# **Alaqua Well-Being:**

# Finding Healing in the Company of Animals and Nature

Tucked among the pines and pastures of Freeport, Alaqua Animal Refuge has always been a place of second chances. Every rescued animal carries a story of survival, and every visitor feels the quiet peace that comes from being near them. It is that same sense of connection that inspired Alaqua's newest initiative, Alaqua Well-Being, a program that invites people to slow down, breathe deeply, and heal alongside the animals who live there.

The idea for Alaqua Well-Being grew out of simple conversations with volunteers. When asked what brought them to the refuge, the first answer was always their love of animals. But as those talks went deeper, something more profound emerged. Many were walking through their own seasons of grief or change — the loss of a spouse, recovery from illness, divorce, or other personal challenges. Again and



again, they shared that it was the animals who gave them the courage to keep going. Watching a once-broken animal learn to trust and love again gave them hope that they could heal, too. It became clear that the refuge was helping people as much as it helped animals.

Alaqua Well-Being was born from that truth. It is built on the idea that when we care for animals and connect with



nature, we also heal ourselves. The program brings together experiences that nurture the mind, body and spirit, including meditation, art, nature walks, counseling and animal-assisted activities. It is a place where compassion becomes a practice and not just a feeling.

One of the most beloved parts of the program is Doggie Day Out, where community members can take an





adoptable dog for a few hours or an afternoon adventure. Whether it is a walk on the beach, a car ride or relaxing in the park, these outings give the dogs a break from the shelter and offer people a joyful, stress-relieving experience. Participants often say it is the best therapy they did not know they needed, and

# SAFE in the **Panhandle**

SAFE (Strategic Alliance to Fight Exploitation) on the Panhandle, in collaboration with Ruthlake Farm, hosts its inaugural Christmas Market at the Destin-Fort Walton Beach Convention Center Nov. 21 and 22.

SAFE In the Panhandle is a local 501(c)(3) "working to end exploitation in the Florida Panhandle," says Director Marissa Osborne. The nonprofit will soon offer the only 24/7 emergency safe home for survivors on the Emerald Coast. SAFE provides free state-approved and state-mandated training for law enforcement, first responders, the hospitality industry, medical profes-

many end up adopting their new, furry friends.

Another cornerstone of Alaqua Well-Being is Humane Heroes, the refuge's hands-on learning experience for young people. Students spend time caring for animals, hearing their rescue stories, and learning how empathy and responsibility can change lives. "We have seen kids open up in ways that surprise even their teachers," says Alaqua founder Laurie Hood. "Animals have a way of reaching the parts of us that words cannot."

The program also extends to senior citizens, both at the refuge and through offsite visits.

Creativity also plays a key role in Alaqua Well-Being. Art classes invite participants to express themselves and find mindfulness through painting, sketching and other forms of creative expression. Alaqua also hosts live music events that bring people together in celebration of community, compassion and the bond we share with animals.

In addition, Alaqua is developing opportunities for counseling and natural healing, connecting participants with professionals and holistic practitioners who share the belief that animals and nature can be powerful partners in emotional wellness.

What ties every part of Alaqua Well-Being together is compassion. The program reflects the refuge's long-standing belief that empathy for animals teaches empathy for people. It is a full-circle approach to well-

ness that reminds us that healing does not always happen in a clinic, but often in the quiet moments when we simply allow ourselves to connect.

At Alaqua, rescue has always meant more than saving animals. It is about creating a refuge for all living things, people included. Alaqua Well-Being is the next chapter in that story — a reminder that kindness heals, and that sometimes, the best medicine has four legs and a heartbeat.

sionals, and community groups. "The goal is to educate groups on how to recognize human trafficking and how to report it."

The for-profit Ruthlake Farm, owned by SAFE, is a 31-acre working farm that, according to Osborne, will one day—in addition to providing funding

for SAFE—join forces with other nonprofits around the world at no charge, guiding them on how to implement a business model for funding.

"We are growing satsumas, blueberries and Christmas trees, and will eventually offer a 'you pick' experience, a Christmas market on the property and more," says Osborne. Currently, the farm crafts artisan soaps, honey and pottery. Ruthlake Farm also has its own private coffee label.

Osborne says the November event will be "our big introduction of Ruthlake Farm products and its mission." Admission is \$10 and includes a complimentary shopping bag and raffle basket entry. "The goal is to go into the market and do all your holiday shopping." The

market will offer a variety of male, female and kid -friendly items, along with photo and letter-writing opportunities with Santa and other children's activities.

"Choosing the (event) space was very important," says Osborne, "and we wanted it to be convenient for the community we serve." Ruthlake Farm will have items for sale, and all of those sales will find their way back to SAFE to further the mission.

The market has enticed many vendors to step up, and Osborne says vendor opportunities are still available. Anyone interested in sponsorship can email support@ruthlakefarm.net or call (205) 478-3862. Osborne's uncle, Bruce Bailey, a businessman who wished to give back to the community, founded SAFE four years ago, and Osborne jumped on board in March. "I'm at a point where I can do something I'm passionate about." Previously, her church family provided opportunities for Osborne to serve as director of the preschool and as part of the women's ministries, and she has numerous fundraising projects under her belt.

Osborne says trafficking is a big problem in all areas of the country. "It truly does hide in plain sight. No community is immune. Learn the signs, how to report and how to keep your family safe."

SAFE is collaborating with The Freedom Collective of Northwest Florida to help run its safe home. Osborne calls the nonprofit "a trusted leader in emergency and stabilization care for victims of human trafficking."



# Reeling in Progress: Destin Casts Big Plans

If you've noticed a little extra buzz around town, there's good reason. From Joe's Bayou to Clement Taylor Park, Destin is making visible progress on projects that have been years in the making—each designed to make life in the World's Luckiest Fishing Village even better. Here's a sampling of Destin's city projects and progress:

**Joe's Bayou:** This Department of Environmental Protection project is in the permitting phase.

"If there is one thing I have learned in government, it is that state projects take time," said Mayor Bobby Wagner. A good example of this is with the Joe's Bayou upgrades. Currently in the permitting stage, Joe's Bayou will see over an acre of

improved waterfront access, upgraded piers, and more family-friendly spaces. "But once this is done, Joe's Bayou will be one of the coolest locals parks we have."

Councilwoman Terésa Hebert agreed. "The upgraded piers, boat launches, and improved parking are all much needed changes for our citizens and visitors."

**The Crosstown Connector:** Storm water drainage is being installed now, with roadway and multi-use path construction to begin in 2026. The project aims to relieve neighborhood congestion while enhancing walkability.

"Apps like Google Maps and Waze have already pushed traffic into our neighborhoods," said Wagner. "The Crosstown Connector takes that traffic off local streets and puts it behind people's backyard fences where



it belongs. And we are not just planning for cars, we are building for people."

Batting Cages at Morgan Sports Complex: With its renewed Children's Park, Morgan Sports Complex continues to be a gathering spot for families, and more plans are in the works. By late Fall 2025, Morgan Sports Complex will unveil one batting cage with six bays — a permanent addition designed to serve athletes young and old.

"Having fixed, permanent batting cages at Morgan's will be a huge asset for the community of Destin as well as all visitors that come to this park," said Councilman Kevin Schmidt. "For the Destin community, having access to multiple cages at this park will allow great practice opportunities. When tournaments are hosted with visiting teams from all across the country, the upgrades will allow multiple teams a safe place to warm up before games."

**Morgan Sports Lighting:** Almost all the field lighting is complete. The lighting in the

parking lot will be next up for the project, and all lighting will be in place by late Fall 2025.

"Having the lights replaced and upgraded to new LED is monumental for every field at Morgan's, including baseball, softball and soccer," said Schmidt. Over the years, we have lost the ability to maintain and fix the aging lights, and we have had no lights on many poles, creating a not-so-great playing field. This will be a major improvement and an amazing cost savings over time."

**Pickleball:** The fast-est-growing sport in America has found a home here. Four new courts, canopy-covered benches, restrooms, and parking upgrades are expected to be ready by Spring 2026.

"This project has been years in the making, and it is exciting to finally see work happening on site," said Wagner. The hardest part was starting from scratch with a brand-new facility, which meant most of the budget had to go toward the foundation and infrastructure. The silver lining is that once these first four courts and bathrooms are done, the groundwork is in place. If the community wants more courts or even new amenities like a skate park, the site is ready to expand.'

**Tarpon Park:** The new beachfront park will offer 340-feet of additional public beach access, free parking with 49 standard spaces, 3 ADA accessible spaces, 29 LSV spaces, bathroom facilities, and four pavilions. The County is leading this effort with hopes to have it ready Summer 2026.

"For years, crowded beaches and legal disputes have left people asking, 'Where is the line in the sand?'" said Wagner. "The surest solution is simple. Buy back beachfront property so

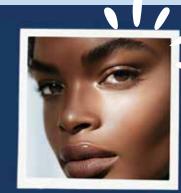

This is the time of year when you should review your Medicare options and make important decisions about your coverage for 2026.

Right now, we are in the Annual Election Period (AEP) for all Medicare beneficiaries. It is often referred to as the Annual Open Enrollment Period. This annual event runs from October 15th through December 7th.

Because this period allows ALL Medicare eligible folks to make switches and changes to their plans, it is the most heavily advertised time of the year...not like I have to tell you that! Folks on Original Medicare (Parts A&B), Supplements (MediGap), Stand Alone Prescription Plans (Part D) and Advantage Plans have a chance to pretty much do anything they want with their coverage mix. The hard part comes with sorting it all out.

One of the things I often talk about with Medicare beneficiaries around this time of year is to make sure you don't get so overwhelmed by all the information out there that you run out of time to take action. It can sometimes become "paralysis by analysis" syndrome. Remember, the AEP ends on December 7th!

Trash and recycling crews: A cash tip of \$10–\$30 per worker (or a small gift if you don't see them directly) is thoughtful and appreciated.

Yard crews, house cleaners, pet sitters and window cleaners: A one-time bonus

equal to one service visit, or whatever fits comfortably in your budget, is always generous, but never expected.

Teachers and caregivers:

These everyday heroes pour so much heart into the lives they touch. While many can't accept cash, heartfelt gifts go a long way — think handwritten notes from your family or child, classroom supplies, coffee shop gift cards, or a small basket of treats. For caregivers and in-home aides' rules can be different; a cash bonus or gift card that says "we see what you do" can mean more than you know. The key is the thought behind it — recognizing the quiet, consistent care they give all year long.

911 response teams — our firefighters, officers, dispatchers, and paramedics: These heroes can't accept tips, but a tray of cookies dropped off, a thank-you card from your family, or volunteering with an organization that supports them goes a long way in reminding them they're appreciated.

# Asking (or Offering) Gracefully





# Charting New Waters:

# **DHS Fishing Program Is Making History**

By Christopher Manson

Captain Mike Parker started Destin High School's fishing class when the institution opened its doors five years ago.

Today, the class enrollment numbers 150. "We're the only school in the state that offers a fishing class," he says. Students learn about safety, boat mainte-

nance and fishing regulations, among other things. "There are lots of field trips."

Those trips include Orange Beach, Alabama's Walter Ma-

rine, the largest artificial reef manufacturer in the country. Walter Marine is responsible for crafting the almost 50 memorial reefs Parker and his students have created in a program that has spanned the last three years. "We were asking what kind of

has spanned the last three years. "We were asking what kind of reefs they were building," says Parker. "They said the memorial reefs were getting a lot of interest. Divers can dive around them, and loved ones can drop ashes in that particular spot." Once the reefs are submerged, they also function as fishing

Most of the reefs that have been placed in the Gulf measure eight feet. But, now a 25-foot "super reef" for the late Charlie Kirk is being readied. It will weigh about 18 tons upon completion. "It's been poured and will be deployed by the end of November or December," says Parker.

The privately funded reef—Parker's idea—has met with little resistance from the community. "Most people are behind it and are contributing," he says. Parker informs me that he's been in touch with the Tallahassee representative from Kirk's Turning Point organization and is hoping the rep will spread the word.

The reef, the cost of which is roughly \$17,000, will be placed two miles off the coast of Henderson Beach and 70 feet deep.

The eight-foot reefs cost around \$2,000 and are made up of concrete, steel and limestone. Inside the reefs are five-foot high stacked platforms that Parker says "draw a lot more fish." Fishermen can pinpoint the GPS coordinates of the reefs at floridagofishing.com.

The reefs are available for local businesses, too. Anyone

investing in a reef is allowed to participate in all phases of its creation. For Tucker Reese, a young man from the area who lost his life in a vehicle accident, the family helped design a memorial reef, witness the pouring of the concrete, and witness its lowering into the Gulf. "You can put more than a person's name on the

reefs. You can place memorabilia and other things that meant something to the person," says Parker. "With the Charlie Kirk reef, we've got his logo and some of his slogans, like 'Prove me wrong."

Parker, a 35-year resident of Destin, spent three decades as a charter boat captain on the Silver King. "I had an idea that my fishing career was winding down, and since Destin had the largest independent charter boat fleet in the country, we needed more captains and deckhands," he says. "In offering a career course to provide that avenue, we've raised up a lot of captains and deckhands."

Captain Brandy Miles teaches with Parker and owns the Discipleship charter boat docked at HarborWalk Marina. "Her dream since she was a child was to be a charter boat captain and a teacher," says Parker. "The kids love her."

In the past half-decade, Parker has watched his fishing class grow. People are gravitating to it more and more, and parents and children are equally enthusiastic. "We have students coming down from Niceville and Crestview," says Parker. "I had someone move here from Utah because of the fishing class!" Representatives from the Florida Wildlife Commission have spoken to Parker's students about career opportunities. They, along with the fire department and the United States Coast Guard, give students hands-on training and practical learning experiences.

I tell Captain Parker I wish they had offered a class like this when I attended high school many decades ago. "That's what they all say!" he replies.

# Why Seniors are Most Vulnerable in the First 30 Days After a Hospital Stay

After a major medical event and a lengthy stay in an acute setting, seniors often are at a loss during the transition of care. This may include the breakdown in communication and coordination between the hospital, the patient/family, and the next care provider, directly leading to preventable readmissions. The senior/caregiver often is unaware of "red flag" symptoms of a worsening condition (i.e. fluid retention in heart failure) or when to call their physician verses 911. This often leads to delayed, inappropriate or overcautious care (i.e. an unnecessary ER visit).

The transition period, particularly the first 30 days post hospital discharge, is the most vulnerable time for seniors because they shift abruptly from 24/7 acute medical care to an often-fragmented system of self-management and family care. This period is often referred to as a state of "post-hospital syndrome," where patients have depleted physiolog-

ical reserves and are at high risk for new or worsening conditions. Some of these conditions may include:

**Deconditioning and Frailty:** Even a short hospital stay can lead to significant muscle loss, weakness, and decline in mobility, making the senior highly susceptible to falls and subsequent injury upon returning home.

**Physiological Vulnerability:** The stress of illness and hospitalization leaves the body's immune system weakened, increasing the risk of new infections (like pneumonia or UTIs) or complications from the initial illness.

**Cognitive Decline:** Hospitalization can often trigger or worsen confusion and delirium, which severely compromises a senior's ability to understand and follow complex discharge instructions.

**Medication Chaos:** Seniors are often discharged with an average of 3-5 new medication changes (new drugs, discontinued drugs, or dosage changes). Medication errors, a leading cause of readmission, are most

likely to occur within the first 48 hours of being home.

Hospitals work diligently with senior care facilities and health care partners to ensure that seniors are discharged with confirmed plans for support (i.e. home health, skilled nursing and rehab facilities, medical equipment and transportation). If you are being discharged from acute care and require specialized follow-on care, it is important to know your options. A skilled nursing and rehab center relies on a variety of specialists to address the patient's acute needs following hospitalization.

Going to post-acute rehab after a hospital stay is an essential step for many people because it bridges the gap between acute medical treatment and safely returning home. The primary goal of post-acute rehabilitation is to help you regain the strength, mobility, and skills you need to live independently, while also preventing complications that could land you back in the hospital. Your treatment plan is customized to your specific condition and goals, ensuring you make

measurable progress towards independence.

## Who is Post-Acute Rehab For?

Post-acute rehab is typically recommended if you:

- Need continued medical care that can't be safely managed at home.
- Require multiple types of therapy (PT, OT, SLP).
- Have the physical and cognitive ability to tolerate intensive therapy and are motivated to participate.
- Are recovering from a major event like:
  - Stroke or Brain Injury
- Major Orthopedic Surgery (e.g., hip or knee replacement)
- Major Illness (e.g., severe pneumonia, heart failure, prolonged critical illness)
- Major Trauma or Amputation

Your hospital care team (doctors, case managers, and therapists) will assess your condition and recommend the appropriate level of post-acute care for your needs. Reasons why post-acute rehab is highly beneficial:

## Types of Medical & Rehabilitation Specialists

Medical Specialists (Consulting Physicians): While the primary care physician (PCP) or medical director in a skilled nursing and rehabilitation facility oversees general medical care, specialists act as highly focused resources within the interdisciplinary team.

These physicians are typically consulted on an as-needed basis for specific conditions:

Physiatrist (Rehabilitation Medicine Specialist): Directs the overall rehab program. They specialize in nerve, muscle, and bone injuries and aim to restore function lost due to injury or illness.

**Cardiologist:** Manages conditions like Congestive Heart Failure (CHF) and post-heart attack recovery, adjusting medications and monitoring cardiac status.


**Pulmonologist:** Treats respiratory issues such as Chronic Obstructive Pulmonary Disease (COPD) or pneumonia recovery,

When did you last compare your life to someone else's and find yours lacking? When did you last have physical symptoms of stress? When did you last spend hours, days, weeks or months focused primarily on the things in your life you wish were different? Life with technology offers you piles of information to sort daily. some balance and perspective to the struggle. Statements like, "I am really struggling with anxiety today and it is hard. And at the same time, I am also so grateful for my support system, for the sun being out today and for my pet who makes me smile," invite the goodness that exists into your processing of the hard.

Gratitude can be contagious if you let it. It has a sneaky way of taking self-focused, negative thoughts and transforming them into healthy connection with God, self and others. You begin to notice kind things others have done toward you and you begin to engage spiritual gratitude. At its best, gratitude can motivate you toward kindness, generosity and creating opportunities for others to experience gratitude.

So, how do you engage and spread gratitude?

# Ways to Practice and Spread Gratitude

**Slow down.** Set aside a time each day for 3-5 minutes. Set a reminder in your phone to help support the habit. Take a few deep breaths and say to yourself, "I am slowing down to notice the good."

Reflect on a gratitude question. What was good today? What am I taking for granted in my life I could be grateful for? What nature do I see around me? Who am I grateful for? What am I looking forward to? What can I celebrate today? What kind thing has someone done for me?

**Savor and celebrate the good.** Think in detail about the beauty of nature. Think about the person you are grateful for and why you enjoy them. Notice deeply what a gift it is to have all of your basic needs met.

**Record your observa**tions. Journal, use notes in your phone, send a thank you note, or tell someone what feels good in your life. Note how it feels inside to spend time thinking about good things.

**Spread gratitude.** Allow gratitude to motivate generosity and kindness. Watch for opportunities to create grateful moments for others. Send a kind

note, give a thoughtful gift, use loving words of affirmation, go out of your way to be helpful or meet a need, share your gifts with others.







often managing oxygen therapy.

locals and visitors alike always have access. That is what Tarpon Park represents. When we secure public beaches, we are not just buying sand. We are protecting a family tradition that stretches across generations. Many visitors tell me about their first family vacations here, and now they are bringing their kids back to repeat the cycle. These are the kinds of stories that bind visitors and locals together, and keeping our beaches open ensures that cycle continues for generations to come."

**Norriego Point:** New dunes walkovers, conservation features, bathrooms, and boardwalks are nearing completion.

"It has been a long time seeing this come to fruition," said Hebert. "Hopefully by New Year's Eve, we can watch fireworks there, have picnics, and enjoy the beautiful park and views."

**Clement Taylor Park:** Fencing is up, and restoration has begun. The pier is currently being replaced board-for-board, and the new playground will be in place in Fall 2026.

"I will admit I am biased because this is my favorite park, with some of the oldest trees in Destin," said Wagner. "What I love is how this project shows we can modernize without losing the natural beauty. The new playground, restrooms, pavilions, and dock are much-needed upgrades, but the real heart of Clement Taylor is still its trees and shoreline. Nature remains the star here."

Undergrounding Utilities: Almost all the conduit is in for the Phase 1 project, and restoration work has begun. Phase 1 is located along U.S. Highway 98 from the Marler Bridge to Airport Road. "Undergrounding utilities is about preparing Destin for the future," said Wagner. "It makes us more resilient to storms, cleans up the look of our streets, and future proofs our infrastructure."

**Dredging:** There is an existing 100-foot-wide Army Core of Engineer channel that helps guide boat traffic in and out of Destin Harbor from the nearby East Pass. The larger boats with greater drafts that utilize Destin Harbor have requested that the City dredge the harbor channel because they are struggling to maneuver within the exist-

ing channel given the amount of boat traffic and the lack of depth within portions of the channel.

Four Prong Lake: Permitting is complete, and the City is working to secure funding. "Four Prong Lake shows what local government can do when we partner and find the right funding," said Wagner. "This is a nearly 3-million-dollar project, and two-thirds of that money is coming from the state. It is also a great case study for annexation. A gated neighborhood with flooding issues, and yet by working together with their HOA, the City, and outside partners, we are solving real problems while being good stewards of our local tax dollars.'

**Dalton Threadgill:** The City is working with Destin Little League to install a drainage system and artificial turf on two fields. The work is expected to be completed by the end of 2025.

"Dalton Threadgill holds a special place in everyone's heart in the City of Destin," said Schmidt. "The partnership that the city has with the Destin Little League (a 501c3 organization) has been in place for nearly 50 years! The fields and playing surfaces are prepped and maintained by volunteers of the league during season in partnership with the city. Having turf playing infields will allow significant savings in maintenance for all, a much better and safer playing surface, and field prep will be a breeze, and we should almost never have a cancellation due to flooded infield."

Calhoun (446) Ave.: The property is currently being evaluated to determine how much parking could be placed there. While still in process, the possibility of purchasing the property could be a huge gain for the city," said Schmidt. "Threadgill park is used probably over 150 nights out of the year by families in Destin. With siblings, aunts/ uncles, grandparents, and parents all coming to games as well, parking has always been an issue. During game season, you will find cars parked all around the streets, on sidewalks, under trees, etc. This not only is a problem for damage to property but a major safety issue with kids walking around. With the potential to add 70+ parking spots, it would alleviate almost every car there for that night of games. Again, game changer!"

Mattie Kelly: The City has a storm water outfall located at Mattie Kelly Park and Nature Walk which is a part of the Joe's Bayou Recreation Area. This storm water outfall serves the wetland area adjacent to Joe's Bayou Recreation Area and a significant area of the surrounding residential neighborhood. The outfall is undersized, and

during storm events with high water levels in the bay, the bay water will run inland through the outfall. This project should be out to bid Fall 2025.

There are, of course, more projects in motion, like the Linear Trail (a new east-to-west connector for walkers and cyclists, currently in easement negotiations) and the Shore at Crystal Beach, for which the Development Order has been approved.

"As our schools grow and more families call Destin home, our parks, roads, facilities and beaches need to grow with them. Years from now, people will see this time as a turning point for our city," said Wagner.


Truthfully, Mom was a little weirded out by this request. After all, people HAD been praying for the boy back home. Friends and family had been praying around the clock, actually.





# People Using SNAP & Other Programs Need Help

In our Facebook locals group, Destinites (www.Facebook.com/groups/Destinites), one member recently expressed concern for people who rely on SNAP and other assistance programs. These programs are in danger of being suspended due to the government shutdown. Those who need help must know where to turn.
