New Year, New You?

The holidays are over and New Year messages are here. Change yourself. Change your life. Lose weight. Earn more money. Look younger. Do more. Take better trips. Buy better stuff. Eat differently. You and your life aren't enough. Spend money to be a better, more acceptable version of yourself.

While a life-long journey of growth is a healthy pursuit, common New Year messages miss the mark for changing vour life. Most messages focus on external adjustments to create a better life. In reality, internal character patterns drive your external behavior. You can drink less, however, if you don't understand the emotional connection between coping and drinking, you are unlikely to sustain change. You can work out and eat differently, but if you don't address how stress or historical beliefs impact your food/ fitness habits, you are unlikely to sustain change.

What if you shifted from setting external behavior goals to setting internal character



goals? What if instead of focusing on working out, weight loss, or drinking less, you focused on strengthening determination, self-control, kindness, or curiosity? It's likely that internal character growth will result in greater success in adjusting external habits. If you grow in self-control, you will set different boundaries with alcohol or money. If

you grow in kindness, you will respond more kindly in relationships. So, how do you shift from external behavior goals to internal character growth?

7 Ways to Focus on **Internal Character Growth**

Identify your character growth area. Ask yourself: What do I really want to be true in my life and relationships? Then, notice a character trait you need to shift in order for your desired reality to become true. An example for a parent: When my kids are adults, I want to have a supportive, patient, curious relationship with them

Meet Our Hometown Hero: **Children in Crisis' Ken Hair**A Legacy of Compassion and Leadership

Ken Hair, a name synonymous with compassion and dedication, has been the face, heart and soul of Children in Crisis (CIC) for 18 years, leaving an indelible mark on the community and the lives of children. After nearly two decades as president and CEO, Ken Hair has retired from the organization, renowned for providing homes and keeping brothers and sisters together, many of whom have been abused, neglected and abandoned.

I recall my first Chamber Breakfast where Ken's influence was evident. During the 50/50 drawing, the winner donated her winnings to Ken and CIC, a gesture embodying the spirit of generosity that Ken himself championed. Who was this Ken Hair and why did so many Chamber members wish to donate their winnings to him and this organization? I would soon learn.

Under Ken's leadership, Children in Crisis, established



in 2002, has flourished. The organization has provided homes for more than 1,000 young children, offering them refuge and stability. Ken;s journey, filled with challenges always stayed the course seen in the tangible impact of CIC's work. Upon retirement, his leadership earned him the Golden Deeds Award from the Exchange Clubs. The Emerald Coast Public Relations Organization (ECPRO) also presented Ken with the inaugural "Ken Hair Non-Profit of the Year Award at the FWB Chamber's First Friday Breakfast on December 1st. This award will be given each year and carries Ken's name and spirit of excellence.

Ken's heartfelt interactions

often moved people to tears, reflecting the depths of his love and life. Recognition of his commitment was exemplified at his retirement ceremony when Ft. Walton Beach Mayor Dick Rynearson dubbed him the honorary mayor of "The Children's Neighborhood"—the residential-style foster care neighborhood conceived and managed by CIC. The mayor also presented Ken with a key to the City of Ft. Walton Beach.

CIC expanded under Ken's guidance to include an Emergency Shelter, family foster homes and the Opportunity Home for young adults aging out of foster care. CIC's influence extends beyond its immediate community highlighted by initiatives like the Pensacola Bay Area Impact 100 and a significant land donation/lease valued at \$3 million from Northwest Florida State College,

Ken's personal and military background is a testament to his life of service. A retired Chief Master Sergeant in the United States Air Force, his military career laid the foundation for his work in child wellbeing. The discipline, integrity and leadership skills honed in the Air Force were instrumental in his successful management of CIC. Even the Air Force recognized his excellence with the coveted titles of NCO and Senior NCO of the year.

Ken's humility and empathy have endeared him to colleagues and community members alike. His ability to connect with diverse groups has been crucial in building partnerships and garnering support for CIC. Reflecting on his journey, Hair credits his military experience for preparing him for the challenges of leading this non-profit: Ken has said, "The skills and values I learned in the Air Force have been integral to my work with Children in Crisis...It's about serving a cause greater than oneself, whether in uniform or in our community."

As Ken navigates through his second retirement, his legacy

stands as a powerful testament to the extraordinary impact one individual can have in shaping a better future for others. Ken's life and work evoke some parallels to the classic film "It's a Wonderful Life." This movie portrayed a man who did not realize the profound impact one person can have on his community. Just as the film highlights this reality, Ken's contributions make us ponder the different landscape of many on the Emerald Coast without his influence. His journey and achievements underscore the immeasurable value of selfless dedication and the ripple effect of kindness and commitment in a community.

As we honor his contributions, it's clear that Ken's service and leadership have left an indelible mark, both to the nation and in the hearts and lives of countless children and families. Lauren's Legacy Pregnancy Center

A Place of Hope and Help

Life happens, doesn't it? The unexpected slaps us in the face and our life begins to crumble. Maybe your pregnancy test came back positive. You're young, single and still in school. What are your options? Or, perhaps, you're a little older with a career and not sure if a baby will fit into your plans right now. How do you navigate these uncharted waters and with whom?

Last March, a new pregnancy center opened in our area as a resource for women and men in Okaloosa and Walton counties providing pregnancy testing and ultrasounds, parenting programs, assistance with community resources and counseling for women in unexpected pregnancies.

At Lauren's Legacy Pregnancy Center, they don't provide for or refer for abortions, but they give education on abortions so women can make an informed decision. All services at the pregnancy center are free and confidential. Stacey Reed, the Executive Director, says it this way: "This is a safe place for women to discuss their options, to have someone who cares. Their story and needs are important to us."

Protecting the most vulnerable and coming alongside to help those in need are some of the ways we can be the hands and feet of Jesus. We know He loves children and has compassion on the sick. We're also familiar with the scripture where He said the second greatest commandment is to "love your neighbor as yourself"

One of the many services the pregnancy center offers is parenting programs, where new parents take classes and receive baby items in return, such as car seats, diapers and other needed supplies. This is a wonderful way for new parents to learn more about taking care of their newborn, and they can remain in the program until their baby is one year old.

Stacey was able to share, with permission, one young lady's story. She was 30 weeks pregnant at the time and wanted to learn more about the center's parenting program. "She and her husband had recently started their own business and were finding it difficult to make ends meet. She found our website and learned she could take our parenting program to earn a free car seat." After completing enough classes

to earn the car seat, she ended up taking additional classes. "Upon completion of those classes, she earned a stroller, bassinette, clothing, diapers, wipes, bottles, books and many other wonderful items." So, you see, there's a lot more to the pregnancy center than just determining the viability of your pregnancy.

With this kind of assistance in providing resources and mentorship, only God knows the tremendous differences these services will make in the lives of everyone involved, not just now,



Why is the Medicare Open Enrollment Period Important?

Now that the Medicare Annual Election Period (AEP) is over (ended December 7th), you can finally take a breather from all those ads, phone calls and mailers. Come January 1st, you will have a chance to try out your new Medicare Advantage, Supplement and/or Prescription plan.

If you suddenly discover the

plan you selected during the AEP is not right for you, all is not lost. You will get one more bite at the apple to make changes to your plan.

As with many situations, in order to get a good outcome, you first have to ask the right questions. In this case, the questions you should ask first are:

• Did you sign up for a new Advantage Plan or a stand-alone

Connector.

Part D prescription drug plan during the last Annual Enrollment Period (AEP)?

• Do you have an existing Advantage Plan or a stand-alone Part D prescription drug plan that renewed with a January 1st effective date?

If the answer to either of these questions is yes, then the Medicare Open Enrollment Period (OEP) is very important to

The OEP runs annually from January 1st to March 31st.

During this time, Advantage plan holders are given the option to make certain changes to the plan they selected in the AEP.

These allowed changes are:

- Cancel your stand-alone Part D prescription drug plan
- Drop your Medicare Advantage Plan and return to Original Medicare (A & B only)

- Enroll in a stand-alone Medicare Part D prescription drug plan
- Elect to change from one Medicare Advantage Plan to another

Let's a look at each option a bit deeper. First, why would someone elect to cancel their stand-alone Part D prescription plan? The only reason one could have would be it was being replaced by other qualifying coverage. If you cancel without replacing, penalties will accrue and be waiting for you when you do put this coverage back in place at a later date. Plus, those penalties will be with you for life!

Second, there are a few rare circumstances when it makes sense for someone to cancel an Advantage plan and return to Original Medicare known as Part A and Part B. Usually this would have something to do with provider networks which are insufficient for the beneficiary. Again, this rare circumstance would require you to also remain in or enroll in a stand-alone Part D prescription drug plan in order to avoid accruing the future penalties I just mentioned.

Again, enrolling in a stand-

Insights for Investors:

Deciding on Where and How to Invest in the New Year

f we reflect on almost four decades in the investment world, we cannot find, with any consistency, anyone who can tell you when and how to invest in the next year. For sure, there are market predictions, economic predictions and forecasts and opinions. The question we keep coming back to is: Does anyone really KNOW where the markets, the economy and the world are headed? Sometimes a prognosticator will get it right, but he or she is rarely right on a consistent basis. Why might that be?

Morgan Housel is an author who has written two books on investing and behavior. One is title "Same as Ever" and the other is "The Psychology of Money." The main theme drawn from these two writings is that the future cannot be predicted, because people and events cannot be predicted. Would anyone have known for sure that Russia would have invaded Ukraine two years ago (and the economic fallout that followed)? Or, as was pointed out, the effects or significance of the coronavirus pandemic? Housel points out that The Economist magazine, well revered in the investing and professional world, predicted neither in its annual forecasts for 2020 and 2022 respectively.

Some call unusual or unpredictable events "Black Swan" events. No one knows when they will appear. It's impossible to predict things, so we encourage investors to plan and invest according to their time frame, their risk tolerance and their investment objective. These are the big three for most investors.

Charlie Munger, Warren Buffet's partner, has had many books written about him, as has Buffet. A current read is "The Tao of Charlie Munger" by David Clark. It is replete with lessons from the investing great who passed away in December of 2023. One consistent lesson was for investors to not be in a hurry. We suggest that investors identify companies, or funds, or bonds or instruments that fit vour investment objective, their time frame and their comfort level, and then be patient.

2023 tested the patience of many investors as they saw the markets gain substantially for most of the year while perhaps their investments did not. Had they held the so called magnificent seven (META, Google, Apple, Microsoft, Tesla, Nvidia and Amazon) only, they would have seen those returns. Most stocks (the remainder of approximately 500 stocks in the S&P 500) had lesser returns, no returns or perhaps lost up until about October of 2023. Then, in November, interest rates (based upon the 10-year U.S. Treasury note) began to decline (from approximately a high of 5% to 3.9%).



The market's performance for the S&P in November was almost nine percent and many long-term bonds appreciated as much as 6%. December numbers, while not final at this writing were equally compelling. So, what might be learned, or gained, from all of this?

Peter Lynch, the well know fund manager from Fidelity, said many years ago in one of his three books to not give up hope at the worst possible time and sellout. We have seen this repeated by many investment managers for years, to not sell at the bottom (as if you would know the bottom). Did that happen in 2023? Many investors were convinced that cash or CDs was the best place to be and as a result either sold out and moved to cash or CDs or remained in cash or CDs. To be clear, these low to no risk investments play a part in most investors' portfolios. However, we would suggest that if someone has a long term time frame, to not use a short term lens, so to speak, when making an allocation decision or a change.

The U.S. economy continues

to lead the world in innovation, cost of doing business and opportunity. We look back over the last almost 100 years and see that investors saw the highest returns in large cap stocks followed by bonds then by cash (Ibbotson Charts). Research, know what you own or what you want to own and why you own it. Know how long you want to own something. Appropriate risk mitigation along with patience might serve investors well in 2024 and beyond.

alone Part D prescription drug plan is a requirement if you do not have qualifying coverage elsewhere and want to avoid those penalties. If you neglected to get that done during the AEP, now is the time to take care of this.

Last, some folks have a change of heart once they see the detailed materials of the Advantage plan they enrolled in during the AEP. Perhaps you find your HMO plan does not

have the providers you need but, a PPO plan does. Or, perhaps the terms of coverage are better in a plan different from your current plan. Maybe, another plan costs less (or even \$0!).

You don't need any reason to switch plans provided you do so before the OEP expires on March 31st. Just remember, you only get one chance to make this change. Once you do, you will have to keep that plan until the next AEP, which begins on October 15th of every year.

The best options for your particular situation should be

thoroughly discussed with your insurance agent/broker to make sure you have all the facts about the choices you may be thinking about and, get all your questions answered.


- In 2023 the number of **SOLD Listings was down** by 21.6% % over prior year.

- In 2023 March had the highest number of sales followed by June and April.

- Average Cumulative Days on Market (length of time from listing to under contract) was 72 in 2023 compared to 39 in 2022.
- Average Sold to List **Price** was 96.33% in 2023 and 97.83% in 2022.
- In 2023 we averaged 4.41 months of inventory; in 2022 we averaged 2.43 months of inventory. Five months or less is considered a sellers' market; over five months is considered a buyers' market. Note that the last two months of 2023 inventory was above five months.
- The current Active Listings have been on market **79 days** on average—the 2023 sold listings were on market an average of 72 days.

Know Your Neighbor: Vet Rides Voice to Second Career

When local resident Kevin Gaddie retired from the Navy after 20 years, he realized he had a lot of life ahead of him. He needed something to do.

"I said to myself, I'm too young to sit on the porch," remembers Kevin, now 63. Possessed of a rich baritone voice, he decided to try his hand at voice-over work. "I ended up going to the University of West Florida and taking a class called 'Getting Paid to Talk," he says. "There were maybe 20 people in the class. They gave us scripts to read and we played them. When

I played mine, I heard some ohs and ahs from the crowd." Kevin was no stranger to using his voice. His two decades in the Navy were spent as a broadcast journalist, a job that won him several awards. The first thing to do was to get an agent. So, he sent his demo tape out. "I got signed around Christmas," Kevin says. "It was the best present I got."

The ball was rolling. Voice Coaches, out of Albany, N.Y., called and gave him a voice test, which went well, so they decided to train Kevin. He participated in four Saturday sessions over

the phone on script reading and interpreting copy. "I pretty much breezed through it," he says. He also got 50 CDs with his demo on them. Next, Kevin attended an acting academy run by Ann Marie Crouch, a model and actress who lives in Fort Walton Beach by way of Enid, Okla., and Los Angeles. She runs AMC Talent and is best known for her role as Princess Shayla in Power Rangers: Wild Force. "When I moved from LA, I wondered, what do I do now?" says Ann Marie. "All I'd ever done through life is act. So I started teaching. I like to help the next generation of actors along this great path." Ann Marie liked Kevin's voice, but saw greater things for him. "I said, why don't we put him on camera?"

Six weeks later, Kevin was cast in the movie "Atlantic Rim" as an extra. Ann Marie was the casting director and fellow actor Steve Marlow said he liked Kevin's voice, which earned Kevin an invitation to her open call designed to meet new talent. Local voice actor Johnny Alexander brought his boom box and they played Kevin's demo. She signed him on the spot. So far, Kevin has had roles in about 30 movies, including seven as the lead actor. He has completed more than 150 voice-over projects as well.

One of his proudest voiceover gigs was as a volunteer for WUWF 88.1's Sightline program.

"We read stories - cold, no rehearsal - from the Pensacola News Journal to our blind and visually impaired audience," he says. "I also narrated 55 children's books for WUWF's 'The Children's Hour.' coworking community, is hosting a Go Red for Women event on Wednesday, February 14 at 9 a.m. The breakfast will be informative for men and women. A local heart attack survivor will share her harrowing journey to a successful heart transplant. Inger Berg, Senior Director of Development and Community Health for the American Heart Association in the Florida Panhandle, will be on hand to discuss Life's Essential 8, the AHA's science-based recipe for improving cardiovascular health in all people. There will also be free blood pressure screenings.

Often called the "silent killer," the AHA estimates that 45% of women over the age of 20 are living with some form of cardiovascular disease. This number can be influenced by the unique life stages women may experience, like pregnancy and menopause.

Pregnancy causes additional strain on a woman's heart and blood vessels, which can uncover existing, unknown cardiovascular issues or create new ones that may last past pregnancy, especially if other risk factors exist, like obesity or gestational diabetes.

While menopause does not raise a woman's risk for cardiovascular disease, some of the changes that may happen during this life stage can.

According to the AHA, many studies indicate estrogen reduces atherosclerosis by reducing low-density lipoproteins (LDL or "bad" cholesterol) and inflammatory processes in the vascular system. Estrogen may also act as

an antioxidant.

After menopause, a woman's body naturally makes very little estrogen and a decrease in this hormone during menopause may cause cholesterol to build-up in arteries, leading to increased heart attack and stroke risk.

Risk for metabolic syndrome also increases during menopause. Metabolic syndrome is a condition that usually includes three or more of the following risks: abdominal obesity, high triglycerides, low HDL cholesterol, high blood pressure and high

blood sugar.

Go Red for Women is designed to educate women about their unique risks and symptoms and empower them to take control of their cardiovascular health through education and self advocacy. The initiative also raises funds for women-focused research.

Next to the U.S. Government, the American Heart Association is the largest funder of heart disease and stroke research. But according to the AHA, only 38% of 2020 clinical trial participants were women. Go Red for Women events support the AHA's commitment to funding research focused on women.

Events like the one being held at Beachworx on Valentine's Day help educate men and women about risk mitigation and raise money to further the AHA's mission of education, outreach and research.

Women's heart attack symptoms can be different from men's.

Both men and women generally experience chest pain or discomfort, but women more often experience shortness of breath, nausea or vomiting and back or jaw pain.

Stroke symptoms are the same for men and women and present suddenly. Stroke symptoms can include numbness in the face or on one side of the body, confusion and trouble speaking or understanding, vision trouble in one or both eyes and severe headache. The acronym F.A.S.T. is an easy way to respond to warning signs of stroke.

F - face drooping. Ask the person to smile. Is there drooping on one side or numbness?

A - Arm weakness. Is one arm weak or numb or drifting downward when asked to raise both arms.

S - Speech difficulties. Is it difficult for the person to correctly say a simple sentence? Are they difficult to understand?

T - Time to Call for an emergency response if any of these symptoms present, even if they go away. Get the person to a hospital immediately.

mean?

• Systolic pressure (the top number in a blood pressure reading) measures the pressure in your arteries when your heart beats. A "normal" number, according to the CDC, is less than 120 mm Hg (millimeters of mercury). You might have high blood pressure if your systolic pressure is 130 mm Hg or higher.

By the Numbers

- Diastolic pressure (the bottom number in a reading) measures the pressure in your arteries when your heart rests between beats. If diastolic pressure is 80 mm Hg or higher, and stays high over time, it can put you at risk for cardiovascular disease, heart attack and stroke.
- Blood pressure is affected by physical activity, diet, cholesterol and alcohol consumption and tobacco use. Some influences we cannot control include genetics, heredity, age, race and ethnicity.
 - A single high reading is not

an immediate cause for alarm. Having blood pressure measures consistently above normal may result in a diagnosis of high blood pressure (or hypertension)

• If your blood pressure is normal (120/80 mm Hg or below these numbers), have it checked at least every two years. If it is high, follow your health care professional's advice to control it and consider monitoring it more frequently. The same with exercising, developing a good exercise plan will make you healthier and could cause fewer medications or doctor visits, thereby saving you money. My grandmother once said, it's better to spend money at the grocery store on healthy foods than for doctor's visits.

Another way to save money which is always on the top of my mind, and typically not on most, is to increase efficiency and tighten the envelope of our homes. Tightening the envelope is not a phrase from Tom Wolfe's novel "The Right Stuff," but a term used to describe a system. The Building envelope is the physical barrier

between the exterior and interior environments enclosing a structure (your home). Generally, the building envelope consists of a series of components and systems such as a roof, walls, windows and a foundation. These systems protect the interior from the effects of the environment like precipitation, wind, temperature, humidity and ultraviolet radiation. One function of the building envelope is to control these effects between the interior and exterior of the building. When there is missing or compacted insulation or unsealed windows, doors and attic penetrations, your building envelope is compromised and wasting energy and comfort.

If your home is older than

15 years, you most likely don't have enough insulation to meet today's guidelines. Prior insulation code for this area was R-19 (roughly 6.5" of insulation), now the new code is R-30 (roughly 10.5" of insulation). That's a 61% increase. Why the increase? Because we know that R-19 insulation has trouble keeping our homes comfortable and the only solution was to add more insulation. We recommend R-38 (14.5" of insulation). More states are requiring the use of reflective radiant barrier insulation installed on the inside of the attic roof line. Reflective radiant barriers reflect 97% of radiant heat in your attic, lowering the attic temperature by 40 to 50 degrees in the summer, allowing your insulation and ductwork to perform better, saving you money and increasing your comfort. It's all about tightening the envelope to increase efficiency and comfort. If one of your resolutions is to save money this year, schedule an inspection to know exactly where your home could improve its envelope.








Nine New Sculpture Designs Selected for Underwater Museum of Art

Meet The Therapist Kathlyn White

Integrating Faith and Therapy for Positive Counseling

During a time when people are struggling with mental health, it's good to know that support is so readily available. One hometown hero who is invested in seeing our community live fully is counselor and author of "The Therapist: Stories about Parenting, Narcissists, Combat, Abuse, and Marriage," Kathlyn C. White, who is with Carpenter House in Niceville.

Carpenter House is a faithbased counseling center and Kathlyn remembers how it came to be named. "I was sitting in traffic one day in Niceville and the car in front of me had a bumper sticker that said, 'My boss is a Jewish carpenter.' Wow. Right in that moment I thought, 'If I ever have a business, I will call it Carpenter House,' because my boss is a Jewish carpenter too."

Kathlyn has always had a passion for mental health. But, it wasn't until she was in her 30s and working on her Master's, that she was saved and decided to integrate her new faith into her work. Since then, she has been helping people by weaving Christianity, faith and the Bible into counseling.

"When you become a Chris-



tian, you have this hunger for knowledge. I always say that cognitive behavioral therapy started in the Bible. The Bible tells us to think on positive things, and that's cognitive behavioral therapy."

So, what is the difference between Christian and secular counseling? One example she cites is in marriage counseling. "I do my best to keep the family together. It's not possible 100% of the time, but I am not leaning toward divorce, like some counselors are, especially if the counselor has been divorced. You really never want to see a marriage counselor who does not have a successful marriage, because they don't know how to stay married. I've been married for 43 years. I know how to stay married and include a chapter will, or won't, be a good fit. in my book about how to have a healthy marriage."

Kathlyn suggests additional qualifications to look for when seeking out mental health professionals. "I think you need a counselor with some experience. I've had experiences in all kinds of places because we were a military family. I started out in an inpatient treatment facility with patients who had what's now called dissociative identity disorder. I've helped people recovering from satanic cults and have worked in domestic violence shelters. I've worked with people who are low income and with children who were navigating the foster system. You want to look for someone with a wide base of experience, who thoroughly understands the DSM (Diagnostic and Statistical Manual of Mental Disorders), and can speak to all these situations, because all these things are very complicated."

Psychology Today is a source that can offer a list of local counselors, but once you're ready to meet, Kathlyn suggests there are aspects to the counseling you should look for that will help your success.

• Trust your intuition that it

- Ask how many patients a counselor is seeing a week. The more they talk to people, the more experience they have to offer your session.
- Look for a counselor who is willing to set goals with you so you can see how much progress is being made.
- You might not know what to say to a counselor, especially in the beginning. But, a counselor who is able to ask open-ended questions will be able to help you open up.


After a patient suggested that Kathlyn write down her own experiences, "The Therapist" was born. One of the most rewarding experiences from her book was with a young woman called "B," who was only 14 when they met. "When I met her, she

didn't know she was psychotic. She thought she had a friend, Max. But, he was a hallucination that began when she was sexually abused. Max helped get her through her troubles. I had to break it to her that her best friend wasn't real."

In the course of their therapy over the next year and a half, Kathlyn was able to help "B" feel what had been suppressed in her childhood, so she could live out a healthier adult lifesomething we all want to experience.



that motivates them to want to spend time with me. Character traits to consider addressing to help this desire become a reality: Are you currently patient? Determine what you need to know inside to be able to let go of the current character pattern in favor of the character you are trying to grow. To embrace more determination, you may need to know that you can do

hard things. To embrace more curiosity, you may need to know you don't have to know everything.

Try a new way. Notice when you want to judge others rather than extending kindness. Stop. Breathe. Remember what you are growing toward.

Try suspending judgment, then asking a curious question truly seeking to understand. See how it feels. Notice the result.

Embrace the discomfort that comes with releasing the way you are used to doing things. Remind yourself that it is okay to feel uncomfortable releasing the past way to create space for more helpful character growth.

Repeat to sustain growth. Keep slowing down

and trying the new way of being. You are rewiring your brain through repetition and over time, it will become more natural.



A Pastor's Ponderings:

Where Does Our Peace Come From?

The world broils with conflict. Can you imagine living in Israel with rockets lobbed into your neighborhood at random times? Or, in Gaza, where the country is being reduced to rock and rubble? Or in Ukraine. where soldiers rot intrenched in freezing fox holes. They fight a war nobody wants, but a lone madman in Moscow. Where does peace come from?

Yes, chaos reigns in the world. Twenty-two veterans a day commit suicide. Three of the leading causes of death among teenagers are accidents, homicide and suicide. The United States records close to 700,000 divorces per year. Bad news abounds, but good news is on the way.

Christians have downloaded the free Bible App, YouVersion, over a billion times as they seek to learn more from the Word of God. What are these billion people looking for? In three of the last four years, the most common search on this app is not for scriptures relating to success, prosperity or healing. The most common search is "Fear not, for I am with thee."

People are searching for peace, the antidote to fear. They are fearful about their future, finances and families. But we do not find peace in financial security, nor is it found in political consensus. We find peace in a person, and his name is Jesus, the Prince of Peace.

Jesus said in John 14:27 (NIV), "Peace I leave with you; my peace I give you. I do not give to you as the world gives. Do not let your hearts be troubled and do not be afraid." Peace is a gift Christ wants to give. He wants to give it to us far more than we will ask for it. You have not because you ask not.

The Lord's presence conveys peace to us. According to Isiah 43:5 (NIV) God says, "Fear not, for I am with you." Fear has no foundation. We have no reason to fear because God is with us. He is with us in Destin. God is with people in Israel, Ukraine, Syria, and Gaza. He is for us and not against us. The sunlight of His favor is shining on us if we will open our eyes to see it.

I remember my ex-wife once saying I dressed like a Sear's mannequin. That is bland and blasé, lacking style. As a pastor, I felt I needed to dress in a neat but non-controversial manner. One of the church members once referred to me as "Robo-pastor" because, no matter what happened, I kept going about my duties. I prided myself on not reacting to circumstances emotionally. Clearly, I needed God's work in my heart.

Following my divorce in 2005, I remember seeing my future, dying alone and uncared for. The thought terrified me and left me depressed. When I

attended worship, I would weep uncontrollably. It was embarrassing. Long suppressed emotions were boiling over. My life and my peace were shattered. As I left a church in San Antonio, unable to control my feelings, the Lord whispered into my heart, "You are angry with Me. You thought your life, fam-Will you trust Me now?"





I turned away from my anger and self-justification. God's presence in my heart was restored. My peace came from the Lord.

God's presence guarantees peace. The remedy to fear and insecurity rests in faith in God's faithfulness. Healing for broken emotions flows in God's presence. Will you invite God into your life in 2024? Turning to the Lord is our barrier to depression, worry and anxiety. Allow peace to flow into your heart.

In 2012, The Mischief Theatre Company dreamed up a worst-case scenario play where absolutely everything that can go wrong, does go wrong. Destin Councilmember Kevin Schmidt has proposed turning the vacant lot by the Marler Bridge into an Amphitheatre and area for the community. The idea is, thus far, being well received by area residents. The city agreed to buy the vacant lot in July 2023. The lot has a slight slope making it perfect for an amphitheater-type environment with the stage at the bottom by the water. Schmidt would also like to see the existing magnolia tree and other nature to be incorporated into the design. He feels the natural slope to the area would negate having to bring in bleachers or other seating. The grassy and sandy tiers would en-

courage picnics and recreation. Schmidt says the stage angle would project sound toward the Emerald Grande and Destin Harbor rather than the nearby residential area.

Councilmember Schmidt proposed that an area toward the top, by the road, could provide space for food trucks, thereby offering dining options. He would also like to see educational areas representing the history of Destin and Choctawhatchee Bay and maritime culture. Docks provided could accommodate vessels and possibly even a ferry service.

John and Allie Stephens, owners of Luther's in Destin, corroborated with Councilmember Schmidt on the amphitheater idea and design. They are focused on the opportunity for a mooring harbor and oyster farming. Mr. Stephens said, "Right now, in the whole Panhandle, there is no mooring

harbor. So, we're missing out on the Loopers." He continued, "When I say oyster farming, it's not to eat, but it's to actually use the oysters to create more living shores in our area." Mr. Stephens would like to see a Harbormaster's office and welcome center placed there at the Amphitheater as well.

Councilman Stephens is interested in hearing public opinions, but did emphasize the use of the area should be for public enjoyment. The city will be hosting workshops to hear and entertain other ideas for the vacant property. Check out the schedule to attend a meeting or workshop at www.cityofdestin.com.
