Special Event to Help Finance Facility for Adults with Autism

The Ground Up Project, an organization designed to find homes for adults who have autism, plans a unique event to raise funds to further that goal. And it promises to be a 'wacky" and "crazy" time.

"This is our inaugural marquee event," said spokesperson Lisa Pitell. "We're throwing a ball and we'll judge the wackiest, craziest outfit to christen the wacky, tacky king and queen."

The Ground Up Project has operated for a little more than two years. Its founders describe it as a "think tank" project.

"What about when the kids with autism are adults?"asked project board member Kendra Brownlee. She said Project members examined facilities for grownups with autism and "what we saw, we didn't like. There was nothing to hope

According to the groundupproject.org, only 7% of adults with autism have access to liv-



ing outside their family home, 48 percent of them report feeling lonely and no living situations are available in our area for individuals with special needs to live independent, fulfilled and happy lives.

Autism spectrum disorder (ASD) is a developmental disability caused by differences in the brain.

People with ASD often have problems with social communication and interaction, and restricted or repetitive behaviors or interests.

Common signs of autism in adults include finding it hard

to understand what others are thinking or feeling, getting very anxious about social situations, finding it hard to make friends or preferring to be on one's own, seeming blunt, rude or not interested in others without meaning to, finding it hard express feelings, taking things very literally – for example, not understanding sarcasm or phrases like "break a leg" and having the same routine every day and getting very anxious if it changes.

"Even when a child accomplishes something he didn't do in the past, it opens up new challenges," Project board member Eric Hambright told Life Media in 2023. If The Ground Up Project is successful in creating this facility," he said, "there will be plenty of demand."

The group's concept includes not only a standard facility with plenty of amenities and first-class care, but

Ten years ago in January, four swimming enthusiasts sat around a kitchen table in Fort Walton Beach brainstorming on how to bring community pools and competitive swimming opportunities back to the area. The last publicly accessible pools had shut down overnight in October of

a community of group homes and apartments, each suited to individual residents' needs and desires. According to the group's presentation to the commissioners, the facility will have a support staff onsite 24/7, along with security measures on multiple levels. Each residence will be centered around an activities center, furthering residents' bonds with the community, sense of belonging and opportunity to be socially active.

"To my knowledge, between Pensacola and Panama City, there's nothing like we're contemplating," says Lisa Pitell. "We're trying to establish a real community."

The goal is to establish a facility that will enable adults to live a little more freely," says Project board member Kendra Brown-

"We want to ensure people like us don't have to worry about people not doing what we planned to do," Hambright says.

The gala event is scheduled for Feb. 22 at 6 p.m. at the Hilton Sandestin Beach Resort. Ground Up hopes to see 150 individuals attending. Tickets for the event, which has been in the planning stages for about six months, Pitell said, are \$150 per person. All proceeds will go toward a residential facility for adults with autism.



A disc jockey will be on hand, as will a photo booth, entertainment and a silent auction. Also

provided will be heavy hors d'oeuvres.

"We're hoping to sell out,"

said Pitell. "This is our first year, so we don't have any kind of expectations."

The organizers hope to see outfits that are "the most outrageous or the silliest that we've ever seen," Pitell said. "Of course, it's not required that people dress up, but the goal is to get as many people participating as possible. Dress can be casual or formal. People can come with whatever level of dress they want."

Some VIP judges have already been set: The event's platinum sponsor, Life Media and another event sponsor.

2014, leaving swim teams, children, lap swimmers, and aqua-

cisers without places to learn or practice.

The foursome - Kathi and Gary Heapy and Pam and Bruce Braseth - were all deeply in-

volved in the swimming community, coaching numerous teams for children of all ages. The closures of the Emerald Coast YMCA in Fort Walton Beach

and the Destin Aquatic Center in Destin were a deep personal loss for them, as well as an immeasurable impact on the community.

Middle school swim season had been set to start in two weeks when the pool closed overnight in October. The sport was shifted to the spring, but even then, students were being bussed to the nearest indoor pool in Pensacola to compete.

The foursome decided something had to be done.

"We're not getting any support for the reopening of these pools and they are sitting there," Kathi said of the time leading up to that kitchen table session. "Vacant, empty, and deteriorating.

"At one point the city started talking about demolishing the facility (in FWB)," she added. "They were getting bids."

That night, they all agreed. It was time to form a nonprofit, Emerald Coast Fitness Foundation, to raise hundreds of thousands of dollars, and find ways to bring pools back to Okaloosa County.

The Fort Walton Beach pool now called the Bernie R. Le-Febvre Aquatic Center – was the first to reopen, thanks to cooperation from the City of Fort Walton Beach, the leadership of Liza Jackson Preparatory School, and a deep dive into serious fundraising. It opened less than a year later in December of 2015 and the renovated indoor pool serves thousands of swimmers each vear.

The Destin facility took a bit longer. The year after the Bernie was opened, the founders learned that the Mattie Kelly Arts Foundation was entertaining the possibility of leasing the two-pool facility to the Emerald

Championship Football Coach, Urban Meyer, To Inspire All

The All Sports Association will host its 56th Annual Awards Banquet on Friday, Feb. 21, 2025, from 5:30-10 p.m. at Northwest Florida State College. A key event for the association, the event honors outstanding athletes and people who have significantly contributed to youth sports in the area and nationally, recognizing excellence and character of worthy athletes in the categories of Professional, Amateur, Collegiate, Scholastic and Special Olympian.


Guest speaker, Urban Meyer, is one of the most successful and celebrated college football head coaches in recent history. Having coached 17 seasons as a head coach, Meyer is most well-known for his tenures at both the University of Florida and Ohio State University, where he earned three national championships (2008 and 2009–University of Florida; 2014 Ohio State University (OSU).

Though well-known for his football success, Meyer has been

a key figure in community initiatives through his involvement in charitable organizations. He and his wife, Shelley Meyer, co-founded the Urban and Shelley Meyer Fund for Cancer Research, which focuses on raising money to support cancer research at Ohio State University's Wexner Medical Center. Meyer also helped shape a culture of responsibility and personal growth for student-athletes by developing the "Real Life Wednesdays" program during his tenure at Ohio State University.

Through this initiative, student-athletes were given opportunities to intern, network and gain real-life experience in various industries, preparing them for life after football. Currently, Urban Meyer works as a college football studio analyst on the Big Noon Kickoff show on Fox Sports, and serves as a co-host The Triple Option podcast.

Kevin Bowyer, All Sports Association President, shared his



excitement about Meyer's involvement. "We are thrilled to have Urban Meyer as our guest speaker this year. His contributions to college football and his commitment to nurturing young talent make him a perfect fit for our event. Our goal is to inspire and celebrate those who excel in athletics, and having a figure like Coach Meyer aligns perfectly with that mission," Bowyer said.

Held every February, the An-

nual Awards Banquet celebrates top athletes from high school, college, amateur, professional and Special Olympic levels. It also acknowledges individuals who have made notable efforts in promoting youth activities. Several prestigious honors are awarded, including the Wuerffel Trophy, the Colonel Al Byrne Award and the Taylor Haugen Trophy.



What You Should Do Right After An Accident

It can be scary to be driving along one minute, and the next, either you've been run off the road, or spun out into the intersection, or even into a ditch. You or your passenger might even be injured, and need medical attention. Here is the short version of how to handle auto accidents so that you know you handled everything correctly and your stress level can come down.

Pull over safely to the side of the road and call 911. Calling for help is the first essential step in making sure that any injuries



are treated in a timely fashion, as well as making sure the police arrive to do a full accident report.

Take photos of the other

Take photos of the other vehicle(s) involved including the drivers, as the position of the vehicles, for your insurance company, so that there is photo evidence of all damage as well as an accurate representation of who was in which car, as well who was driving.

Make sure you have your license, registration and insurance information on hand. I recommend keeping a copy of your declarations page, your auto id cards and your registration in your glove box.

If your vehicle is not drive able after the accident, you have two choices. If you have AAA, you can have them pick up your vehicle and drop it off at your preferred auto repair shop. If you have towing on your auto policy, and the site of your accident is less than five miles away from your repair shop, you can potentially use the towing coverage on your policy for this accident.

If you are injured, go to the hospital to get checked out or your primary care physician, if your injuries are not serious. Personal Injury Protection in the state of Florida pays 80% of your \$10,000 coverage, minus the deductible. This includes

hospital bills, medical bills relating to your accident injuries, physical therapy, casts, crutches, etc. If you have medical payments on your policy as well, they will start where the Personal Injury Protection ends. If the at fault driver is not you, and they either have no bodily injury liability coverage, or not enough to cover your injuries, this is where uninsured/underinsured motorist coverage comes in. You insure for those times that you get hit, you're hurt, but the person who causes the accident does not have enough coverage to cover your medical expenses.

If you have not already called your insurance company to put in the claim, do so now, calling your agent and explaining to them what happened. Answer their questions and do not guess if you do not know the answer. Let them know that the police have been on the scene. Give them the case number the police give you and they will get the accident report when it becomes available. Write down the claim number and any other instructions the claims representative, and your agent give you for the accident.



Why is the Medicare Open Enrollment Period Important to You?

Now that the Medicare Annual Election Period (AEP) is over (ended December 7th), you can finally take a breather from all those ads, phone calls and mailers. As of January 1st, you

are now able to try out your new Medicare Advantage, Supplement and/or Prescription plan.

If you suddenly discover the plan you selected during the AEP is not right for you, all is not lost. You will get one more bite at the apple to make changes to your plan.

As with many situations, in order to have a good outcome, you first have to ask the right questions. In this case, the questions you should ask first are:

Did you sign up for a new Advantage Plan or a standalone Part D prescription drug plan during the last Annual Enrollment Period (AEP)?

Do you have an existing Advantage Plan or a stand-alone Part D prescription drug plan that renewed with a January 1st effective date?

If the answer to either of these questions is yes, then the Medicare Open Enrollment Period (OEP) is very important to

The OEP runs annually from January 1st to March 31st.

During this time, Advantage plan holders are given the option to make certain changes to the plan they selected in the AEP.

These allowed changes are:

- Cancel your stand-alone Part D prescription drug plan
- Drop your Medicare Advantage Plan and return to

Original Medicare (A & B only)

- Enroll in stand-alone Medicare Part D prescription drug plan
- Elect to change from one Medicare Advantage Plan to another

Let's a look at each option a bit deeper. First, why would someone elect to cancel their stand-alone

Part D prescription plan? The only reason one could have would be it was being replaced by other qualifying coverage. If you cancel without replacing, penalties will accrue and be waiting for you when you do put this coverage back in place at a later date. Plus, those penalties will be with you for life!

Second, there are a few rare circumstances when it makes sense for someone to cancel an Advantage plan and return to Original Medicare known as Part A and Part B. Usually, this may have something to do with provider networks which are insufficient for the beneficiary or some other unusual event. Again, this rare circumstance would require you to also remain in or enroll in a stand-alone Part D prescription drug plan in order to avoid accruing the future



penalties I just mentioned.

Again, enrolling in a standalone Part D prescription drug plan is a requirement if you do not have qualifying coverage elsewhere and want to avoid those penalties. If you neglected to get that done during the AEP, now is the time to look at this.

Last, some folks have a change of heart once they see the detailed materials of the Advantage plan they enrolled in during the AEP. Perhaps you find your HMO plan does not have the providers you need, but a PPO plan does. Or, perhaps the terms of coverage are better in a plan different from your current plan. Maybe another plan costs less (or even \$0!).

You don't need any reason to switch plans provided you do so before the OEP expires on March 31st. Just remember, you only get one chance to make this change. Once you do, you will have to keep that plan until the next AEP, which begins on October 15th of every year.

The best options for your particular situation should be thoroughly discussed with your insurance agent/broker to make sure you have all the facts about the choices you might be thinking about, and get all your questions answered.

This time, the Mayor and I sat down to share the latest on the underground utilities conversion project. We appreciate everyone's patience with the stretch of Hwy. 98 being worked on presently!

TY: Our underground utilities project kicked off in November. This will not only be terrific for resiliency in storms, but also aesthetically it's much more pleasing without extra overhead wires. What all area encompasses Phase 1, which is the current work being done?

98 in our Harbor District and Town Center area, stretching from the Marler Bridge to Airport Road. We prioritized this section because of its critical role during hurricanes. Undergrounding here helps first responders and utility crews work more efficiently, facing fewer roadblocks and safety hazards.



"Grounded"

This means residents can regain access faster and begin recovery. As we've seen from other Florida communities this hurricane season, every day counts for recovery.

TY: The contractor said the biggest challenge, like other underground conversion projects, has been site layout and locating existing infrastructure. They did a great job limiting impacts on the sidewalks, working in short, intermittent sections. They even had sections temporarily stabilized with compacted millings so that they could be utilized by pedestrians during our City's Christmas parade. Have you been pleased with the work so far?

BW: I've been very pleased with the contractor's hands-on approach. My expectations are high, especially after how long it took the state to expand HWY 98 on the east side of town. Unlike that five-year ordeal, we're planning to finish this project in just 18 months, with minimal impact on traffic and businesses. So far, they're doing an excellent job meeting those expectations as they were able to under-



ground 1,800 linear feet in the first week!

TY: Phase 1 is expected to take about 18 months total. What are your thoughts in getting Phase 2 a reality and where would it encompass?

BW: My goal is to finish Phase 1 during my first term and begin undergrounding all of West Destin. This is the logical next step after Hwy. 98 and aligns with making Destin a model for storm resiliency

and beautification across Florida. Of course, this depends on budget and grant opportunities. I plan to advocate in Tallahassee for state matching funds and build partnerships with regional stakeholders to secure the necessary resources. We can't keep rebuilding the grid the same way after every storm. For example, Florida Power & Light (FPL) is requesting a \$1 billion hurricane damage bailout this season alone. Instead, those funds



could help coastal communities like ours invest in infrastructure that's built for the future, reducing costs and risks long-term.

TY: Some people are getting FPL work being conducted, for instance around Fudpucker's, confused with our City's undergrounding project. We've shared that those particular new poles near the restaurant are part of the FPL transmission line improvements, and that those are never undergrounded as the cost is excessive. Anything to add to help with clarification of the different projects?

BW: It's definitely a bit confusing to see both projects happening at the same time. The reality is that burying high-voltage transmission lines requires extensive trenching, which increases costs by up to five times. That's why these lines remain above ground. FPL is covering the cost of their improvements while the city funds the undergrounding project. The upside is that the new poles and additional lines provide redundancy, helping keep the power even if one line fails.

Throw Pillows 101: The Do's and Don'ts

Throw pillows are everything! Okay, I'll admit it... throw pillows are not an essential item in our homes. Some even say they're not necessary; but I beg to differ. Throw pillows can absolutely help change

the look of a room. They can add texture, color, prints and patterns to your space and even take attention away from that piece of furniture that you're not ready to replace yet. Throw pillows are front and center in most spaces and here's a few tips on how you can make sure your pillows don't fall flat.

DO: Buy pillow covers or fabric that will add color, texture, print, plaid or patterns to your sofa. This allows you to add personality to your space that's uniquely yours.

DON'T: Refrain from using the pillows that came with your couch on the couch. They're too matchy-matchy and don't usually add much personality. However, you can use those pillows on a chair (since most chairs are in a different fabric than the sofa) to create a cohesive look. You can also use a pillow cover to create a new look in another

DO: Invest in good pillow inserts such as a 50/50 blend of feathers and down. But, if you've got allergies or prefer not to have anything from an animal, I highly recommend a down alternative fill.

DON'T: Whatever you do, don't by foam inserts. They tend to go flat and become shapeless. This ends up making your throw pillows look cheap.



DO: For that overstuffed look, always buy an insert that is 2-4 inches larger than the cover. For example, if you have a 20x20 pillow, purchase a 22x22or 24x24 insert.

DON'T: Avoid keeping the insert that came with the pillow your purchased. They're never full enough and are almost always too flat, unless you've purchased a high-end pillow. Those are typically sold with the upgraded inserts.

DO: Buy pillow covers that have full sized zippers. This will allow you to accommodate the larger sized inserts and it will also allow you to easily change your pillow covers and reuse the inserts.

DON'T: Try not to flatten your inserts once you've fluffed them. You don't want them to lose the shape or get lumpy when it's time to use them again.

DO: Go big! Bigger is better when it comes to throw pillows. In fact, 20x20 is as small as you should go on a sofa. To achieve a designer look, try mixing the sizes of your pillows. A great combination of pillows is 22x22, 20x20 and a 10x20 on one side of your sofa and a 20x20 and 18x18 on the

other side. Mixing fabrics, textures and prints, stripes, etc., is

DON'T: Try not to use a bunch of small pillows on your sofa. It looks messy, lacks in visual interest and has that off-theshelf look





A New Chapter in Manatee Care:

The Gulfarium Welcomes Lil Joe and Inigo

In a profound stride toward protecting one of Florida's most beloved marine creatures, the Gulfarium proudly announces the arrival of two rescued manatees—Lil Joe and Inigo—to its newly renovated manatee habitat. This milestone is the culmination of a three-year vision that began in 2022, when Patrick Berry, CEO of the Gul-

farium, first spoke with the U.S. Fish & Wildlife Service about creating a haven dedicated to nurturing manatees in need of long-term care.

Originally a 300,000-gallon dolphin habitat, the space, now named Manatee Cove, has been meticulously transformed to meet the specialized needs of rescued manatees. Improved

viewing windows invite guests into the gentle underwater world of these animals, while enhanced Life Support Systems (LSS), a dedicated medical area, and intentionally designed resting ledges ensure that Lil Joe, Inigo, and future manatee residents receive the focused attention they need to thrive.

Yet this undertaking is about far more than a physical renovation—it is a testament to the Gulfarium's dedication to giving manatees a second chance at life. With so many of these gentle giants, a federally threatened species, facing threats in the wild, it became clear that an expanded facility was necessary to help manatees beyond their initial critical care stages.

By joining forces with the Manatee Rescue and Rehabilitation Partnership (MRP), U.S. Fish & Wildlife Service (USF-WS), and the Florida Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission (FWC), the Gulfarium is now the first facility in the Florida Panhandle to provide housing for rescued manatees requiring extended care. This vital collaboration relieves pressure on central Florida's critical-care facilities, allowing them





to focus on more urgent cases and strengthening statewide efforts to save manatees from harm. Additionally, the Gulfarium plans to further develop its manatee program by expanding to provide critical care for manatees in need within the northern Gulf Coast region.

Lil Joe and Inigo, who previously called The Seas with Nemo & Friends their home, will serve as living ambassadors for their species-sharing a message of resilience and hope with everyone who comes to see them. Visitors will discover their stories in a newly created education area, where daily chats and additional educational programming with the Gulfarium's team shine a light on the challenges manatees face in the wild and how each of us can play a role in their protection.

"The Gulfarium is honored to welcome Lil Joe and Inigo, two extraordinary manatees who will help illuminate the urgent conservation needs of their species," said Patrick Berry. "Our vision has always been to create a caring environment where manatees can continue their healing journeys while inspiring our guests to connect more deeply with marine life. By taking on the long-term care of

these animals, we enable facilities in central Florida and elsewhere to devote critical resources to those manatees in acute need. We're proud to stand with our partners in the MRP to protect these vulnerable creatures."

Central to the Gulfarium's mission is public engagement. In addition to providing top-tier animal care, the new manatee habitat fosters a deeper understanding of manatees' plight. Through interactive programs, visitors can learn about Florida's marine ecosystems, ongoing rescue efforts, and the simple steps we can all take to protect wildlife.

This vision aligns seamlessly with the Gulfarium's accreditations by the Alliance of Marine Mammal Parks & Aquariums (AMMPA) and the International Marine Animal Trainers' Association (IMATA), underscoring an unwavering commitment to the highest standards of animal care, conservation, and public education. By welcoming Lil Joe and Inigo, the Gulfarium demonstrates the power of compassion, collaboration, and community engagement in safeguarding Florida's remarkable marine life.

For those eager to learn more about manatees and experience the wonder of these gentle giants firsthand, Lil Joe and Inigo can be viewed as part of general admission to the Gulfarium. Guests are encouraged to explore Manatee Cove, attend daily educational chats, and discover how their own actions can make a positive impact on manatee conservation efforts.

Coast Wildlife Refuge for rehabilitating marine life.

There were many obstacles, including the fact that the City of Destin and the Mattie Kelly Arts Foundation had both invested in the YMCA's Destin facility and lawsuits were pending. In late 2016, after those matters were settled in bankruptcy court, Pam and Kathi forged on to convince the MKA and the city to support their efforts to bring a pool back to Destin.

In January, 2017, an agreement was signed and once again crews of volunteers got to work.

"It was all those ugly colors," Pam recalled. "It looked like it belonged in a circus. We wanted it to be a place that people felt comfortable coming to and happy when they got there."

Eight months later, the Destin facility – now known as the Taj Renee Community Aquatic Center – opened.

Facility Manager Jackie White, who volunteered 20 hours a week during the rehabilitation phase, remembers the day well.

"It was Aug. 15, 2017, at 2:15 p.m.," White said. "I made a note to always mark that day in my head."

Today, the Taj serves as a hub for competitive swimming, hosting 20 meets a year for high school and middle school teams, as well as summer league and year-round teams like Coast Aquatics. Collegiate teams from across the southeast train there over winter break and the Panhandle Pirates Water Polo Club





practices there twice a week. Lap swim and deep water aquacise are offered year-round.

From October through April, the eight-lane competition pool, which is heated during the winter and chilled during the summer, is the center of activity. A family pool opens late in the spring for aquacise, swim lessons, pool parties and family play time, closing each season with the Des-



tin Doggie Swim Day.

"People who didn't know Pam and me when we started this whole process thought we were crazy," Kathi said. "The people that knew us, and they knew us because we had coached their kids, they believed we could do it. "And we did it."



Staying Healthy This Cold & Flu Season:

A Q&A with Dr. Karen DeVore

As the seasons change and the air gets crisp, so does the likelihood of sniffles, sore throats and seasonal viruses. What is your favorite way to naturally support kids and teens?

Dr. Karen: Although noth-

ing takes the place of sunshine, a balanced and low sugar diet, exercise, and limited screen use, a great liquid multivitamin with methylated B vitamins and minerals is a great way to get good nutrients into sensitive pallets. Have you ever done something kind for someone you value to then feel like it went largely unnoticed? Do you feel frustrated when you spend time and energy investing in a relationship to feel like the other person doesn't really see or appreciate your investment? Doing thoughtful things for your loved ones matters. However, the human instinct, most often, is to do for others what you would like someone to do for you. And, while that approach works sometimes, often the other person in the relationship feels most loved and seen in ways that might be different than what helps you feel loved and seen.

Maybe you are spending energy cleaning your child's room and packing time consuming lunches when what really makes your child feel seen and loved is playing a game with you. Maybe you are spending energy buying something for your partner when

what really makes them feel seen or loved is time and meaningful conversation. Maybe you are spending energy planning a party for a friend when what makes them feel most loved is spontaneous lunch with you.

Investing energy in relationships unintentionally can create frustration, confusion and disconnection over time as both parties can end up feeling unseen. So, how do you figure out how to invest energy in your relationships strategically so your effort is landing in a way that feels meaningful to the other person? And, how do you learn to communicate your needs clearly to others, so they can invest energy strategically in their relationship with you?

Seven Ways to Invest Relationship Energy Strategically

1 - Let go of mind reading. Mind reading is a myth. Culture has sold you a false idea that mind reading equals love. No one can read your mind and you can't read theirs. And, that's perfectly okay. Let go of expecting yourself or others to read minds when it comes to what makes you or them feel seen and loved.

2 - Reflect on what makes you feel seen and loved.



Notice what makes you feel valued, connected, deeply seen and known. Do you feel most seen with side by side time together, meaningful conversation, acts of service, physical touch, encouraging words, gifts, surprises? Notice that what makes you feel seen works for you but is not necessarily the same for others.

- **3 Ask the other person** what makes them feel seen and loved. Be curious and take notes. Remember, your way of feeling seen is not the right way, it's just your way. Let the other person have space to need and want what feels best and most connecting to them in the relationship.
- 4 Make adjustments in your approach. Make consistent and meaningful efforts to spend more energy on what helps the other person feel seen and loved and less energy on things that do not matter as much to them.
- **5 Tell people what you need.** Communicate clearly what helps you feel seen and

connected in your relationships. Remember that communicating what you want and need does not take away from the value when the other person gives you what you're asking for. Being clear about your needs makes you more likely to get what you need and to feel connected in your relationships. Instead of hoping someone reads your mind about wanting a nice dinner for your birthday, tell them a nice dinner would make you feel loved.

6 - Give and notice positive feedback. When your friend does something that felt meaningful, tell them directly what it meant to you. When your family member tells you the fo-

cused time you spent with them was meaningful, take mental note and prioritize spending focused time with them.

7 - Initiate check in conversations periodically. Try directly discussing connection in your relationships. Ask the other person how it's going for them? Don't judge their response. Share your connection needs.





How's Your Vagus Nerve?

This very crucial nerve (the 10th of 12 cranial nerves) winds its way from the brain down the spinal column to the heart, lungs, liver, stomach, spleen and GI tract. As part of the parasympathetic system (rest and digest) its role is to transmit signals from the brain to the body. This nerve plays a role in our heart rate, immune system, mood, mucus and saliva production, skin and muscle sensations, speech, taste and more.

When the vagus nerve is not functioning properly, one can experience symptoms such as heart rate irregularities like bradycardia (slow beat), palpitations or an irregular heartbeat. Our mood and wellbeing can change due to a change in the neurotransmitter levels and stress responses. These heightened stress levels and/or mood swings can be experienced with no apparent cause.

Managing daily stress is a huge part in our optimal health. Because stress stems from the sympathetic system (fight or flight), it is important to have a strong vagus nerve which tells the sympathetic system that everything is ok and we can relax. This happens by stimulating the vagus nerve.

There are many different ways we can do this, and if you meditate, exercise, sing or gargle, you are on the right track. Other things we can do to

- Tapping EFT (emotional freedom technique)
- Singing slower songs are better
- Gargle 30 to 60 seconds. This causes vibration in the throat which stimulates the nerve.

There are plenty of videos online with stretches and other exercises. There are also machines that can stimulate the nerve. My vote is to incorporate a few of the options into my daily routines. The one thing I didn't mention that can stimulate the

nerve is a cold face plunge. So, if you're a cold plunger go for it. I'll keep my face warm and happy as I make a joyful noise in song.












Insights for Investors: Some Things to Watch for 2025

Leading off our list would be interest rates. We watch, daily, the yield on the 10-year U.S. Treasury Note (USTN). That is a leading indicator for the stock and bond markets. It also is a leading indicator for mortgage rates as well. It is important to be aware of how changes in the rate can impact stocks. A rising vield means a declining price for bonds (and investors are selling bonds and buying stocks). A declining yield might mean Treasury prices are going up and there is more demand for those, and investors are moving assets from stocks to bonds.

When we refer to investors, we are pointing more toward professional investors vs. indicators, professional investors account for almost 80% of the daily volume in the stock market What or who are professional investors? Those could be hedge funds, mutual funds, private equity funds, trading firms, pension funds as well as others. Professional investors are less likely to be buy and hold vs. individual investors, because they rely on shorter term profits or returns for performance (in our

The question on everyone's mind is will rates on the 10 year remain the same, head higher or go lower? A few things impact that, the first of which is inflation. While inflation has come down, it remains to be seen if it will continue to decline, head back up or remain the same.

Next would be the **borrow**ing demand of the U.S. Treasury. That is from the issuance of new debt as well as the refinancing of maturing debt.

Lastly is the **strength of the U.S. dollar.** At this writing, it is up in value almost 4% over the past 12 months. Many would think the dollar is too high citing the fact that a too strong dollars makes U.S. exports costlier over-

Next, we look at valuations. individual investors. By some In other words, the prices for



stocks and bonds and if they are becoming over-valued, undervalued or fairly valued. We would agree the overall stock market (after two straight years of 20% returns) has grown rapidly and is overvalued. What follows would mean earnings would have to up or prices would have to come down. We do also share the concern that a majority of the returns have been from just 10-20 stocks.

Bonds, on the other hand, might be seen as cheap. The risk with bonds is if they move down from where you bought them and you feel like it is a losing proposition. A few things about bonds: 1) You know what you will have and when you will have it. 2) You can sell them at any time (subject to market movement) and they help reduce risk in your overall portfolio. We have heard and read that Warren Buffet, the famous U.S. investor, prefers stocks over bonds, because of the greater potential over time. But we have also learned that he does include short-term bonds in his holdings, but also that he currently has built a lot into cash or money markets. Money markets continue to offer a compelling yield and do not come with the same risk as bonds-after having said we believe bonds can be used to diversify portfolios. The same can be said for tax-free bonds which have experienced lower prices and hence higher yields.

Gold, silver and other precious U.S. metals, we feel, should play a part in a longterm, diversified portfolio. We also believe that a small percentage of commodities in a portfolio can be beneficial. Also take note that precious U.S. metals, gold and silver and others have seen significant rises in price over the past 12 months. Many wonder what might be driving that, particularly with the U.S. dollar so high. We think it is a lot of foreign buying that has driven those prices. By the way, foreign investment in the U.S. stock market has grown significantly over the past decade. The strong dollar has helped to fuel that. We do take note that if the dollar were to eventually begin to decline that investments in foreign markets might see stronger returns.

And then there is **crypto.** That is a difficult one to address as many investors do not want to overlook what might be an emerging choice for them to allocate their assets. Raymond James has continued to decline to offer trading in these types of assets and we take note of that with a cautionary tone. We agree that it has added elements of risks, among them, as Raymond James points out, lack of regulation. There are some known and some unknown risks and we do not encourage investors to consider investing in crypto assets at this time.

There is much more for savers and investors to consider when it comes to investing and saving. Investment objective, time frame and risk tolerance cannot be overstated in their importance when making investment decisions.

because he just won't stay down. Since the Holy Spirit raised Christ from the dead, it prompts several questions for me.



Funerals are not an attractive look for the title of a story. But we see Jesus assaulted at every turn in Luke. The religious community is at the point of attack, stabbing at Jesus as he marches toward Jerusalem.

The place was tiny, and about as ugly as homemade soap. The tenant before us had painted the walls black and greenish-gray. Sherwin Williams officially titled this color "Seasick Granite®."

When we moved in, we made the place our own. We painted the walls brown and khaki. We bought a used coffee table and some scented candles.

My friend, Chubbs, found an old console television on the side of the road. I was lucky enough

She told me all her stories. I told her mine. You can do a lot of soul-searching over crullers.

My professional life was non-existent, I took whatever jobs I could get. I spent days crawling rooflines, swinging a hammer, or operating a commercial lawn mower. She worked as a preschool teacher at



church, or in a kitchen.

For extra income, I played piano at a Baptist church on Sundays, Sunday nights, Wednesday nights, Thursday night choir practices, and Saturday night prayer meetings.

We learned things about each other. We learned important things.

We learned how to argue in the middle of a Winn-Dixie, and how to attend two Thanksgivings in one day. How to share a sunset, seated on the hood of a truck. How to read in bed with a flimsy battery-powered book light.

We learned how to hold each other when loved ones die. We learned how to sit together—me reading a magazine, her playing a crossword puzzle.

We learned how to wring our hands in hospital waiting rooms. We learned how bury dogs with a shovel and a burial sheet.

We learned how to make a life together.

A lot has changed since those days, but I still wake early in the mornings to write. I don't use a legal pad anymore, I use a laptop.

This morning, however, I did not write. Instead, I sifted through our storage closet. I

found things. An old coffee-tin sewing kit, some scented candles, love poems, and the picture of a young man and his new wife in their first apartment.

In the picture, the place had ugly gray walls, but that's the only ugly thing about this photo.

He's holding her. She's holding him. They are young. Their skin is smooth. I wish I could tell you how much I love these two people in the picture.

I wish you could see their faces, and their punchdrunk smiles. You can tell they belong together by looking at them. You simply know that their names should never be said apart.

It's as though nothing bad in this life can ever touch them. As though the two of them, in thought, and deed, and breath, and heart, shall never be lacerated apart.

I suppose that word is growing on me.

Victimology: Part 2 of a Series on Homicide Investigations

Murder is an intentional act often as the result of extreme emotions such as anger, hatred. revenge, jealousy or even love. Or, it could be due to a desire to conceal a different crime (self-preservation) or to gain something (greed). A relationship between the murderer and the victim - however slight -

somehow causes this fatal interaction.

I recently watched a true crime show in which the victim was initially described as having no enemies. Yet, he was brutally murdered in his store and the safe was open. I wondered if my premise of extreme emotions was incorrect. As the investigators looked further, his best friend became a suspect. The friend later confessed that he was jealous of the victim's successes and was angry that his friend refused to give him a loan to pay his gambling debts. It was only after the investigators dug into the victim's background and social circle that they came upon the "best friend" and his troubles.

The investigator must understand not only the victim's biographical information, such as name, age, gender, health status, living conditions prior to death and identification of immediate family members, but a deeper examination of every aspect of their lives prior to death. Victimology is the term used in the law enforcement community.

By determining the victim's acquaintances, their last known location and the reasons for their presence there, an investigator can effectively narrow down the suspect pool to individuals who were with the victim shortly before their death. Witnesses who observe prior events can further corroborate a suspect's culpabil-

Victimology is composed of three major categories: background information, a timeline of the last known locations of the victim and risk assessment. Background information can include understanding the personality of the victim, lifestyle, routines and daily habits, employment, health habits and economic status. It also includes the victims' family, friends, acquaintances and any people interacting with the victim - both casually and more deeply. A timeline is then established in-

NOT CROSS CRIME SCENE DO NOT CROSS CRIMESCENE dicating where the victim was, when and why they were there. This is cross checked with anyone in the suspect pool to see if there are any unusual gaps or unexplained connecting points. Finally, an investigator must assess the level of risk-taking the victim engages in. A victim who routinely engages in risky behavior or interacts with violent or questionable people is at a higher risk and, consequently, has a larger pool of suspects. On the contrary, a victim who is risk adverse and constantly moves away from risky situations has a much smaller pool of suspects to investigate.

The well-known disappearance and murder of Laci Peterson by her husband, Scott Peterson (December 24, 2002), is a classic example of a low-risk victim. Laci, 8 months pregnant, stayed home most of the time and took care to protect her health and the baby. Investigators quickly looked at her husband as a prime suspect. By contrast, a high-risk victim could be a street prostitute, a drug user or a gang member. They are at risk from a multitude of people simply because of life choices. But, their murder still matters and deserves to be solved. The victim cannot speak on their own behalf, but it doesn't mean they can't help the investigation. Their lives matter, and victimology is a meaningful step.





- 5. The City's Department of Public Works provides maintenance on all publicly-owned streets, storm sewer infrastructure, grounds, facilities and pub-

We did pass a financial ordinance to repave every road in Destin in the coming years. what we have here. Most cities are full of potholes and other vehicle-damaging issues. Roads around here are fantastic.


