Destin High School Expands with New Additions and Educational Offerings

If you've been a resident of Destin or the nearby coastal communities of Miramar Beach, Fort Walton Beach or Niceville for any length of time, you've probably heard a great deal about Destin High School, and the immense dedication and work of those involved in making the much-needed home of education a part of Destin's growing list of improvements for the families who call America's Luckiest Fishing Village home.

With a brand new, three-story multi-use building, state-of-the-art classrooms and the remarkable Tripp Tolbert Up To It Weight Room and Training Facility, the recent, and coming, additions to the ever growing Destin High School campus are definitely impressive. Currently the school encompasses 20 classrooms, consisting of over 20,000 sq. ft. of learning space on the beautiful new campus located just off Des-



tin's Commons Drive. However, with the addition of a new building, Destin High will be adding 23 classrooms, and over 25,000 sq. ft., including a spacious science lab; thus, bringing the new total size of the school to more than 45,000 sq. ft. of educational space.

Destin High School is a tuition-free, public charter school, which gained its state charter and became a part of the thriving Destin community for the 2021-2022

school year. The high school is funded through the support and donations of generous businesses, organizations and members of the surrounding Northwest Florida Gulf Coast community, in conjunction with the events and fundraising efforts of its board members, educators, parents and students.

Destin High School currently offers a complete comprehensive experience including all of the expected core curriculum areas, along with

instruction in the fine arts, business disciplines, foreign languages, physical education and fishing. Additionally, the school is looking at partnerships to expand their career and technical offerings, starting in Fall of 2024.

As a somewhat unique example of Destin High School's feel for educating outside the box, its fishing education program offers students the

opportunity to learn about the charter and commercial fishing business, and even provides a path by which its students can earn their captain's license while still in high school! How's that for educating our students in something that actually makes a remarkable difference for our community's future too?

As part of its growth, Destin High School recently celebrated a ribbon cutting celebration on January 25. It included a Town Hall event where interested parties and parents could learn more about all the new school additions—and what Destin High School as a whole has to offer both students and our Destin community. The event was widely attended and, I believe, went a long way in painting an accurate picture of what the founding board members, community stakeholders and parents have been working tirelessly to achieve for years. The school and its new additions will serve our wonderful city and families for decades upon decades to come.

Heidi LoCicero, President of the Governing Board of Directors and Founding Board Member of Destin High School, told me, "Once students take a tour of the remarkable campus, they are hooked on attending Destin High. Pun intended!" Heidi went on to say, "The footprint in Destin continues to grow, our students' impact is impressive and our legacy is firmly rooted in the community's foundation.

The Destin community has truly embraced local education and provided the funds to support our students' success. Our teachers are dedicated to their students' success. Destin High has built-in academic support programs to help with students' rigorous course loads. All of our teachers are focused on helping students build confidence in their areas of study and reduce anxiety, as they learn new subjects. Students reap the benefits of small classes with individual attention and their grades show

I asked Heidi why she and others involved feel the new building is so important to Destin High School's future success, and she explained, "The new building allows appropriate space for the school to continue to grow and thrive. Space constraints in the existing footprint, and an upward trajectory in student enrollment, caused us to have to adopt a split schedule in the fall to accommodate all students. The additional square footage effectively doubles our classroom space and allows us to continue adding enrollment and unique programs while combining our student body back into a common schedule. For example, with additional space, our fishing program was able to expand into two classrooms, and now has a proper lab space to allow students to partake in fishing labs. Additionally, our new band program will no longer have to share space with our drama program. We've also added appropriate state-of-the-art science labs which are instrumental in







preparing students for college and career trajectories."

I asked Mr. Donald "Willy" Williams, Jr., Executive Director of Destin High School, what he is most proud of about the new school: "As the executive director, I am most proud of the vibrant and flexible culture of the school. Students are happy to be at Destin High School, and teachers are happy to be part of an amazing team. There is a tremendous amount of work to be done-especially when considering all of the construction, moving and split schedules. But, I haven't once had anyone say 'We can't do that.' Everyone, from the students and teachers to our governing board and stakeholders has a can-do attitude. I'm proud to be part of a high-will team! It has been amazing to walk into a place where education is valued, excellence is expected and community support is 1000%! I am a huge fan of 'Aesop's Fable, The Tortoise and the Hare," he continued. "The story of Destin High School reminds me that slow and steady wins the race. There are a million competing priorities in every school. And when we try to focus on all of them, we can focus on nothing. It may take us awhile to address everything coming at us each day. But, I see a willingness and understanding in all stakeholders that slow and steady will really win this race!"







As is often the case with any new school, people want to know how they can be a part of the solution and future growth. "Destin High School needs volunteers to assist," said Heidi. "All kinds of research indicates [that] the presence of multiple adults in a student and young adult's life significantly enhances their chances of success in life," she said. "We, as a school, need tutors. We need adults who are willing to come in and be a part of our lunchtime mentoring, monitoring and serving. We need people who are willing to help us get clubs going; we need volunteer coaches; we need support at games and competitions. We need everyone in this community to rally around the school, our students, and to celebrate the achievements and accomplishments of our community who have made DHS a true success story."

Well spoken, I would say, as I could immediately tell Heidi lives, breathes and speaks, "Go Sharks!" The process for getting involved is simple she says. "Just email a letter of interest and your skill set details to info@DestinHighSchool.org and a pass the Okaloosa County School District background check. For those wanting to

A Rare Gem: McCaskill & Company Celebrates 30 Years

What was once a childhood dream for a young boy, William "Bill" Campbell, has grown into three decades of one of the most successful jewelry design businesses in the Southeast. McCaskill & Company owners, Bill & Elizabeth Campbell, have established an exciting jewelry business foundation and impeccable customer service philosophy that continue to propel McCaskill & Company to the forefront of the jewelry industry.

Bill's passion and love of jewelry stem from he and his grandmother, Gussie McCaskill Campbell, spending hours together marveling over the jewels and gems that his great-grandfather brought home from his travels around the world. Here the seeds of his appreciation for fine jewelry were sown from the McCaskills and Campbells, some of the earliest settlers in Walton county. Never did he imagine that the precious time spent with his grandmother would one day culminate into a coveted business where he could fulfill his dream of one that is loved by McCaskill's many devoted customers.

Like many jewelers, owners Bill and Elizabeth Campbell started with humble beginnings—first a small kiosk in Seaside (1994) and later a storefront at the Market Shops at Sandestin (1995).

As the business grew exponentially, it was a sign for Elizabeth to join full time after her 25-year-career as a licensed therapist. In 1999, with determination and passion, the Campbell's opened their current free-standing location.

McCaskill & Company became a true, next-generation family business in 2008, which also included their next milestone, an accessory boutique, Sarah Carolyn, adjacent to McCaskill & Company, opened by their daughter, Carolyn Campbell Brigman. It later became a luxurious bridal design gallery (2015). Now serving as vice president, Carolyn grew up learning the jewelry business, while managing the former boutique served as the perfect

training ground for running all aspects of the business.

Carolyn feels the brand's success through three decades hinges on its unique ability not only to adapt to some trends, but also to maintain the classic, memorable and timeless jewelry designs coveted by customers. "It could largely be attributed to our vigilance in anticipating, recognizing and choosing jewelry that moves us in hopes of moving our customers as well," Elizabeth continues. "We cherry pick our pieces, favoring one-of-a-kind designs," she says.

Never stuffy or pretentious, Bill, Elizabeth, Carolyn and the

entire McCaskill staff strive to offer the most memorable experience possible, from the time you enter the store. "We realize for some it can be intimidating," says Elizabeth. "But we are actually very down to earth. It's important for us to help people feel warm and invited." For example, each morning, the staff offers chocolate chip cookies and coffee. "We want people to feel at home, welcome and enjoy their time here," says Carolyn. "They can even shop in their beach attire!" Bill delights in sharing his knowledge and intricacies of jewelry pieces, often relating interesting tidbits about



from around the world right to your home. They still make videos to entertain and educate our locals, but their efforts are now inspiring people around the world.

Morgan shares that growing up as missionaries positioned the Wilds to share experiences that no one else was having back home. "In 2003, my family moved to the country of Indonesia as Christian missionaries to serve the Wano, a community of approximately 1500 indigenous semi-nomadic people living in the Highland jungles. They were a beautiful people, but they were burdened by sickness and tribal warfare that led to a lot of hardship in the village

We lived among them as stu-


dents of their culture, spending the first five years just learning their language, worldview and culture. As we were building relationships, we served them through my parents' medical clinic, even before we could speak fluently."

Back in the United States, friends and family asked questions about their day-to-day life. In response, with their parents' encouragement, the boys began to film their many adventures. "In 2011, on a short furlough here in America, we came back for a few months, and our parents produced a series of 15 videos for our church called Growing Up Wild. That was developed as an elective for a homeschool curriculum. This show was the starting point of our filming career."

Over the next several years, the brothers continued to document their lives overseas, collaborating in their distinct talents and learning how to get better. Their goal was to be authentic and unscripted so their audience could truly be with them in the moment. Over those 10 years, they would grow up with scientists from around the world who provided an amazing education, footage and distinct opportunities. They were able to produce reality show content and documentaries, even partnering with Answers in Genesis. Without Wi-Fi, however, they were unable to take full advantage of the internet to reach an international audience. That would change in 2020 when COVID brought the family back to the United States. "We were in different stages of education, most of us in college. We had always imagined that we were going to go our separate ways. But, when







We already had 10 years of footage. So, that's when we began wildbrothers.tv It's where people can see all our shows for a small subscription fee, and we have new content dropping every Saturday. As a team, everyone takes turns holding the camera. But, each brother has also taken on specific roles to advance the company. Morgan and Kian are the main producers and directors, Hudson is in charge of the business and its correspondence, and Asher handles customer service while being their licensed drone pilot.

The Wild brothers' newest show, Off the Couch Into Creation, began when they wondered if their days of adventure could ever be captured



again. "When we moved back to America, we found ourselves on the couch a lot and we began to doubt that we could replicate the exploration of our childhood. About a year ago, we set the challenge to experience Niceville and our state of Florida. It set us on an amazing journey where we are learning that you don't have to be on the far side of the world to have adventure. Locals will be excited to see how the show highlights the natural beauty and iconic atmosphere of Niceville, Bluewater Bay and Destin."

Insights for Investors:

Health and Wealth - What are the Key Drivers?

Keith Knight spent over 50 years in the investment and financial services business before retiring to the Emerald Coast of Florida. During his years advising clients and consistently across the beach towns, you could hear his often-repeated refrain: "Money never sleeps."

Following on to this, we are pondering what drives building and maintaining wealth in this life as well as building and maintaining health in this life. The Declaration of Independence speaks to the rights of life, liberty and the pursuit of happiness. To that end, what or

how does someone make that happen? Morgan Housel in his book "The Psychology of Money" wrote that a key driver to wealth in this world is not necessarily knowledge or education. It is trumped by behavior. Yes,

Identifying objectives, risk tolerances and time frame help form the plan for building wealth. The same can be said for health (which makes up about 18% of the U.S. economy or gross domestic product). Health care spending topped \$4.2 trillion in 2022, according to data from Statista. While knowing the answers to the big three are important, the results to our health and wealth are driven by our behaviors. Housel writes that people should save out of pessimism, but invest out of optimism. He notes that optimism must be realistic. In other words, the eternal optimist is probably more complacent than optimistic. The compound effect, per Housel and countless others, is a result of behaviors of consistency, patience and determination. It takes time and consistency to build assets, and



the compound effect can illustrate that.

Behaviors can also work against us. Sometimes in investing, people are driven to chase returns of a stock or a fund or some other asset. And many times, we might hear what has worked so well for someone (think a particular stock), the resulting behavior is motivated by FOMO: Fear of Missing Out. The problem with chasing returns and acting on limited input (a friend's experience or something overhead at a cocktail party) is that we always hear about the incredible successes but how often do we hear about the incredible failures? We have all heard it before: Past performance is no indication or guarantee of future performance. No one can time the market, or can they? Many will say that they have and that they can. Sooner or later, what goes around comes around. Someone who might have been correct before might not repeat again for a while. We believe that behavior trails persistence, patience and, ultimately, the compound effect.

What about living off our investments (now or in retirement)? We believe that investors should focus on maintaining principal and living off income produced (stocks, bonds, real estate, CDs or money markets) vs. the gradual selling of principal to maintain income. That might mean sacrificing some appreciation in up markets, but it also means not selling principal in down markets. It is a concept known as the sequence of returns. Put another way, don't cut the branches of the trees that are producing the fruits or vegetables. That is behavior driven.

Think about the compound effect in weight loss, weight gain, muscle loss or muscle gain. Nothing happens quickly and there is no proven way or shortcuts to success. We think investors can and should contemplate that behavior can drive desired outcomes in life, liberty and the pursuit of happiness.

What about saving and investing behaviors? Housel also speaks to the 50/30/20 rule: Spend 50% of income on what it takes to run your life and household. 30% on what you enjoy and 20% on saving. That saving we think includes your retirement savings. And take a cue from what behaviors it takes to get out of debt, should you find yourself in debt: You need to drive income up and or expenses down. A key behavior is to work toward growing your income faster than your outgo. That takes behavior vs. education, knowledge or skill.

What about time? Warren Buffet has been quoted repeatedly about how time is something that cannot be created or

gotten back. Time (unlike energy), once used, is gone. The behavior of how we spend our time will (via the compound effect) produce a given result. If we spend our time studying nutrition, exercising and eating right, that, over time, could lead to a healthy state. Same for wealth. Energy is interesting in that we hear that energy cannot be created or destroyed, only transformed from one form to another. So, if we put our energy into reading, researching, saving, exercising, eating right, getting enough sleep, drinking enough water, investing, applying and investing our time, what might the results be for health and wealth?

As many times as I have said the term "age-in" to folks when discussing Medicare, it has never failed to elicit a visceral response such as, "What do you mean with this age-in thing?!" or "I don't feel aged-in!"

The fact of the matter is, "aging-in" means you are turning 65 soon, and it is a good thing. There are many we all know that didn't make it to that milestone. Bravo for making it and cheers for many more.

Yes, we are in the middle of the Open Enrollment Period which runs from January 1 – March 31 of every year pre-dominantly for Advantage Plan members (you can re-read my article from last month for more information about the ins and outs of that). But, that does not change the fact many people have birth-days all year long and are actually aging-in during this time as well.

What Does it Mean to "Age-In" to Medicare?

What generally happens is, folks get confused between what they see on TV with all the pitches about "time running out," and what they can actually do during the aging-in period. Let me attempt to de-mystify it a little bit here.

There is a period of time when a person ages-in and becomes eligible for Medicare. Typically, this period of time is three months before the month in which they turn 65 and three months after the month in which they turn 65. Do the math and you will see this is a seven-month period of time around your birthday. There are a few other exceptions to this eligibility period, but those will have to be saved for another article or very long-winded phone call for the braver among us!

The first order of business is to obtain your Part A and B (if desired or needed) through Social Security. Without adding a litany of boring details as to qualifications for each, suffice it to say Part A is typically \$0 premium for most folks and Part B for 2024 will typically cost \$174.70 per month. The Part B premium is means tested and can get a little complicated-certainly more complicated than can be described in this article. Again, suffice it to say, some could pay much more or much less, depending on your Modified Adjusted Gross Income from two years prior unless you apply for a break based on current income. We have a form for that.

If you wish to avoid the LIFE-LONG penalties, you will have to have Part B and Part D (prescription coverage) in place at the time of first becoming eligible. As a reminder, eligibilities are one of those things unique to each person's circumstances. So, it is important to know how these things apply to you.

If you choose to obtain a Supplement, commonly called a "Medi-Gap" policy, you will need to also obtain a separate Part D prescription plan as Supplement plans DO NOT INCLUDE such. If you choose to obtain an Advantage plan, the Part D prescription coverage is typically INCLUDED.

As you can see, this can, and usually is, a very confusing time for most folks used to having traditional insurance their entire lives. Suddenly, you are thrust into this new system where everybody and their cousin is calling and/or mailing you every single day with their "better option."

Your best option is the one that best suits you. Maybe it is a great price. Maybe it is a great network of providers. Maybe it is just the peace of mind knowing you have someone you can rely on for information when you need it.

If there is only one take away you receive from this article, it would be to work with someone, like me, that can help you navigate the local landscape and help you completely understand this otherwise very confusing time in life.

Protecting Your Treasures

During the holiday season, many beautiful baubles are bought, beautifully wrapped and gifted to loved ones to smile, ooh and ah over. Rings, and earrings, and bracelets and necklaces, Oh My! Now that you have these beautiful gems, gold and silver, too, how do you insure these beautiful treasures?

There are two ways to insure your new valuables. One is to schedule your new jewelry onto your existing home insur-

ance policy for its specifically appraised value. It will be necessary for you to have the item or set appraised by a licensed or certified jewelry appraiser prior to insuring them. Many insurance companies allow appraisals up to 36 months old, while some require new appraisals every 12 months. Please review the terms of your policy to find out what the rules require.

The other way to insure your valuables is on an Inland Marine Floater policy. These policies typically cover for the perils of theft, breakage or mysterious disappearance, but are not tied to your home insurance.

One advantage of having an Inland Marine Floater policy over scheduling on your home insurance is that, if there is a claim, it won't count against your home insurance policy itself. It will still count as a claim, but not the same way.

There are 12 categories of

personal property that are typically classified as Scheduled Items:

- Jewelry, goldware, silverware, pewterware
- Furs
- Sports equipment
- Firearms
- Artwork
- Antiques/collectibles
- Stamps
- Coins
- Rare books and Manuscripts

The rating basis of the item or items in question has to do with the current value of the item or set, where it is kept, either in the home or in a safe, as well as the condition of the item.

In the event of loss by theft or mysterious disappearance, there would need to be a police report filed as well as the claim itself.

Many carriers offer discounts for the scheduling multiple items on one policy. For example, if you have a 10K ring and your husband has a Rolex, scheduling them together under one policy would reduce the premiums for both, as it would make more sense than to have a separate policy for each item.

For any older yet still valuable items that fall into this category, please make sure to keep appraisals current to get full value in the event of a claim. If your last appraisal showed a value of 15K, but the current value is 20K, you will not be able to collect on the difference, if you have an old appraisal that is outside the bounds of the underwriting guidelines.

You may also add other items to the same policy such as rare

books, antique firearms or other valuable items from the list, provided they have been appraised within the timeframe of the carrier's rules, usually either 12 months, or sometimes up to 36 months, depending on the carrier.

Your treasures carry more than monetary value; to you they would mean the world. So, protecting them to the fullest extent possible is a logical next step, and will be much less expensive than you think.

It's a good idea to sit down with your Independent Insurance Agent to talk about your options, and outline a good plan to protect your treasures in a way that makes you feel comfortable.

Destin American Legion Hosts Student Competition for Oratorical Scholarship

In January, Davis-Sikes Destin American Legion Post 296 hosted its local competition for the National High School Oratory Scholarship Program. The purpose of the program is for high school students to develop a better understanding and appreciation of the Constitution of the United States and is open to grades 9-12 who are U.S. cit-

Post 296 hosted three area high school students from both Destin High School and Fort Walton Beach High School. All participating students must learn four speeches and each level of competition selects one for use in their event.

Each student is then required to make two presentations:

1) Students prepared an original, 8-10-minute oration from memory on a phase of the U.S. Constitution, which gives emphasis to the attendant duties and obligations of citizens to our government. 2) Additionally, each student presented a 3-5 minute assigned topic on one of the following subjects:

Amendment 2: A well-regulated Militia, being necessary to the security of a free State, the right of the people to keep and bear Arms, shall not be in-

Amendment 5: No person shall be held to answer for a capital, or otherwise infamous crime, unless on a presentment or indictment of a grand jury, except in cases arising in the land or naval forces, or in the militia, when in actual service in time of war or pubic danger; nor shall any person be subject for the same offense to be twice put in jeopardy of life or limb; nor shall be compelled in any criminal case to be a witness against himself; not be deprived of life, liberty, or property, without due process of law; nor shall private property be taken for public use, without just compensation.

Amendment 23: The District constituting the seat of Government of the United States shall appoint in such manner

as the Congress may direct. A number of electors of President and Vice President equal to the whole number of Senators and Representatives in Congress to which the District would be entitled if it were a State, but in no event more than the least populous State; they shall be in addition to those appointed by the State, but they shall be considered, for the purposes of the election of President and Vice

President, to be electors appointed by a State; and they shall meet in the District and perform such duties as provided by the twelfth article of amendment.

Amendment 25: Section 3 Whenever the President transmits to the President pro tempore of the Senate and the Speaker of the House of Representatives his written declaration that he is unable to discharge the powers and duties of this office, and until he transmits to them a written declaration to the contrary, such powers and duties shall be discharged by the Vice President as Acting President.

The winner of the local 2023-2024 competition was

William will advance to a district competition followed by a Western Area competition, State/Department Championship and finally to the National Championship where scholarships of \$25,000, \$22,500 and \$20,000 will be awarded to the top three national winners. Only the winner at each level of competition advances to the next level.

Davis-Sikes Destin American Legion Post 296 would like to thank the students, local school officials who helped identify and prepare the students, as well as its volunteer judges and our local Post volunteers who served as timekeepers, score tabulators and in food preparation. Next year's local competition will be in early January 2025.

Commissioners Ask Eglin Air Force Base if Okaloosa County Can Manage Beach **Property by Destin Bridge**

Several years ago, in May of 2020, Eglin AFB decided to close the beach to the west of Destin

trash and unauthorized commercial activity on federal property. Fences and barriers went up to keep the public from entering

Bridge due to large amounts of the area that locals have longed called Redneck Beach. Local residents groaned at the loss of this magnificent beach property which had long been a favorite

destination for family outings for decades.

During a regular Tuesday, January 16th Board Meeting, Commissioners considered and passed a motion to send a Letter of Intent to Eglin AFB to open the beach. This area of beach lies in my district and has been a problem area for a number of years.

A 1988 Congressional Act designated the land to provide for continued public access. In recent years, a lack of resources to handle visitors forced the closure. There have been many discussions on what it would take to re-open this land to make it safe, clean and preserve the natural beauty. The county believes we now have a workable plan that will provide for more public beach while managing the natural resources of the area. Safety is foremost in the minds of everyone, as there have been many tragic drownings in the East Pass over the years.

I am hopeful for the reopening, not just for the expanded beach for the public, but also for the 12-foot-wide bike path on the south side, which will soon be a part of Hwy. 98 from Beasley Park to the Destin Bridge. With ADA compliant, organized and lined parking spaces and turn lanes, this will provide for a turnaround or resting space for bik-

The county will invest in infrastructure to improve and manage the area. The improvements will be paid for with tourism development dollars. Some of the proposed amenities will include lifeguards, stationed marine patrol, county maintenance, which includes trash removal and control, bathrooms and entrance signs. The area would have barriers to landscaping, designated environmental areas, law enforcement and park rangers, turtle safe lighting and educational information. The proposal includes cameras in the parking area and fencing where necessary. Once again, a sign will announce the entrance to "The World's Luckiest Fishing Village."

Destin area residents have long needed more public beach access. This property, well managed, will be a big win for the Destin community. The availability of this open beach will help alleviate the necessity of Destin area residents traveling further westward on Okaloosa Island to enjoy the many lovely beaches with ready access ways on the island.



Homeowners' Frequently Asked Questions

What does R-valmean? ue

R-value measures insulation's resistance to heat flow. It can also be referred to as "thermal resistance." The higher the R-value, the greater the insulating power. All materials having the same R-value, regardless of type, thickness, or weight are equal in insulating power. Don't forget that R-values are determined by material type, thickness, and installed weight per square foot, not by thickness alone. Insulation helps keep your home cool during the summer months and warm during the winter months.

How much will I save by adding insulation to the walls, ceilings and floors of my home? Insulation saves money, increases your home's comfort and protects the environment by reducing energy use. According to the U.S. Department of Energy (DOE) shows that typically 44 percent of a homeowner's utility bill goes for heating and cooling costs. DOE also states that homeowners may be able to reduce their energy bills from 10 percent to 50 percent by taking certain steps. One of the major steps is increasing the amount of thermal insulation in their existing homes or purchasing additional insulation when building new homes. Unless your home was constructed with special attention to energy efficiency, adding insulation will reduce your utility bills. The amount of energy you conserve will depend on several factors: climate, size, shape and construction of your house, your living habits, the type and efficiency of the heating and cooling systems and the fuel you use. Energy conserved is money saved and the annual savings increase when utility rates go up, which many of us are experiencing. Insulation upgrades also instantly add value to your home and are a great investment. The Inflation Reduction Act of 2022 allows homeowners to claim significant tax credits for adding qualifying insulation products. Some projects qualify for 30 percent of the project up to \$1,200. (Consult your tax professional for details)

How much insulation should I have? "Insulation," says Bob Vila, "is the most efficient energy-saving expenditure." Energy Star and ECES agree and recommend R-38 or about 10 to 14.5 inches, depending on the insulation type. Many homes we inspect are under-insulated. Even new homes only meet the minimum requirement of R-30. If your insulation is below R-30 or if your insulation is just level with or below floor joists, you should add more insulation. Take the time to understand how much insulation you have by using a measuring tape or have a professional inspect your home and offer available options and savings.

What words should I watch out for in contracts or job estimates? Once you have chosen an insulation contractor, make sure the contract includes the job specification, cost and warranty information. The contract should list the type of insulation to be used and where it will be used. Make sure that each type of insulation is listed by R-value. Beware of any contract or verbal offering that quotes the job in terms of thickness only (e.g., "14 inches of insulation"). Remember, it is the R-value, not the thickness that tells how well a material insulates. Avoid contracts with vague language with the terms "plus or minus," "+ or -,"; "average," or "nominal." Also ask for before and after pictures. The installation team should be installing measuring sticks in the attic to determine the proper


Is there anything other than insulation to increase comfort and efficiency? There are several innovative materials in the market that are not widely used by most insulation contractors. ERG window film is a smart tint material which can be applied to glass and is virtually clear. This film blocks 65 percent of solar gain heat and 99.9 percent of UV rays, protecting floors, furniture, you and pets from the damaging sun's UV. Some common applications would be any room with direct sunlight; sunrooms and offices are great areas to add ERG films. Another great product is Radiant Barrier, which is a reflective material installed in attic spaces which blocks 97 percent of radiant heat, reducing your overall attic temperature by 40 to 50 degrees in the summer. By reducing your attics heat signature, you increase your comfort and your insulation and HVAC systems work less, saving you money and extending the life of

HVAC systems. Radiant Barrier systems should be installed on rafters, just under your roof line and should not be installed lying on top of your insulation.

There are many ways to save energy and become more energy efficient. The first step is understanding where and how your home is losing energy and then taking steps to increase comfort and save money.







Help Sustain Our Ecosystem

The ecosystem provided by the Choctawhatchee Bay and surrounding areas is vital for environmental balance and biodiversity, with its waterways and estuaries serving as crucial components. These aquatic habitats not only support diverse life forms but also play a key role in regulating temperature, nutrient cycles, and serve as breeding grounds. Additionally, these waterways are integral to the local economy, contributing to fishing, recreation, and tourism. Preserving their health is essential for clean water sources, flood mitigation, and regional resilience. Sustainable practices and conservation efforts are crucial for ensuring the ongoing well-being of this important ecosystem.

The Choctawhatchee Basin Alliance (CBA) is a nonprofit organization formed in 1996 dedicated to promoting swimmable, fishable waterways in Northwest Florida through monitoring, education, restoration and research. In order to inspire water stewardship, they are working to grow a network of supporters to protect these precious natural resources. Here are some of the recent ways they've been able to drive that mission forward.

Through their education efforts, the CBA was recently able to bring hands-on science learning to over 3,600 students in our community through their Grasses in Classes program. Students grow shoreline grasses at their school, tend to salt



marsh nurseries throughout the year, and receive monthly education on local estuarine topics. At the end of the school year, students will then plant their shoreline grasses at a designated salt marsh restoration site along Choctawhatchee Bay. This helps support the CBA's living shoreline initiative.

In October, CBA's Executive Director Alison McDowell & Senior Restoration Program Manager Rachel Gwin, attended the 2023 Living Shorelines Tech Transfer Workshop, an event hosted by Restore America's Estuaries and Galveston Bay Foundation. Alison presented on how CBA sources plants for restoration, and they were able to see Galveston Bay Foundation sites to learn about oyster recycling, conservation lands and education programs.

The CBA relies on sponsors to enable their initiatives. One admirable supporter is Islander year, Coastal Outfitter, situated at the Boardwalk on Okaloosa Island. As a proud member of 1% For the Planet, they dedicate 1% of their annual sales to the CBA. Beyond financial support, they actively volunteer and have made a substantial impact by assisting with Grasses in Classes this year.

Another outstanding supporter is the beach and fishing apparel company, FL BABE. They endorse four nonprofits, including the CBA. In addition to shopping on their website, you can also explore information about conservation efforts across Florida on their blog. They've even featured our CBA in a November article.

If you're interested in supporting the CBA by volunteering, there are openings currently available with the Water Quality Monitoring and Monofilament Recycling initiatives. The CBA collaborates with the UF Florida LAKEWATCH program to conduct monthly water quality tests at 130 stations spanning Choctawhatchee Bay, the Choctawhatchee River, and the coastal dune lakes of Walton County. The CBA is actively seeking dedicated citizen scientists to contribute their valuable efforts and help ensure the program's effectiveness.

The Monofilament Recycling bins are located at various locations along Destin Harbor, Bluewater Bay Marina Complex, Veterans Park and Ross Marler Park on Okaloosa Island, as well as Nick's Seafood

Restaurant, Cessna Park and Thomas Pilcher Park. These bins play a crucial role in preventing fishing line from finding its way into the water where it poses a threat to wildlife causing entanglement, starvation, loss of flipper, tail, or wings, and can even cause death. Volunteers are needed to maintain the bins, aid in outreach efforts and occasionally help with beach cleanups.

Remember that we coexist with a diverse range of wildlife that depends on the same water sources. Our actions can make a positive impact on their habitats. Wait to Prune Cold Injured Landscape Plants

Recent freezes have resulted in many people questioning whether to prune or not to prune cold damaged plants. The short answer is — wait. Winter's not over. Our winter temperatures go back and forth all season — one week it's winter, the next week we think spring has sprung and then winter decides to pay us a visit again. This is typical here in Northwest Florida.

It's difficult to tell how much damage has been done to plants in the winter. Pruning immediately after a freeze will cut away live wood that doesn't have to be lost. Also, leaves and branches, which have been killed, can help protect the rest of the plant when the next freeze strikes.

Some of the more tender landscape plants such as bananas, cassia, gingers, tropical hibiscus and many of the tropical perennials may have been killed back to the ground. Don't give up on them too soon. These plants may surprise you by sending up new shoots come spring. Some of these plants require warm soil temperatures before they'll

produce new growth. Many of the gingers, for example, may not show any signs of life until April or May.

Some winter and spring flowering plants such as camellias and azaleas may experience flower bud damage. This will be evident at blooming time with few to no flowers. Cold damaged camellia flower buds will either drop off the plant or only partially open showing brown centers. Stem damage will show up in spring and early summer when some of the branches die. Cold inured leaves will fall as new spring growth occurs

Individual woody stems on some azalea and bottlebrush plants are likely to split or crack during a freeze. These injured stems/branches are subject to dieback the following spring or summer. It's best to wait until these branches begin to die before removing them, during spring or summer. When pruning, make sure to cut below the split or injured area into healthy wood

When spring really has sprung, you'll know what survived and what didn't. That's the time to prune.





Large Research Vessel Deployed for Artificial Reef

The northern Gulf of Mexico has a new addition to its extensive artificial reef system with the deployment of the 239-foot R/V DEEP STIM III. The vessel, deployed on Jan. 30, 2024, joins hundreds of other artificial reefs already deployed off the shores of Northwest Florida and will serve as a haven to support various marine species while simultaneously providing the fishing and diving industry with an additional resource.

The successful deployment of R/V DEEP STIM III was accomplished through a Tri-County partnership between Tourist Development Councils in Destin-Fort Walton Beach, Panama City Beach and Walton County. Emerald Coast Reef Association and South Walton Artificial Reef Association provided funding for additional reef modules that were placed on the deck of the vessel adding to the complexity of the new site. Coastal Conservation Association provided funds for the towing fees necessary for deployment. "This collaborative effort is an example of excellence in Northwest Florida and a guide for future successes," said Okaloosa County Board Chairman Paul Mixon. "We look forward to many more opportunities that will allow





marine life, tourists and locals."

The majority of the vessel deck sits at about 100 feet, ideal for an advanced dive experience. In addition to diving, the 65-foot high-relief site will provide an outstanding fishing location and habitat for popular species like amberjack. The added reef modules enhance the overall habitat and will attract fishing favorites such as grouper and snapper. "While fishing has always been at the heart of our region's history, creating sites that increase scuba diving opportunities is something we look forward to continue to develop.

Collaborating with neighboring counties and communities on a large artificial reef project like this not only creates essential habitat off our coast but certainly moves the needle on establishing our area as a leader in adventure tourism," said Alex Fogg, Coastal Resource Manager for Destin-Fort Walton Beach.

The deployed vessel will benefit a wide range of coastal communities. It is located about 22 NM from the Destin East Pass, 29 NM from St. Andrews Pass and 16.5 NM south of Walton County.

"This collaborative effort with Okaloosa and Bay counties to provide a new artificial reef serves to illustrate what great things can be accomplished when we work together for the benefit of our residents and visitors alike," said Walton County Commission Chairman William McCormick.

While the Tri-County partnership involves three counties, large reef deployments like the DEEP STIM III have the potential to draw in adventure seekers from beyond the borders of our counties and the state of Florida. "The Gulf of Mexico serves as a shared resource among our destinations, and we are thrilled to collaborate with our partners on this artificial reef project, said Visit Panama City Beach President and CEO Dan Rowe. "In addition to benefitting our region's diverse marine life, this joint effort will enhance the

spectacular diving opportunities for all residents and visitors in Panama City Beach."



Golf Series: Emerald Bay Golf Club is a Golfer's Jewel on the Emerald Coast





Have you ever found yourself wanting to rescue someone you love from hard things? Maybe you keep taking your child the homework they left at home, paying their speeding tickets or paying their rent into adulthood. Maybe you feel like being a good friend or family member means swooping in and preventing people from struggling. Do you ever find yourself avoiding facing

your own struggles and feeling someone should rescue you from difficulty if they really love you?

Struggle, disappointment and suffering are hard to walk through no matter your age and stage of life. It's common to feel life should be fair when reality uncomfortably reveals life is often not fair. You can do the "right" things and still aren't guaranteed the outcome you want. When things go sideways in life, it's easy to begin to view yourself or others as victims who need to be rescued. It can feel mean to not soften struggle when you know you have the power to do so.

However, often, struggle, failure and suffering are where life's deepest growth and lessons reside.

The resilience you and others develop when working through

and bouncing back from struggle is an essential life skill. When you move through hard things seeking the lessons, you become wiser, more confident and more competent at navigating life's frequent complications. When you let those you love move through hard things with support, but without rescuing them, you are supporting their growth and maturity. Supporting is showing empathy, compassion and validating the person's hardship without trying to fix the situation or alleviate the discomfort. It's being present and encouraging the person in the midst of pain without believing it is your job to make the pain stop. Rescuing is taking ownership of the person's pain and falsely believing it is your job to stop natural pain and consequences that are part of a growth process.

So, how do we help ourselves and those around us build resilience rather than engaging rescuing behavior?

7 Ways to Encourage and Support Bouncing Back

Notice and acknowledge when life gets difficult. Notice when you or others experience stress. Watch for stressed behavior, overwhelm, anxiety and depression. Notice behaviors such as isolating, mood changes, physical tension and irritability. Say to yourself or another, "You seem stressed. What might be causing stress? How can you take care of yourself right now?"

Validate the struggle. Say to yourself or another, "That situation is stressful. I can really see why you would be struggling and feeling over-

whelmed."

Notice victim/rescuer stories you are believing. Notice where you might be seeing yourself or another as helpless, needing rescue, lacking ability to take action, or victimized by some outside villain (a person, a circumstance, or a condition). Notice thoughts of wanting to be rescued or thoughts of feeling it is your job to rescue another from a natural consequence or struggle that is likely to produce personal growth.

Embrace empowerment. Ask yourself what power you or another has to take action in the midst of the difficult situation.

midst of the difficult situation. Release trying to control people and situations you can't control. Identify and encourage steps of self-control.

Encourage internalizing lessons. Notice the lessons emerging from the struggle. Encourage yourself and another to see the lessons, to internalize them, and to incorporate them into future decision making.

Engage support through the process. Spend time with people, call, text, listen to give and receive encouragement when things are hard. Avoid advice giving, problem solving for others, or taking responsibility for others' pain. Be present and kind rather than trying to fix.

Celebrate learning. Notice and talk about when you or another have moved through difficulty, learned new things, and has developed resilience. Be proud of the work.


ECCAC Announces 2023/2024 Board of Directors

Did you know that there is a consensus emerging that maintaining good oral health can be the underappreciated practice to a longer, healthier life?

Even though having healthy gum tissue and removing the plaque buildup on a daily basis is important, it's the microbiome that needs our attention. Our oral cavity is home to viruses, fungi and 700+ bacteria species. If we let our oral hygiene slip, this bacteria can travel throughout the body causing or exacerbating problems, from cardiovascular disease and cancer to Alzheimer's and arthritis. On the flip side, keeping this environment in check staves off decline.

Recent studies, DNA sequencing along with more attention being given to a person's oral health when they are dealing with other diseases has led to several connections:

There Are Surprises Behind Oral Health

• People with gum disease are as much as 20% more likely to be diagnosed with cancer compared to those with healthy gums. Another recent study revealed oral bacteria in the brain of those with Alzheimer's. In very basic terms our oral bacteria could be hitching a lift inside specific immune cells (white blood cells) and traveling to other parts of the body (brain) and released when the white blood cell breaks apart. These processes cause inflammation and can create a snowball effect as the body can't keep up with the in-

• 39 People with IBD (irritable bowel disease) had elective colon surgery and the affected biopsy samples were found to contain much higher levels of oral bacteria compared with nearby healthy colon tissue.

• One study tracked 10,000 healthy volunteers over 15 years and showed that participants with gum disease were more than twice as likely to go on to have a stroke as people without this condition. They have studied plaque that has been scraped from carotid arteries and the bacterial DNA revealed bacteria from gum disease. These bacteria are migrating to the arteries and building a home by forming a protective layer preventing an-

tibiotics and the body's natural defenses from attacking them. Once they are established, these bacteria cause atherosclerosis by provoking immune cells to release a chemical that turns LDL cholesterol into a special oxidized form that builds up on artery walls.

Flossing and brushing before bed and brushing in the morning should become a ritual. Don't be in a hurry. Take time to curve the floss around each side of the tooth, bringing the floss below the gum line and back up. Also, remember to brush your gums. It increases circulation and stimulates the tissue. Do not add pressure when brushing; be gentle. Begin using a tongue scrapper after brushing. I am amazed what actually remains on the tongue between all those little fungiform papilla. GUM brushes can be used after everv meal or snack which cleans debris between the teeth. You might also consider an oral probiotic (Contact me for details). And since fluoride is added to water and toothpaste as well as the dentist's office list of therapies ('for our benefit'), let's take a quick look.

Fluoride is a byproduct of the element fluorine. There are three types of fluoride produced (Fluorosilicate, Sodium Fluoride and Hexafluorisilicic Fluoride). Of these, Fluorosilicic acid is the most regularly used additive for our water and it is not pharmaceutically graded. It's a byproduct of the phosphate fertilizer, aluminum, steel and cement industries. The warning labels on these products are marked with hazard signs (corrosive, toxic, health hazard, harmful) and must be handled using great caution. Fluoride is a cumulative toxin and increases with the amount and length of exposure. It also has an insatiable appetite for calcium which can deplete the natural calcium hydroxyapatite that contributes to bone density, thus making our bones more brittle.

As of December 2019, 72 studies have investigated the relationship between fluoride and human intelligence. Over 60 animal studies concluded exposure impairs learning and memory capacity of animals. 62 studies have found that elevated fluoride exposure is associated with reduced IQ and IQ examinations were of 23,773 children (62 studies) and 245 adults (2 studies).

In October 2022 The National Toxicology Program (NTP) published a review draft of fluoride neurotoxicity conclusion: "...Fluoride is presumed to be

a cognitive neurodevelopment hazard to humans. This conclusion is based on a consistent pattern of findings in human studies across several different populations showing that higher fluoride exposure is associated with decreased IQ or other cognitive impairment in children."

You can repair a cavity, but you can't repair a child's brain.

A few other known health effects are cardio toxicity, neuro-toxicity, endocrine dysfunction and hepatotoxicity and nephrotoxicity. Anyone drinking this water is prone to toxic cumulative and highly reactive substance. The younger you are, the worse are its effects.

Consider these questions: Can you guarantee that no toothpaste is swallowed while brushing? What about fluoride treatments? Please take some time and learn more about this in-depth topic which I have only skimmed. It can help you make an informed decision with your next purchase and dental visit.

greatest among you should be like the youngest, and the one who rules like the one who serves. For who is greater, the one who is at the table or the one who serves? Is it not the one who is at the table? But I am among you as one who serves." Luke 22:24–31

Many years ago, I served as a substitute teacher in a Nebraska High School when I observed several striking quotes in the weight room. These football



players often competed against bigger students from larger schools. Some of them sported workout shirts that boasted, "It's not the size of the dog in the fight, but the size of the fight in the dog."

Competition has upsides and

downsides. Sports Illustrated proclaimed Muhammad Ali "Sportsman of the Century" and Ali colorfully proclaimed himself "the greatest." We are certainly a competitive people who continually seek to be number one, the boss, or the G.O.A.T. (greatest of all time.) But Christ has another definition in mind for the greatest in the kingdom.

Competition and ambition

can give rise to the sins of envy, jealousy, and quarrels. Our sin nature is the breeding ground for taking that which is good and transforming it into a monster.

I left the school's weight room that day and shifted to my next teaching assignment in Business Class. Once the students were engaged in their work, I observed the following quotation on that classroom wall:

Today, may there be peace within. May you trust you are exactly where you are meant to be. May you not forget the infinite possibilities that are born of faith in yourself and others. May you use the gifts that you have received and pass on the love that has been given to you.



May you be content with yourself just the way you are. Let this knowledge settle into your bones, and allow your soul the freedom to sing, dance, praise, and love. It is there for each and every one of us.

This prayer is like a hot shower on a cold day, both warming and renewing. When I emailed the teacher concerning the source of the quote written by Teresa of Avila, the teacher's answer was as good as the saying. "I found that quotation a few years back after I had a student who committed suicide. I read that to my students in the days after. It was one of my toughest times as a teacher. I found it fitting for how I felt toward my students after that horrible day. Since then, I read it to my students at the beginning of each term."

The juxtaposition of these quotations serves to remind us of the inherent conflicts of life. Jesus rebuked His disciples, who crassly argued among themselves about who was the greatest. What would the Lord say to us about our ambitions and desire for recognition?

St. Teresa's prayer and the teacher's care for her students show us the way to the path of true greatness—faith toward God and love toward people. Every week in the media, we see various groups serving the needs of our community, exhibiting the kind of service Jesus exemplified. In the end, God measures greatness by selfless service done in Christ's name. Your care for others, all brothers and sisters in the human family, demonstrates true faith, love, and greatness.



Crimes of The Heart

Back when I was a little baby acting student in grad school, I had the pleasure of playing the character of Meg in "Crimes of the Heart." She's the sister who has returned home after an unsuccessful attempt to make it big in Hollywood. Her favorite pastimes are drinking, dating and telling half-truths, which makes her a really fun character to portray—think of that wacky cousin who is always making bad decisions, but never really learning from their mistakes. I remember being fascinated by these three sisters who make odd and unexplainable choices while trying to navigate such unusual circumstances.

Playwright Beth Henley masterfully writes each character with such depth and dimension that one might suspect they are drawn from real life inspiration. Exploring the motivations of such a richly written character is the kind of role that actors live for, and the character of Meg was no exception. Henley creates the perfect storm of disappointed Meg, withdrawn and bitter Lenny, and Babe, who has seemingly had a mental break from reality. Although I don't have sisters, it wasn't too much of a stretch to understand the multi-layered relationships of three sisters in this broken family. We all have that weird neighbor, crazy sister-in-law or eccentric aunt who continually surprises us with their zany antics.

This darkly comic, 1981 Pulitzer-prize-winning play has everything you want in a good story: dysfunctional family relationships, scandalous affairs and a shooting.

In 1986, it was made into an Oscar nominated film with a heavy hitting cast of actors including Diane Keaton, Jessica Lange, Tess Harper and Sissy Spacek. Harper and Spacek both garnered Oscar nomi-

nations for their exceptional performances in this southern, gothic story about the ties of sisterhood and family.

BSN graduates earn approximately \$92,000 annually. Additionally, a BSN degree can equip nurses for graduate school and job advancement.

The NWFSC Nursing RN to BSN degree program (Bachelor of Science in Nursing) is designed for licensed registered nurses. This program provides nurses with the knowledge and skills to become nurse managers, case hospital-based managers, educators and more. The program content addresses high-demand nursing specialties. Clinical instruction targets the specific needs of special populations, including community and family healthcare.

Okaloosa County Receives A-Rating from the Florida Department of Education

2023 Baseline School Grades were released by the Florida Department of Education (FL-DOE) and the results are highly encouraging in the first year of a new statewide assessment. As a District, OCSD earned an A-rating from the Florida Department of Education once again. The District's percentage of points jumped from 63% last year to 68% this year. Okaloosa is one of three districts in Florida to earn an A each year since 2014.

Superintendent Chambers notified Principals, stating, "Recognizing that the school grades process has been adjusted for this year due to a new assessment and the lack of a learning gains component, I am thrilled that every single one of our schools either maintained their prior-year school grade or improved!"

Ten schools increased their grade from C to B or B to A.



Specifically, Laurel Hill, Edge Elementary and Florosa Elementary each earned an A this year after having a B in 2022-2023. Bob Sikes, Riverside, Wright, Shalimar, Elliott Point, Mary Esther and Kenwood, all elementary schools, improved from C to B. Four (4) district-operated schools, Eglin, Choctawhatchee, Crestview and Fort Walton Beach, along with Destin Charter High School, received Incomplete (I) grades. The District has reached out to FLDOE for clarification on the process to be issued a school grade and will provide additional information as soon as possible. In past years,

incomplete grades were given if the percent of students tested was below 95%.

According to Superintendent Chambers, the District expects even

better results at the conclusion of the current school year. "The 2023 Baseline School Grades released today could not take into account learning gains made by students because 2023 was the first year of the new FAST assessment. Many of our schools do a tremendous job helping students achieve significant gains each year and ensuring a year's worth of growth in a year's time. This will only help school grades going forward."

For this month's article, instead of sharing community thoughts or concerns from our Facebook Destinites Group (www.Facebook.com/groups/Destinites), I would like to share a personal Valentine's Day story. Picture it—February 14, 2005—an almost 47-year-old lady in the hospital having just

gone through surgery for a right mastectomy due to breast cancer. That lady was me and the surgery was followed by a grim diagnosis: stage 3C breast cancer.

Fifteen lymph nodes were removed and 14 were positive. Not only that, but the cancer had broken through the cells and were now running through my bloodstream. I later asked my Oncologist if I would live to see my son graduate high school. He sadly looked down at the ground as he said, "Probably not." It's important to note that my son was in 3rd grade and my daughter was in 10th grade, at that time. They are now ages 29 and 35.

I did receive a miracle from God and I well remember that blessed night. There's not

enough room to include that story in this article, but if you would like the details, I am happy to share. Feel free to reach out to me (Destinitesinfo@gmail.com). Also, you can read my story in the November 2021 Destin Life edition at MyDestinLife.com.

The main point to this story, for the moment, is for you to know the following: The reason my diagnosis was so grim is because I was originally misdiagnosed. My doctor sent me to a surgeon, because she thought they would want to do a biopsy. However, they did an X-ray only and the surgeon walked in the room saying, "Good news! It's not cancer." Words I wanted to believe so badly. So, I trusted her. I later learned that there was no way she could have

known for sure if it was cancer or not without doing a biopsy. I didn't know she couldn't tell just from looking at an X-ray. She hung a name on the knot and told me that they never bother with "those." I said, "What if it starts to grow and bothers me?" She said, "If that happens, we might possibly remove it. But, normally, we just leave these types of knots alone."

Well, it did grow, but I wasn't worried about it at the time since she said so emphatically that it wasn't cancer. However, I did eventually get it looked at and that is when the truth was discovered. But, it was too late.

My point is, please be proactive with taking care of yourself. Don't get excited just because a doctor is giving you news you want to hear. If something on or

in your body doesn't look or feel right and you are told it's nothing to worry about, go get a second opinion. I never dreamed that the surgeon would dare play with my life that way; but, she certainly did. Second opinions can save a lot of heartache, suffering and maybe even save your life. Yes, it's a little trouble, but your life is worth it. You matter! Just do it!


