

In my two decades of covering festivals and writing feature cover story interviews on well knowns from Alan Jackson and Brian Kelley to Kenney Chesney, Darius Rucker, and the late great Jimmy Buffett, I've often said that to sing is one thing, but to write and breathe lyrical life into a song is quite another. Remarkably, the Destin Songwriter Festival offer attendees the opportunity to experience both. Answering the Call with **Emerald Coast United**

The past year for Justine and Joey Sauvageau has been one of both heartache and reward. They started their nonprofit, Emerald Coast United, last year to assist with search and rescue, and disaster relief efforts along the Panhandle and in nearby states. While they've been a blessing to many, the organization was created out of personal loss.

Their close friend and diver, Jeremy Carmical, went missing September 22, 2024, while spearfishing

mainstage, and feature acts, just up the hill at 314 Harbor Blvd. These waterfront stages include popular Destin venues like Boat House, Sky Bar at Edge Seafood and Harbor Tavern. All of the shows in those venues will be free to attend, while the mainstage will be a ticketed, patrons-only area."

The festival's Main Stage at 314 Harbor Blvd. is where the weekend crescendos, with both general admission and VIP tickets available. Here fans will get up close with a premium production setup complete with drink and food vendors, along with world-class performances by such renowned writers and performers such as James Otto, Kent Blazy, and Andy Griggs.


Pennings, also reminded me





in Destin. With Hurricane Helene closing in on the Gulf, and Destin still in the range of impact zones, every minute in the search counted. Once Justine and Joey found out Jeremy was missing, they were able to assist in organizing search and rescue efforts. A collective group rallied approximately 45 boats together over the span of the two-day search and they became points of contact for the United Cajun Navv.

Volunteers were able to recover Jeremy two days later, just before Hurricane Helene made landfall in the Big Bend area, east of Destin. Although it wasn't the outcome they hoped for, Justine and Joey felt peace knowing they could help bring closure to Jeremy's family. "The community supported us in ways I never thought possible," said Justine. "I'm extremely thankful."

After assisting in the rescue efforts for Jeremy, and working closely with Justine and Joey, the United Cajun Navy urged them to start their own nonprofit to assist in future efforts along the panhandle. Jeremy's mother, Michelle Carmical, also encouraged them to follow their calling to help others.

TY: It's a good day when the Mayor and I can meet up to discuss sea turtles! The Destin-Fort Walton Beach Sea Turtle Patrol regularly evaluates nests, and this season we are excited to say that we have 15 nests in Destin. The critical piece is those nests developing and emerging into thousands of tiny little hatchlings and ultimately making it to the Gulf and living long lives. That trek to the water is perilous, though, and that's where we're seeing some problems lately. More hatchlings are crawling toward buildings and roads because artificial light is brighter than the beach. What can residents and visitors do right now to help?

"Reel Talk" from the City of Destin

Lights Out for Our Sea Turtle Hatchlings

BW: The good news is that simple habits save hatchlings. Keep the beach dark after sunset. Turn the balcony and porch lights off. Close curtains on gulf-facing windows. Fill in holes and flatten sand before you leave. Give space to the patrol and early morning crews.

TY: FWC Sea Turtle Management reached out to us this season about disorientation reports. A report might include two or more dead hatchlings found, or live hatchlings found out of habitat, like a road, a parking garage, or even a pool. The reports also estimate which properties may be contributing so we can educate owners. People can also share problem spots with us so we can follow up.

BW: It's been heartbreaking to see the many pictures of these sad situations. But the good news is that we can make significant strides to fix this through knowledge and dedication from our city and community.

TY: We still have red light



friendly flashlights at City Hall to give out, up to two per household for both residents and visitors. But we also need beach property owners to use sea turtle compliant fixtures and bulbs. Porch lights are a big driver of disorientation.

BW: If you own or manage a place by the beach, or help run an HOA or hotel, you can swap bright white bulbs for amber,


add shields and aim lights down and away from the beach, put lights on timers or motion sensors, and close curtains or add tint on gulf-facing windows at night. Take a quick evening walk with your team to spot problem lights, share information with residents and staff, and please get your free red flashlights at City Hall.

TY: Many local governments

use beachfront lighting ordinances to address this impact. Not that I want more rules, but is that worth exploring for Destin?

BW: Yes, and we will keep it education first. Let's start with a voluntary Lights Out Destin push and targeted outreach using FWC data, then bring a simple, fair code update for new construction and major renovations so turtle-friendly lighting is the default from day one. If we all do the basics now, most disorientations go away, and future projects will be built right from the start.

Call to action: Keep beaches dark and clear, use red light and report injured or disoriented hatchlings to 850-243-9046 or 1-888-404-3922. Owners, managers, HOAs and hotels, email tyoung@cityofdestin.com if you want a quick evening walkthrough or access to more resources. Let's light the way to the water, not the road.







Tequila Lesson 101

You have probably noticed that whiskey bottles often list the actual age of the whiskey. Unlike whiskey (and some other spirits), tequila doesn't list the year on its bottles. Instead, you'll see terms such as **Blanco**, **Reposado**, **Añejo**, **Extra Añejo**, **Cristalino** and more.

Blanco (also known as silver) is often unaged and bottled directly after distillation; but it can be aged in wood for as long as 30 days and stainless steel for up to two months.

Reposado is the next level. It can mature as long as a full year. This tequila is versatile and a top choice for premium margaritas.


Next is añejo. When it comes to sipping tequilas, añejo is the sweet spot. This is the tequila variety for fans of bourbon and single malt Scotch whisky. It's complex, nuanced and perfect for sipping neat or on the rocks. añejo tequila is defined by being aged for one to three years. It



gets its name from the Spanish word for "old."

Extra añejo is aged for a minimum of three years, making it the smoothest and most refined type of tequila. Cristalino is a newer style of tequila, made by filtering aged tequila to remove color and impurities.

Tequila is usually aged in barrels made of oak. While there are other barrels used, they are most often American or French oak. Additionally, a number



In general, tequila aged in bourbon barrels will have flavors and aromas such as charred oak, sticky toffee, toasted va-

nilla beans, pipe tobacco, roasted agave, honey, cinnamon, cracked black pepper, dried fruits, caramelized sugar and more.

Añejo may be the most versatile tequila. Aged for at least one year, and sometimes longer, this tequila is appropriate for drinking neat, over ice, or with water. At the same time, if you buy a reasonably-priced bottle of añejo tequila, you'll still feel comfortable mixing with it. If you're a tequila drinker, you can elevate your favorite whiskey-based cocktails by swapping out bourbon, blended Scotch whisky and other types of whiskey with añejo tequila. You can also use añejo tequila as the base for classic tequila-driven drinks like the Paloma or Margarita to add depth and flavor.

You can step up your cocktail by using extra añejo Try a classic Old Fashioned with extra añejo tequila instead of the usual rye or bourbon for a unique, roasted agave take. The same goes with the Manhattan.

Whiskey drinkers who would like to branch out into tequila, añejo is the right choice for you. You should stock up on a bottle or two for sipping neat or on the rocks. As a bonus, añejo is an excellent choice for mixing. It can be used as a base for tequila beverages or as an alternative ingredient in drinks that are typically made with whiskey.

Calm the Chaos: Understanding Cortisol and How to Take Back Control of Your Health

Let's talk

about cortisol. You've probably heard it called "the stress hormone"—and while that's true. it's also a bit of an oversimplification. Cortisol is one of the most essential hormones in your body, playing a key role in everything from your energy levels and metabolism to your mood and immune system.

But like anything in the body, balance is everything. When cortisol is too high or too low for too long, it can wreak havoc on your health.

I see this every day—patients who are feeling tired, wired, inflamed, anxious, or burnt out, but whose lab work comes back "normal." Often, the missing piece of the puzzle is cortisol imbalance.

So, What Exactly Is **Cortisol?**

Cortisol is a hormone produced by your adrenal glands, two small glands that sit on top of your kidneys, and acts like a built-in alarm system. Cara Teeter and Jana Ramsey. They bridge a gap between law enforcement and volunteers and are an asset to the United Cajun Navy and other out-oftown volunteers, helping them navigate the area. They have a strong working relationship with the United Cajun Navy, who assists them in searches when they need more resources. "It's nice that it's not up to one organization. It nice to have the collaboration and access to resources as needed," stated Justine.

Emerald Coast United has assisted with several search and rescue efforts in the area. Bret Valona, a U.S. Marine veteran, went missing in the Blue Moun-

tain Beach/Point Washington State Forest area after being dropped off at the Eastern Lake Trailhead, where he planned to spend several weeks in the forest. Although extensive canvassing of the area was carried out, his location remains unknown. Early March is when his phone was last known to be in service. He was last seen wearing a plaid shirt, cargo pants, a yellow raincoat, brown hiker boots, and carrying two backpacks. If you have any information, please contact the Walton County Sheriff's Office at (850) 892-8111.

Their most recent search and rescue effort was for Trinity Eslinger, a search that greatly affected the entire Florida Panhandle and surrounding areas. The United Cajun Navy assisted in the search effort, bringing in resources such as search and recovery K9s, helicopters, boats, search spotter aircraft that fly above the spotter choppers, and drones that fly lower, scanning the water, looking under docks. Their resources provided multi-layered details to the search area.

Emerald Coast United and the United Cajun Navy continued to search for Trinity after the Okaloosa Sheriff's office and Coast Guard made the decision to scale back their resources. As long as Mother Nature is cooperative and they have resources, Emerald Coast United will continue search efforts when local officials need to pull back. "It took a village to help look for



Trinity. Unfortunately, we came up empty-handed, but it wasn't for lack of effort," said Justine. "I wish we were able to provide that closure for the family."

Accidents happen to even the most prepared and knowledge-able people on the water, as Jeremy's friends and family know too well, but continuing to educate and remind people could make a big difference. Justine suggests that locals and tourists alike pay attention to the water conditions and educate themselves on water safety. "People don't realize how dangerous the water is," stated Justine.

One suggestion is that more

information be available for those coming in from out of town. "The biggest thing we need to do as a community is we need to teach people what a rip tide looks like and what to do during a rip tide," said Justine. "If every property management company around here could have a laminated flyer in their houses, it would be beneficial for our area to get them in the hands of all these wonderful people visiting."

Other safety resources include looking at surf conditions on local beach cams, or

Birkenstock: Centuries of Comfort, Now at Blue Bay Lifestyle Co.

Look down at your feet. What shoes are you wearing? How long have you been wearing them, and what roads have those shoes travelled?

If you're like most of us, you don't give much thought to your shoes beyond how they'll serve you—if they look good, if they feel good, how well they'll navigate the terrain ahead. And sure, your shoes have a personal history attached to you: where they've taken you, where you've taken them, the memories you've made in them (some good, some bad, some best left

in the dust behind you). But, here's something you probably never think about when you pull those shoes out of the closet: They have a history all their own.

Interestingly, some of the oldest shoe companies are hundreds of years old—and the

name Birkenstock ranks near the top of the pile. And no, they weren't invented for the freelove-giving, Woodstock-bound hippie era of the late '60s and '70s. Get a cup of coffee and settle in—it's story time at Blue Bay Lifestyle Co.

This one actually begins in 1774, with a cobbler in the small German village of Langen-Bergheim named Johann Adam Birkenstock. Yep. That Birkenstock. Over the next hundred years, Johann and the men of his family mastered their craft of shoe making, passing down techniques to generation after generation of fathers to sons.

And then something incredible happened. In 1896, Konrad Birkenstock created something that, for the times, was pretty profound: a flexible footbed. It was kind of unheard of—shoes of the era were rigid, narrow and conformed to the dictates of fashion, making them stylish, but decidedly uncomfortable and unsupportive. Konrad's groundbreaking idea was that footwear should conform to the human foot—not the other way around. To bring his vision to life, he began producing contoured insoles, essentially revolutionizing the shoe industry around the world.

By 1902, Konrad's first design had been refined into the first contoured arch support. Of course, it wasn't anything glamorous-and it was sold mainly to shoemakers who put them into custom footwear. But it addressed a problem that, during the industrial age, was becoming more of an issue. Factory workers who stood for hours at a machine or spent their days on cobblestone streets needed relief from the pain caused by stiff, nonconforming shoes. Birkenstock's arch supports offered it.

In the 1930s, Birkenstock's footbeds had found their way into medical use. Orthopedists, podiatrists and even soldiers realized the benefits of proper foot support, but the product was still only considered a medical tool. It was still decades away from becoming a fashion statement.

Birkenstock's time to shine came in 1963, when Karl

Birkenstock launched the company's first sandal—complete with a deep, anatomically designed footbed. Marketed as a fitness sandal, the Madrid was touted to strengthen leg muscles and promote natural gait. But here's the kicker: Birkenstock had finally stepped into the limelight and was no longer hidden inside a shoe.

By the 1970s, Birkenstocks had become part of the uniform of American counterculture. College students, artists and free thinkers embraced them as a symbol of nonconformity-they were authentic, comfortable and flew in the face of fashion norms. Hippies wore them to festivals and protests, while professors wore them in the lecture halls of colleges and universities. Without having to utter a word, the sandal's signature wide straps and unpretentious cork soles spoke the language of a lifestyle that was all about simplicity and questioning authority.

That representation of the counterculture remained for decades, and Birkenstock continued as a niche non-fashion fashion statement until the 1990s and early 2000s, when minimalism came back into vogue and comfort became chic. Designers began collaborating with Birkenstock, sending its sandals down Paris and New York runways, and even celebrities began wearing them.

Nearly 250 years after it began, Birkenstock is more than a shoe brand—it's a cultural touchstone that straddles the line of so many categories: medical, practical, fashionable, sustainable. Hire for Safety: What Every Homeowner and Business Should Know

Picture this: a ladder leaning against your siding, a roofer balancing in the breeze, or a housekeeper stretching to dust a transom no one's touched since hurricane season. Most home projects look routine — until they aren't. The difference between a close call and a catastrophe is rarely luck. It's preparation: safety training, the right equipment, and the right kind of insurance carried by a company that takes responsibility for its people.

Why safety training matters

Falls remain the leading cause of death in construction. OSHA reported more than 400 fatal falls in 2023 alone — tragedies that experts say are almost always preventable with proper

training and equipment. That's why OSHA requires fall protection at as little as four feet in many industries, and specific ladder and stairway training for anyone who climbs them.

And here's something most people don't realize: it doesn't take a rooftop fall for things to go wrong. Even a tumble from a simple step ladder — the kind most of us keep in the garage can cause life-changing injuries. The CDC reports that falls are the most common cause of traumatic brain injury nationwide, and many of those happen from heights under ten feet. A bump to the head on concrete or tile might not sound dramatic, but it can lead to concussions, fractures, or worse. That's why proper training and safe practices matter at every height, not just on high roofs.

If a company can't show you how it trains its crews, that's a red flag.

The insurance side homeowners can't ignore

In Florida, workers' compensation (WC) isn't optional — it's the law. Construction employers must carry coverage with one or more employees, and non-construction companies must carry

it with four or more. Homeowners can verify coverage through Florida's state-run "Proof of Coverage" database.

Why this matters: if someone is injured on your property and the company doesn't carry WC, the fallout can get complicated. Coverage generally protects the worker and the company — but without it, a worker may turn to the homeowner for damages.

And here's the tricky part: in construction, even "1099 independent contractors" are usually treated as employees unless they've filed a legal exemption. That means the hiring contractor is liable for their coverage. Companies that rely on loosely defined 1099 labor often leave both workers and homeowners exposed.

For businesses, the stakes are even higher. If you're a shop owner, property manager, or office leader, hiring uninsured or untrained contractors doesn't just put workers at risk — it puts your business at risk of lawsuits, downtime, and reputational damage. One accident on your property can disrupt operations, lead to costly claims, or even draw OSHA's attention if employees are present. Choosing vendors with verified workers'

comp coverage and strong safety training isn't just about compliance — it's smart business risk management.

Spotting the companies that put safety first

So, how can you tell if a contractor truly values safety? Here are a few signs you can see right away:

Uniforms and PPE: Do crews arrive in company gear, using harnesses, gloves, or goggles where needed? If not, ask why.

Well-maintained equipment: Ladders, cones, and safety gear should look caredfor and ready to use, not thrown together.

Clear insurance answers: A reputable company will gladly show you proof of coverage and point you to the state website to double-check.

Direct employees: When workers are W-2 employees, coverage and training are consistent. Ask if the crew is in-

house or all 1099 subcontractors.

Visible safety habits: Look for small routines — ladders tied off, walkways cleared, teammates spotting each other. Safety is a culture, not a checklist.

For commercial jobs, these signs are even more important. Look for vendors who provide site-specific safety plans, use signage or cones to protect customer walkways, and communicate clearly about when and how work will be done. These habits show they're thinking beyond their crew — they're protecting your employees, customers, and reputation too.

Five safety questions to ask any contractor

- Want a quick gut-check before you sign? Try these:
- Do you carry workers' comp, and can I verify it through the state?







This Ain't My First Rodeo, But It Is My Last...

As we come together to celebrate the 77th Annual Destin Fishing Rodeo, I find myself reflecting on what this event has meant to me—and to so many others— over the years. After more than two decades at the helm, this year will mark my final Rodeo as Director. It's a moment filled with emotion, pride and deep gratitude.

The Journey

In 1998 I was hired as director of the Rodeo, we operated out of the Fisherman's Co-Op. Not long after, we moved to Harborwalk Marina, and eventually found a long-term home at AJ's Seafood & Oyster Bar. That move was transformative for the event.

In those early years, weighins were held in two shifts with a long midday break—a schedule that worked well for a while. But, after paying closer attention to boat patterns, we realized many charters returned around 1 p.m. and quickly turned around for afternoon trips. We adjusted our

hours to remain open continuously from 10 a.m. to 7 p.m.—a decision that made a meaningful difference for our anglers and helped the Rodeo to grow.

We've now been hosted by AJ's for nearly 20 years. I'm especially thankful to Alan Laird for his ongoing support, the



dedicated maintenance team and Rachel Green, who has worked tirelessly to help bring all the moving parts of this event together every year.

The People Behind the Scenes

No one accomplishes something like this alone. From the very beginning, Ham and Marion Palmgren were instrumental in guiding me. Marion stood beside me throughout the years, offering knowledge, encouragement and the kind of friendship that sustains a person. Mr. Ham passed in 2013, and I still miss his wit, his generous spirit and his willingness to wear any Hal-



loween costume we asked him to. Bruce Cheves has also been a constant presence—offering not only wisdom and institutional memory, but also a deep love of the fishing community. Tina Harbuck at the Destin Log has documented the Rodeo's story faithfully each year, and Angela Kalthoff has ensured that our operations remained organized and efficient, especially during the busiest of times.


I would be remiss not to mention Ann White, who has led our merchandise and marketing efforts with creativity and dedication for 20 years. Her work helped define the visual identity of the Rodeo, and her friendship has been one of the great gifts of my time here.

Growth and Change

So much has changed. When I started, we sold T-shirts under a tent with a single design in two colors. Today, our Rodeo merchandise includes multiple designs and colors, a full-size trailer for sales and an additional stock trailer to keep up with growing demand. Our shirts are everywhere! You can't walk along the Harbor or go to a local store without seeing someone in a Rodeo T-Shirt! That's why our slogan is "Dress Like a Local."

Our recordkeeping has evolved too. In the early days, we used simple computers and kept most information by hand. Today, our digital system updates in real time, allowing anglers and spectators alike to follow the action every day throughout October.

And through it all, we've endured. Hurricanes, the BP oil spill and even a global pandemic challenged us—but they never stopped us.

LSU returns for its second appearance, having won the 2021 title over Wake Forest, 75-61. Head coach Matt McMahon, now in his fourth year, welcomes a transfer class ranked No. 16 nationally by 247Sports. Drake is coming off a program-record 31-4 season, sweeping the Missouri Valley Conference titles and reaching the second round of the 2025 NCAA Tournament. The Bulldogs, now led by first-year head coach Eric Henderson, have advanced to three straight NCAA Tournaments.

Georgia Tech, under thirdyear coach Damon Stoudamire, finished 17-17 last season and advanced to the NIT. DePaul, led by first-year head coach Chris Holtmann, reached the 2025 College Basketball Crown—the Blue Demons' first postseason appearance since 2019. Holtmann previously guided Ohio State to the 2023 Emerald Coast Classic championship.

The women's tournament will feature eight teams Nov. 24-25, divided into the Bay and Beach Brackets.

12 last season, advancing to the second round of the 2025 NCAA Tournament. Nebraska finished 21-12 and also made the NCAA field. Middle Tennessee State posted a 26-8 record in 2024-25 and competed in the 2025 WBIT.

I'm 17 years into sending kids back to school. And, every year, it is still hard. Switching from one life rhythm to another in a day is hard on the brain and body. The sleep schedule changes, the morning and evening rhythms shift. Everyone in

the house is a little overwhelmed and irritable. It gets better each week, but I've found six weeks to be the sweet spot when we are all reoriented and things feel normal again.

Transitional discomfort is not isolated to returning to school. Maybe you've started a new job, added a child to the family, started care-giving for a family member, moved homes or dropped off a child at college. Or, maybe you're making a habit change like quitting smoking, eating healthier, moving your body or trying to be more optimistic. All kinds of life transition can feel overwhelming at

first and you might find yourself saying, "Why is this so hard?"

Your brain is wired for routine and repetition. Whatever you have been doing most consistently is what your brain gravitates toward. When you shift gears, make a change or transition into a new way of doing things, your brain initially pulls you back toward your old, familiar routines it associates with safety and security. Rewiring your brain to the new pattern requires daily repetition over 3-6 weeks. In the beginning, you might feel overwhelmed and frustrated with the effort required to sustain your new rhythm. However, as you reach week three, you will often find it's getting a little easier. After week 3, your brain begins to gravitate more and more toward the new behavior. And usually, around the 6-week mark, your brain doesn't feel like it's fighting the new direction you've purposed to go.

So, what are you supposed to do when transitional brain strikes and sticks around for 3-6 weeks?

8 Ways to Support Yourself Through Transitional Brain

Notice and acknowledge. Notice feelings of overwhelm, irritability, brain fog, stress and exhaustion. Remind yourself you are experiencing transitional brain and it's normal. Be kind and remind yourself it will take several weeks to feel your normal groove again.

Name the source of transition. Observe what might be a transitional event in your life. Name back to school, moving

homes, new responsibilities or whatever else defines your transitional time.

Slow down. Your brain won't go from zero to 60 in a day. Give yourself steps. This week we are going to focus on sleep schedule and homework. Next week we will focus on family dinners. The week after that we will focus on balancing school with weekend fun. When you force your brain to overhaul everything at once, you are less likely to sustain anything well.

Prioritize rest. Transitional brain makes you tired. Try getting enough sleep at night and saying no to some commitments so you have time to rest and recharge.

Regulate your mood. You are more likely to be frustrated, grumpy, and irritable during transitional brain. Notice when you are getting edgy and engage some regulating practices like stretching, sitting in nature, deep breathing, watching a funny show, reading a book, moving your body, or talking to a friend. Remember to circle back and apologize to others if you've not been your best self.

Be gracious to others. Try remembering others around you are also often having transitional brain. Be kind and curious rather than judgmental and shameful when others are strug-

Keep going. Put one foot in front of the other and you will find that days turn into a week and weeks turn into a month. At some point, you will be surprised to look up and notice you are feeling more normal and settled in your new life rhythm.

Remember for next time. Try writing yourself a brief note in the notes of your phone about your experience with transitional brain so you can look back and see in your own words that you really will make it through next time.

You aren't alone. People all around you are navigating various changes resulting in transitional brain. Try talking about it and connecting with your friends to normalize your experience. 






Shattered by Suicide: A Mother's Mission to Save Lives

In the early hours of December 23, 2018, Diane Cooke's life was forever changed by a heartbreaking phone call. Her 20-year-old son, Drew, had taken his own life. As a mother, Diane was devastated and confused. She had known that Drew was struggling emotionally in the months leading up to his death, but she had believed that this difficult period was just a passing chapter in his life. Drew was under the care of a counselor and a psychiatrist, and Diane felt confident that, with the support of professionals, medication and the love of their family, he would be able to navigate through the storm.

Tragically, this was not the case.

September is National Suicide Prevention Month—a time to raise awareness, support one another and reduce the stigma around mental health. Diane is sharing her story to encourage others to speak up, seek help and know they're not alone in hopes of saving others.

According to the American Foundation for Suicide Prevention (afsp.org), 49,476 Americans died by suicide in 2022, making it the 11th leading cause of death in the U.S. An estimated 1.6 million people attempted suicide that year. Reflecting on Drew's experiences, Diane suspects that the actual number might be even higher. "During the last five years of his life, Drew had several incidents that, in hindsight, appear to have been suicide attempts, although they were not recognized as such at the time," said Diane.

What Diane Has Learned About Suicide:

Not Everyone Talks About Their Struggles: In the days before his death, Drew did not speak about ending his life. On the contrary, he spent time with his mother, helping her bake cookies just the day before. While Diane was aware that Drew was dealing with the challenges many young adults face—such as the end of a serious relationship and hurtful rumors—she did not realize these issues felt like life and death for him. She wishes she had asked him directly about his feelings. Though she can't be certain he would have opened up, the conversation might have provided an opportunity to offer him life-saving support. "It's a common fear that asking someone if they are having suicidal thoughts might introduce the idea," said Diane. "But, this fear is unfounded. If a loved one seems to be struggling, asking if they feel safe can be crucial, especially if they have had past incidents like single-car accidents, overdoses or risky behavior."

Take Every Statement Seriously: When someone expresses thoughts of suicide, it's vital to take them seriously. Sometimes, these expressions are mistaken for attention-seeking behavior. But, suicidal thoughts often manifest as casual comments such as, "It would be easier for everyone if I were gone," "I don't know if I can do this anymore," or "If I died tomorrow, life would go on." Drew was a vibrant and joyful young man who loved to make others laugh. "He had many friends and was known for his kindness and sense of humor," said Diane. "However, he also struggled with significant mental health issues that affected his mood, perceptions, impulsivity and judgment. If a loved one makes comments that hint at giving up or dying, it's important to ask questions, listen carefully and help them access resources that can keep them safe."

Explore All Treatment Options: Diane believed that the love and support Drew received would be enough to carry him through his difficult time. "Since his passing, I've learned much more about mental health and the various ways it can be treated," Diane said. "There are now many innovative treat-

ments available that are highly effective for those struggling with mood disorders that don't respond well to traditional therapies." To help others, Diane partnered with me, Melanie Yost, her childhood friend, to open Be Well Solutions and Complete Ketamine Solutions in Destin. Our mission is to provide affordable and effective brain health therapies, such as Ketamine Infusion Therapy and Hyperbaric Oxygen Therapy, to help people heal and reclaim their lives. Diane hopes that by offering these treatments, others won't have to suffer as Drew did.







On the inside we watch what we eat, continually making better choices as we learn new things. We do the same thing on the outside of our body, choosing healthier lotions, potions, deodorants, makeup, hair products, etc. We add exercise and increase our water intake. But then....

Some time back, a study was done on the air in downtown Los Angeles vs. the air in the homes around the area. Would you have guessed that the air in downtown LA was healthier than the air in their homes? It was

Here is another interesting find. I watched a video in a training on fires. They set up two rooms with identical furniture, drapes, lamps, etc. One room was from my grandmother's time and the other one was from modern time. An ignition was set in the exact same spot in each room. Once ignited, in less

than three minutes, the modern room reached the flash point. In the other room, the couch arm and part of the drapes were burning. Everything else was fine. The difference? Grandma's room was made with all-natural materials such as cotton, wool, etc. The modern room was made up of polyester, nylon, foam, etc. Many of these materials have a petroleum base in their manufacturing. Manmade versus natural.

We nestle into our favorite toxic chair or couch. Sleep in our non-wrinkled sheets. Slip into our favorite synthetic fabrics and breathe the off gases from all of it. In the morning we head into the bathroom with all our products to dress for the day. (By the way, the bathroom is usually the most toxic room in our house.)

It's time to stretch our health goals to the home. This is not an easy task. If you thought buying organic was expensive, try pricing out a natural fiber couch or mattress. However, there are steps we can take to offset what we are breathing and absorbing through our skin. Small changes can make a big difference.

Looking for a new rug? Focus on natural fibers such as cotton, wool, jute, hemp, silk, linen, etc. These are also the choices for clothing, curtains, drapes, etc. We have vinyl flooring so I don't walk around the house barefoot. Slippers and socks are my choice for lessening the exposure load. Another good habit is to open your windows whenever possible to allow the gases from the products to escape and let the fresh air in. Even if it's only for 20 minutes early in the morning and longer when the weather is cooler can improve the health of our home. Take your car as an example. The windows always get that film on it after awhile. I used to wonder why they got like that since I wasn't a smoker. Then I learned that it was the off gassing of all the materials.

Our homes are no different. To minimize harmful substances entering your home take your shoes off at the door. You would be amazed what we track in from parking lots and yards.

It's a bit harder when it comes to the bedroom. The clothes we wear, the mattress we sleep on and the products in the bathroom if it's connected to the bedroom are filled with manufactured materials and chemicals. We spend about 9-10 hours daily sleeping or dressing. Start off small. Update the

pillows and sheets with natural materials. Wear natural fiber sleepwear. Switch out products as they need to be replaced.


When it comes to the kitchen, consider switching dishwasher and dishwashing liquid for a more natural option. The other items to consider replacing are aluminum cookware, plastic storage containers and glasses. Best choices are stainless steel, ceramic, cast iron or glass. Food-grade silicone, stainless steel or wood is a better choice vs. plastic utensils.

Lastly, check the cleaners you use. More natural options are Borax, baking soda and vinegar. If you opt to stick with certain cleaners, such as for toilets, take precautions to prevent breathing in the fumes and wear gloves.

Spend some time looking around your home. Read the labels on your towels, products, clothes, etc. A little at a time can make a big difference. Be sure to open the windows for a while as often as possible (Do this for your vehicle as well.). Here's to Health!

So how can we help them get back to their "balcony" and shine? Here are 3 ideas:


- Encourage Confidence -Remind them of their past successes in leading with clarity. A little reassurance can reignite their natural leadership skills.

A Pastor's Ponderings: The Place of Forgiveness

ecuted. When they came to the place called the Skull, they crucified him there, along with the criminals — one on his right, the other on his left. Jesus said, "Father, forgive them, for they do not know what they are doing." (Luke 23:32–34 NIV)

Picture yourself in a church in ancient Rome, Corinth or Ephesus in the second century. Your pastor has just received a scroll from Dr. Luke describing the death of Christ. As a Roman citizen, you feel uneasy, because it was your people who carried out the crucifixion. In truth, humanity itself drove the nails.

Two criminals were led out with Jesus to be executed. They were guilty; He was not. Pilate admitted as much. It was hatred, pride and greed that demanded Jesus' death. Yet, in His agony, Jesus prayed: "Father, forgive them, for they know not what they do."

Who was He forgiving? The criminals? The soldiers? The religious leaders? The crowd? The truth is staggering: Jesus laid bare the promise of forgiveness for us all. Past, present, and future.

The cross was not His darkest hour, but His finest. This is the peak of Christian revelation—grace revealed as forgiveness.

We see this same spirit in Acts 7 when Stephen, as stones rained down upon him, prayed, "Lord, do not hold this sin against them." Forgiveness is the rarest, most heroic act of faith. Paul echoes it in Ephesians 4:32: "Be kind and compassionate to one another, forgiving

each other, just as in Christ God forgave you."

Even Marcus Aurelius, the Roman emperor and philosopher, seemed to glimpse this truth. Each morning he reminded himself: "Today you will meet unpleasant people; they will hurt you, insult you. But you cannot live like that. You know better."

The Place of the Skull

What is Calvary—the place of the skull? It's where humanity told God, "We don't want You interfering in our lives." And yet it is also where Jesus showed us what to do with humanity's worst sins: forgive. That is the Jesus prayer. It must become ours, too.

A Modern Picture of Grace

Jessica, a young woman from Guthrie, Oklahoma, recently offered a living example. While shopping, a man stole her wallet. She tracked him down quietly and said, "I think you have something of mine. You have two choices—return it and I'll forgive you, or I can turn you in."

Ashamed, the man handed it back, apologizing repeatedly. Jessica then stunned him further—she walked with him to the checkout and paid \$27 for his groceries: bread, milk, bologna, crackers, cheese and soup.

"The last thing he said was, 'I'll never forget tonight. I'm

broke, I have kids, I'm embarrassed, and I'm so sorry.""

Critics said she should have pressed charges, but Jessica replied, "Sometimes all you need is a second chance."

That is Christian forgiveness—releasing someone from what they owe, even when they don't deserve it.

Forgiving Like Jesus

So, who has wronged you? Who took from you, spoke against you, betrayed you, or hurt you deeply? Jesus absorbed the blame of the world so you wouldn't have to carry it. Your part is to extend the grace you've received.

The place of forgiveness is not easy ground. It often feels like the skull—bleak, painful, humiliating. Yet, it is the place where resurrection hope begins.

When bitterness tempts you, return to Calvary. Listen again to Jesus' words: "Father, forgive them." Then make them your own.

Heroes in the Backyard

A Review of Raiding the Rising Sun: The Doolittle Raid—America Strikes Back

Few moments in American military history match the daring and determination of the Doolittle Raid. In his newly released book, Raiding the Rising Sun: The Doolittle Raid—America Strikes Back, aviation historian Dan Steelman revisits this bold World War II operation in a format that's as informative as it is visually rich.


This isn't your typical war history. Steelman walks readers through the mission in a day-by-day format, beginning on December 7, 1941—the day of the attack on Pearl Harbor—and continuing through April 18, 2022, marking the 80th anniversary of the raid. Told in the present tense, the story unfolds with immediacy, allowing readers to experience the tension, bravery, and resolve of the men involved as though it were happening now.

Led by Lieutenant Colonel James Doolittle, the April 1942 raid targeted Tokyo, Yokohama, Kobe, and other Japanese cities. It was America's first counter-strike following the attack on Pearl Harbor and served as a powerful symbol of national resolve. Though the physical damage inflicted was limited, the psychological impact was profound—boosting American morale and shaking Japanese confidence.

What makes this story especially meaningful for readers along the Gulf Coast is its deep local connection. The crews that would take part in the raid trained at Eglin Field in Northwest Florida. They practiced low-altitude bombing runs, night flying, and learned how to take off from a short runwayall in preparation for launching B-25 bombers from the deck of the USS Hornet. Naval flight instructor Lt. Henry L. Miller from NAS Pensacola played a pivotal role, teaching the crews how to simulate takeoffs on a carrier deck using makeshift runways on base.

Their mission had no return plan. The crews knew they'd be flying into hostile territory with no landing strip waiting on the





other side. Most would have to bail out or crash-land in occupied China, risking capture or worse. Yet they went anyway.

Steelman's account is notable for its attention to detail and historical accuracy. Drawing from both American and Japanese sources, it offers a balanced perspective, supported by more than 200 high-quality photographs—many rarely seen. The images, in both color and black and white, are integrated throughout the book to help bring the mission to life.

The author's background adds credibility. Steelman is a seasoned museum professional and lifelong aviation enthusiast. His love of history began in his youth and led to a career preserving artifacts that ranged from dinosaur bones to Apollo-era spacecraft. His admiration for the men who carried out the Doolittle Raid is evident on every page.

For readers who remember a time when patriotism wasn't just a word but a way of life, Raiding the Rising Sun is both a history lesson and a tribute. It reminds us of a time when America responded to tragedy with unity, grit, and courage—and of the young men who trained right here in our own backyard before taking off into history.

The USAF Armament Mu-

seum will be hosting Author Dan Steelman for an author signing event on August 16 from 10 a.m. to 1 p.m. The Museum is located at 100 Museum Drive, Eglin AFB, Fort Walton Beach. The museum has a B-25 on display in the colors of Jimmy Doolittle. Admission to the museum is free.







From Palette Knife to Poster: Kathy Schumacher's Art Sets Sail for MKAF's 30th Festival

With bold strokes and vibrant color, Niceville artist Kathy Schumacher will set the tone for the Mattie Kelly Arts Foundation's 30th Annual Festival of the Arts as this year's official poster artist. This milestone event kicks off Friday, October 24 with the Arty Kickoff Party, followed by the festival weekend October 25–26 at the Mattie Kelly Cultural Arts Village in Destin.

Schumacher's winning piece, Sails in Symphony, is a vibrant 30 x 24-inch impasto oil painting bursting with jewel-toned sailboats poised for a magical coastal voyage. "It's inspired by Destin—by the water, by the coastal lifestyle—and it just feels like Mattie Kelly," says Schumacher. "I wanted it to be more colorful than my usual sailboat paintings so it would stand out on a poster. It reflects the beauty of our area and pairs perfectly with the festival's music and atmosphere."

While this is Schumacher's first time as the festival's featured poster artist, she is no stranger to the event. She first exhibited at the MKAF festival of the Arts in 2013, taking home the People's Choice Award her debut year,

and has returned nearly every year since. "I love the festival," she says. "It offers such a wonderful variety of art—paintings, jewelry, pottery, and more—in a beautiful setting with live music, great food, and activities for all ages."

From Wisconsin Fields to Florida's Gulf Coast

Schumacher's journey as an artist began later in life. Raised in Wisconsin's rolling farmlands, she developed an early appreciation for the natural world but didn't pick up a paintbrush until her 40s. At the time, she was a busy mom and military spouse, traveling the globe with her husband and raising two children. A casual acrylic painting class with friends sparked an instant passion. "From day one, I loved it," she recalls. Encouraged by instructors impressed with her natural ability, she began exploring oil painting using traditional Old Masters techniques.

Her artistic path took a new turn during a move to New Mexico. With no job or kids at home, she immersed herself in classes at the New Mexico Art League, experimenting with pastel, watercolor, figurative work, and realism. The turning point came when she discovered the work of a Ukrainian palette knife artist. Captivated by the sculptural texture and bold color, Schumacher set out to master the technique herself, eventually developing her signature style: richly textured oils with luminous layers of color and an almost three-dimensional effect.

The Palette Knife Signature

Today, Schumacher paints exclusively with palette knives. Her process begins with toning the canvas in underlying colors that peek through the top layers, adding depth and vibrancy. "I think that underpainting gives my work another dimension," she says. While many palette knife artists work in acrylics, she prefers the richness of oil pigments. Her subjects—often coastal landscapes, sailboats, marshes, wildflowers, and birds—reflect her deep connection to nature and her Niceville waterfront surroundings.

Nature, she says, is endlessly inspiring. "Whether it's a quiet

marsh, a burst of wildflowers, or the rhythm of the sea, I'm captivated by the way light, color, and space interact. My goal is always to create a moment of connection between the viewer and the natural world."

A Family Legacy in Art

Art is a family affair for Schumacher. Her daughter, Krista Schumacher, is an award-winning palette knife artist based in San Diego, and the two occasionally collaborate on projects, including large-scale commercial installations. "It's been such a joy to share this journey with her," Kathy says.



"Watching her develop her own style in the medium we both love has been a source of immense pride."


Meet the Artist at the Festival

Festivalgoers can meet Kathy Schumacher in person and view Sails in Symphony—alongside her other original works—in Tent No. 61 during the festival. As the official poster artist, her winning design will appear on the festival's poster, program guide, t-shirt, MKAF website, social media channels, and throughout the event's marketing campaign.

The Festival of the Arts will feature more than 100 artists from across the U.S., competing for \$12,000 in cash prizes across 18 categories, including Best in Show and People's Choice. Visitors can enjoy live music, a collaborative art exhibit, hands-on children's activities, an art raffle, and a variety of local food trucks with beer and wine available. Admission is free, and proceeds benefit MKAF's ArtsReach initiatives serving K-12 students, individuals with special needs, and the military community.

Reflecting on her selection, Schumacher says, "This is truly such an honor. The festival has been such a big part of my journey as an artist, and I'm thrilled to help represent its 30th anniversary."

From Carole King to Our Community: Beautiful Ushers in a Season of Storytelling at ECTC

Fresh out of graduate school for business administration and taking on a new marketing role at Emerald Coast Theatre Company, I find myself connecting with Carole King in ways I previously never thought of. Her story is deeply individualistic and personal, starting out as a teenager writing songs for others, struggling with selfdoubt, then stepping into the spotlight and forever changing music. Though what dawned on me is how her journey doesn't just belong to her. It belongs to all of us.

That's why I think that Beautiful: The Carole King Musical is a fantastic opener to ECTC's biggest season yet. It's a reflection of the universal journey of finding yourself. Every one of us, in some way, goes through those same pitfalls and struggles.

We stumble through uncertainty, question ourselves, and, at some point, have to decide to step forward into who we really are. For someone like myself in their twenties, it can be about moving to a new city, starting a career or trying new hobbies once the tassel is turned. It may be back in high school, where we are pressured to fit into the everchanging trend, but at the same time testing out who we want to be. For parents, it can be learning how to balance their own identity with the responsibility of raising a family. For those later in life, it might be deciding to move on from a lifelong career and finally retire or pursuing long-held dreams they once set aside.

Carole King's music has always had that wide-reaching quality that doesn't just speak to individuals but rather to entire generations. They carry themes of love, connection, resilience and hope that transcend time and circumstance with the same importance as all those years ago. That's why, decades later, her work still resonates with audiences who weren't even alive when those songs first topped the charts. Especially in a world that can feel divided, distracted or disconnected. her story reminds us that art brings people together, across generations and backgrounds.

Here at ECTC, our Season 13 lineup feels like an extension of that idea—that storytelling is never just about one person, but about us as a community. The Glass Menagerie reminds us of the weight of societal expectations. Annie gives us hope in the

face of hardship. Murder on the Orient Express reminds us that the truth matters, even when it's hard to uncover. Forever Plaid celebrates the importance of friendship in times of uncertainty, while Mystic Pizza captures the search for belonging

and identity in this giant world as we come of age. All of the stories, like Carole's, are mirrors we hold up to ourselves.

Carole King's life is about resilience, reinvention, and the universal search for meaning which is what makes Beautiful the perfect start to this season at Emerald Coast Theatre Company: it's a story that belongs to all of us.

Florida Artist Blacksmith Association Keeps Craft Alive

Blacksmithing may have been popularized in recent years by shows like Forged in Fire and Men at Arms, but in Florida the tradition has been thriving for decades thanks to the Florida Artist Blacksmith Association (FABA).

Founded in 1984, FABA has spent 40 years teaching the craft, preserving its history and setting up historical blacksmith shops across the state. Its mission is simple: "To teach – To preserve." The organization will mark its 40th anniversary with a three-day celebration in Gainesville, Oct. 10-12, featuring demonstrations and hands-on classes.

Monthly meetings are also

part of FABA's educational program, held at eight locations statewide. The Fort Walton Beach chapter—known as the Far West Panhandle Blacksmiths—is headquartered at Traditions Workshop, 418 Green Acres Road. Meetings often include demonstrations, open forges where attendees can try projects themselves, and a provided lunch with donations appreciated.

First-time visitors are welcome free of charge. Annual family memberships cost \$30 and include access to every FABA event statewide, discounts for the annual convention, and a digital copy of The Clinker Breaker, the

group's monthly newsletter.





- 2. Rules will be broken again. People are uneducated on how to legally go about the hunt.
- 3. They are not letting just anyone bear hunt and you've got to pay a good bit to even try and get to see an animal. I only see maybe one time a year or so while I'm hunting...They ain't

easy to find.

- 4. Florida is now the state to which the ultra-rich flock (at least they have second homes in Miami). There is plenty of money flowing in this state without killing bears if you want to look at it that way - every Florida resident should be concerned about its unique ecosystem (no party lines in this) - much different than all other states. I was just looking at how much concrete Seaside has now compared to how very green it used to naturally be (30A posted an aerial view). If you don't actively preserve Florida year after year, it will be gone.
- 5. They are only giving a few tags out...not everyone can do so. You can't go buy it like a fishing license... bunch of hoops they make you go through, then and only then you get the chance to get out in a drawing. So, to get a zone, you're allowed to get a chance to kill one, which will probably be tagged or something and you got to check it in regardless. So, you can't just go outside and shoot one-just like you can't speed or text and drive—not legal but still gonna happen.
- 6. The idea of planting food that bears eat into the woods

and wetlands areas was a really good one - also a few ponds stocked with certain types of fish might help. Not sure why some of them can't be relocated to the wildlife corridor the state has been funding. Opening up a hunt like this will have ripple consequences - some very seri-

7. The public gets to weigh in - that's why they have meetings to vote and even announce an agenda ahead of time. The moment the *proposal* went forth, it became everybody's business - at least all Florida residents. Right now, it's in the "update the rules" phase, but a lot can happen between now and December.
