The Housing Revolution Starts Now Meet Visionary Bekah Manley

Bekah Manley is a holistic realtor, meaning that she looks well beyond the structure of a house. "I take the physical, spiritual and emotional into consideration," she explains. "I go a little deeper than most realtors when it comes to finding an environment in which a person will best thrive. To me, a house is more than a structure. It's a sanctuary for your soul."

Bekah has called the Emerald Coast her home since 2017. After graduating from Auburn University (Manley majored in psychology, which she says she uses every day in her work), she visited her mother who had recently moved to the area. "And me being a broke, confused college student, it was either go back to my hometown or go to the beach," she says. "I decided to go to the beach."



The Northwest Alabama native has been engaged to Destin Mayor Bobby Wagner for more than a year now, and I jokingly ask if she has any influence over the city government. "No," she laughs. "But we have been able to use both our jobs to create a positive impact on the community."

Bekah and Mayor Wagner worked together shooting videos in Gulf County after Hurricane Michael, letting the rest of the world know that the area was rebuilding. She obtained her real estate license in 2021, and one of the first things Bekah did was ask her brokers:

"Why do we keep building the same thing over and over again and expecting different results?"

Bekah sought out contractors and architects with a passion for revolutionizing the building environment "from the ground up" as well as utilizing political connections to "challenge and change the building standards for the state of Florida."

For the past three years, Bekah and business partner Joseph Beeman have been building THEIA Development to create sustainable, resilient and affordable houses using advanced technology like 3D printing. "Due to recent hurricanes, people's eyes have been opened" to new things, she says. "You don't have to be an expert to know if something isn't working. I believe we can change the standards. The 'Oh, we've always done it this way' isn't working anymore."

Bekah says traditional building methods are outdated. "Insurance rates are not going to budge until we have better products for them to cover."

She is also working to connect with industry people interested in green initiatives. "I know they exist," says Bekah. "I'm just trying to bring different experts – appraisers, lenders, builders, engineers – out of the woodwork who care about sustainable futuristic building practices."

Bekah and her team are looking to launch the new housing initiatives here in the Panhandle, with a focus on areas affected by hurricanes. And then, spreading throughout the state and beyond.

"The next step for me is to build a physical product for people to touch and feel," she says, "so they can see the whole process and open their minds about how to build in the future.

"It's not that scary. The big obstacle is that a lot of people fear change and things they don't understand. Sometimes people tend to be a little closed-minded when it comes to (housing)." Bekah is working to create a dialogue and educate the community.

"It should be clear, in light of recent events, why I'm looking to change things. And have been."

Seeking Justice **Destin True Crime Club**

Murder is an unnatural act that fascinates many of us. Not that we want to commit it; but, we wonder about those who do. The rise in popularity of true crime books and streaming shows proves the unexplained fascination with murder - as long as we view it at a distance from the safety and comfort of

However, a few select people go further and seek out online forums and special interest groups that discuss specific murders. The Destin True Crime Club is a dedicated group of people who get together to discuss murders. Members review various cold case murders and select one with the goal of solving the murder through extensive research, interviews (when possible) and public records. The information is then presented to the proper investigative agency, in the hope that they can move the case toward a solution.

In this journey, club members learn the principles of solid homicide investigations. Local resident, Mike Yoder, who leads the group, is a retired FBI Supervisory Special Agent with 20+ years working on violent crimes, with eight years of that career as a Criminal Profiler where he worked on both single and serial murder cases, violent child crimes, kidnappings and FBI Top Ten Most Wanted cases. Mike taught at the University of West Florida as an Adjunct Instructor in the Criminal Justice program, and as founder, mentor and advisor to the Destin True Crime Club, he shares his vast knowledge of crime, interviewing, and investigation so that civilian members unfamiliar with criminal investigations are effective and well trained.

"Each case starts with researching who the victim is because we want to learn how a victim becomes a victim (Victimology)," says Mike. "We look for reasons that the murder occurred (Motive). We research how the crime happened, the circumstances of how the murder took place, when it occurred, and any forensic information we can find to form a theory on a possible offender (Crime Scene Analysis)."

He continues, "We look at the details of the murder, because each has its own characteristic (Typology). In many cases, we learn enough to understand the type of offender (Offender Profiling). We incorporate police techniques such as statement analysis and behavioral analysis to help us understand the nature of the crime," Mike

The Destin True Crime Club members learn to become true crime sleuths by digging deep into the research and learning how the information fits into the narrative of who committed the murder and why they committed it. "Our shared goal with the police is to seek justice for a victim that can no longer speak for themselves by holding someone responsible for their deadly acts," says Mike. "We hope our efforts bring closure to the families and friends of victims as they mourn the loss of their loved one."

"Human behavior is varied and complex, but most behavior fits into common themes.

It is about knowing the various themes and applying the correct one to the specific crime," says

If you have an interest in true crime and want to know how to become a sleuth, please check out the FaceBook page at Destin True Crime Club. The group meets once a month to discuss its ongoing research of the case at hand and brainstorm ways to continue its research. "This is a serious, but fun, group of people who have the passion to solve cases," Mike says.



From Hardship to Hope:

A Story of Resilience and Renewal

Homelessness. It's a word we often hear, a situation we see, but one that too many of us avoid truly talking about. For some, it feels distant—an issue for "other people." But what happens when homelessness isn't just a statistic, but a reality that hits someone you know, someone you love?

For me, it was personal.

I grew up in Fort Walton Beach, a place filled with fond memories and a deep sense of community. It's the same community where someone near and dear to my heart also grew up. He was someone who gave his life to caring for othersparticularly his mother, whom he loved dearly and supported for as long as he could remember. But when she passed away, everything changed.

Grief is a difficult road to walk, and, for him, it brought more than just emotional strug-

gles. A tragedy occurred—a life-altering event that became the start of a downward spiral. When life hits you with an unexpected boulder, sometimes you don't see it coming. Sometimes, it rolls downhill, taking everything with it-mental and emotional well-being, finances, and stability. And despite his best efforts, he found himself in a place no one ever imagines:

I wish I could say this story is uncommon. But the truth is, it's not. For so many of us, there's someone—a family member, a friend, a neighbor—who has struggled with homelessness. It's not just a distant issue. It's real, it's painful, and it's closer than we like to admit.

Last year, during the holiday season, my loved one's story became a testament to the power of hope and perseverance. At his lowest point, he was referred to One Hopeful Place (OHP) by



a family member: me.

At OHP, he found more than just shelter. He found a team compassionate, dedicated individuals who gave him the support he needed to start over.

Among them was Mike, whose kindness and encouragement made an immediate and lasting impact.

"I'll never forget the day I arrived at OHP," he shared

with me. "It was cold and rainy, and Mike welcomed me with warmth and kindness. He talked with me about housing re-





Doug Stauffer Elected as Chairman of Okaloosa County Republican Party

The Okaloosa County Republican Executive Committee (OCREC) has ushered in a new era of leadership by electing Doug Stauffer as its Chairman alongside a slate of other new officers. This marks a significant transition for the organization, with all four Executive Board positions replaced in the recent election.

Doug Stauffer, a pastor, author, Life Media writer and Niceville City Councilman, was overwhelmingly chosen to lead the party, garnering more than 75% of the vote. Stauffer made headlines early in 2024 when he won a Niceville City Council seat through a historic coin flip to break a tie vote. He has been a member of OCREC since 2019 and has served as Treasurer for the last two terms.

"I am deeply humbled and honored to be elected Chairman of the Republican Party of Okaloosa County," stated Stauffer. "With President Trump's election as our 47th President, the Panhandle counties must remain a bedrock of conservative values in Florida. As the world watches our nation over the next four years, we are poised to lead with strength, unity, and a commitment to our shared principles."

Stauffer also addressed the role of faith in public service: "Christians have been told they should stay out of politics, but the opposite is true. While government needs to stay out of the church, Christians must greatly influence the government. The Founding Fathers designed our Republic to be guided by biblical principles, ensuring that faith and values form the bedrock of a just and moral society. Republicans must insist on 'following the science' rather than ideologies driven by agenda-based narratives that undermine truth, freedom and morality."

Stauffer succeeds Sandra Atkinson, who dedicated over 12 years to the OCREC and served as Chair for the past four years, a period marked by significant challenges within the Okaloosa Republican Party. OCREC members elected Chris McKay, the former Secretary, as Vice Chair and Diana Graham, who succeeded McKay as Secretary. Neither had a challenger and were elected by unanimous consent. Stauffer appointed Ed Gilbert as interim Treasurer until a formal election for that position is held on January 27, 2025.

Okaloosa County remains a Republican stronghold, with registered Republicans far outnumbering Democrats. President Trump, Senator Rick Scott, State Senator Don Gaetz, and State Representative Patt Maney secured over 70% of the county's vote in the November general election. Representative Maney emphasized, "To maintain our momentum, we must boost turnout to counter heavily Democratic counties. With key races ahead, including Congressional and State House elections, robust education and get-out-the-vote efforts will be critical."

The OCREC is a critical resource for Republican candidates, designed to provide support, training, and grassroots organization. "We are not campaign managers," emphasized Stauffer. "Our role is to serve as a resource pool for Republican candidates at every level, from city and county positions to congressional and other national offices." Voter turnout in Okaloosa County dropped by 2% from the 2020 presidential election.

Stauffer brings a wealth of experience to his role, balancing his duties as pastor of Faith Independent Baptist Church, Niceville City Councilman, and a commissioner for the Niceville CRA, the Okaloosa County Transit Cooperative, and the

Okaloosa County Library Governing Board.

Stauffer's leadership seeks to rebrand the county Republican party as a unified, cohesive organization dedicated to constitutional principles. Okaloosa County should serve as a model county for others to follow. Success will be measured not by maintaining the status quo, but by principled individuals achieving truly conservative outcomes that align with the founding of this great Republic. What Does it Mean to "Age-In" to Medicare?

As many times as I have said the term "age-in" to folks when discussing Medicare, it has never failed to elicit a visceral response like, "What do you mean with this age-in thing?!" or "I don't feel aged-in!"

The fact of the matter is, aging-in means you are turning 65 soon, and it is a good thing. There are many we all know that didn't make it to that milestone. Bravo for making it and

cheers for many more.

With Annual Enrollment Period now officially ended (even though there is a little known Special Enrollment Period for certain local counties which extends the period until 3/31/2025!), we are now in the middle of the Open Enrollment Period which runs from January 1 – March 31 of every year for pre-dominantly for Advantage Plan members (you can re-read my article from last month for more information about the ins

and outs of that). But, that does not change the fact many people have birthdays all year long and are actually aging-in during this time as well. Confusing but, it can be made sense of with a little guidance.

What generally happens is, folks get confused between what they see on TV with all the pitches about "time running out" and, what they can actually do during the aging-in period. So, let me attempt to de-mystify it a little bit here.

There is a period of time when a person ages-in and becomes eligible for Medicare. Typically, this period of time is three months before the month in which they turn 65 and three months after the month in which they turn 65. Do the math and you will see this is a seven-month period of time around your birthday. There are a few other exceptions to this eligibility period. But, those will have to be saved for another article or very long-winded phone call for the braver among us!

The first order of business is to obtain your Part A and B (if desired or needed) through Social Security. Without adding a litany of boring details as to qualifications for each, suffice it to say Part A is typically \$0 premium for most folks and Part B for 2024 will typically cost \$185.00 per month. The Part B premium is means tested and can get a little complicated (and expensive)—certainly more complicated than can be described in this article. Again,

suffice it to say, some could pay much more or much less, depending on your Modified Adjusted Gross Income from two years prior unless you apply for a break based on current income. There is a form for that.

If you wish to avoid LIFE-LONG penalties, you will have to have Part B and Part D (prescription coverage) in place at the time of first becoming eligible. As a reminder, eligibilities are one of those things unique to each person's circumstances so, it is important to know how these things apply to you.

If you choose to obtain a Supplement, commonly called a "Medi-Gap" policy, you will need to also obtain a separate Part D prescription plan as Supplement plans DO NOT INCLUDE such. If you choose to obtain an Advantage plan, the Part D prescription coverage is typically INCLUDED.

As you can see this can, and usually is, a very confusing time for most folks used to having traditional insurance for their whole lives. Suddenly, you are thrust into this new system when everybody and their cousin is calling and/or mailing you every single day with their "better option"

Your best option is the one that best suits you. Maybe it is a great price. Maybe it is a great network of providers. Maybe it is just the peace of mind in knowing you have someone you can rely upon for information when you need it.

If there is only one take away you can have from this article, it would be to work with someone that can help you navigate the local landscape and help you completely understand this otherwise very confusing time in life.

ECSC's Diane Fraser: Discovering the Chemistry between Science and Community

Diane was born in Mobile, Ala., graduated from Niceville High School, earned her undergraduate degree from Huntington College, and her master's degree from University of Alabama at Birmingham (UAB).

Armed with her chemistry and forensic science degrees, she moved to Salt Lake City. In her 20's she was looking forward to seeing something different and broadening her horizons. She enjoyed working in a forensic toxicology lab doing cutting edge research. Diane will tell you television shows about crime scene investigation are not true to life. The script will combine six jobs into one character. Diane met her husband in Salt Lake City.

Diane and her husband moved to Cincinnati after they were married, where she worked for five years as a research chemist at the Food and Drug Administration. The Forensic Chemistry Center par-

ticipated in a lot of criminal investigations. If someone had an adverse effect from some food or chemical, etc., her team would try to find out what was in there that made the person sick.

While in Cincinnati, her husband traveled a lot and was gone all week. They decided to move back to Fort Walton Beach in 1999. His family was there and her family was in Niceville. Diane quit work and became a full-time mom. She has taught as an adjunct professor at UWF since 2003 and joined the Emerald Coast Science Center (ECSC) board in the spring of 2014.

A couple of weeks into November, the ECSC director left to become a full-time teacher. The board asked Diane to be the interim director while they looked for a replacement. In 2015, Diane became the permanent director. It was a leap of faith. There was no money to invest in new exhibits and programs; there hadn't been invest-




ments in a while, and the science center didn't have the strongest reputation. It took a couple of years to change the perception. The experience of attending the science center needed to change between visits or why would anyone come back?

With no business experience, but plenty of ignorance and enthusiasm, Diane didn't know how scared she should be. She started writing grants and, with board guidance, began to make friends in the community, improved the science center's reputation, obtained some investments, generated more revenue and began to build small successes.

The ECSC generates revenue by charging admission. The staff hosts field trips from Okaloosa County, Walton County and Alabama. The center also provides home school programs. Fundraising programs along with personal and corporate donations help the science center keep moving forward.

When asked to share the greatest lesson she's learned, Diane says it's collaboration with our communities. The first two years were focused on investing and income generation to become stable. Then Covid happened. There were big concerns.

The science center board met weekly and the community stepped up. Diane gets emotional when she talks about the community support. The



To say thank you, the ECSC offered free passes to the United Way, foster programs, guardian ad litem programs and Big Brothers. Anyone with EDT or SNAP can show their card and four people get in for \$12. Normally the fee is \$12 per person. Diane says the science center is not serving the mission if a lot of the population don't have access. "Many families can't afford admission and still pay bills. One of these kids could be the scientist that solves the next big problem."

The ECSC houses 60 animals. There are birds, reptiles, tortoises, chinchillas, geckos, tarantulas, turtles, parrots, hedgehogs and hermit crabs to name a few. They name their animals

Alaqua Animal Refuge Calls for Emergency Support

Alaqua Animal Refuge, a nationally recognized nonprofit organization dedicated to saving animals in need, stepped in recently to rescue 21 severely neglected horses in partnership with the Washington County Sheriff's Office and Washington County Animal Control. These horses, now safe at Alaqua's sanctuary, were victims of heartbreaking neglect and cruelty, leaving them frail and vulnerable.

The rescue operation took place amidst freezing temperatures, raising concerns about what might have happened if these horses had been left in the cold. Their emaciated bodies, weakened by starvation and mistreatment, would not have survived the harsh conditions.

"No animal should ever endure what these horses have been through," said Laurie Hood, Founder and CEO of Alaqua Animal Refuge. "Thanks to the swift action of law enforcement and animal control, they are now safe. However, their journey to recovery will be long and costly."

These horses require immediate and intensive medical care, specialized nutrition, and constant attention. Already operating at full capacity, Alaqua had to activate its emergency sheltering to accommodate them. The financial strain of their rescue and care is immense, and the organization is reaching out for public support.

Alaqua Animal Refuge, located on 100 donated acres in



Freeport, has become a beacon of hope for animals throughout the country, offering rehabilitation, refuge, and second chances. The rescue of these horses underscores Alaqua's commitment to its mission, but also highlights the urgent need for community support during crises like this.





How the 2024 Hurricane Season Impacted Recreational Fishing in the Gulf

The 2024 Atlantic hurricane season, which officially ended on November 30, showcased above-average activity. It had a profound impact on recreational fishing in the Gulf of Mexico, causing recreational fishers to face challenges and interim closures. Hurricanes Beryl, He-

lene, and Milton caused devastating effects in many Gulf Coast fishing communities—many of which are still working to recover.

The aftermath of this hurricane season is still being felt by many key industries that contribute to the coastal economy—including the recreational fishing community. NOAA Fisheries'

Southeast Recreational Fishing Coordinator, Sean Meehan has spoken with key members in the industry to learn the full scale of this hurricane season's impacts.

"Hurricanes can upset coastal marine ecosystems, but they also have the ability to negatively impact the economy in the Gulf," Sean Meehan says, "Many business owners rely on tourism to keep their tackle shops and charter operations running smoothly. I've met with several members of the recreational fishing community here in Florida who have shared the challenges they're facing in the wake of the 2024 Atlantic hurricane season. Rebuilding efforts are underway and it's only up from here."



Hubbard's Marina has been operating in the Tampa Bay area since 1928. They offer deep sea fishing trips, dolphin-watching excursions, sunset cruises, island visits, and private fishing charters to both visitors and locals alike. After four generations of family ownership and operations on the Gulf Coast, one could say the Hubbard family

is experienced in Atlantic hurricane seasons.

"This hurricane season has had a horrendous impact," says Captain Dylan Hubbard, owner of Hubbard's Marina, "But while we got knocked down, it's all about how we get back up. We were back running strong just days after the storm but admit that we need help from our inland neighbors to come out and shop local, shop small to help our coastal communities and fishing communities to rebound more quickly."

Hubbard's is just one of many fishing businesses in the Southeast that were impacted by these storms. While others are on their way to recovery like Hubbard's, many others are still struggling.


Key Impacts on Recreational Fishing in the Gulf

Safety Concerns and Storm Damage

Part of the widespread damage is moderate to severe damage to popular marinas, piers, and docks. Recreational fishermen use these to access waterways in the Gulf. Periods of intense weather also raise safety concerns with rough seas, heavy rainfall, and strong winds, making it dangerous for anglers and those with smaller vessels.

Shore-based anglers are finding that many key water access points have been damaged or temporarily closed. Many private recreational fishermen who

don't have access to boats/vessels rely on these access points to fish. Hurricanes can destroy or damage shoreline structures, docks, and piers commonly used by this group of anglers.

Environmental Damage

Hurricanes can disturb marine ecosystems and agitate longstanding habits held by certain fish populations and species. For example, increased sand, sediment, and nutrient runoff into the Gulf can impact

the health of crucial habitats for spawning and feeding fish.

In severe cases, entire waterways can become closed off, causing some species to temporarily move away from damaged areas. Often they return once waterways are able to stabilize again, but this has impacts on the frequency and amount of fish caught in certain areas.

Economic Impacts

Some recreational fishing charter companies have had to suspend operations or temporarily close due to storm damage. Tackle shops, boat rental companies, and bait suppliers can suffer financially due to a reduced amount of tourism to hurricane impacted areas. Many local economies in the Gulf rely on out-of-town visitors to stay open year-round.

Although the 2024 hurricane season has presented many challenges, there have also been notable moments where communities have united to support each other and assist in recovery efforts. The best way to help recovering businesses and communities is by continuing to fish.



Eight Steps to Figure Out What You Want, Really

Ask yourself what you want, really. Brainstorm what you want. "I want to double my current income."

Ask yourself, "What will that get you?" What will doubling your income get you? It will give me more freedom for family vacations. What will more family vacations get you? More vacations will give me more time with my family. What will more time with your family get you? More time with family will help me know what's going on with my kids beyond grades and activities. And what will

knowing what's going on with your kids more get you? It will get me more authentic, connected relationship with them so they know I really want to know them.

Follow the "What will that get you?" question to the deeper desires and values. Name your desires and values. What I want really is to have authentic, connected relationship with my kids and for them to know I really want to know them.

Clarify what you want, really. So, it's not really that I want to double my income (while that would be nice), what I really want is deeper, more connected relationships in my family.

Orient your priorities and choices toward what you really want. Try using reminders in your phone and post it notes for several weeks to remember your value/desire. How am I scheduling my time this week to prioritize more meaningful connection with my family? How are we considering family connection when we sign up for family activities? How am



I putting boundaries around my phone time to prioritize family connection? How am I showing up in conversations with my family this week? What will I choose to say no to so I can say yes to what I really want?

Determine how you will measure your progress at the end of 2025. How will you know if you have engaged in more authentic, connected relationships with your kids and shown that you really want to know them? I will know based on how much they share about their lives outside of grades/sport. I will know based on average face to face time spent talking or having fun together each week. I will know based on how affectionate we are or how

much we laugh together.

Celebrate progress or evaluate lack of progress. If you made progress in living toward what you want, enjoy and continue to lean into change. If you don't see the progress you were hoping for, identify the one thing that prevented progress the most. Distraction with work on my phone during family time was the one thing that prevented progress the most.

Determine the one thing you can commit to that will most likely move you toward what you really want. I will create a phone/email boundary from 5-9 so I can be more present with family in the

By Michael McManus LCSW "365 Thank Yous" by John Kralik is a heartfelt and inspir-




reasons to be thankful.

Self-Care Corner: A New Year of Benefitting Your Body

Improved lymph movement: Lymph is the milky-white fluid that drains waste from the cells. The pumping effect of muscle contraction moves lymph through the body, and massage (as well as exercise) can facilitate the process. The pressure of massage also increases blood flow that can help reduce swelling after surgery.

Increased circulation:
The manual pressure of massage increases blood flow to the treated areas. The increased blood flow brings more oxygen and nutrients to the muscles to help repair and revitalize the body.

Better skin: Massage helps the skin by stimulating the sebaceous and sweat glands. Increased blood flow also has a positive effect on the skin by supplying the cell with nutrients and oxygen. More blood at the skin's surface also leads to a rosy,

healthy glow.

Positive attitude: Massage has been shown to increase the body's protection of "feel-good" endorphins and the mood regulating hormone serotonin and decrease levels of the stress hormone cortisol.

Balance the nervous system: Stress revs up the nervous system, leading to restlessness, hyperactivity, anxiety, muscle tension, cardiovascular stress and even abdominal problems. Massage helps reduce stress and the body's reaction to it, bringing your nervous system back into harmony.

More perfect posture: Muscles that are too tight or too slack can throw off your posture. To compensate, your body will utilize other muscles, which can eventually become accepted by your body and lead to permanent imbalance and chronic muscle pain. Massage can loosen those areas and help bring them back into balance.

Just Breathe

Happy New Year. 2024 is over and I'm ready to take a few deep breaths...Looking ahead, I have renewed hope and new adventures awaiting me. This is the way I've chosen to walk in the weeks and months to come. Will you join me?

Breathing is life and our brain ensures we do it from birth to our last breath. The problem lies with how our breathing changes as we grow up. Symptoms of breathing incorrectly can be trouble catching one's breath, elevated heart rate, pain in the neck and shoulders, pain or weakness in the chest, labored breathing, involuntary breathing gasps, taking a sudden deep breath, overall weakness, dizziness and inability to speak.

We can also experience symptoms of obstructive sleep apnea (OSA) such as snoring, daytime sleepiness, waking up suddenly during the night, sometimes gasping or choking, dry mouth or sore throat, morning headache, difficulty concentrating during the day, mood changes, such as depression or irritability, high blood pressure and decreased libido.

There are 4 types of breathing patterns:

- **Eupnea:** This is our breathing pattern when we aren't thinking about it. It's also called quiet breathing.
- Diaphragmatic breathing or deep breathing: As



the diaphragm muscle contracts the breath passively leaves the lungs. • **Costal breathing:** Shallow breathing uses the muscles between ribs (intercostal mus-

cles). As they relax the air leave the lungs. This can happen when stressed or unconsciously holding our breath.

• **Hyperpnea:** Forced breathing happens when both the inhalation and exhalation are active rather than passive due to muscle contractions.

Proper breathing and deep breathing activates the vagus nerve (The boss of the parasympathetic nervous system.) which oversees things like mood, digestion, heart rate, etc. It also sends more oxygen to your brain and organs. Some of the benefits include lowering anxiety and

Insights for Investors: Strategies to Consider for 2025

Happy New Year to our readers! We hope that you can move closer to attaining your goals and realizing your dreams.

The new year brings resolutions, a new administration, a new congress and a lot of potential things that can impact investors in 2025. We thought it would be an innovative idea to get our readers thinking of some strategies that might help them become more tax efficient, work toward their objectives and help maximize the return on their savings and investments.

Let us start with tax advantaged type plans. First there is an IRA of course (it may or may not be tax deductible and it grows tax deferred). Next, do you have a workplace retire-

ment savings plan? If you do, are you maximizing the amount you can have deducted (thus reducing your taxable income) from your paycheck? There are so many updates and potential for investors that we cannot cover them all here. Check out the IRS.gov website and look at IRS notice 2024-80. In summary, contribution limits are higher and there is even a provision where those 60-63 years old can do an \$11,250 additional catchup contribution vs. the \$7500 catchup available to those over 50. The IRS max is \$23,500 and if over age 50, it could be \$31,000 in total. If age 60-63, that could be \$34,750. That could lower taxes in the current year and help build your retirement. Add to that that employers can make contributions to your 401k as well and the grand total for your and your employer for 2025 has moved up to \$70,000.

Then there is the Roth IRA. To qualify single tax filers would need make less than \$146,000 and joint filers less than \$230,000. That is because the ability to put in \$7,000 to \$8,000 to a Roth starts phasing out at those levels. The most important thing about a Roth? It grows tax free. So, while you may not get a tax deduction for

the contribution think about never having to pay taxes on withdrawals. Retirement savers with Traditional IRAs from years ago are now taking distributions and of course those are taxable income. Note, they have an option to start converting a part of their traditional IRA to a Roth each year, pay the tax now and let it grow tax free. Unlike a traditional IRA there is no required minimum distribution when you reach that point for traditional IRAs. For these reasons and others, we believe Roth IRAs (and now Roth 401ks) have grown increasingly popular for those who can save and invest for their retirement. There are other things that investors should explore about Roths: The Kiddie Roth which allows the starting of this taxfree vehicle for those under age 18. We have learned that time in the market has meant more than timing the market and the longer the time money has to grow, the greater the potential. Lastly, for those that might have 529 funds remaining, some portion might be able to direct to a Roth.

Note that this information is for education and thought and cannot be a substitute for tax advice. Please utilize professionals on tax advice when wanting

to potentially act on any of this. Also, working in conjunction with a financial or tax advisor might help you decide if one of these would be beneficial for vou to consider.

What about HSAs (health savings accounts)? Another vehicle to lower taxable income and have a benefit grow tax free (if used for medical expenses). First you need to be enrolled in a high deductible health insurance plan to qualify. If you do, individuals can contribute \$4,300 (add \$1,000 if over age 55) and a family can contribute \$8,550 (\$9,550 if over age 55). These contributions lower your taxable income as well. Many providers also offer investment options for your contributions giving those the opportunity for growth. In sum, HSAs offer tax deductible contributions, tax free growth and tax-free withdrawals for qualified medical expense. Any funds not used by age 65 can be withdrawn without penalty, but it does count as taxable income. You could also pay some Medicare premiums and Medicare advantage plans from the HSA.



Our super-heroes want to be clothed with power. Superman and Batman have their capes. The Hulk has his muscles and Wonder woman has her uniform. We use these figures to fantasize that we have a superpower. It's fiction with no foundation in reality.

Jesus wants to clothe us in

real power, Spirit-power.

The disciples had witnessed Christ's life by living with him and working alongside him. Day and night for over three years they observed both his miracles and listened to his teachings. The Lord is now commissioning them to tell the world about what they have learned. But they lack something important—power.

The same Spirit that empowered Mary to conceive Baby Jesus is now promised to us by the Father. The Holy Spirit raised Jesus from the dead and now pledged to us. Jesus told the disciples to wait in Jerusalem until they received this promise.

They waited in prayer for 10 days for the Spirit to come during the Holiday of Pente-

cost. And the Spirit came with power.

The King James Bible translated Luke 24:49 with the phrase "endued with power." But the modern phrasing catches the meaning better, "to be clothed with power," literally to sink into God's garment of power. The Sprit of God is real.

The Spirit was writing on his heart.

Fast forward roughly 25 years with my daughter Jessica, now a youth pastor in the Columbus, Ohio, area. She had taken a group of young people to a summer camp in the Midwest. There, a dynamic speaker ministered effectively to the teenagers present. The preacher was from the Boston area, and



he described how a camp director had once spoken into his life, leading him to a lifetime of ministry

Yep, that troubled teen from the camp in New Hampshire was now the dynamic minister in Ohio. God is great.

We don't need a superman cape to be a powerful Christian. If we wait and ask to be clothed with the Spirit, the Lord can use us in wonderful ways. The Holy Spirit still moves with power, confirming Christ's saving power.

Sean of the South: New Year

The misperception about New Year's is that it's supposed to be a happy occasion. Sort of like Christmas. Or a birthday party.

But it's not Christmas. New Year's represents the end of something. And goodbyes are not joyous.

New Year's is also a beginning. Beginnings are not entirely happy affairs, either. Beginnings are frightening. You have no idea what you're in for. Could be good. Could be bad.

This year your wife could win the lottery. And when you get home, she might scream, "We won the lottery, honey! Pack your bags!"

"What?" you might reply. "Should I pack for the beach or the mountains?"

"I don't care!" she might an-



swer. "Just pack your bags and get out of my house!"

Sometimes the worst news you can get is good news.

In many ways, last year was a rough one. Six of my close friends died. I was a pallbearer twice. That wasn't happy.

But last year was also a year I accumulated new friends.

It all started when I adopted a blind dog. Which I wrote about in this column. Which led to me getting invited to schools for the blind.

I spoke at the Helen Keller Art Show. There, I met Henrietta, who has blindness due to a mitochondrial disease. She has practically grown up in hospitals. One of the happiest people

I know. "I'm not fearless," Henrietta said. "I'm brave. There's a difference."

I learned how to use a white cane in the hallways of the Callahan School for the Deaf and Blind. Whereupon a little blind girl traced my face with her little hands and sang "You Are So Beautiful."

I visited Alabama Institute for

the Blind and Deaf, where a little boy felt my face, and said, "Will you hug me so I know what you feel like?"

I met a cheerful 17-year-old girl named Morgan. We were at the Service Dogs Alabama training facility.

Morgan has paralysis on the left side of her body, frequent seizures, diabetes. She has low vision, and is blind in one eye. Today, she is a freshman at UAB. Totally independent, thanks to Clarabelle, the black Lab who has saved her life on more than one occasion.

I'll never forget when Morgan squeezed my hand and said, "You have a choice to be happy or sad. And each moment you must consciously make that choice."

I inherited a blind goddaughter named Becca.

I met a kid named Owen, who came to one of my shows.

He underwent brain surgery that separates the left from the right hemisphere. He hugged me and said, "You're shorter than I thought."

I met a young woman who is blind, who was a national Braille reading champion. She held my hands and in a happy voice, said, "You're officially one of us now."

In only one year, I was sort of welcomed into the Blind and Deaf community. I have no idea how this happened. Or why.

And I don't know what it means.

But I know one thing. And this one thing was told to me by a young man who could not see, hear, or speak. Our conversation was translated by a tactile sign language interpreter.

He said to me, "When I first went blind, I told my mom that this is not the end, Mom. This is just the beginning of an adventure."

And I can't think of better words to begin the new year.

An Interview with Lyle Lovett

If you know much about music, then you likely know at least something about the talented Texan turned singer, songwriter, actor and producer, Lyle Lovett.

As if 14 albums, 25 singles to date, four Grammy Awards (including wins for Best Male Country Vocal Performance, and Best Country Album) were not enough to prove his creative genius, Lovett has also managed to snag over 40 acting credits in film and television, in addition to more than 30 vocal and scor-

In addition to all of his entertainment accolades, however, the multi-talented Lovett, who celebrated his 67th birthday in November while performing at the recent Moon Crush Cowboy Moon event, can also add to that impressive resume: Dad to seven-year-old twins.

In advance of his Moon Crush performances, I sat down to talk with Lyle about everything from fatherhood, music,



acting and his time playing along our beautiful beach communities:

Man, You're quite the work horse. You're playing two of three nights at Moon Crush in Miramar Beach, and then you head out for a UK tour where you are literally playing five nights in a row, from Glasgow to Dublin to Belfast then two dates in London. That has to be incredibly exhausting to play so many days in a row. Most artists I talk with just don't do that-or can't. How do you handle that with such a small amount of vocal rest?

You know, I don't really worry about doing shows multiple nights. My voice is not such an instrument that I have to take that kind of care of it. I mean, I sort of sound the way I sound no matter what [laughing].

Have you always done numerous back-to-back dates like that, across most of your touring career?

We have to, you know, just because of the size of our group. I mean, with the full band we had 32 people on the road this summer, so we really do have to work in five or six nights a week. And you know, I would rather be productive when I'm away from home than have a night off somewhere and do nothing. So that then when I am home, I get to really be home and spend time with my family.

There are plenty of artists that don't choose to do it that way, but one thing that I've found over the

years, to quote one of my mom's training axioms, when she was a training specialist at Exxon, "There are many, many correct ways to do something." I'm guessing having twins in first grade also makes being home as often as possible very important, right?

Absolutely it does. And I'm home far more than I'm gone. In fact, I've kind of kept track, and since they were born in 2017, I've only missed 12 days [at once] away from home, and that was just for logistical reasons. Many times, I even fly back home when I have one day off between shows. It's hard for me to go for more than a week without seeing them. So, most of the time, I'm able to get on an early flight out and be home even if it's just for the day, you know. But when I'm home, I'm really home and I get to take them to school in the morning.

You've stayed close to your roots having grown up just outside of Houston, and still calling that general area home. What made you stay there?

Yeah, I grew up in Klein [a rural Texas town near Houston]. My mom was a Klein and my great, great grandpa was the first Klein there. So, that's our place. We've got a real family connection to the area. And that's just one reason it's important to me. Ours is one of the last rural properties in the area and we're surrounded by subdivisions at this point.

In many ways that place has

been my life's work. To hang on to my grandpa's farm place, you know. Buying it back over the years after being sold out of the family back in the early 80's. And, you know, reassembling it.

I think it's safe to say that your music is most typically associated with the country genre. But, the truth is, your compositions are really amalgamations of everything from blues and jazz to folk and gospel. What does Lyle Lovett consider his music to be, and where did that influence come from?

I grew up in Houston, which was, as you know, one of the big media markets in the country. And I listened to pop music. I listened to country music. I listened to my parents' record collection, which had Glenn Miller records, Ray Price records, Ray Charles records and Nat King Cole records. So, to me, that was all just great music. My writing just reflects my taste, really.

What about the gospel element to some of your songs. What brought that

into the writing room?

I grew up in church, but I grew up in the Lutheran church. So, singing that kind of gospel music didn't really happen. But, I always liked that kind of gospel music. My dad was raised Baptist, and when we'd go visit his home church, I could hear the difference. They'd have a gospel quartet for music. I love church music and I've always been intrigued by different styles of music.

I've asked artists from the late great Jimmy Buffett to Kenny Chesney to Darius Rucker What the biggest changes have been over their musical career, that actually made a specific impact on how they do things. You've come up in some of that same time frame. What industry changes have impacted you the most?

Well, the changes I've seen are more from just observing and listening, but I don't feel like they do impact me, as much as they have some. But, you know, there's certainly more pop influence in country than ever before. I mean, the style of country—what's considered

country—has changed dramatically even since the 80's when my first record came out.

I've kind of always been into doing my own thing. I started out playing solo, or with one other person, doing my own songs. I mean, I've always played singer songwriter rooms and folk clubs. So, my approach to performing has always been more from that point of view. I really never was thinking about how I can write a hit like one that's on the radio right now, or what sort of styles I need to write. I was able to make up songs that appeal to me for personal reasons, rather than, you know, sort of trying to guess what the market might want at any given time.

What keeps you going? What is the driving force behind Lyle Lovett all these years later?

I just love being able to do what I get to do. It was very important to my parents that I went to college and got a degree, so I did. My parents both worked really hard and made decisions based on what they had to do. And, by doing that, they were able to afford me the ability to instead do something I wanted to do. I never ever want

to take that for granted, and, I believe I owe it to them and me to be the best I can at this. No matter how long I do it.

What would you be doing if you weren't writing and performing music or acting?

I have no idea, Will. [laugh-ng].

Then I guess it's a damn good thing that you're so good at what you do. [both laughing]

I saw you perform at 30A Songwriter's Festival and you've mentioned to me that was your first time along our Northwest Florida beach communities. What do you think of our area? Have you been able to hit the beaches and spend any time out taking in scenery that has drawn so many of your fellow artists, and Texans, to spend their vacations along our shores?

When I was there for the 30A Songwriter's Festival [2023], that was really the first time that I'd spent any time there, besides just driving through.

April, my wife, used to go to Destin every summer with her parents and she's really fond of the area. I mean it's beautiful, as you know. I'm excited that we get to be there for a few days this weekend. I grew up going to Galveston and Surfside [Texas beaches] where the beaches are quite different. Where the sand is kind of brown. So, it's a whole different deal. And I know it is quite the destination for lots of folks.

Any parting thoughts or perils of Texan wisdom you'd like to leave for our readers?

Get out and see the shows! Our shows with The Large Band [the actual name of Lovett's full band] are just incredible. I absolutely love what the people in my band bring to my songs and how they make my songs better and more musical. You know, I get to play music with some of my heroes. Legends in the business. I mean, we have Russ Kunkel playing drums. Leland Skylar playing bass and Jim Cox playing piano. James Herr along with Jeff White on guitar. That's quite the lineup, right? You know, to step on stage with them when those guys are trying their best to help me, that's a great feeling.





depression, managing stress and improving focus. We can also experience better sleep, faster recovery from exercise or exertion.

Our breathing begins to change around age 5 which is when we start sitting for longer periods of time. Injuries as

well as wearing waist bands, bra straps, compression garments and sucking in our gut also contributes to the change.

The role proper breathing has in our well-being includes regulating the nervous system and emotional well-being. It also enhances vitality by increasing the alpha and beta waves and boosts respiratory performance. Studies with athletes suggests that deep breathing following intense physical exercise can foster antioxidant response and protection from the effects of free radicals. This translates to improved levels of health and greater longevity. By the way, you don't have to be an athlete to experience these benefits.

Taking the time to learn how to breathe and practicing it daily can definitely offer health benefits. Proper breathing can aid in combating diseases such as cardiovascular by lowering blood pressure and heart rates, lowering stress (places the body back into the parasympathetic system), lessening anxiety and depression, aids the respiratory system with asthma and tuberculous and people who want to quit smoking. It also improves the sympathetic response when combined with diabetic treatment. Lastly cancer patients can improve fatigue, sleep and anxiety caused by treatment.

Stand up and take a deep breath. If your neck and shoulders moved, stop. Relax and take another deep breath relaxing your shoulders. Your breath should expand 360 degrees around your rib cage and back. You'll feel your ribs open as well as your back. Watch your pets breathe; nature is a great teacher.

Another great thing about breathing properly is that it can be done anywhere and at any time. So, no matter where you are, take a few minutes to just breathe.
