, for example (we understand mandatory retirement is 65). Significant numbers are at or near these ages. The labor shortage is going to be with us for awhile. Will that prove inflationary? Believe it or not, it has not so far. Wage inflation is not having the impact that many predicted it would have.

What's an investor to do now?

So, where does that leave our investors? We think this is a time where short-term rates offer yield not seen in a long time (savings and money markets over 5%). We also look at equities across the board; not concentrated in any one area and representing opportunities for long-term buy-and-hold (and patient) investors. Fixed income rates (think bonds) have climbed again lately. The increase in longer-term rates is largely due to the U.S. Treasury issuing more bonds (the main lever) and longer dated bonds as well. That will drive yields up and prices down. We think investors could lock in good, long-term yields be they in treasuries, corporate

or municipal bonds. We caution investors to always review the duration before investing in a particular bond. CDs certainly offer significantly higher yields now, but we encourage investors to think about what those represent: Mainly higher yields over shorter terms.

We hear many investing pundits wondering where and when rates will peak. With Federal Funds at 5.33% now, we are aligned with opinions that see them coming down in 2024. We think that will be 3.5 – 4%.—another potential reason to lock in a short-term CD or a longer-term fixed rate bond now. It may be a good idea to complement that with a diversified basket of stocks, as companies will continue to reap the productivity gains we are seeing now.

Caregiving For a Loved One With Alzheimer's:

Tips For a Compassionate Journey

Anna Rogers was diagnosed with Alzheimer's at age 72, a progressive brain disease that impacts thinking, memory and behavior. For her daughter, Jana Walker, the last 14 years have had ups and downs.

"I have learned through this journey over time that there will be good days where sometimes she might remember a little, and then the next day nothing is familiar to her. Be grateful and cherish the good days," said Walker.

Walker is one of more than 827,000 Floridians serving as

unpaid caregivers. According to new research from the Alzheimer's Association International Conference, more than 10.6% of Okaloosa County residents age 65 and up are living with Alzheimer's. Florida has the second highest prevalence in the U.S, with more than 580,000 Floridians living with the disease.

When her father passed away in 2020, Walker moved her mother from long-term care housing in Oklahoma to Florida. She now makes the drive from Destin to Miramar Beach daily to visit. "The challenging

part is trying to still have your own life with your family and not let your concern for your loved one consume your life," said Walker. "...but over time I have realized that about every 6-8 weeks, I need to get away."

Caregiving for family members can be overwhelming and many report experiencing higher rates of stress. According to the Alzheimer's Association 2023 Alzheimer's Disease Facts and Figures report, 66% of Florida caregivers reported at least one chronic health condition, 29% reported having depression and 14% reported be-





ing in poor physical health.

Practicing self-care can reduce the negative impacts of caregiving and improve quality of life. Services like respite care and adult day care can give caregivers a break to complete errands, enjoy social time or take a break. Many of these are available at low or no cost to Floridians through state and local programs. Caregiver support groups can also provide mental and emotional support while connecting with others going through a similar situation. 



Off the Hook

Fishing with GrandPa

Sharing the sport of fishing with children, no matter where one lives, can be an excellent way to spend time and make long lasting memories. Whether you're fishing experience began with a cane pole using a piece of hot dog on the hook, on a boat, surf fishing, going out on a fishing party boat or love fishing off the pier—fishing adventures and legendary stories always follow and are passed down to the next generation. As we all know, some of the great fishing stories become exaggerated and funnier as the years roll by.

Told by 7-year-old Dalton Arwood, this story is about him and his GrandPa fishing. Even though Dalton doesn't realize it yet, fishing has attributed to his development, thought patterns, vocabulary, behavior, and current and future relationships. GrandPa also teaches him conservation and sportsmanship. Early on, members of his family—Daddy James, Uncle Jesse (his daddy's twin brother), Paw Paw (Phillip, recently deceased May, 2023) and "especially" his GrandPa (Mark) instilled a love for fishing. Hopefully, you'll want to pass fishing on to the children in your life, too.



Dalton's Story

Others might know my GrandPa as Captain Mark in Destin, but he's always been GrandPa to me. He has a boat and me and others go along to fish. Everybody has been on GrandPa's boat with me. Pictures are taken with me and my daddy and anyone that's on the boat with the fish we catch. He loves to fish and knows where red fish are hiding in Destin Harbor. Daddy tells me a lot of funny stories about himself and my Uncle Jesse when they were little boys.

My Paw Paw from North Carolina, he's been with me in Destin fishing several times and taken me fishing at several lakes and ponds in North Carolina, West Virginia and Virginia. He also went fishing many times with me and my Daddy. I will remember Paw Paw fishing with me when I grow up and the stories he told me about him being a little boy. He always told jokes and taught me how to whistle.



All of us have been on Grand-Pa's boat many times. Paw Paw just went to heaven.

GrandPa drives the boat all around Destin when we fish and there's things to see: Destin Harbor, Pirate ship, the pass, jetties where big fish are caught and kept during season, Crab Island, the Coast Guard Station and out in the Gulf of Mexico. GrandPa taught me that out in the Gulf is called off-shore fishing and other places were called inshore. We see schools of mullet and they jump all the time, ducks with 7-8 baby ducks swimming be-hind, seagulls and 1 time there was a big green turtle swimming on top of the water then it dove deep. Dolphins swim along the side of the boat and chase us. We listen to Craig Morgan songs first, then other music is played. I wear my life jacket all the time. When I was younger, Daddy said and I listened: my life jacket is very important, this is the first thing I do or look for right when I get on the boat—put it on. They keep buying me life jackets to fit


Sitting beside GrandPa in the First Mate's chair is my place on the boat and he calls it Dalton's Chair. Before we fish, bait fish has to be caught using Sabiki (hard and funny word to say) rigs. It's a lot of fun and gets a little crazy when all of us are catching bait fish. We use them to catch larger fish later. You can only keep fish that are in season and size limit. They say about the fish we catch: short, out of season, in the slot fish or keeper. There's many good fish I'd like to keep, but can't. At least, I have my picture taken with every fish I catch. It's a good idea to reel up your fish fast. If I don't and there's dolphins hanging out around the boat while fishing, they have eaten a big bite off of my fish. One time when fishing, I caught a big Amber Jack. Then, a hungry bull shark came up and ate the entire fish in one bite! My favorite fish to catch is Red Snapper. 
When I'm older, I want nothing to change about going fishing in Destin. The Gulf water

Celebrating 75 Years of the Destin Fishing Rodeo!

2023 will mark the 75th Annual Fishing Rodeo in Destin, and each year it gets better and better. Created back in 1948, the Destin Fishing Rodeo had one simple goal: to extend the tourist season another month. Destin has always been a popular tourist spot for fishing, and keeping those extra vacationers here helped our town thrive.

The Destin Fishing Rodeo has expanded into one of the largest fishing tournaments along the Emerald Coast. The rodeo is a month long, spanning October 1-31st and roughly 30,000 anglers compete each year.

The weigh-ins happen on the docks behind AJ's Seafood and Oyster bar, located on the Destin Harbor. They are free to the public and are open daily from 10 a.m.-7 p.m. For boats to participate, charter and private boats must be registered at least 24 hours prior to weighing in a fish. There is no fee for anglers fishing on a registered vessel (private or charter) and shore fisherman can participate by



simply bringing their catch to the scales. Fish by kayak, paddle board, pier, bridge, jetty, shoreline and surf — whichever you prefer.

If you're planning to make a trip down to the docks, expect to see a broad spectrum of fish being weighed in. From Sharks to Amberjacks, Grouper to King Mackerel, Tunas to Marlin, the rodeo has it all. Anglers are competing for over \$100,000 in cash and prizes, awarded for both daily and overall catches.

2022 was the first year that the Extended Voyage Division added five extra species of fish for a total of ten eligible fish.

The Destin Fishing Rodeo leaderboard includes grouper, amberjack, scamp, yellowfin and big eye tuna, dolphin, wahoo, Almaco Jack, snowy grouper and yellowedge grouper. There was also a Ladies, Seniors and Junior Divisions added in 2022 for wahoo, alongside king mackerel, grouper, amberjack and blackfin tuna.



Even if you're not a fisherman, the energy level and excitement that comes from being at the docks for weigh ins is like nothing else we've ever experienced. Boats back into the scales, pull the fish from their boat while the announcer hypes up the crowd. Fish are strung up on the scale while the crowds cheer and applaud the boat and their team. For the best seat in the house, get there early, grab a few beers and snag a seat on the bleachers by the leaderboard or

above on AJ's upper deck.

Halloween on the Harbor will signify the end of weigh-ins on Wednesday, Oct. 31, when the captains, anglers, volunteers, and even Miss Destin, will be dressed in their favorite costumes. Everyone is invited to partake in the fun!

October kicks off with the Destin Seafood Festival, in conjunction with the Destin Fishing Rodeo! Make your plans to visit the Harbor all month long!

Detox (Cleanse), 'Internal Shower'

The words detox and cleanse are used interchangeably, but they basically have the same definition. They are often used to replace the word 'diet.' "Our world is wrought with harmful pollutants that can be transferred, stored and cause harm within our bodies. The list of these toxicities range from pathogens (viruses, bacteria, yeast/fungus, mold, parasites), chemicals, plastics, pesticides/ herbicides, radiation, heavy metals, etc. We are exposed to these harmful toxicants in the air we breathe, the water we drink, the food we eat and the products we put in and on our bodies. When the body can't clear these toxins, they can build up, injure our body organs, tissues and cells, and be a root cause of countless chronic diseases and bothersome symptoms."

Many of these cleanses detox various systems of the body.

You Didn't Earn My Respect

I was talking to a student about a difficult relationship with a teacher. The student didn't like the teacher's communication style and decided the teacher had not earned respect.

The student gave less effort and had a negative attitude, because the teacher was "not worthy of respect." The student ended up with a poor grade, being grounded and not being a great version of self all in the name of withdrawing respect from someone who hadn't earned it. Following the interaction, I started wondering about the cost to ourselves and others when we practice withdrawing respect from others when they displease us or behave in ways that don't align with our values.

It's uncomfortable when we discover someone holds a different view or value that is in fundamental opposition to our way of approaching life. We are left to decide how we will engage this person going forward. Current culture encourages us to believe respect is earned and only safely given to people who agree with us. Social media and news give us permission to cut off, cut out, publicly shame and withdraw not only respect, but also kindness from anyone who sees things differently. This begins as a way to "hold people accountable" and ends with us finding ourselves being unkind, rude, judgmental, self-righteous, bitter and a version of self that can become unrecognizable.

What if there are two kinds of respect? The traditional definition of respect is holding someone in high esteem or admiration. This type of admiring respect is what we refer to when talking about earning respect. It is based on character, performance and behavioral choices. We choose to bestow admiring respect on some and not on others. The second brand of respect is basic human respect. Basic human respect is the fundamental belief that each human has inherent value and worth regardless of what they believe or how they behave. Basic human respect is born out of respecting self and extending to others the

same level of common decency you hope others will extend to you. This respect assumes we do not have the right to subtract from the value of another person regardless of their disagreement with us in word or action. Basic human respect is freely assumed and not earned or lost.

Our culture is often confusing withdrawal of admiring respect with withdrawal of basic human respect. When we don't admire someone, there is not a significant social cost. When we don't extend basic human respect, we begin to believe we are better, to verbally assault others, to lose compassion, to dehumanize, to oppress, to reduce our character and to blindly engage in hypocrisy—all in the name of withholding respect others aren't doing their job to earn. When we make withholding basic human respect a habit, we find ourselves going down a dark character hole. So, how can we avoid this pitfall?

5 Ways to Practice Extending Basic Human Respect to Others

Extend grace freely because you're going to need it. No matter how hard you try, you will not be perfect and will make mistakes. Your values will not always align with others. You will need others to extend basic human respect to you.

Use judgment as a mirror. Typically, when we feel judgmental of others, there is an internal issue we need to address. Ask yourself what purpose your judgment is serving both inwardly and outwardly. Try trading judgment for curiosity. Try being curious about others beliefs/behaviors.

Treat others with kindness you would show to your friend or child. You would be kind to your friend or child if they disagreed with you. Treat others in the world with this same level of kindness. Your kindness should be based on who you want to be, not on whether someone else is pleasing you.

Speak to others as equals. You are not better or worse than anyone. Use a tone of voice, words, eye contact and nonverbals that reflect your belief that others are your equal.

Embrace humility. Just because you believe you are right about things doesn't mean you are. Try remembering you are human and you have things to learn from other people. Sometimes we learn the most profound lessons from those who see things differently.

Ever heard of Microneedling?
Well, now you have!

Also known as collagen induction therapy (CIT) and percutaneous collagen induction (PCI), microneedling is a cost-effective, minimally-invasive treatment for a number of skin conditions. In the past few years, it has increased in popularity due to its ability to improve skin texture and firmness, and diminish scars, pore size and stretch marks. One of the greatest benefits of microneedling is that it can be used anywhere on the body to improve texture, reduce scarring and diminish the look of discoloration. Even areas such as the delicate skin around the eyes can be treated (carefully!) as well as on sunken areas of the skin such as acne scars. It's also safe for treating fine lines, wrinkles and scars. Because the epidermis remains intact, the procedure can be repeated safely and is also suited to skin areas where laser treatments and deep chemical peels are not typically performed, such as around

the eyes and mouth, hands and chest. These controlled injuries trigger the skin's natural repair processes, stimulating collagen and elastin production.

The technique involves a series of small needles passed over selected treatment areas, creating tiny "micropunctures." This minor "injury" to the skin generates a healing response producing collagen and other skin building blocks that can improve color and texture.

The pores created by the microneedles can make more effective other topical therapies such as antioxidants and lightening creams. Because it keeps the skin's protective barrier essentially intact, treatment with micro-needling has less risk of adverse effects than other skin resurfacing procedures and is safer to use in patients with naturally darker skin types.

Treatments are quick, with only mild discomfort. Recovery time is minimal; return to school or work next-day with only mild redness. As with most in-office procedures, microneedling will increase your skin's sensitivity to the sun.

I use a pen with a new head for each client and recommend

a series of three sessions at time when sun exposure will be minimal. You'll see gradual improvement after each session.







Imagine a God who is closer to you than the breath in your lungs or the thoughts in your head.

God is greater than all that. I remember as a child attending Sunday School where I saw God on a funky used flannel board. I heard Him in starchy old hymns in a sanctuary where I was told to hush and be still.

The stiff, soulless sermons talked about life and love, but did little to show it.

And as You speak, A hundred billion failures disappear.


Where You lost Your life so I could find it here.

From Student to Master: The Inspiring Zentangle Journey of Charles Burkett

Zentangle is a form of meditative drawing that involves creating intricate patterns using simple strokes. The practice was created by Rick Roberts and Maria Thomas, who discovered that drawing repetitive patterns had a calming effect on the mind. Zentangle has since gained popularity around the world as a way to reduce stress and anxiety, while also promoting creativity and mindfulness.

After practicing Zentangle for many years, Charles Burkett became a Zentangle teacher in 2022; when Mattie Kelly Arts Foundation (MKAF) sponsored his certification coursework.

"It was our intention to "pay it forward" by empowering a veteran to become a certified CZT and connect with active duty and veteran military personnel as a peer," said MKAF Education Director Melanie Moore.

Collaborating with Burkett was a natural fit as he has a personal understanding of the benefits of Zentangle.

Burkett, proud to be raised in Walton County, enlisted in the U.S. Army at 17. He married his high school sweetheart, was stationed in Germany and in 1998 had a baby girl. They returned stateside in 2000. After serving 22 years, he retired as a Chief Warrant Officer 3 in 2013 and they returned to the local area.

In 2004, a devastating helicopter crash left Burkett with a Traumatic Brain Injury and extensive nerve damage, limiting most of his fine motor skills on his dominant right side. Fearing he may not regain full use of his hand, he used Zentangle for physical therapy and taught himself how to write with his left hand. Learning how to hold a pencil was the first step towards re-learning the same skills on his dominant hand. Starting with the letters of the alphabet, he progressed to drawing creative patterns and connecting lines to create images. Within months, he had regained 80 percent of his fine motor skills, and by the end of the year, he had full control of his right arm, hand, and

Zentangle worked wonders for Burkett who says, "You get to create a product from just relaxing and letting your mind expand."

The stress-free, no-fault method of creating beautiful patterns inspired him to share it with others. "Their mental and spiritual improvement was amazing," he says.

Today, Burkett is as a Certified Zentangle teacher for MKAF's Warrior Arts, a special ArtsReach initiative established by Moore in 2016. He teaches a variety of Zentangle classes both virtually and in-person since joining the program.

Burkett — who also teaches combat readiness, motorcycle safety, self-protection among other things — has taught introductory classes for mixed groups, combat vet support groups, and female vet support groups at the Okaloosa Vet Center. He has also taught virtual classes for the Bay County Vet Center female vet support group, the AFSOC Commando Caregivers/Warrior CARE summit, and the EOD Warrior Foundation. Burkett's virtual classes have reached military service members from around the world, including their spouses and caregivers, in both active duty and veteran roles.





When he isn't teaching Zentangle you can find Burkett scuba diving, parachuting, cross-country running, cross-fit training and caring for his family and ranch in Laurel Hill.

Burkett is inspired by those who have come before. "Living through history is such a cherished commodity. Watching things unfold before your eyes and cataloging events to share is priceless," he says.

This veteran commits fully to whatever he takes on. If you need a nudge, follow his motto: "Give 110 percent at whatever you are doing. Whether it's piloting a helicopter or sweeping

the floor. Therefore, on those days that you don't feel like you are at your best, chances are your performance may have slipped "down" to 100 percent!"

MKAF's ArtsReach program is dedicated to bringing the arts to underserved communities throughout the region. Through partnerships with local schools, community centers, and other organizations, ArtsReach provides access to high-quality arts education and programming for people of all ages and backgrounds.

Through his classes, Burkett is helping people to tap into their creativity, reduce stress and anxiety and explore the world of art.

This year, Moore has scheduled more than 100 Zentangle and painting classes through the MKAF Warrior Arts program. In addition to Zentangle, the MKAF Warrior Arts program also offers classes in painting, jewelry making and comedy/improv.

The Million Dollar Quartet

Picture it; America–1956. A gallon of gas is 29 cents and a glass bottle of Coca Cola costs you a nickel. Grace Kelly becomes Princess Grace of Monaco and new products on the market include Play Doh, Comet Cleanser and a funny little dice game called Yahtzee. It is also



the year a relatively unknown Elvis Presley explodes onto the scene at the tender age of 21. The term "catapults" might even be more apt. 1956 is a rockn-roll pot of water that is just beginning to boil, and then Elvis comes along and cranks up the heat.

He released five songs to top the Billboard pop charts that year including "Heartbreak Hotel," "I Want You, I Need You, I Love You," "Don't Be Cruel," "Hound Dog" and "Love Me Tender."

On Nov. 15, 1956, the movie "Love Me Tender" was released, and not long after that on Dec. 4, 1956, Elvis stopped by Memphis-based Sun Records Studios to have a chat with owner

Sam Phillips, also known as the man who invented rock-n-roll. It just so happened that Rockabilly artist Carl Perkins, who originally wrote and performed "Blue Suede Shoes," was there to lay down some tracks. Wild piano man Jerry Lee Lewis was brought in to help fill out those tracks with his distinctive sound. Oh, and there was someone else

there, too—a popular country singer named Johnny Cash.

These four legendary musicians proceeded to have an impromptu jam session that included gospel, hymns, rockabilly, country and a little rock-n-roll thrown in for good measure. Sam Phillips had the presence of mind to leave the tapes running, and managed to get a record-

ing of this epic jam session that made the Memphis newspapers the next day with the headline "Million Dollar Quartet."


The actual recording wasn't released until 1981 and, even then, only in Europe. It wasn't until 1990 that the complete recordings were released in America. The musical, which is based on this once-in-a-lifetime convergence of some of the greatest musical talent in American history, premiered in Chicago in 2008 to rave reviews and eventually went to Broadway.



The great thing about ECTC's premiere of this toe-tapping musical is that you have more than one random Tuesday afternoon to catch it. As the King would say, "It's now or never."









Ask Destinites: Crab Island Vendors

tional Park Service (NPS) has jurisdiction over Crab Island as part of the Gulf Islands National Seashore. They are developing a Commercial Services Strategy and Environmental Assessment. The plans have potential to change how vendors operate and what services or products would be allowed.

Destin Mayor, Bobby Wagner, has expressed his concern over the implementation of the proposed changes. He stated the plans could be "detrimental" to the vendors and there could be safety risks to the visitors. Relocating the space for the vendors would force the visitors into an area with deeper waters and where the currents could be worse, thus, causing more drownings.

The mayor's other concern is that 88 independent vendors could be replaced by a single concessionaire contract. This would hurt the diversity of businesses currently enjoyed on the island. He feels the current family-operated businesses are important, because they not only bring uniqueness, but also the owners who know the area best. These local vendors definitely add to the Crab Island charm.

Local vendors are worried about their livelihood if the current plans go through. Mayor Wagner said via a WEAR TV interview, "The whole industry has tried to come together as best they can to try and regulate what's best for guests and businesses. So, now that they're working together, big government is coming in telling us they

have a better plan for us." Mayor Wagner has made it clear that he does not want to give up regional control to the federal government. He doesn't want locals to lose their voice or freedoms in local matters.

This is what one of our Destinites Facebook group members had to say after reading an interview with NPS on www. getthecoast.com. "I think this shares an important perspective with an interview from the NPS. It's clear they have been communicating with local government for several years about their plans, but it's been presented as if this is a new plan and it seems based on this interview that that is untrue. It remains a very heated issue, but Crab Island has been part of the NPS since the 70s. I would like to see a follow-up article regarding the environmental impact the commercialization of Crab Island has had on the ecosystem in that area of the Bay. The sea grass in that area has all but been destroyed and that can have far reaching ramifications for everything from fisheries to erosion of channels during storms, I would infer."

It remains to be seen what will happen with this situation. Congressman Matt Gaetz has also expressed his concerns about the safety and other issues, should the current plan be implemented. The NPS states that they plan to work with local vendors and officials on a strategy. There will be a 30-day public comment period, and that, probably, will include a public meeting to divulge the details.


