Any landlubber knows Pirate Captain Billy Bowlegs has been setting his sights on our sandy white shores since the 1950s!

This year's new "Captain Billy," Bill Kilpatrick, takes the helm as Captain Billy Bowlegs LXVIII and is joined by the 68th Queen of Bowlegs Sharen Burt, First Mate and Mistress Brad and Krista Bowman along with their lackeys Christina Kilpatrick and John Burt and the Captain's Honor Guard krewe.

The 2024 festival kicks off with a Pre-Invasion on Thursday evening, May 16th, around 4:30 p.m., just off Main St. downtown, where Captain Billy Bowlegs and

There are locals, however, who are struggling with necessities such



Saturday. The mayor of Fort Walton Beach and his forces are prepared and have threatened to arrest Captain Billy if he tries to land, resulting in a skirmish. The city of Fort Walton Beach will also host its Concert in the Park (6 p.m.), Arts & Crafts Fest (3 p.m.) and a Fireworks show (8 p.m.) over Santa Rosa sound.

On Saturday afternoon, May 18th, Captain Billy will return with the entire Krewe of Bowlegs and his allies from visiting Krewes across the country, after his defeat the night prior. The mayor will try everything to stop him from landing. Will he be a match for the overwhelming presence of Captain Billy's pirates? Will the Captain prevail in taking over our city? The pirates and wenches will be full of merriment and mischief as they hand out treasures (3:30-4 p.m.). Festivities at the Landing throughout the day include live music (noon-6 p.m.), an arts and crafts festival (10 a.m.), along with food, beverages and other vendor booths.

TY: I love that our community places an emphasis on the event to highlight its significance. Both in 2023 and this year, I was at Norriego Point for a cleanup. It was beautiful to see people volunteering. What's one of your favorite memories of celebrating Earth Day?

BW: One of my favorite memories is when the Okaloosa Island Pier allowed a few of us divers to go underwater along the pilings and take a few hours to clean up all the fishing gear and trash that had fallen over into the water. Before that time, the pier never allowed diving. While we were doing a voluntary trash cleanup dive, it became one of my favorite dives to date. The marine life, big and small, was very active that morning, and it was a great reminder of why it's so important to keep our waterways healthy and thriving for the marine life underwater.

TY: What an experience that had to be, and it's a good reminder that cleanups and care



aren't just for the beaches. In fact, we have a tree planting ceremony coming up to celebrate Arbor Day on behalf of the City of Destin, and we'll be planting a live oak in Kell-Aire Park, the South side. I know live oaks are one of your favorite trees. Why?

**BW:** Wow! It's amazing that you remembered my favorite tree! Live oaks are truly remarkable, not only because they can live for centuries, but also because they are incredibly resilient. Just like us Floridians, they



can withstand even the fiercest storms and adapt to the toughest challenges. Their sprawling and twisting branches are a symbol of Southern life, providing lush and cooling shade that's perfect for sunny days. And, they host a rich ecosystem that supports numerous species of local wildlife along the Emerald Coast, including us.

Planting a live oak tree is not just about adding a tree to the community. It's about enriching the community with a resilient, beautiful, and wildlife-supporting asset that will serve multiple generations.

# A Legacy of Service, Dedication and a Remarkable Journey: Meet Hometown Hero Patt Maney

In the tapestry of American public servants, few threads are as colorful and resilient as that of General Judge Representative (GJR) Patt Maney. From military battlegrounds to the judicial bench and into the halls of the Florida State House, Patt Maney's life epitomizes leadership, patriotism and an unyielding commitment to minister.

Maney's military tenure as a Brigadier General in the United States Army honed his leadership skills and ingrained a profound sense of duty in him. His service across various global hotspots, including Panama, Haiti, Bosnia, and Afghanistan, equipped him with unique insights and experiences that would later refine his approach to governance and public service.

### Blown up by an Improvised Explosive Device

Patt Maney's military legacy took a pivotal turn following a near-fatal encounter with an IED in Afghanistan. The blast

left him with a TBI (traumatic brain injury), testing his resilience and reshaping his future. Fortunately for Patt, he married his college sweetheart, Caroline, almost 50 years ago, and she became his caregiver. "He became a 56-year-old/6-year-old, and I had to learn how to deal with him and help him," Caroline Maney said. "I was his fulltime caregiver, and he needed assistance daily to get him from place to place."

Despite the daunting challenges of his recovery (20 months at Walter Reed Medical Hospital), which included over 80 hyperbaric oxygen therapy dives and multiple surgeries, Maney's spirit remained unbroken. His profound personal struggle and subsequent recovery not only restored his capabilities, but also deepened his empathy and commitment to fellow veterans facing physical and invisible life-changing inju-

Upon returning to his duties



as an Okaloosa County judge, Maney initiated the county's first Mental Health and Veterans Treatment Court, recognizing veterans' unique challenges in the justice system. This court, the first of its kind in the state, has become a transformative platform for rehabilitation and

reflects Maney's dedication to serving those who have served, ensuring they receive the support and understanding needed to reintegrate into society successfully. The Florida statute establishing a Veterans Treatment Court system statewide is named after Maney, as is the

street around the Okaloosa County courthouse.

## Transition to Civilian **Impact: The Legal Chapter**

After retiring from active military service, Maney's journey did not decelerate. He shifted his battlefield to focus on the courtroom in Okaloosa County. For nearly three decades, he served as a judge, where his decisions were guided by fairness, empathy, and an ever-present commitment to justice. His legal career allowed him to directly impact his community, addressing local issues and making judicial decisions that resonated well beyond the courtroom walls.

### A New Arena: Political Aspirations

In 2020, General Maney transitioned to another realm of public service by entering the political arena. His election to the Florida House of Representatives was not just a change of career but a continuation of

# Yellow Fly Season! Are You Ready?

Florida mosquitoes weren't bad enough, yellow flies are here to steal their thunder. These devilish insects will begin to arrive around mid-April and normally stick around for six weeks. They are quiet flyers and are hard to hear approaching. Once the female yellow fly decides you are the perfect meal, she will gently land on you, and I am sure we are all very aware of what happens next. The female yellow fly is known as a

fierce biter, and she will begin feeding on your blood by using her saw-like mouthparts to cut through the skin. I know it sounds horrible but just wait... there's more! Once the cut is made, she will begin to lacerate the skin with her two pairs of cutting "blades." This will allow the blood to flow out of the painful bite where she will then begin to "drink it up" with her sponge-like mouthparts. When this process is complete, the victim is left with a VERY painful welt which can take days and, worst case, weeks to go away.



You might be asking yourselves at this point, "Where are the male yellow flies?" Great question! The males are non-biters and keep busy as pollinators and nectar feeders. So surprisingly, male yellow flies help us out with their pollinating abilities.

Yellow flies are most active on cloudy days or in wet, shaded areas near the edge of tree lines and avoid bright sunny, open areas unless

they are extremely hungry. If you cannot avoid going outside, the best way to prevent bites is to stay covered. They are attracted to dark materials, so it is best to dress in bright clothing.

Applying insect repellent containing DEET has had the best results.

Unfortunately, there does not seem to be an effective method to control populations, especially the larvae. Yellow fly kits can be used to reduce their presence in small areas or at least distract them from you but will not eliminate them.

Believe it or not, there is some good news when it comes to yellow flies! They do eventually disappear, and we can then turn our attention back to our dislike of mosquitoes!

# 2024 Okaloosa County Mosquito Control

Okaloosa County's Mosquito Control technicians will begin night spraying operations Countywide in mid to late April and early May. Broadcast treatment is conducted in the evening and is required by State Law to be justified. Justification is based on mosquito population surveillance data and other methods. Treatments will begin one hour before sunset.

In our areas...

Mondays: Wynnehaven Beach, Florosa and Valparaiso; Destin: County Line to Airport

Tuesdays: Airport Rd to Destin Bridge, Mary Esther/ Fort Walton Beach and Bluewa-

Wednesdays: Streets off of Lewis Turner Blvd. to Carmel Dr., Rocky Bayou, Fort Walton Beach from Brooks Bridge to Memorial Pkwy.

Thursdays: Shalimar, Ocean City, Mooney Rd area and Niceville

Okaloosa County Mosquito Control and the Florida Department of Health urge the public to remain diligent in their personal mosquito protection efforts. These should include remembering to "SWAT."

Stay inside with screened doors and windows when mosquitoes are biting (dusk and

When outside, wear clothing that covers skin.

Apply mosquito repellant that includes DEET [N, N diethyl-m-toluamide] on your skin when you are outside.

Turn over standing water where mosquitoes lay eggs or rid your outdoor area of standing water in which mosquitoes can lay their eggs.

Remember to apply all mosquito repellants in accordance with the recommended frequency and methods suggested by the manufacturer.

Okaloosa County Mosquito Control recommends the following mosquito-borne illness preventative measures:

- Drain standing water to stop mosquitoes from multiplying: Drain water from garbage cans, house gutters, buckets, pool covers, coolers, children's toys, flower pots or any other containers where sprinkler or rain water has collected.
- Discard tires\*, drums, bottles, cans, pots and pans, broken

appliances and other items that aren't being used.

- Empty and clean birdbaths and pets water bowls at least once or twice a week.
- Protect boats and vehicles from rain with tarps that don't accumulate water.
- Maintain swimming pools in good condition and appropriately chlorinated. Empty plastic swimming pools when not in
- Waste tires can be disposed of FREE at the South Okaloosa County Transfer Station and the Baker Landfill. This applies only to local households, not businesses. Tire sizes are limited to passenger car and light truck tires. Quantities limited - 5 tires per household per month.
- · Cover skin with clothing or repellent.

Clothing: Wear shoes, socks, and long pants and long-sleeves. This type of protection may be necessary for people who must work in areas where mosquitoes are present.

Repellent: Apply mosquito repellent to bare skin and clothing. Always use repellents according to the label. Repellents with DEET, picaridin, oil of lemon eucalyptus, and IR3535 are effective.

Netting: Use mosquito netting to protect children younger



than two months old.

 Cover doors and windows with screens to keep mosquitoes out of your house. Repair broken screening on windows, doors, porches and patios.

The County Mosquito Control Program sprays for mosquitoes county-wide excluding federal and state-owned land. Mosquito spray trucks generally operate starting 1 hours before sunset and/or in the 1 hours after sunrise. Surveillance activi-

ties may indicate certain types of mosquitoes known to be disease vectors that are active during time periods other than noted. If this is the case, the County will respond appropriately.

In addition to spraying, the County has an aggressive larviciding program that includes more than 1,500 sites treated and are checked on a regular basis. Additionally, more than 750 ponds and areas with standing water are treated with gambusia fish which eat mosquito larva and are able to reproduce at a high rate.

Residents are also reminded to have outdoor animals vaccinated against mosquito borne disease. Horses should be vaccinated against Eastern Equine Encephalitis (EEE). Although West Nile and EEE can occur throughout the year, peak season is August, September and October. Horses must receive two vaccine injections three to six weeks apart and then it is recommended every three to six months. Dog owners are also reminded to have pets treated for heartworms since certain mosquitoes present in Okaloosa County carry the disease as well.

# **Condo Insurance and Claims**

When you have a property insurance claim in a single-family home, the claims process can be both frustrating and intimidating, and can be a long involved process. In a condo, it can be even more challenging, because the association is responsible for the exterior walls and the roof. So, what happens when the claim involves damage to the interior premises as a result of property that the association is responsible for?

Hypothetical situation:

Due to a roof leak that was not discovered, the ceiling collapses in a condo unit, with the ceiling dry wall pieces landing on furniture in the living room and dining room. In addition to the drywall damage to the ceiling, there is now mold in the unit that spreads on whatever it lands on as well as the other areas of the home.

In this situation, up until several years ago, insureds would put the claim in with their carrier and then wait for the carrier to subrogate against the condo

association. Now however, carriers opt to take care of the parts of the claim that the unit owner is responsible for, i.e. contents, additional living expenses and mold.

For the areas that the association is responsible for, the carrier will deny those parts of the claim that the unit HO6 coverage does not pertain to. In a condo, you own from the drywall in, and anything permanently attached to the inside of the unit are things the association is NOT going to pay for such as the flooring, cabinets, counters, bathroom fixtures and interior doors.

COA-Condo Association is responsible for the exterior walls and the roof. If there is a claim arising from property your COA is responsible for, your best bet is to get a copy of the Master Property policy for your building, along with a copy of their certificate of insurance, as well as a copy of your declarations page.

If you end up in the situa-

tion above, please let your agent know right away, and have your policy jacket and your declarations page handy. Protect against further loss by moving undamaged items away from loss site, and cooperate with the carrier inspection. If a carrier representative asks you questions you do not know the answers to, do NOT guess. Let them know you do not know the answer and will find out and let them know when you can.

Any questions you have about your coverage and how the coverage will respond in the event of a claim, please direct those questions to your insurance agent, and make sure you let them know any definitions you do not understand.

Claim time is the wrong time to not understand your insurance policy or what coverage you have, and whether it meets your needs. Having the conversation now will give you peace of mind that your insurance coverage meets your needs and will respond when you need it.

Economic growth can be measured by corporate revenues and profits, GDP growth, productivity growth (latest report is a strong 3.7% for the last three quarters), market performance, low unemployment and the rate of inflation over time.

What is driving all of this, particularly when we look at the growth of the public debt (now at approximately \$28 trillion), historically large deficits and recent market volatility?

We can start with the monetary (money supply) stimulus from the Federal Reserve's balance sheet. That is the assets it owns because it bought bonds on the open market with the newly produced money supply. By buying the bonds it injects money into the economy. Would you believe that at the start of

the Great Recession/financial crisis of 2008 that it stood at \$900 billion? It grew to \$3.8 trillion (2019) pre-pandemic and then peaked at \$8.9 trillion in March of 2022.

That is a significant amount of new money that has made its way into the American economy. They call that quantitative easing or QE. It is now coming down steadily as the Federal Reserve is letting things mature and decreasing the money supply. They call that quantitative tightening or QT. The latest read from The Federal Reserve is \$7.4 trillion. Inflation grew steadily with the move in the money supply and peaked at 9.1% in mid-2022 and it is now at approximately 3.5%. So, the stimulus is down %17 and inflation is down about 60% even though much of the money that was created in the last 16 years is still out there and that has helped drive consumption, construction, innovation, the economy, and GDP.

Of course, federal spending has an impact as well albeit a two-sided effect: 1) It provides economic stimulus but 2) it also drives up deficits, the debt and borrowing costs for the US government. The US Treasury has had the luxury of paying less the 3% on all of debt held by the public (about 30% of that is held by overseas buyers). We take note that this year the Treasury has to refinance almost a quarter of that, about \$7 trillion. There are a lot of new Treasuries hitting the market and the Treasury will have to pay higher rates than it was paying. One recent impact has been the steady rise in yield of the bellwether US Treasury 10-year note. Why are yields going up? When there is a lot of new supply and not a commensurate growth in demand, the price goes down and the yield goes up. At this writing it is at 4.66% and at the start of the year it was closer to 4%. Most of this move was recent and stocks correspondingly sold off. One mitigating factor is the strength of the US dollar. Its year-to-date increase in value is 4.5% (after an increase of 2%) for all of 2023). That can have a positive impact for demand for dollar denominated securities like U.S. Treasuries and even though rates are up, can keep borrowing cost lower in the long

We are well into earnings season for America's corporations and thus far about 20% of the S&P 500 (which makes up about 80% of the value of the US stock market) have reported and about 68% are beating estimates. Growth rates (for earnings) for the year are projected to be 11% for 2024. Stock prices typically follow earnings (or sometimes get ahead of them). That is strong growth and typically that is reflected in stock prices unless there are competing priorities (like the 10-year US Treasury), and or an increase in costs of goods and or labor (hurting productivity and profitability).

So, we come down to a few questions: 1) Will the continued drawdown in monetary stimulus eventually lead to lower growth overall because the excess money is drying up? 2) Can the U.S. address its deficit growth? We think yes and the answer lies in healthy and fair, entitlement reform. We believe Social Securi-

ty and Medicare/Medicaid (the biggest drivers of government spending) can and will be fixed because they can be fixed. 3) Can the U.S. put a lid on public debt and outgrow it with GDP?

This brings us to innovation. The U.S. leads the world in the flow of capital and the incentive to innovate and create. The results are being seen with artificial intelligence, or AI. We are beginning to see the increased impact that is having on productivity and economic growth as mitigating factors. The USA leads the world in innovation but also consumption. We consume a lot of what we build or serve. If we look at the threat many see coming from China, we take note that China is more of producer and less a consumer of what if builds or serves. It depends on the rest of the world, the US in particular and that is yet another factor to consider for the long run.

Long-term investing and saving, to us, means that those who save out of fear but invest out of optimism best position themselves to obtain their goals and their dreams.

### Hurlburt Field Reopens Memorial Air Park to the Public

Air Commandos gathered with members of the public to celebrate the grand reopening of the Hurlburt Field Memorial Air Park, April 10, 2024.

For the first time in more than 20 years, Hurlburt Field opened its air park to the general public, allowing visitors to come face-to-face with the aircraft and history of Air Force Special Operations Command.

"Today's grand opening is really a celebration of what Air Commandos are all about, this park and the people who flew these aircraft ... they have a story to tell," said Col. Patrick Dierig, 1st Special Operations Wing

commander. "We want to take the opportunity to open the gates and open that history up to the public, so that we can



plant the seeds for future Air Commandos."

The air park not only serves as a place of reflection but also as an educational venue for future generations. Informational plaques provide insights into the technological advancements and historic achievements of each aircraft, fostering an appreciation for the contributions of military aviation. "As we view this crown jewel of our history, we see our heritage from two perspectives, our Air Commandos and our iron," said Lt. Gen. Tony Bauernfeind, Air Force Special Operations Command Commander. "While the latter physically looms largest in the air park, the stories of our men and women on the bronze placards speak volumes of the true inspiration and carry the heaviest weight."

Among the aircraft on display is the AC-130H Spectre gunship, emblematic of the specialized capabilities that have become synonymous with Hurlburt Field's mission. Additional-

ly, visitors can see the MC-130H Combat Talon II, an aircraft integral to special operations.

The Hurlburt Field Memorial Air Park stands as a living testament to the dedication, sacrifice and valor of the men and women who have called Hurlburt Field their home. As visitors wander among the stoic aircraft, they are reminded of the enduring spirit of aviation and the profound impact it has had on AFSOC as a whole. "The Hurlburt Field Air Park is not just a reminder of our heritage; It is a living symbol ... a living story of our Air Commandos, bravery, valor and unending spirit of innovation that has and continues

# **Base Access Procedures Change**

The 96th Security Forces Squadron will begin 100 percent identification checks for anyone accessing the Eglin Air Force in May. Visitors who do not have a DOD issued ID card will need to get a visitor pass. "Our current security and information environment requires us to make this policy change," said Brig. Gen. Jeffrey Geraghty, 96th Test Wing commander. "We're committed to safeguarding Eglin's vital national resources."

Uniformed service members, their dependents (over the age of 16), DOD employees and retirees can sponsor these passes, which can be obtained at the East Gate and West Gate visitor control centers until the new Air Force Armament Museum VCC opens in May.

Passes are good for up to 60 days. However, if a visitor pass is required for more than 60 days, a commander's approval is needed and can then be issued for up to a year except for retirees. Retirees with visitors will need to renew those passes every 60 days. Passes should be shredded or turned back into the VCC when no longer needed. People can also process REAL IDs into the Defense Biometric Identification System, a networked database system designed to easily verify access authorization of people entering military installations at the VCCs.

Registering a REAL ID in DBIDS will alleviate gate congestion if an ID card holder forgets it at home or in a CAC reader. The REAL ID can also be used by retirees to access the base if they lose their ID or it's expired. For more information, please contact the 96th Test Wing Public Affairs Office at 850-882-3931.

# Destin Celebrates the 67th Annual Blessing of the Fleet and Its History

Think of Destin Harbor. Now add to the scene more than one hundred fishing boats, dive boats, rescue, recreation and tour boats forming a great line around the harbor. Picture a worship service outside the Destin Fishing Co-op with boat captains and crew members, families, friends and visitors gathered together. Then envision many of Destin's clergy processing down the docks. Imagine locals and visitors watching from those docks as each vessel passes by in its turn to receive a prayer asking the blessings of God on its captain and crew. Then, let your mouth water as you contemplate the fish fry which follows.

The past, present and future of Destin are tied to the sea. Her fishing industry is an integral part of northwest Florida history. The fishermen formed the backbone of early Destin. They and their families also shared their faith as members of Destin's churches. Thus, on May 15, 1958, Ascension Day on the Church calendar, an Episcopal minister named William P. Erwin, of Destin's first little church, St. Andrew's by

the Sea Church, held a simple worship service asking God to bless those who made their living on the water. 20 boats were blessed that day. Who would have guessed that the Blessing of the Fleet would grow to become one of Destin's greatest annual traditions?

The Rev. Mr. Erwin later reflected on the reasons behind that first celebration;

"Our purpose in blessing the boats was that the boats, as tools by which the people work for their living and serve others may be consecrated as worthy objects used according to God's will; that the Lord will bless the labors of those who work the boats and prosper them; and that God will keep in safety all who come aboard."

Those reasons still stand and Immanuel Anglican Church continues the tradition today. Clergy from various Destin churches now participate in blessing boats and the number of captains and crews seeking blessings has grown to more than 140 vessels per year.

God has been good to Destin. He has blessed the community with beautiful water, abundant fish and a safe harbor for her

fishermen. The Ascension Day Blessing of the Fleet is a time for us to thank the Lord and humbly ask for His continued favor on those who make their living from the sea.

Ascension Day 2024 marks the 67th celebration of the event. This year's Blessing of the Fleet will be held on Thursday, May 9, at the docks behind Brotula's Seafood House and Steamer restaurant. The event begins at 4 p.m. with a public Worship and Prayer Service to be held under a large tent. After the service, around 5:15 p.m., clergy will head to the floating dock to begin blessing those vessels which have pre-registered.

All commercial fishing, safety and recreational vessels that make their living on the sea are invited to participate. In 2023, 153 fishing boats and other vessels were The blessed. public is invited and encouraged to attend. A communi-

ty Fish Fry will also begin around 5:30 p.m. with a suggested meal donation. Many community sponsors help make the Blessing of the Fleet possible. Our special thanks go



The National Weather Service (NWS) has recently renewed Okaloosa County's StormReady status, a designation that acknowledges the county's emergency preparedness through robust communications infrastructure and an increased lev-

el of severe weather awareness.

The county has maintained this

designation since 2002. "I am

level of storm readiness," said

StormReady status is effective for four years and is a success that is approved by the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration (NOAA), NWS and the local StormReady Advisory Board. Applicants must demon-

strate efficiency in Emergency Operations Planning, Coordination and Partnership Development Community Preparedness.

To be officially StormReady, a community must:

• Establish a 24-hour warning

point and emergency operations center.

- Have more than one way to receive severe weather warnings and forecasts and to alert the
- Create a system that monitors weather conditions locally.
- Promote the importance of public readiness through community seminars.
  - Develop a formal hazardous

weather plan, which includes training severe weather spotters and holding emergency exercis-

"Meeting the metrics defined by the National Weather Service for this recognition is a reflection on the hard work of the County's Emergency Management team," said Okaloosa County Director of Public Safety Patrick Maddox. "The fact that we pay attention and have plans and policies in place, ensures that we are as prepared as possible in the event of a disaster."

Do you ever notice you aren't behaving consistently with the person you want to be? Maybe you want to be honest, but you find yourself lying. Maybe you want to be patient, but you find yourself being irritable with those around you. Maybe you want to be trustworthy, but you find yourself continuing to let yourself and others down.

Day to day life can be overwhelming and distracting from

the bigger picture of who you want to be. Often, you might find yourself doing the next thing without creating space to be intentional about your values. When you don't know what you value, you don't know who you want to be. And when you aren't clear about who you want to be, your choices and behavior are likely to take you down destructive paths you did not intend to travel. When your lifestyle is out of alignment with your values and who you want to be, life becomes less fulfilling, less hopeful, less focused and less purposeful. Life lived out of alignment can also bring destructive patterns like addiction, failure to tend to relationships and lack of self-awareness about

### **6 Ways to Check Your Alignment**

Refine. Refine what character traits and values are most important to you. Use character guides like the Biblical fruit of the spirit to clarify who you want to be. "I want to be kind, patient, loving, responsible, thoughtful, adventurous, creative." Use value lists to determine what is most important to you. "I value integrity, faith, family, loyalty, travel, generosity, commitment." Try creating a list of 10 positive character traits and 10 values to provide structure. You can find a printable Strengths List and Values List at journeybravely.com to help you get started.

Remember. Take time weekly to remember your values. Revisit character and values lists. Notice when your behavior is in conflict with who you want to be. "I want to be reliable but I am not following through on commitments leaving others experiencing me as flaky."

**Reflect.** Notice what is contributing to your alignment struggle. Are you under stress? Do you have unhealthy coping skills that need replacement?

Are you surrounding yourself with negative influences and information? Are you engaging in positive things that help you stay grounded such as spiritual practices, self-care, personal growth? Are there boundaries you need to set? "I have trouble saying no to people so I say yes when I know I'm not actually going to follow through. I need to learn how to say no."

Repent. Repent means to turn in the opposite direction once you realize you are off your desired path. Acknowledge to yourself, God, and others you have made mistakes and engaged in behavior that is inconsistent with who you want to be. "Failing to follow through is not how I want to live. It's distancing me from people I care about. I'm sorry I've been making that choice and I want to learn to live differently."

Repair. Take ownership of your unaligned behavior's negative impact on yourself and others. Make amends. Apologize directly. Receive forgiveness. Communicate adjustments



you will make. "I'm sorry I told you I would help you and then I backed out at the last minute. I'm realizing I have a tendency to say yes, because I don't want to hurt people's feelings and then I don't follow through. It will be better for me to say no up front and I'm going to work on improving in this area."

Realign. Determine meaningful action steps to bring your behavior and choices back in line with your values. Seek spiritual, social, and professional support as needed in your process. Begin taking action in the direction of your values and remember your brain naturally rewires through consistent repetition over time. Move forward in grace and growth. "In the spirit of learning to say no and keeping my word, I'm going to listen to a boundaries podcast and I'm going to ask a friend to check in with me each week on what I'm learning and how I'm applying it."

found the makeup I use.



as basic healthcare, from the homeless to entrepreneurs. This is the gap that Tim Roberts, the Founder and Executive Director of the Hope Medical Centers in Destin and Freeport, has been trying to fill since the Destin clinic opened in 2009. Both clinics are designated free and charitable clinics, in Destin and Freeport. "I moved here from Oregon and was introduced to the need that people who were working jobs 'behind the scenes'

- restaurant workers, cleaning staff, etc. - weren't able to afford healthcare, including the insurance that was offered by their jobs. It was just too expensive, especially now as food and housing costs are increasing. People shouldn't have to choose healthcare OR basic needs. As I was considering what I could do to help, Brad Bynum, who was the minister at the Destin Church of Christ at the time, felt like there was a possibility that they had space that could be used, and they had connections to medical personnel. Once I

understood the needs of the community, which are similar to much of our nation, just exacerbated. The two counties we serve, Okaloosa and Walton, are classified as medically underserved areas. What makes our area work are

the individuals who do foundational work. They're working in construction, they're working on the docks, they're cleaning, they're cooking, they're doing all these things That make our tourist economy work, and a lot of those jobs do not provide health benefits. And so that's where the Hope Medical Centers in Destin and Freeport can offer some relief to the residents of Okaloosa and Walton counties. When we stay healthy as a community, everyone benefits."

The Destin clinic is based in the Destin Church of Christ while Destiny Worship Center hosts the Freeport clinic. The generosity of these church communities in donating space and resources has provided the opportunity for Hope Medical Center to use their donations and grants directly toward patient care, offering massive relief from rent and utilities, as the number of patients continues to grow



The staff at both clinics are made up of Nurse Practitioners, Case Managers, Medical Assistants, Front Office Managers, Social Workers and Counselors. Together, with a team of medical volunteers and students, HMC can provide a more holistic model of healthcare. Patients are not only given a physical assessment through consultations, exams, and lab work but there is also an opportunity to assess the mental health of the patient as well. "We all want to be known and for many of our patients, Hope isn't just where they get their physical needs met, it's a place to be supported in many other areas too. We understand that for a person to build emotional resilience and move toward healing, we not only need to take care of the body, but we also need to look at how they're responding to what's going on in their lives. Not everyone wants or needs that kind of support but we do want to make that available.'

Hope Medical Center is a 501(c)(3) non-profit primary care facility that serves those who don't have any type of medical insurance, and also meets the salary cap which is based on how many adults and children make up the household. The clinics are primarily funded by private donations, support from local churches and grants. There is no cost to the patient when they are seen at either clinic but donations are gratefully accepted to help with the longevity of their healthcare, no matter how modest. If the patient has to be directed toward specialty care, in most cases, there are available community partners that offer discounted rates, and every effort is made to build a team for the patients who are part of the practice. This includes partnering with other agencies and hospitals, offering discounts on medication, and talking with a social worker to see what other resources are available.



Many of the patients who come to Hope Medical Center are referred by local hospitals or word-of-mouth and Tim appreciates that the growth has been steady throughout the years, with the Freeport clinic opening in 2016. "If we're going to give free healthcare, why wouldn't we do it the best we can and make it what we would want for ourselves and our families? Our staff and volunteers work together to make our care the highest level it can be. Cost shouldn't be the difference between critically declining health and taking care of treatable diseases, like hypertension and diabetes."

So, how can you partner with Hope Medical Center to ensure that our local community continues to stay as healthy as possible? There are several ways. "We're always needing more volunteers, especially medically trained volunteers, especially if you are a specialist. The great thing about volunteering with us is we're grateful for any time you can provide and can schedule patients accordingly. No matter how much time you can offer, it will make an impact.

The other thing we need is advocates in our community. We need people who see the value in what we do and want to support us in whatever capacity their resources or connections can offer. Partnerships in health services and funding are what help our everyday operations. Even a donation of \$125 helps us to see one patient for an entire year."



## Earth Day and Mother's Day – Two Great Reminders to Save Energy

expensive filters to allow more air flow and efficiency. These filters do need to be changed more often but cost less. After replacing the air filter, pour distilled vinegar down the condensate drain line to remove mildew and grime from the line, as well as extending time between service calls. If you are uncomfortable or unfamiliar with this process, consult a professional. Don't forget to dust HVAC vents and fans. These areas build up dust quickly and could be hurting the circulation of airflow as well.

What better way to show your mother love than with savings on energy costs. One of the easiest ways to save energy is to change out incandescent light bulbs with LED bulbs. LED bulbs can save as much as 75-80 percent on lighting cost and they can last 10-20 times longer than incandescent bulbs. By switching these off at the power strip when not in use or unplugging them you can save as much as \$100 a year. When cell phone and tablet chargers are not in use, they still consume energy, costing money and wasting energy.

#### **First High School Health Academy on HCA Healthcare Campus Opens**

HCA Florida Fort Walton-Destin Hospital and the Okaloosa County School District (OCSD) have partnered to open the Health Academy of Northwest Florida on the hospital's campus. The Health Academy of Northwest Florida is the first high school health academy to be housed on an HCA Healthcare hospital campus anywhere in the country! A joint partnership between HCA Florida Fort-Walton Destin Hospital and OCSD, the Health Academy of Northwest Florida provides high school students interested in healthcare careers the opportunity to earn induscertifications, providing them with the skills they need to directly enter the workforce or continue their post-graduate studies.

Students enrolled in the twoyear practical nursing program learn the foundational principles of basic nursing and medical skills needed to provide care to patients.

Students at Niceville High School, Choctawhatchee High School and Fort Walton Beach High School are eligible to participate in the practical nursing program through the Career and Technical Education Department of OCSD. Students receive hands-on clinical training at HCA Florida Fort Walton-Destin Hospital during their senior year. Upon completion of the two-year program, students will be eligible to earn a Certified Nursing Assistant (CNA), a Certified Patient Care Technician (CPCT), and/or Electrocardiogram Technician (EKG) certification. Juniors who complete the program will have the opportunity for dual enrollment in the LPN program at Okaloosa Technical College during their senior year, and get a head start on earning their required course hours toward an LPN license.

"We are grateful for this pioneering collaboration, alongside the invaluable support and funding provided by Triumph Gulf Coast for this program," said April Branscome, OCSD Career and Technical Education Program Director. "This marks a historic milestone as the first initiative of its kind nationwide, ushering in a transformative era in healthcare education."

As part of the partnership, HCA Florida Fort Walton-Destin Hospital provided a 6,375-square-foot-space to OCSD for the Health Academy of Northwest Florida, which includes two classrooms and two practical labs. Students who successfully complete the practical nursing program will have job placement opportunities throughout HCA Florida Healthcare. In addition, if employed by an HCA Florida Healthcare facility, tuition reimbursement will be available for students wishing to continue their education.

Establishing bi-monthly coaching sessions provides executives two dedicated monthly hours for deep reflection. This time is invaluable for assessing past actions, envisioning future goals, setting or refining objectives, and considering the necessary adjustments. An executive coach serves as more than just a sounding board; they are a partner, confidant, unbiased adviser, and cornerstone of accountability, helping turn plans into actionable strategies for immediate and long-term success.

Much like the importance of regular maintenance to keep an aircraft in optimal condition, the best time to prepare for an emergency is not during the crisis itself but beforehand. Regular coaching sessions offer not just a remedy for the monotony of daily life but also prepare leaders for the unforeseen challenges that leadership often presents.

A crucial element of executive coaching is to assist executives in executing their strategies swiftly and effectively. It provides the necessary support and accountability to keep them aligned with the objectives set by the leader, not the coach, for both the company and their personal leadership development. 

Jesus talks about a manager of an abundant estate with great resources. The manager is about to be fired for wasting the owner's resources, so he plots a devious plan.

The dishonest manager negotiates with those who owe money to his boss. He cuts the debtors a sweet deal to gain favors for his future. I'm sure both the "sinners" and the "pious people" who heard Christ's story thought, "That guy is a scoundrel."

Jesus shocked everyone by complimenting the unjust manager. Christ commended the rascal, because he had the foresight to think ahead and plan for his future. By using this dark figure, Jesus grabs everyone's at-

Dear Young Person,

I am an imaginary old man. I am every World War II veteran you never knew. I am each faceless GI from the bygone European War. Or any other war for that matter.

I am in my 90s and 100s now. Lots of young folks probably don't even know I exist.

In my war, I was one of the hundreds of thousands of infantrymen, airmen, sailors, marines, mess sergeants, seabees, brass hats, engineers, doctors, medics, buck privates, and rear-echelon potato-peelers.

We hopped islands in the Pacific. We served in the African war theater. We beat the devil, then we came home and became the old fart next door.

Wartime was one heck of an era to be young. Let me tell ya. When we went overseas we were still teenagers, smooth skinned, scared spitless, with government haircuts, wearing brand new wedding rings. We hadn't seen action yet, so we were jittery and lots of us smoked through a week's rations of Luckies in one day.

Then it happened. It was different for everyone, but it happened. Shells landed everywhere. People screamed. And in a moment our fear melted away and we had war jobs to do. It didn't matter who we were or which posts were ours. Everyone worked in the grand assembly line of battle.

When the smoke cleared and the action was over, we had new confidence in ourselves, and we were no longer boys.

And anyway, we weren't just boys, we were girls, too. There were 350,000 females serving in the U.S. Armed Forces in World War II. People forget that.

Speaking of women. We guys were always talking about our sweethearts, wives, and mothers. If you mentioned someone's girl a man was liable to talk for hours about her. And even if you'd already seen his wallet photos before, you never interrupted a guy talking about his gal. Because eventually you'd be talking about yours.

There were nights overseas when we would stare at the moon and wonder if our sweethearts were looking at the same moon. There were moments of indescribable loneliness.

Infantrymen had it the hardest. I don't know how our doughboys did it. They lived like pack mules. Their boots got wet, their feet swelled, and their flesh became waterlogged. Chunks of their heels would fall off; the dreaded "trench foot."

The funny thing is, even though their feet were falling off these men still didn't want to leave their posts. Many had to be dragged away cussing. That's how committed these guys were.

Oh, and the food was godawful. You learned to appreciate the rarity of a creative company

In Italy, sometimes we could buy eggs from local merchants for outrageously inflated prices. One time I knew a guy who ate 32 scrambled eggs in his tent one night. I asked him why he did this and he told me he didn't want to die without tasting eggs one last time.

A lot of guys brought banjos, guitars, and fiddles over there. They'd play music at night sometimes in the open Italian air. We'd square dance and laugh. Others would sit on their helmets, smoking, thinking of home, wiping their eyes.



The Germans had a local radio station that broadcasted American stuff like Bing and Frank. Then, between songs, a German gal talked propaganda over the airwaves to us American GIs in a sexy voice, trying to mess with our heads.

She would speak flawless English and say, "Give up, boys, there's no point trying, you can't win. Everyone hates you. Your girls are at home cheating on you, they don't love you anymore. Give up. It's over. You lost "

This was supposed to discourage us, but it usually just made us laugh. Or cry. Sometimes both.

When the war ended, we felt too much joy at once. In fact, most weren't totally sure they could trust good news. A lot of guys got like that.

So when we heard the official papers had been signed and the war was over, it was Christmas morning multiplied times a hundred. No. Times a trillion.

Those of us overseas immediately wrote letters to family and told our wives we were coming home, told our kids to grease up their baseball gloves. Our letters were covered in little wet polka dots, if you get my drift.

Stateside, there were huge celebrations happening. Sailors climbed lampposts to unfurl flags. Infantrymen stood on rooftops, toasting mugs of homebrew. Mothers were frying chickens out the wazoo.

People were partying everywhere from San Bernardino to Flatbush. Big cities, little towns, and the rural parts between. There were ticker tape parades, auto processions, and girls would kiss any guy in government clothes.

But on this important day, you know what I think about? I think about all the guys who never got kissed again. Our men in the soil.

They were those who evaporated like the early morning fog over Anzio, or the thick mists of Normandy. They died young. And they died for a lot more than a three-day weekend of barbecues and Budweiser.

These were men who fell upholding the mantle of our unalienable American spirit, the Blessings of our Liberty, and the pride of their homeland. They were friends. They were the kids next door. They were children of God who once proved, beyond speculation, that even hellfire cannot kill the great idea that is America. I hope we never forget them. I know I never will.

We get a little taste of fall, a miniscule winter, a gorgeous capsule of spring and a large slice of summer. I feel the same excitement when our new season is announced at Emerald Coast Theatre Company. Like fall, winter, spring and summer, we always have four different phases culminating in the run of our new season.

We start with one of the most important phases, the reading and research quarter. This is the time when Nathanael and I read a portion of the stacks and stacks of plays we have in our home library. Our desks at work and our counters at home be-

come the staging area for "must reads" and "maybes" along with every color sticky note to mark our thoughts about each one. Then we order more scripts and do the same thing with them too. This leads to the next phase of impassioned debate and deliberation. Did I mention "impassioned debate?" We discuss each story and its nuances, (always calmly and rationally without throwing any scripts across the room) the characters, the writing, the music, and the overall cohesion of each show choice within the full season. We present our first draft picks and some other top choices to our executive staff for input and collaboration before settling on our new line up.

The next phase is securing production rights and graphic design for all of the show posters and media which leads up to the big announcement of what's coming in the new season! We aim to get this information out in the spring, well ahead of when we actually launch the new season in the fall. The final large slice kicks off on opening night with a dynamic fall musical and all of the anticipation that a new season brings.

One of the most exciting moments for our patrons is the big spring announcement that happens ahead of the new season-



and that day is here! I'm thrilled to present the upcoming 2024-25 Season 12 at Emerald Coast Theatre Company!

We launch in September with **Jersey Boys.** This toe tapping musical takes you behind the music of Frankie Valli and The Four Seasons as they work their way from the streets of New Jersey to the heights of stardom. You can continue the fun in October with **Baskerville: A Sherlock Holmes Mystery** as our five talented actors portray more than forty characters complete with silly accents and hilarious disguises.

All Is Calm: The Christmas Truce of 1914, our holiday show, is an a cappella masterpiece. This remarkable true story is told in the words and songs of the men who lived it. Every Brilliant Thing, an interactive show with depth and






came from and to be a part of it."





## A Mother's Day Tribute to My Sister



"All I ever wanted to be was a mom," she often said, even when we were growing up. That's my sister, Lisa Leath Turpin. And when her first child, William Wesley Turpin, was born, she was elated—glowing—like the culmination of her life's purpose was ignited. With her second child, Lauren Elaine, she further fell into her coveted role of being the best mom for her kids.

She then understood why she had always held that desire in her heart. There is no greater love than that of parent for their child. And the bond between a mother and child is a most precious one, truly unbreakable.

As Wes and Lauren ("Bebe") grew, Lisa lived her life around them and saw to their every need (and many wants), trying her best, later as a single mom, to rearrange her schedule, her events and all so that she could be a hands-on mom-whether it was soccer games, track meets, football games, cheer leading competitions, art shows, musical performances—she did her best to be an involved mom, making the choice every day to put her children in front of herself....and still does to this day.

I once saw something written: It takes someone brave to be a mother, someone strong to raise a child and someone special to love someone other



than herself. How true that is of my sister! I might add, however, it takes a strong mom to be an overcomer, even through the loss of her precious child.

So, when something tragically out of order happened, it made me wonder how Lisa would cope. You see, no one ever considers losing a child or even being able to understand things when it happens—until it does. Things are still fresh for her. Wes was killed only a few months ago. A senseless, out-of-order death such as this one can break a person. But not my Sissy. She is coping with grace, compas-

sion for others who have experienced the same and is doing her best to balance the pain and guilt of outliving Wes with the desire to live in a way that honors him and his time here. There are very challenging days. But, ultimately, she finds hope and security in our creator, and knows she will see her son again one day.


To all the moms who have loved a child unconditionally, but have suffered this loss, we support you, love you and want to honor you and your children while imparting hope.

## Ask Destinites: Florida Toll Bridge Fees

In our local Destinites group this past month (www.Facebook. com/groups/Destinites), a poll was taken regarding paying bridge toll fees. The majority agreed that Florida residents should not have to pay any fee to use the bridges. Residents speak out with some legitimate concerns. Below are just some of the comments made in addition to the poll:

1. We own a small business in Destin and constantly hear from people in Niceville that they won't come to Destin to shop even though they would love to support our business. They don't

want to pay the toll. The ZIP Codes at each end of the bridge should be free. It also keeps people in Niceville and Crestview from coming to Destin to work, which also hurts small businesses.

- 2. When we lived in Hilton Head, the people who lived there full time could purchase a sun pass for like \$35 a month and go over the bridge as much as they needed too. It is insanity to me that isn't offered here as well.
- 3. Have to pay to exchange my kids with their dad when he decided to move to Niceville is maddening.
- 4. The bridge maintenance benefits residents more than visitors I think it's silly to say we shouldn't pay.
- 5. I think there should be an annual pass for locals for a flat fee. Tourists should pay for it, and money should be put towards improvements, maintenance and Destin.
- 6. I just want someone to explain to me why the two lane, poorly maintained 293/Mid Bay Bridge and extender highway have ever-increasing tolls—and the beautiful, 4-lane 331 Bridge hasn't ever had tolls? Explain it like I'm in kindergarten please. Thank you.
- 7. Free Okaloosa and Walton counties. We have been paying tolls for almost 25 years. It was supposed to have been paid for already.
- 8. We have enough tourists to cover this. Florida residents have a higher cost of living and should not be charged for crossing a bridge to go to work.
- 9. When the bridge at Navarre Beach was paid for with the HUGE .50 cent toll, they took the toll booth down."
- 10. I do believe the Destin/293 bridge should get freed of the toll if necessary tolls make sense for the first few years if they are paying for construction beyond that I'm not for them.
- 11. If you don't want to pay the toll don't use the bridge. Fair-

ly simple concept.

- 12. There is no state tax and we have to pay for bridges, roads, etc. somehow.
- 13. Destin has an interesting take on "residents." Tax payers should be getting the breaks on tolls and parking. We do not get a proration on our taxes if we can't be there six months a year, yet we can't consider ourselves a "resident." Therefore it is difficult for me to answer this. But yes, I agree those who pay property taxes should get a discount on things that help fund the government and not be treated equal to any other "tourist." Some of us are also contributing with bringing in large amounts of bed tax on top of property taxes, yet we need to pay \$20 to park by our own house near the beach. Meanwhile, our next-door neighbor who is a long-term renter pays zero taxes and gets to park for free. "Residents" and ALL property owners should get a break on things we charge tourists.
- 14. My daughter went to Collegiate High School. She had classes early in the a.m. before the bus and a night class. She was 13 and unable to drive herself. There were days I was crossing the bridge as many as six times in a day. It was financially killing us. I finally just sent her to live with her sister, so she could go to Florida tech when she was
