Active Compassion for the Homeless

Imagine a world where every night brings the uncertainty of finding a safe place to sleep, where danger can be right around any corner, and feelings of fear, demoralization and alienation are constant companions. This isn't a hypothetical scenario for many; it's the everyday reality for those living without the basic security of a home. Addressing this need doesn't always require grand gestures;

sometimes, the smallest acts of kindness can make the biggest difference.

At the forefront of this compassionate response is One Hopeful Place, a beacon of hope in Okaloosa County dedicated to breaking the cycle of homelessness for people living in our communities. My journey in understanding this crisis began three decades ago, as the President of a city rescue mission. A heart-rending moment happened when a homeless couple, struggling with addiction and caring for two small children, stayed at our shelter. Months after they left, they contacted my wife and me with a life-changing request: would we adopt their young son and daughter? They were aware of our loss and wished for their children to have the stability they couldn't provide. This poignant episode not only highlighted the multifaceted challenges faced by the homeless, but also the critical need for community support and intervention. We said "yes."

The Growing Need

In today's world, the challenges faced by the homeless have intensified, with fewer resources and increasing societal apathy. In this bleak landscape, One Hopeful Place emerges as a sanctuary, providing critical services such as a day program, cold night shelter, health screenings and transportation for medical needs. These services, as simple as a hot meal or a safe place to sleep, are often lifesaving, offering a glimmer of hope in the lives of many.

The Day Program: A Lifeline

The Day Program at One Hopeful Place transcends the definition of service; it is, indeed, a lifeline. For those on the streets, basic necessities like nutritious food, clean water and access to hygiene and laundry facilities are luxuries. Here, the program bridges this gap, often



marking the thin line between survival and despair. The stories of those who have found solace and support here are a testament to its impact.

How Can YOU Help?



as ye have done it unto one of the least of these my brethren, ye have done it unto me" (Matthew 25:40). Jesus was directly referring to our responsibility to care for the hungry and the homeless! Our Mission and Goals

One Hopeful Place's mission is to provide shelter and support for single men, women, with priority given the veterans experiencing homelessness. Our goal is not just to offer a handout but a hand-up, helping individuals rebuild their lives. The shelter, which opened in 2016, has expanded to accommodate more individuals, including a separate shelter for homeless women.

The Community's Role

Community engagement is crucial. The story of One Hopeful Place is one of collective effort and shared responsibility. It began with community leaders recognizing a need and taking decisive action. Today, it continues to grow with the support of local businesses, nonprofits, churches, and volunteers.

The night Christ was born, the inn-keeper was busy with a full house of customers, thanks to the new taxation decreed by Caesar Augustus. The people of Bethlehem were unaware that the couple entering their town were about to give birth to the Son of God! Perhaps even Joseph and Mary wondered how this could be God-directed when the only place they could find shelter was in a smelly stable. But this night would change everything! Micah, a prophet of the Old Testament had prophesied hundreds of years before, that a ruler was to be born in Bethlehem, whose origins were from Eternity. "But you, oh Bethlehem...though you are a small village in Judah, a ruler of Israel shall come from you, one whose origins are from the ancient past."



Destin Library: Crimes, Clubs and Community Involvement

"I think it's fantastic to have a real expert who is delving into a real unsolved case," said Amy Adams, Destin Library Assistant. "You're not only learning fascinating details about crime solving, but you also have the opportunity to possibly help justice be served. Too cool!"

It may not sound like the typical Library discussion, but the criminal focus is thanks to Michael Yoder, a 20-year veteran with the FBI who now shares his knowledge in victimology with the Destin community. He has set up a wildly successful True Crime Club at the Destin Library, amassing over 160 members to date.

It's one of many groups who utilize space at the Destin Library. There's also the annual AARP free tax service meeting, the Daughters of the American Revolution setting up displays for patriotic holidays, the snowbirds who utilize the place in January, and more.

It's a space where everyone can find their own form of sanctuary.

Yoder credits the Library with finding him a free space to host monthly meetings, and he said Skylar Dennis, Library Technology & Programming Spe-



cialist, immediately helped him when he rang the Library phone number asking about reservation options. "I couldn't have started this Club without the Library's help."

From the standpoint of Dennis, it's a win-win. "I love that the True Crime Club is engaging people in the community that have never been to the Library before," she said. "Several people have come in for the Club and gotten Library cards."

Wen Livingston, Library Director, echoes this. "I'm delighted that people are enjoying the Club, and we have community members willing to provide their time to create interesting events. Michael Yoder also spent some time with me looking at the building and suggesting ways to make it safer and the best rooms to go to if there is an active shooter or other emergency."

Despite retiring some time ago, Yoder can't help but share



his expertise. The last eight years of his FBI time was spent as a criminal profiler with the BAU. Perhaps due to the popularity of shows like "Criminal Minds", the BAU – Behavioral Analysis Unit – has gained plentiful followers. But with that, there are also misconceptions.

"Murder is not an FBI thing," explains Yoder. "It's a local or state crime. The FBI only gets involved in murder cases at the request of police."

Yoder said one of his more memorable cases took place when he was working for the Crimes Against Adults Unit. There was a case about 13 years old (which means 13 years cold), and Yoder received a call from a police department that "provided their theory that a small group of young adults was responsible for killing this woman. She was in a wheelchair and killed in her home while sleeping."

After investigating, he was able to dismantle the entire theory and come up with a new one that matched the killing to one individual, and the police were able to pin that person -a scorned suitor of the woman's daughter - and get a conviction.

"Imagine if you were suspected of a murder you didn't commit; imagine that shadow hanging over you," said Yoder. "Five or so people were exonerated because I was able to debunk a theory."

Those memories provide great satisfaction, but Yoder knew he needed something to occupy his mind upon retirement. He also knew with the national true crime trend, that he should get a group of like-minded folks together.

"The first thing was determining a location," said Yoder. "I wasn't going to spend my own money on a room. I'm too much of a cheapskate."

Hence, the True Crime Club at the Library was born.

"The first couple of meetings,

for the first hour, I talked about what I want this Club to be. I talked about goals. The second hour I taught a class. I do teach at the University of West Florida – in their criminal justice department – so I spent the second hour teaching pure civilians on criminal justice concepts."

The first class was on 'No Body Homicide,' which means a person is missing, you think they are dead, but there is no body. "People think if you don't have a body, you can't charge with murder, and that's not true," said Yoder. "We talked about the misconceptions of No Body Homicides, and that was a pretty rowdy class with lots of questions."

After a few months of meeting, Yoder said he didn't have to do much at all. "By that time, we found a Club president who is good with investigations, we found a case for the group members to take up, I interjected with opinions and concepts, and then I got to sit back and enjoy."

At present, the majority of the monthly meeting time is made up of updates on the real cases that they work on as a Club. He said they pick the cases to have a focus on victimology. "It's not to solve a case, not to find a who-



Taxes

It's no secret that taxes are heading up across the board. Many increases have been legislated and more are on the way. Does it make sense to pay taxes now under low Trump Era rates or wait until they increase? For many it might be a great time for a Roth Conversion. This strategy involves converting IRA assets to a Roth IRA and paying the income taxes in the current period. If early in retirement, this can be a great way to get tax free income in the future. Additionally, tax efficiency can be achieved utilizing a mix of account types, trusts, tax deferral and tax-free investments like municipal bonds.

Income

The most common question we get when meeting for the first time with prospective clients is: How can I generate enough income with my retirement savings to maintain a certain lifestyle AND not run out of money? At Gulf Financial, income is job one. If we can create enough income the rest of the plan becomes simple. Fortunately there are a number of ways an independent Fiduciary advisory can create income. With interest rates at a 30 year high, it's a great time to buy Fixed Income instruments such as CD's, Pension Annuities, structured notes, dividend stocks, and high quality corporate bonds. We are seeking to create yield (that

means earnings) in client portfolios above 6 percent at a very low risk to principal. As we near or enter retirement our focus must shift from growth to asset preservation and income. When buying Fixed Income, utilize a ladder strategy and buy several different maturities at once.

Risk

Most economists and stock analysts perceive that there is significant risk in the current market. There are a few economic indicators that would suggest we are heading for recession and market correction sometime in 2024. The first indicator is what we term an inverted yield curve. That's when the 2 year treasury bond pays more than the 10 year treasury. That's the current situation. A recession has occurred 100% of the time this has happened in the past. It may not happen again but we are ready if it does. Another indicator is the Price/Earnings (PE)ratio of the market. PE ratio is a valuation measure. It is very high now and that's a signal that stocks are overvalued and ripe for a pullback. Our experience tells us most retirees are far too aggressively invested in mutual fund and etf portfolios. Reduce risk by hedging your bet with risk-free, principal protected, and buffered products in the Fixed Income markets. Consider reducing equity exposure and increasing your cash position as current money market rates are approaching 6%. Any large drawdowns are destructive and catastrophic to a retirement plan and must be avoided.

It's a great time for a second opinion. Analyze your current portfolio and take steps now to protect your future. Consider an Independent Fiduciary Advisory like Gulf Financial, required by law to always act in your best interest.

Which Medicare Enrollment Period is Right for You?

Eventually, if you are lucky, you will find yourself needing to make the transition from traditional insurance to Medicare. Knowing when you qualify to first enroll and when to make changes later on can prove a bit confusing. But, it is critical to make sure you make the right moves at the right time. Missed opportunities, and sometimes even monetary penalties which could last a lifetime, might otherwise result.

So, let's get right after it, shall we?

There are four types of enrollment periods for Medicare. For the purposes of this article, I will use the term "Medicare" to apply to Advantage Plans, Supplement Plans and Stand-Alone Prescription Plans, unless otherwise noted. Those Enrollment Periods are:

- Initial Enrollment Period
- Special Election Period

Annual Election Period

• Open Enrollment Period

The first Enrollment Period you will encounter is called the Initial Enrollment Period, or IEP for short. As the name indicates, this is when you are aging into eligibility for Medicare. The IEP is different for everyone as it starts three months before the month in which you turn age 65 and runs until three months after the month in which you turn age 65.

The IEP does expose you to a potential lifelong penalty if you fail to enroll in Part B and a Prescription Plan. Those penalties would apply after you eventually did enroll late and accrue every month after your IEP ended. The penalties will stop accumulating after you get the proper coverage arrangement. Important note: These penalties will not apply to you if you have other Qualifying coverage through work or a spouse.

The second Enrollment

Period you may encounter is a Special Election Period, or SEP for short. This Enrollment Period is for certain types of special events such as moving to a different coverage area or losing your employer or union coverage. The SEP timing is, again, unique to everyone as every situation is unique to the person. This Enrollment Period lasts for three months after the month in which the qualifying special event occurred.

The third Enrollment Period you will encounter is the Annual Election Period, or AEP. Every year, from October 15th through December 7th, you can switch plans, drop coverage or change companies for your Medicare coverage. You can also join a Medicare plan if you missed the window for the IEP or SEP described earlier.

It is important to note, any Medicare plan elections you make during the AEP will become effective on January 1st of the following year.

The fourth and final Enrollment Period you will encounter is the Open Enrollment Period, or OEP. Depending on the type of Medicare plan you have (or don't have), you may be allowed to make a one-time election to switch a plan (Advantage Plan) or purchase a plan (Supplement Plan and/or Stand-Alone Prescription Plan. The OEP runs from January 1st through March 31st every year.

Deciphering all this can be somewhat confusing. Using a broker with experience in such

matters will be your best bet. If you have been using a broker that worked with you on your under-age-65 plan, that person would be your best first telephone call, provided they also work in the Medicare field as I do. Often times, folks will look to move that under age 65 policy to a broker that works with Medicare at least three to four years prior to becoming eligible for Medicare just to help make the transition as smooth as possible. Know your Enrollment Periods or get someone that does and your transition will be as easy as Key Lime pie!

Taking Stock of Changes in Insurance

2023 has been a strange year for insurance in the state of Florida. We have seen some massive increases in premiums across the board. Home, Auto and Flood insurance premiums have risen above levels seen last in 2005. Between 2022 and 2023, nearly 20 carriers either went into receivership or left the Sunshine State entirely due to the high incidence of claims and litigation. Now that it has been nearly a year since litigation passed, changing the way property damage attorneys are paid in the event of a disagreement, from carrier-paid to contingency paid, what does this mean for insureds whose claims were either denied or underpaid? Does the litigation help? Will there be relief?

These are all good questions. When an attorney takes a case on a contingency basis, it generally means that in return for their help in resolving a case, they will take a percentage of the case value. If you had a \$100,000 property damage claim that should have been covered, and the attorney recovered the entire \$100,000, whatever set percentage you agreed to at the outset of the lawsuit will belong to the law firm. Generally, the percentage is 33% or roughly 1/3 of the total claim payment.

Some of the rates are starting to decrease. Citizens Property Corp. Depopulation program has two types, voluntary and forced, in which it contracts other private market insurance companies to take on Citizens' policies at rates that are within 20% of the Citizens premium. Many of the premiums in those assumption notices are lower than Citizens premiums. Many. Not all, and not enough.

Flood insurance as well has seen historic highs in premiums this year in the wake of last year's shocking storm surge during Hurricane Ian, and it may be another year until flood premiums go down. Many of those affected by the worst of the storm surge waters either did not have any flood insurance, or they didn't have enough.

Many of those who did not have any flood insurance said they didn't think they needed to have flood insurance. Flood-





ing in their area caused genuine shock and awe, and ruined their homes. Many of them are still trying to recoup their losses, even after help from FEMA.

Florida is a flood zone, all of it. What we need to recognize moving forward is that the best thing we can do for ourselves and our wallets is to do everything we can to document what we have through taking photos of the inside and outside of our homes and emailing our receipts for big ticket items to ourselves to date and time stamp them. In addition, purchase flood insurance for your home, knowing you might never need it, or you might need it, but you can't get it once you need it.

Speak with a local independent Insurance agent about making sure you have the right kind of coverage, neither too high or too low, which may involve your agent performing a new Replacement Cost estimator for your home, with you on the phone, to make sure it's correct. The only person who knows what you have in your home is you. The property appraiser network for your county may or may not keep updated records, so that you, dear reader, are the best source of information about any changes you have made to your home, to update your coverage accordingly.

There are three basic home incidents that are some of the most frequent causes of water damage claims in Florida:

1-Rubber supply/drain lines that either leaked or burst. Steel braided supply and drain lines are much more durable, and go a long way towards prevention of these types of leaks.

2-Air Conditioning leaks that happened because the AC lines have not been flushed and no anti-algae treatments were deposited into the AC line. Having your AC line flushed every three months and putting anti-algae tablets into the AC line, as well as changing out your air filter every couple of months will help to reduce the chances of loss.

3-Old hot water heaters that have rust and/or corrosion are much more likely to burst or even to explode. If a hot water tank has orange and or green corrosion on it and/or has a manufacture date older than 15 years, replacing the hot water tank with a properly fitted TPR or pressure release valve, is a less expensive option than dealing with a large-scale water claim.

Preventative maintenance is much less expensive and stressful than the kind of insurance atmosphere in which we find ourselves currently. Insurance is there in case something happens, yes, but there are two caveats to this. 1) Not everything is covered and 2) the claims process can take several months to complete.

In short, relief is coming slowly, but we need to do all we can to protect ourselves and our homes and vehicles now, before we have an issue.

Insights for Investors: Fear or Optimism for Investors

It has been noted that most people, when they hear or read things that speak to fear, respond with seeing that (about 70% of people) as credible. They believe it, or are motivated by it, or act because of it. Optimism by contrast tends to stir skepticism. Today's investors and savers are faced with both messages on almost a daily basis.

Inflation has had its steepest decline in over 70 years, yet most consumers don't see it that way and are fearful for the economy. That is either because of what they experience at the grocerv store or the gas pump. And for sure those on the lower end of the income spectrum feel it mostly because they spend most of their money on living vs. saving or investing or buying luxuries. Gas prices, when adjusted for inflation, are lower than they were 45 years ago. When adjusted for inflation, a gallon of gas in 1978 was \$4.37 in today's dollars. As of October of this year, it was \$3.91 (down from \$4.11 in September). And cars are more fuel efficient today. In other words, it takes fewer gallons today to go 100 miles than it did 45 years ago. The fear is that this necessity is more expensive than ever. The optimism is that it means consumers have more dollars to spend on other things. Consumer spending tends to support that.

Groceries are of significance. Groceries, like most other things, went up over 10% in 2022. So far in 2023, they are up 3.7% year over year. The inflation rate (The Labor Department's number) came in at 3.2% for all inflation when that was reported in mid-November. That is down from over 9% late summer of 2022. Groceries over time have been closer to the overall inflation rate of 3.2%. Many grocery store chains passed their costs on to consumers, and one concern is that they are paying lower wholesale prices now, yet they are not passing those onto the consumer. Their earnings tend to suggest that.

Have you ever heard of FOMO? That is "fear of missing out." That drives buying and investing behavior, because people see it as credible. The problem is that asset prices (think the so called magnificent seven stocks or housing prices over the last few years) accelerate well beyond their long-term valuations in a very short period. Some also call that a form of momentum investing. These assets appreciate with added risk. But, the fear of missing out is beyond the fear of these assets perhaps being overpriced.

Many investors think that U.S. companies, beyond those seven (Tesla, Amazon, Nvidia, Apple, Microsoft, Alphabet, and Meta), are performing rather poorly. The rest of the stock market – the other approximate 3,500 stocks – have been relatively flat. Earnings growth for the S&P 500 is now positive at approximately 3.2 year over vear.

Raymond James Chief Investment Officer Larry Adams (CIO) note: "With 80% of the S&P market cap having reported, the 3Q 23 earnings season was generally solid. The earnings recession officially ended as the S&P 500 posted its first quarter of YoY EPS growth in four quarters, and the percentage and magnitude of beats were both above the 10-year averages. The strongest performers were the mega cap names, which saw earnings growth of >40% YoY during the quarter."

We take note that historically stock prices tend to follow earnings. That is optimism, however, not fear.

The optimist sees huge growth in productivity, economic and wealth growth. The pessimist sees job losses, even though past technological innovations have resulted in job gains and standard of living gains. The potential impact across all sectors of the market and the in-



dustries they represent could be substantial.

Current rates on cash like alternatives like CDs is over 5%. Many investors and savers have taken advantage of this and are shying away from equities or even bonds. The common theme is that this is the most practical approach. Historically, when investing for the long term, if investors wait to see if stocks and bonds do better, they might be missing out on the potential growth when the market rebounds.

The national debt is over 33 trillion dollars. The fear is that the U.S. debt is not sustainable and there is nothing that will be done, and the standard of living and economic progress are going down along with the U.S. dollar. The optimism is that the U.S. historically has figured things out. One example of that is the dollar has appreciated year to date. The big three are Social Security, Medicare and Medicaid. The optimist says that the USA, for over 70 years, continues to lead the world economically. Its population and consumption are growing and that its open society make it a bastion for innovation and invention. Sustained economic growth (compare post WW2) can lead an economy to significantly reduce its debt to GDP over time.

Gross Domestic Product (GDP) grew at 4.9% in the most recent quarter with historical averages of over 2% (Statista notes GDP averaged 2.1% from 1990 to 2022). We believe that productivity is growing, consumer spending has been resilient, that unsustainable growth of entitlement programs will be addressed, that inflation will continue to wane and that shortterm rates will begin their decline soon. That is optimism. We tend to think it has credibility, but also acknowledge our thinking is in the minority.

per, but don't cut it yet. Place the box in the center of the paper, leaving enough paper at the ends and ensuring that there's enough to cover the box. Now you're ready to cut the paper.

• Center the box on the cut paper and bring one side of the paper halfway across the top of the box. Tape the paper to the box so it doesn't move.

• Before folding over the other piece of wrapping paper on the box, use your fingertips to create a straight, tight crease. Now you're ready to bring this side up and over the box. Allow it to overlap the first taped piece of paper and affix it with tape. Using double-sided tape creates cleaner look.

• Now for the ends of the package: Starting on one end, fold the top flap onto the side of the box, creating two wings at the side. Flatten those in against the box, then fold the triangle of paper up against the box and fasten with tape. Stand the box up and repeat this step on the open end.

Yay, you just wrapped a gift like a pro did it!

I promise, it's not as daunting as it sounds. If you're like me, visualizing it is easier than reading it and you'll appreciate the step-by-step pictorial included in this article.





Golf Series: Indian Bayou Golf & Country Club, A Historic Treasure

Before there was Regatta Bay, before there was Kelly Plantation, before there was Emerald Bay, there was iconic Indian Bayou.

As one of four Destin courses in Okaloosa County, Indian Bayou Golf & Country Club is recognized as the first course to invite tourists to play golf as well as enjoy the pristine waters and sugar sand beaches of Destin.

The beautiful Indian Bayou Golf & Country Club course, located in the heart of Destin, is an 18-hole semi-private challenge suited for all skill levels. This 72 Par challenge is visited by tourists and enjoyed by over 150 members as their home course. Members include faithful snowbirds who appreciate the comradery that membership brings. Several golf tournaments are also offered throughout the year for special groups and charities.

Indian Bayou was built in 1978 by local families. They recognized the need for a golf course in the upscale community of Indian Bayou. In 199,2 another nine holes were added to the original 18 holes. Each nine holes is named for an historic Indian nation: Seminole, Choctaw and Creek. In 2018, however, the nine holes of Creek were closed and sold for other development.

Golf manager and Director of Golf, Jim Carpenter, has served Indian Bayou Golf Club since 1984. Like the course itself, Jim follows the present golf course Indian heritage lineage. Graduating from Choctawhatchee High School (Choctaw) and attending Florida State University (Seminole) Jim is definitely "Mr. Indian Bayou." Jim's pride in the course is evident as he shares credit for the course success with a talented golf course superintendent and devoted staff. Jim talked about the well-conditioned course and the signature putting greens that are among the reasons visitors return to play golf along the Destin corridor.

Morning rates with carts included are \$159 with the lowest afternoon rates of \$105. With 7,038 yards of challenging holes, Jim chooses hole number 15 as his favorite. It is a short dog leg left. For those who know how to make a golf drive obey, they can draw the ball slightly left in order to place a second shot on the green. The striking landscape throughout 18 golf holes contains water, sand traps and bunkers ready for errant golf shots that miss the perfectly manicured fairways.

Prior to a round, golfers can practice at the driving range or



practice putting green. There are also golf items for purchase from the well-stocked pro shop. Shoes, shirts, golf clubs and hats, no problem! Golf memorabilia for home or for gifts is available as well. Lunch is served seven days a week beginning from 11 a.m. to 3 p.m. and a lounge in-





Bake for 25 minutes at 375°. (I use two round cake pans, but you could make a sheet cake, too.)


Icing:

Now, everyone knows someone coping with emotional discomfort that creates significant life disruption. We can all benefit from basic tools for providing healthy support to those around us.

Things TO do when supporting others:

Reach out consistently. People struggling with mental health often find it difficult to keep up relationships when they are spending significant energy managing their emotional/physical state. Often, this is not about a lack of value for relationships but about a state of overwhelm. Call, text, send a note in the mail, send a care package, bring a meal, invite the person for coffee, ask if you can come by for a visit, offer to do a load of laundry, babysit, sit with the person, ask questions about their experience and be present. Encourage seeking additional support. A support system needs to have multiple people and components to be

effective. It is not healthy to be someone's only support person. Be supportive while encourag-

Can You Digest the *Holidays?* Gut, Constipation and Colon Health

By Kay Leaman, HEALTH ARCHITECT, HEALTHYDAY HEALTHYLIFE What a great topic for the holidays! This is the time of year we escape from the disciplines we've created. The family recipes, the cookies, pies and beverages flow. And, depending on our emotional state during all

the busyness and possible drama is what can move us to over indulge.

Our gut system can take a beating this time of the year. So, read on and I'll offer some thoughts for making this season a bit more digestive (pun intended).

There are two types of constipation: **Periodic**, which is mostly due to dietary or activity fluctuations; and **Chronic**, which can frustrate both doctor and patient.

Let's take a look at each:

Periodic constipation can be resolved with minor changes. Causes can be dietary intake, reduced fiber consumption, dehydration, change in schedule or holding or ignoring the urge to go for too long.

14% of people suffer with recurrent episodic or Chronic constipation and there is no known cure. It, many times, also requires medication to help alleviate the symptoms. A medical diagnosis requires two or more of the following symptoms for at least three months:

• Straining 25% of time

• Hard stools 25% of time

• Two or less bowel movements per week

Causes for chronic constipation include pregnancy, hypothyroidism, Diabetes, IBS, depression/anxiety, MS, Parkinson's, stroke, cancer, spinal cord injury and medications. Some of these medications include:

• Narcotics

HBPAnti-cholinergic for muscle



spasms, such as Benadryl, etc.
Anti-Parkinson's and seizure medications

• Tricyclic antidepressants (adrenal, etc.)

• Iron supplements

• Anti-diarrhea and laxatives Caffeine can cause constipation. But, in general, it helps to alleviate it. Coffee stimulates muscles in the bowel to help evacuate the sigmoid colon. Decaf can do the same, but caffeinated is best. It is also a holistic treatment for constipation.

Substances that can also cause constipation are dairy products which are high in calcium and low in magnesium, calcium intake without magnesium, iron, excess caffeine, alcohol and artificial sweeteners such as aspartame which affect the nerves needed for elimination.

The process of moving food and then stools through the digestive system requires nerve stimulation and these muscles require micronutrients to contract and relax, notably calcium (contract) and magnesium (relax). Diets high in calcium should supplement with a minimum of 250 mg. per day or 400 mg, and should be consumed with fiber. The average fiber intake is

15 grams per day. The optimal amount should be 35 grams per day. We can supplement our fiber intake with 20 grams of a high-quality fiber that contains both soluble and insoluble fiber.

Implementing fiber into our diets should be done gradually, allowing the bowels to adjust. The ratio is 6 grams of soluble and 4 grams of insoluble 2x daily. Begin with 1/2 serving in the evening. After several days add a second dose in the a.m. Then graduate to the full dose after several more days. Be sure to take a probiotic daily to aid in reducing gas and bloating.

Increasing water consumption is also key. Start here. Track your intake and choose water over sodas or tea.

Now let's get back to the tips for the holidays:

• Choose a healthy snack before sitting down for the main meal.

• Consider substituting the sugar in your recipes with honey. You can also cut back on the amount needed as honey is sweeter than sugar.

• Drink a glass of water about 20 minutes before eating. Do not drink liquids during the meal as it neutralizes the stomach acids.

• Set out a small plate of cookies and sweets each day. Once the plate is empty, no more sweets until tomorrow.

• When you sit down to eat have everyone take a few deep breaths and offer what they are grateful for.

• Put your fork down between bites.

• Go for a walk after eating.

By Dr. Richard Chern M.D. Sleeping through the night seems like an impossible task for many of us. Waking up at three or four in the morning can be an everyday ordeal for many as we age. You should already

Night of Sleep Just One Good

know sleep is one of the most important tools to heal our bodies, maintain the immune system, keep our mind invigorated and our memory healthy. So, you would think we would sleep

better as we age. The effects of sleep deprivation are more than just a day of feeling tired and fighting to make it through. Sleep deprivation has been well studied and has catastrophic long-term results. Besides daytime sleepiness, irritability and a shortened attention span, sleep deprivation

causes obesity, hypertension, diabetes, anxiety, heart attacks, reduced sex drive, impaired memory, and depression. That's not, might cause, that's does cause.

dunnit, just to work on victimology. In my experience, working with hardcore homicide detectives, many times they gloss over victimology as if it's not necessary. I have found that when you understand victimology, you get a better understanding of the crime."

The True Crime Club's first big case is somewhat local, a Panhandle Florida case, and it's within the last 10 years. That helps the group members utilize Internet skills, explained Yoder.

"I'm truly amazed at the direction of this Club," said Yoder. "We're finding some real hard-core, true crime researchers amongst the group. Law enforcement is usually close to the vest people, and they don't want to share, and there are legitimate reasons for that. With that in mind, we're going to work hard to get as much information as we can get, put it in a packet and try to get a meeting with the lead detective at that agency, just as a gift. They will see the value of our work, and if they'd be willing to share certain specific answers to some specific questions, we'd be willing to go further with our work."

Yoder doesn't mind that he's leveraging a bit with the BAU's connection. He explains that it's that same reputation that got him and others in the doors of cases for years. "We're the Hail Mary's of homicide investigations. When a police department is completely depleted of leads, when they have nowhere else to go, the easiest thing they can do is call the BAU. It gets us in the door, and, hopefully, we come up with some suggestions and new leads for them."

The True Crime Club will take a break in December, as Yoder wants to let people enjoy their holiday season. But, the Club will kick back in during January. The Library will have been re-carpeted, people will have missed their book club discussions, and a new year brings new hope and perhaps new solving of crimes.

Of course, the new year will also bring continued community involvement with other groups.

"Beginning in January, we will have Josh Hipp, a licensed financial planner, offering free, monthly classes," said Amy Adams. "His first class will cover estate planning including probate, long-term care, and strategies to avoid federal estate taxes. He just moved to the area and has a lot of experience giving these classes to Library audiences."

And, as always, there will be the Amateur Authors Writers group and other active community groups.

We'd all scream bloody murder to say there was nothing going on at the Destin Library.

Luck isn't the word. It's a blessing from On High. Magic, even. It's a sign that things are going to get better. That's what it is.

It is the manager. He is accompanied by a young black boy. They are jogging after the couple.

"This kid wants to thank you,"

the manager explains. "Thank me?"

Then boy starts to cry. "My mama sent me to the store for bread and milk, and I lost the money she give me.

"I thought we was gonna hafta skip dinner again, and I was gonna be in trouble. I looked everywhere for that five bucks.'

The boy wipes his eyes with his sleeve, then shoots his hand outward. "Thank you, sir," the boy tells the man. "And merry Christmas."

They embrace. They part ways. The couple leaves the supermarket. Before they crawl into their car, the man looks into the night sky.

He could've kept that money. But he didn't. He wonders why this is. What made him do it?

ing the person to also seek counseling, a support group, faith support or medical support. You can encourage, however, it is the person's choice to follow through on seeking additional support.

Use words of affirmation. Try reminding the person what positive traits you see in them. Tell them about ways they have been a good friend, ways you see they make a contribution, ways they matter in the world, ways they matter to you.

Provide empathy and validation. Try reaching for how it might feel to be in their shoes. Communicate with words and actions that you see they are having a hard time, you care about them, and you are seeking to understand their experience. "It makes sense that you're feeling overwhelmed." 'It seems like you're working really hard to feel better and not sensing progress and that is really frustrating."

Involve others when needed. When someone is talking about suicide whether directly or indirectly, it is important to help connect the struggling person with helpful resources such as the suicide hotline (dial or text 988) and the ER for additional support for staying physically safe. If the struggling person is a minor, it is important to involve safe adults in the process.

These tips are a beginning. Continuing to educate ourselves about healthy ways to support others makes a difference in the lives of individuals and in communities. As you move through the holidays, intentionally be aware of others who might be struggling and extend some love and support where possible. Connect with us along your journey at journeybravely.com.

"On the eighth day, when it was time to circumcise him, he was named Jesus, the name the angel had given him before I had conceived him." – Luke 2:21

John Lennon mistakenly believed the Beatles were more famous than Christ. While the dead Beatle lies in the grave, Jesus' Name is the most recognized Name in the world.

Two hundred and fifty years ago, the French Enlightenment philosopher Voltaire railed against the authenticity of the Bible. He said Christianity would be extinct within a hundred years. Ironically, within a hundred years of his death, Voltaire is all but forgotten. His home now belongs to the Geneva Bible Society, and that group distributes millions of Bibles from there.

Over two billion people on this planet believe the Bible and trust the Name of Jesus for salvation, hope, and healing. His is the Name that makes demons flee and believers rejoice.

Luke records the endowment of Christ's Name at the Temple in our passage today. The Name of Jesus derives from the Hebrew name Joshua, meaning The Lord is Salvation. It is the Name world religions hate because Christians will not bow to Mohammed, Buddha, Krishna or secular humanism.

The Name of Jesus represents the man above all men—God of every God, Light of every Light. It is the Name that sometimes divides families, communities, and nations, dividing between unbelievers and believers. It is the Name above all names, the Name to whom every knee shall bow, and every tongue confesses, "HE IS LORD."

There is power in Jesus' Name to break every chain of addiction and unclean habit. The resurrection power exerted by the Name robs the grave, strikes the devil dumb, and sends demons scurrying like liz-

ards on hot rocks. It is the Name by which every sickness must submit, and every affliction must bow.

Jesus demolishes evil kingdoms and causes dictators to tremble. Satan shakes with terror as heaven populates with new believers. Heaven's armies engage the hordes of Hades in battle, reducing that dark dominion to rubble. At the very whisper of the Name of Jesus, Lucifer's power evaporates.

It's been said that Satan no longer recruits on Saturday nights at the local bars, but he goes to church on Sunday mornings. He employs demons of gossip, strife, and condemnation to tempt the faithful. Those fellowships that lift and worship the Name of Jesus cause the devil to flee.

This month in our locals' Destinites Facebook group at www.Facebook.com/groups/ Destinites, I posed a question to our members and received an overwhelming amount of creative and thought-provoking replies.

My post to members:

"Is there anything special you would like to see implemented by the city of Destin during the holiday season which, of course, isn't already being done? Could we think of anything else that would possibly help the less fortunate in the area or maybe just think of something fun that would bring the community together. The parade is one great example. But, what else could be done? A designated night for caroling maybe? Caroling on the beach? I haven't thought that through, but my church choir participated in caroling when I was a teen, and it was so much fun! What are your thoughts and ideas?"

Below are just some of the replies from members. Check it out and maybe you could help implement one of these wonderful suggestions. Take action and get involved. It's a great feeling to help your community and it all starts with one. Be the one!

1. "I think caroling on the beach or down by the Harbor by different church choirs would be awesome!"

2. "Just make sure you get a permit...lol. We tried flash mob caroling at Destin Commons and after the second song, the security came and told us we needed a permit..."

3. "Community shelter, food and personal hygiene assistance



to those in need, toy drive for less fortunate families in Destin. Maybe a holiday pancake breakfast that's offered complimentary with volunteers to host and serve inside in a warm community center."

4. "I agree with a community shelter of some type. Seems like we have a lot of people in need of such lately."


5. "I'd like to see if there is a way to offer a weekly or fortnightly lunch with a family for the older population and others with no local family over these holiday periods. It's lonely and it's easy for most families to add an extra place at the table (and pick and drop them from home if they don't have transport). Just unsure how here in the Destin it could be advertised."

6. "I read somewhere about a Christmas "cop stop" for lunch for all first responders... it was at someone's home, in a smallish town, and all first responders were invited to stop and have, or pick up, their lunch. It was in its 10th or so year, so was well received. Not sure of logistics, using a home or school or church, and further details, but would be willing to work on this idea if others thought well of it."

7. "Festival of trees. I saw a community that asked businesses to set up and decorate a 10' tree in a community center and then judge for different categories. Set up first weekend after Thanksgiving and have open to public till Christmas. It was a magical place with over 50 trees. I think businesses entered the event for a fee, but then the public got to view for a canned good to a community food bank."

8. "Golf cart (decorated of course) pet parade, maybe on Main Street or Airport? How fun would that be? Not necessarily a Christmas theme, but maybe Halloween?"
