This time, the Mayor and I sat down to share the latest on the underground utilities conversion project. We appreciate everyone's patience with the stretch of Hwy. 98 being worked on presently!

TY: Our underground utilities project kicked off in November. This will not only be terrific for resiliency in storms, but also, aesthetically, it's much more pleasing without extra overhead wires. What all area encompasses Phase 1, which is the current work being done?

BW: Phase 1 covers Hwy. 98 in our Harbor District and Town Center area, stretching from the Marler Bridge to Airport Road. We prioritized this section because of its critical role during hurricanes. Undergrounding

here helps first responders and utility crews work more efficiently, facing fewer roadblocks and safety hazards. This means residents can regain access faster and begin recovery. As we've seen from other Florida communities this hurricane season, every day counts for recovery.

TY: The contractor said the biggest challenge, like other underground conversion projects, has been site layout and locating existing infrastructure. They did a great job limiting impacts on the sidewalks, working in short, intermittent sections. They even had sections temporarily stabilized with compacted millings so that they could be utilized by pedestrians during our city's Christmas parade. Have you been pleased with the work so far?

BW: I've been very pleased with the contractor's hands-on approach. My expectations are high, especially after how long it took the state to expand Hwy. 98 on the east side of town. Unlike



that five-year ordeal, we're planning to finish this project in just 18 months, with minimal impact on traffic and businesses. So far, they're doing an excellent job meeting those expectations as they were able to underground 1,800 linear feet in the first week!

TY: Phase 1 is expected to take about 18 months total. What are your thoughts in getting Phase 2 a reality and where would it encompass?

BW: My goal is to finish Phase 1 during my first term and begin undergrounding all of West Destin. This is the logical next step after Hwy. 98 and aligns with making Destin a model for storm resiliency and

beautification across Florida. Of course, this depends on budget and grant opportunities. I plan to advocate in Tallahassee for state matching

funds and build partnerships with regional stakeholders to secure the necessary resources. We can't keep rebuilding the grid the same way after every storm. For example, FPL is requesting a \$1 billion hurricane damage bailout this season alone. Instead, those funds could help coastal communities like ours invest in infrastructure that's built for the future, reducing costs and risks long-term.

TY: Some people are getting FPL work being conducted, for instance around Fudpucker's, confused with our city's undergrounding project. We've shared that those particular new poles near the restaurant are part of

the FPL transmission line improvements, and that those are never undergrounded as the cost is excessive. Anything to add to help with clarification of the different projects?

BW: t's definitely a bit confusing to see both projects happening at the same time. The reality is that burying high-voltage transmission lines requires extensive trenching, which increases costs by up to five times. That's why these lines remain above ground. FPL is covering the cost of their improvements while the city funds the undergrounding project. The upside is that the new poles and additional lines provide redundancy, helping keep the power even if one line fails.





5 Tips to Lower Your Insurance Costs in a Rough Market

1. Update your home. In this property insurance market, most of the standard carriers are imposing strict age guidelines on Roof, Heating, Wiring, and Plumbing. If your home is 20 years old or older, keep in mind that the older your roof is, the harder it will be to move your insurance to a different carrier. The same holds true



for your hot water heater, which most carriers regard as too old once it has been in your home for at least 15 years.

2. Confirm with your agent that your insurance has all applicable discounts. Wind Mitigation discounts weigh heavily on your premium. Roof credits such as FBC, or Florida Building Code Equivalent, Hip roof, for roofs that slope on all four sides like a pyramid, and single wraps, may vastly decrease your premium from what it is now. If you have recently replaced your roof, it is best to order a new mitigation inspection directly afterwards, and submit it to your agent. Carriers acknowledge new inspections as of the date they are received by the underwriting department, rather than the date they are performed.

3. Check your Total Insurable Replacement Cost. Ask your agent to update your replacement cost estimator. Most standard carriers have some form of inflation guard on their policies, which is designed to keep your dwelling coverage at or above the level required in order to fulfill the Florida Valued Policy Law. Due to the recent burst of inflation in materials and the costs of hiring a licensed contractor, some policies may experience a bigger jump in dwelling coverage from policy term to policy term. It is best to check with your agent to be sure your home is not over-insured.

4. Smart Water Protection System. Some newer homes have a Smart Water Protection system which automatically shuts off the water in the



event of accidental leakage, and many carriers offer a good discount to policyholders for having this device installed in their homes.

5. Increase Deductibles. This is a valid way to reduce your overall property insurance premium. However, there is a downside. For one thing, if raising your deductible significantly increases your potential out of pocket expenses in the event of a claim, you have to decide if you are prepared for that risk. Secondly, some deductibles can only be changed at renewal. If you change your wind deductible from 2% to 5%, you will have to wait another year before changing it back, so be sure to calculate your potential out of pocket exposure before making this decision.

In this rough market, it is difficult to shop rates between carriers, but the best time to do that is after hurricane season ends, which is in December.

The guidelines are always the toughest in high summer, so that by December, many of the carriers have relaxed their rules enough for people to move from carrier to carrier with much less fuss and expense, and that, dear reader, is what we all want—peace of mind with less expense.

Christmas Sausage Balls

My father has made sausage balls for Christmas morning as long as I can remember. I often wonder why he did not get recipe credit for this amazing comfort food as he has been making them for 50 + years! Sausage balls are wonderful for tailgating and a delicious cocktail appetizer, but most of all as a breakfast snack on Christmas morning. The ingredients are simple and the prep and cleanup are easy. If selecting regular sausage, then add about 1/4 tsp of cayenne pepper. I prefer to grate my own cheese rather than buying pre-shredded, as I do not like the caking ingredients used in packaging. I also prefer not to use low-fat cheddar as it does not melt well and the sausage balls will be dry. You will be surprised at how quickly they disappear!

Ingredients:

- 1 lb. ground hot breakfast sausage
- 3 cups cheddar cheese, shredded



2 cups Bisquick baking mix 3 tablespoons water

Preparation:

Preheat oven to 350 de-

In a large bowl, combine sausage, cheese, and baking mix using hands to mix well.

Only add water if portions of the mix are too dry, and just drops until it gets to the consistency where you can roll into 1 to 1.5-inch balls.

Place on an ungreased baking sheet.

Bake 18-22 minutes (depending on your oven) until golden brown.

Remove and cool on rack or parchment paper.

Quickly move to sealed container or Ziploc storage

These keep for up to two weeks in the refrigerator and freeze very well.

Simplifying Medicare Advantage vs. Supplement Choices

Choice: When it comes to Medicare, one size does not fit all - what works for your neighbor (or doctor/provider!) may not work best for you. Remember, you are getting the best for you, not your doctor or other provider.

Care: Care starts with a strong relationship with your primary care provider. If your plan has a network, make sure you're comfortable with the doctors and hospitals in that network. Check to see if your plan will coordinate your care with the rest of your providers...in and out of State.

Experience: Medicare can be complex and confusing. It's important to find a seasoned agent that works for you and supports you throughout your health care journey with plan benefits and resources that can help you live more and worry less about out of pocket costs.

Since Medicare Advantage Plans are offered by private companies, one excellent feature is they have more freedom and motivation to include extra benefits such as vision, hearing, gym memberships, dental, overthe-counter pharmacy items and more.

However, it is important to note that, not only do Medicare Advantage plans vary by state, but are different right down to each individual county in each state. Supplements are universal regardless of state/county, but often times cost more premium per month and do not cover prescriptions, requiring additional premium costs to pick up that coverage.

Try not to get trapped into believing the terms Supplement and Advantage are the same. It is critical to know your specific differences before making choice that works for you.



"I have always had a love for Christmas lights and have continued my family's tradition of going all out on decorations during the holiday season," says Mayor Wagner. "One of my favorite parts of this time of year is when my family and I pile into a car to drive around and see everyone's Christmas lights. I am hopeful that we will see even more spectacular light displays in the future."

This is the 18th year the city is holding the competition, says City of Destin Public Information Director Tamara L. Young. In addition to a lovely plaque, winners will receive "huge bragging rights in the community," she says.

In 2023, the Roberts family

from Indian Trail took Best of Holiday honors with a dazzling display of lights and inflatables. Best Business went to the La Paz restaurant on Gulf Shore Drive, The Palms of Destin was chosen as best Organization, and Bent Arrow Drive resident Renee Potter won Best Home.

Young says last year's winners are eligible to compete for top honors again this season.

Prior to the decorating todo, the city will host its annual Christmas parade Saturday, Dec. 14, starting at 10 a.m. The procession kicks off at Destin Methodist Church on Beach Drive and brings the merry westward on Harbor Boulevard (U.S. 98) to Stahlman Avenue.

This year's theme is "Flash-back to 1984," and we're not sure if Santa will arrive decked in purple Prince-inspired duds surrounded by moonwalking elves.

The next day, Sunday, Dec. 15, the Holiday Harbor Lighted Boat Parade, a time-honored tradition in our little fishing community, makes its way from Harbor Docks to the Emerald Grande.

Boats will line up at Harbor



Docks and begin the parade at 6 p.m. Judging commences at roughly 6:15 p.m. at Sky Bar at Edge Seafood, and then boats will arrive at Harborwalk Village at approximately 6:30 p.m. It's free to participate, and you can register your boat online at destinhistoryandfishingmuseum.org for an entry fee of only \$25.



Organized and executed by the Destin History and Fishing Museum, three community judges will watch and cast their votes on the best decorated boat for each category, and the public is welcome to join. Upstairs at Sky Bar will be a ticketed event, which includes a complimentary glass of champagne and passed hors d'oeuvres, meet and greet with the parade judges and emcee, live coverage of the event, fireworks show, DJ and more. Upstairs is an adults-only venue, while all ages are welcome on the lower level of Edge Seafood. Tickets can be

found on their social media channels, and proceeds will benefit the Destin History & Fishing Museum for its efforts in organizing the parade.

The parade route will be visible from all local businesses along the Harbor, and there are a variety of additional holiday events that day surrounding the parade, including the Mistletoe Market & Photos with Santa at Harborwalk Village and Dock the Halls and Holiday Block Party fundraisers at Boathouse Oyster Bar. Fireworks will also follow the parade at 8 p.m., sponsored by Harborwalk Village. If you'd like to ride IN the boat parade, several local companies sell seats on their boats for the parade time frame.

In keeping with the City of Destin 40th anniversary celebration, the parade's theme is "Christmas in the 1980's." No word yet on whether or not Mrs. Claus will be attending in her Madonna outfit.

This is the final article in a series about the four golf courses at Sandestin. Have I saved the best for last? That's what you will find out as you tee your ball up and navigate your way around the Raven, a semi-private course available to the public. Memberships are also available and information about rates can be found by contacting the course.

I'm not sure who named the course that was opened in 2000. A mystery for sure. Perhaps the haunting words of Edgar Allan Poe's most famous poem, The Raven, can suggest a compari-

haunting imagery and the unforgettable repetition of "Nevermore." The narrator resigns himself to a life in the shadow of the Raven, Nevermore. Sandestin's famous course has similar haunting imagery as it challenges the golf enthusiast to say, "Evermore" and resign himself to a life of golf on the Emerald Coast.

And who can blame a golfer for wanting to play this signature course? Rick Hileman, PGA Executive Director of Golf Operations, shared some interesting facts about The Raven. Designed by Robert Trent Jones Jr., famous golf course designer for numerous courses throughout the south, this 6,900-yard par 71 marvel is carved through marshes and pine trees of the Sandestin Golf and Beach Resort. The Raven has 19 holes. When constructing the golf course, parts of the existing Baytowne Golf Course were used. One such hole, a Par 4, dogleg right, was too narrow once homes were developed along its corridor. So, the designer created back-to-back Par 3's. 16A plays as long as 228 yards and 16B plays 172 yards. The two holes are rotated daily.

Golf accolades pour in from many golf magazines and the Boeing Championship was held at The Raven in 2006 and 2007. Other high-level tournaments include Division III Men's National Championship in 2013 and the PGA Korn Ferry Tour in 2021.

Rick couldn't decide which hole was his favorite. He said there are three memorable holes. The first is an island green Par 3 on the sixth hole. Next is the Par 4 ninth hole of 460 yards that requires an accurate

tee shot to a small landing area. Finally, the 18th hole Par 4 is a masterpiece from tee to green. Water protects on the right side with bunkers along the left... again demanding an accurate tee shot. The green is protected by a large oak tree to the right, a bunker in the back and water to the left. Wouldn't a par on this final hole bring you back for more? Or "Evermore?"

The Raven is definitely a course for those golfers who want to elevate their game with undulating greens, marshes, water hazards and strategically placed sand traps that demand precise golf shots.





gram? Try this holiday fat burning, muscle building treat—a gift from me to you. Exercises are arranged in blocks. Each block should be completed twice before moving on to the next. Do 15 repetitions per exercise.

*Warm up with a 5-minute walk.

Block 1

- Stationary Lunges (split lunges)
- Plank with alternating row (in plank, pull one arm back like you are pulling a lawn mower cord from the floor then alternate to other side)
- Push-up to Downward Dog (alternate from single pushup to piking your hips up making a teepee shape with your body then back to pushup)
 - Side Elbow Plank

Block 2

- Wide Squats see if you can reach the floor with back straight & chest and head up (you can bend over from hips only and as little as possible. heels planted knees direction of toes)
- Grocery Biceps (fill a grocery bag to desired weight with cans or rocks, or whatever)

- Tricep Dips
- Grocery Shoulders (fill grocery bags and press overhead or straight out to sides)

Block 3


- Bridge Dips (on back, feet on floor, knees bent, push hips up toward ceiling then back to floor)
- Seated Side Twists (Russian Twists) lean back to engage abs
- Anchored Leg Lifts or Knee Arcs (on floor, stabilize by grabbing something overhead with hands and raise and lower either straight legs or bent legs)

Note: To raise intensity, add jumping jacks, jumping rope, running in place or any cardio movement of choice for 1-3 minutes in-between each block. I suggest this only if you have already been doing this form of exercise and you have no underlying reasons not to.

Investigate value origins. Values originate from sources including family of origin, national origin, faith background, generational influences, trauma background, racial background,

Consider different does not equal less. ing through the same process with different value backgrounds. You can be clear about what you believe while respecting the humanity of those with different views.

Disagree with curiosity rather than judgment. Knowing what you believe and living your life in open alignment with your values is good. When interacting with someone who holds conflicting ideas, try suspending judgment and asking curious questions about how they developed their perspective. Openness to others' life experiences often results in growth for the listener and we all have room to grow.

Focus more on your character than on the conflicting values. Acknowledge the conflict of values while asking yourself what character you want to exhibit toward other humans. Allow your character goals to lead as you engage conflicting values rather than allowing the values conflict to lead your character.

Engage boundaries before ending relationship. If
values conversations get heated
or disrespectful, try suggesting
avoidance of the topic to preserve the relationship or refuse to
participate in conversations that
feel hostile. Ending relationships
can be necessary at times when
boundaries are continuously
disrespected, however, working
through boundaries communication first helps preserve relationship in many cases.

View people with different values as a challenge to grow rather than as villains. When we define others as villains,

we give energy to feeling resentful and disempowered. When we define others as a challenge to grow, we give energy to expanding our emotional and behavioral capacities both in immediate interactions with those who challenge us and beyond into many other areas of life.

Remember to give yourself and others compassion and patience as you evaluate and grow in showing up as a loving, mature version of yourself in the world. Safe Connections Curbs Domestic Violence

By Kenneth Books

Divorce can be vicious. Sometimes marriage can, too. Until 1997, there were few local places families could turn to in order to exorcise the hatred, violence and mistrust that are often the aftermaths of a failed marriage.

But since 1997, an organization has existed to serve children and families dealing with domestic violence and other related issues

Safe Connections, with offices in Okaloosa and Walton counties, "specializes in supervised visitation and court-ordered custody exchanges," according to executive director Carole Antoon. "Our staff is very well trained and our training is quite extensive. Our manual on sex abuse is almost 200 pages. The supervised visitation training manual is over 400 pages." In addition, there is roughly 24 hours of further training annually.

Helping that goal is the passage of Florida House Bill 385, "The Safe Exchange of Minors" law, which came into effect in

July, and which allows families experiencing domestic violence to use Safe Connections for their court-ordered custody exchanges. When there is a domestic violence injunction, the court can order monitored exchanges, or supervised visitation, to take place at Safe Connections' facility. "This ensures that parents do not have any contact during the exchange, and the process is documented and conducted smoothly," Antoon said.

One of the founders, Sharon Rogers, who recently retired as executive director, said the organization's birth was a joint venture between volunteers and Shalimar United Methodist Church. "It was brought to the church that we needed a safe place for kids," Rogers said. "The church formed a committee, which offered the old church building for the organization.

"We had no money, but we had space and interested people," Rogers, who was serving as a Guardian ad Litem, providing a legal advocate for the child in difficult circumstances, at the time, said.



"Everything was free," Rogers said. "We had donated furniture, toys. We used a model that had been started in Jacksonville and just went from there. Eventually, we got some money and decided we should hire somebody. I applied. It was just a very small amount, just a parttime job."

Donated space was the early prerequisite for Safe Connections. "The only way we could have done it was with that donated space," she said. It allowed us to expand into other areas, such as Walton County, in 2001.

Then, in 2012, Safe Connections got a substantial grant from Impact 100, its first. "We bought a building in Crestview and we've been there since," Rogers said

Recently, the organization bought a building on Beal

Parkway, just past Hollywood, for \$86,000. "It needs a ton of work," Rogers said. "We have to put in the safety parameters, flooring and bathrooms need to be done and it needs an entirely new air conditioning system."

"We're in the process of getting handicapped accessible ADA compliance bathrooms done," Antoon said. "We need money for a security system. We do have parents who get really angry and threaten us. Those systems cost a lot but we're trying to get to the point where we're self-sustainable.

"We want this to be a place where parents and children can rebuild those bonds from prior to whatever family event happened."

"Child sex abuse, neglect, domestic violence – We have parents who have tried to kidnap their kids," Antoon said. "We have so many different categories. It's so hard to understand others' experiences so we try to put ourselves in their situations."

Safe Connections had a "giant field grant that carries us for years," (a federal grant that supplied 200k of our budget for three years) she said. "We were competing with major entities (for grants)." But that grant wasn't renewed. "We're in a major funding crisis right now," she said.

Those wanting to help can do so on the Safe Connections Website, safe-connections.org/donate.

Some of Safe Connections' encounters are less than cordial. For example, said Antoon, "We had a military father. We could tell from his domestic violence injunction that he had lot of anger and he was horrible to our staff. Finally, we let him know his actions were unacceptable, and that we understood why he was angry, but he couldn't treat our staff poorly anymore.



"You wouldn't know it's the holiday season around here," says Doug Kuba, owner of the Gulf Breeze-based Everlights by Design as well as Everlights Orlando. "Things don't die down in January."

Actually, two other companies if you include Orlando. "It's one of the hottest markets in the country," Out of 271 Everlights dealers, Everlights of the Gulf Coast is currently the second largest in the country after Sacramento, Calif. "We may overtake them by January," he says.

"One day, we're a gutter company in Gulf Breeze, and the next we're a multi-million-dollar business. Our product is for everyone. You don't have to be a millionaire."

One benefit of Everlights is the ability to mix and choose for any occasion. "With the touch of a button, you can go from Fourth of July to Saint Patrick's Day," says Kuba. "Every holiday on the calendar is pre-programmed, and you can do it from your smartphone."

The company is growing as fast as Kuba can enlist more installers and gutter people. "Gutter installation is a skill," he says. "You need about 17 years of experience, and usually you apprentice for five to seven years to get onto a crew."

Customer feedback has been consistently positive. "We refuse to take your final payment if we don't earn a five-star review." Kuba also offers a referral program where clients can earn a \$200 VISA gift card. "Our customers get to share in the profits."

The Third Day of Christmas. My three French hens must have gotten lost in the mail. The weather was a stolid 34 degrees. The water in the dog bowls was stone. The sun was out.

Waffle House was warm and inviting. The parking lot was mostly empty except for a few muddy trucks. My wife and I had an 11-year-old with us. She is blind. This is her first time attending a Waffle House.

"Have a seat wherever," said the server.

We found a table in the corner. A booth. Red vinyl. Faux wood table. Laminated menus. Napkin dispenser.

Going to Waffle House is one of my most cherished habits. I go a few times every week. Sometimes more often, if I'm on the road. I give the Waffle House corporation half my annual income. And I do it gladly.

But going to a Waffle House with a blind child is another matter entirely. The whole ordeal is different. For starters, the multisensory experience begins with the nose.

"That smell," the child said, as we walked into the door.

She used her white cane to trace the perimeter of the aisle, navigating between booth and bar and jukebox.

"What is that smell?" she said. Nose to the ceiling.

"It's bacon," said my wife.

When you walk into a Waffle House, it's the smell that gets you first. The smell of cured pork and frying tuber vegetables. It hits you in the back of the throat. If you're lucky, the scent works its way into the fibers of your clothes. And it stays with you all day.

The child was smiling. "This place smells delicious."

"Welcome to Waffle House," said the server.

We told the waitress it was the kid's first time visiting.

The employees made a big deal about it. You would have thought Young Harry and Meghan Markle were entering the premises.

We sat. We talked. The waitress gave the kid a complimentary paper hat.

I've known people who worked at Waffle House. The industry term for this hat is the Confidence Killer. But it looked good on the girl.

The waitress gave me a paper hat too. She put it on my head. I looked like an unhappy messhall sergeant.

The child is thrilled to be here and she doesn't care who knows. She is dancing in her seat. Bouncing in rhythm to the jukebox music. Which is Taylor Swift. "Are you having a good day" says our waitress.

"Yes, we are!!" says the kid, using not one but two exclamation points.

She ordered eggs, scrambled. Bacon, crispy. White toast, buttered within an inch of its grain. Strawberry jam. An Irish pint of chocolate milk. A giant waf-fle—blueberry.

The waitress drew a whippedcream smiley face on the waffle. Nobody asked her to do that.

When the meal was finished, the waitresses asked, "Has it been a good first visit to Waffle House?"

But the kid can't answer. Her mouth is still full.

So the waitresses offered to pose for a picture with us, to commemorate the monumental occasion. One that will not soon be forgotten.

We all pose. The photogra-



pher holds the camera and tells us all to smile. "Say cheese," says the photographer.

"No," says one waitress, kissing the blind girl's head. "Don't say cheese. On the count of three, let's everyone say, 'Love!"

Whereupon every customer joined in unison, counting down with the photographer. We all counted.

"ONE...! TWO...!"
Love.

"And while they were there, the time came for her baby to be born. She gave birth to her first child, a son. She wrapped him snugly in strips of cloth and laid him in a manger, because there was no room for them in the village inn." (Luke 2:6, NIV)

The 80-mile walk from Nazareth left Mary exhausted. Sharp pains erupted in her pregnant body as she and Joseph arrived in his hometown of Bethlehem. Overrun with visitors because of the Roman census, the young couple sought desperately for a place to lie down. Did Joseph run from family member to family member seeking a guest room? Probably.

Finally, a stable was offered.

A Pastor's Ponderings: God Gives Us A Gift

The eastern inn was the crudest of arrangements, typically, a series of stalls that opened into a common courtvard where animals fed and slept. Where the traveler's animals lay, Mary gave birth to Jesus, with only Joseph attending.

Joseph likely wept as much as Mary. Seeing her pain, people's lack of empathy, and the humiliation of their circumstances, would leave Joseph feeling helpless and rejected by his own family. These

realizations will make a man either curse or cry.

If we imagine Jesus was born in a freshly swept county fair stable, we miss the whole point. It was wretched and scandalous. There was sweat, pain, and blood as Mary cried to heaven for help. The ground was cold and hard. The smell of birth



mixed with the stink of manure and straw made for an offensive odor. Joseph's trembling hands clumsily grasped God's Son, slippery with blood. While the baby's limbs waved helplessly, he gasped his first breath of chilly evening air and wailed like any other newborn.

God allowed himself to be

born as a helpless infant. The Son of God was not born into the world as a prince, but poor as a pauper. Christ sets the example by coming to the needy and lowly of heart.

The Son of God becoming human is a marvelous model of Christ's work in us. Look long and hard at the paradox, God of very God, light of very light, lying in an animal's feeding trough, the God-man. Fully divine and fully human. The Eternal Word came with a cry and a whimper. He who embodies eternal light lays wrapped in swaddling clothes.

What does all this mean for us? Jesus became fully human, one of us. He empathizes with our situation. He is also fully God with the ability to save us from ourselves.

What would have happened if Christ had never come, had never been born in a manger? Humanity would have devolved into chaos. What does the birth of Jesus Christ mean to the

world? It gave us the hope of heaven and love that dispels loneliness.

Jesus came and gave himself as a gift to us. From his birth in the manger to his death on the cross, Christ came to build a bridge of relationship between God and people. When they drove nails into his hands and the wood of the cross, they were nailing down the last boards of the bridge that crosses from darkness to light, from earth to glory, from dying to living.

The people in Bethlehem did not have time or room for Joseph, Mary, and Jesus. Will we make room for Jesus this Christmas season?

prioritizes generosity, responsibility and faith. Your giving could fundamentally impact lives.


Practical Steps for a Meaningful Year

Miracles Small and Grand

Recently I traveled with our Emerald Coast Theatre Company (ECTC) Junior Thespian Troupe to the state district competition in Tallahassee. This is the qualifying event for the Florida State Thespian Festival, which is essentially like the Florida theatre Olympics. Each of our 18 students participated in solo, duet and group pieces as well as everyone performing in the one act play entitled "Box." We were a giant roving group of students and parent supporters, cheering each other on

with silent jazz hands as we also cheered on our fellow thespians who were competing alongside us. It was a day of tiny miracles, watching young middle schoolers sing their hearts out, act with conviction, and dance like everyone was watching. The highest rating one can receive is a "Su-

perior." This rating allows the monologue, duet or acting scene to advance to the State competition. Our students racked up 15 superiors and won Critic's choice in the pantomime category. They also won the honor of performing their One Act at the state festival. The aforementioned miracles

lie not in the fact of winning, for they worked tirelessly to achieve these rankings. The miracle lies in the motivation and determination of each student to bring their very best, the willingness to sacrifice their weekends and after school time to work on a scene, and in their understanding that this is more than just a hobby; it's a passion.

I've always loved the general feeling that Christmas is a time when miracles are more prevalent and anything is possible. Just like these students experienced the miracle of working hard, believing and achieving, we continue to believe with them that "Anything Can Happen." In keeping with ECTC's Season 12 theme for the holidays, we chose the beautiful a cappella musical All is Calm; The Christmas Truce of 1914 to keep that spirit alive. This story is based on true events that transpired on Christmas Eve, 1914 in the Belgian territory of Ypres between the English and French soldiers, and German soldiers.

British Soldier Albert Moren of the 2nd Queen's Regiment wrote of that night:

"There was a lot of commotion in the German trenches and then there were those lights — I don't know what they were. And then they sang 'Stille Nacht.' I shall never forget it. It was one of the highlights of my life."

In a miraculous and risky show of peace, a German soldier reached out through the darkness of the trenches and sang "Silent Night." What followed was an incredible truce, lasting hours, and, in some places, days.

Within moments, soldiers from both sides found themselves standing in the middle of "no man's land," unarmed, shaking hands, laughing and doing their best to communicate in a foreign tongue. During the next several hours, they would exchange gifts, share a little rum, pause to bury fallen comrades, play a game of soccer and sing Christmas carols.



The Christmas Truce is a story that is almost too far-fetched to believe. But, the overwhelming evidence based on letters from soldiers and diaries of those who lived through it has corroborated this miraculous event. To experience the beauty of this story, as told through those words and the music that weaves seamlessly throughout the performance, is a miracle, too. This show will also feature a return to the stage of some of your favorite ECTC performers.

Bruce Collier, local actor and playwright best known for his one-man Winston Churchill show, will be joining the illustrious cast alongside many of your favorites that you know and love. Vincent Pelligrino, last seen as Bert in Mary Poppins, brings his musical direction and vivid stage presence once again. Chris Saltalamacchio, who last took a turn on our stage as buttoned up Mr. Banks with a change of heart in Mary Poppins, will once again share his velvety tenor voice with us this season. Also gracing the stage is the dynamic Logan Polson of Jersey Boys and Baskerville; A Sherlock Holmes Mystery and the multi-talented Gavin Parmley, also of Jersey Boys and The Play That Goes Wrong.

On Christmas Eve in 1914, Allied and German troops shared a "Stille Nacht" and laid down their arms to shake hands across a muddy trench. It was the smallest of gestures that resulted in a grand miracle that made history. Miracles small and grand are happening all around us in the everyday normalness of life, even the tiny miracles of confidence and achievement our students experienced at competition. I hope that during this holiday season, you experience a few miracles of your own. In fact, come join us at ECTC for All is Calm and walk away believing in your heart that "Anything Can Happen."

Cultural Arts Alliance Advocacy Alert—You Can Help!

In the past, the Florida Division of Arts & Culture (DAC) grants received regular funding through state budget approvals. For the FY25 budget, the state legislature recommended \$32 million for two of the DAC's four grant programs. However, the governor vetoed this funding, leaving hundreds of arts and cultural organizations like ours that provide education, enrichment, and economic impact in our communities without state support for the year—a first in state history.

For FY26, arts advocates are closely watching the budget process. The Department of State submitted a legislative budget recommending zero funding for DAC grants, although this isn't yet the governor's final decision. This is all especially disappointing because the state's investment has shown a 9:1 return year after year.

Importantly, this isn't the governor's official budget recommendation, and the governor's budget has not been



published yet. But this is a recommendation for the governor to consider.

In Walton County, the arts & culture sector generated \$57.3 million in economic activity during 2022—\$8.6 million in spending by arts and culture organizations and an additional \$48.6 million in event-related expenditures by their audiences. That economic activity supported 652 jobs, provided \$23.9 million in personal income to residents, and generated \$8.1 million in tax revenue to local, state, and federal governments. To learn more about these important findings, visit our webWe are at the beginning of the budgeting process, where advocacy can make a big difference. For now, I ask that you write our state representative and senator. Make them aware of this situation and ask them to reinstate the arts & culture recommendation to include

funding for the FY26 Division of Arts & Culture grants (DAC).
