## Festival of the Arts Marks 30 Years of Color, Creativity and Community

The first time I walked into the Mattie Kelly Arts Foundation office, it felt like coming home. It reminded me of my mom-a talented artist with a gift for detail who loved bringing barns, old buildings, people, trees and landscapes to life in watercolor and pen & ink. Growing up, weekends often meant traveling to art shows, helping her set up and soaking in the creative buzz of those events. I even sold my own pet rocks (don't judgesome of you remember!) and tried my hand at leatherwork

and paint. Those early shows were my first classrooms in community—how art unites strangers in one place and somehow sends them home as friends.

Perhaps that's why today, as a Mattie Kelly Arts Foundation (MKAF) board member, my love of art and artists still runs deep. And the Festival of the Arts remains one of my favorite times of year. This year, we celebrate MKAF's 30th anniversary, a milestone for one of the Southeast's premier juried art festivals.

Group was the extraordinary, world-wide impact of his ministry. The following excerpt is drawn from an editorial written by Metropolitan Tikhon Shevkuno, Patriarch of the Russian Orthodox Church, in an article from Orthodox Christianity—offering a perspective from the other side of the Christian faith tradition.

## Excerpt from Metropolitan Tikhon Shevkuno, Patriarch of the Russian Orthodox Church:

Just a week ago, the name Charlie Kirk was virtually unknown in Russia. Then, like a supernova explosion, he burst into our information space, unleashing a wave of both indignation and admiration. Some saw in him the embodiment of values they found unacceptable and reacted with open hatred and outrage toward Kirk: "How can an American (an American!) be like that?"

Others—astonished and grieved that he is no longer among the living—discovered in him an unexpected kindred spirit. Death, without a doubt, became both the chief sermon

and the pinnacle of Charles Kirk's ministry. It also illuminated his complete image—one filled with faith, resolve and Christian love—refuting the slanders of those who read the Gospel with their soul's eyes shut, failing to understand that the bold defense of Gospel truth is love in action.

The murderer—and all those who stood behind him—are powerless to place a final period on the existence of a man who believes in Christ. And in the hearts of millions of his like-minded followers and friends, Charlie's martyred death breathed new, greatly multiplied life in service of their goals, thoughts, and convictions.

In an age of post-truth, relativism, and libertarianism—when reality is constructed by the media and social networks, and conformity has become the norm—truth is drowning in a sea of political correctness. Charlie Kirk dared to go against the current. He acknowledged no shades of gray, no compromises, no deals with the conscience. He couldn't have cared less about what was fashionable, accepted, or dictated by the crowd. He allowed himself

"I'm nothing without Jesus. I'm a sinner. I fall incredibly short of the glory of God. We all do. I gave my life to the Lord in fifth grade, and it's the most important decision I've ever made, and everything I do incorporates Jesus Christ."



a luxury almost unheard of in our time—to call things by their proper names, even if that meant that such a royal choice would, inevitably and without a doubt, bring a series of consequences, including the most dreadful ones.

What is especially admirable about Charlie Kirk is his willingness to go and speak about the Kingdom of Heaven, about traditional values, about conservative principles in the very places that seemed most unsuitable—places whose inhabitants, for the most part, do not want to hear anything of the kind. He chose a "mission field" perhaps the most important, but—as we now see—far from safe, not unlike preaching somewhere among a tribe of cannibals. University campuses, the youth culture of Generations Z and Y. But Charlie Kirk, even among

these young and often aggressive beings—so dearly loved by him in a truly Christian way, each one of whom he saw as bearing the image and likeness of God—was not afraid to be a "black sheep," was not afraid to go against the current, was not afraid to speak the truth as he understood it, even if it frequently provoked anger and rejection.

The example of Charlie Kirk is a lesson for us.

Charlie Kirk spoke, first and foremost, about what he truly believed. His sincere passion, integrity, and conviction were contagious to young people and compelled them to think. That is precisely why he was both loved and hated—but he left no one indifferent.

The life and death of Charlie Kirk—his entire life's work—cannot help but evoke the deepest respect. His stand against retreat and decline, against what our Orthodox elder Father John (Krestiankin) once called "the march of the destroyer," proved, despite the confessional differences, to be strikingly resonant for many of us.

On October 25–26, the MKAF Cultural Arts Village in Destin will transform into a kaleidoscope of creativity, color and connection. Festivalgoers can stroll through more than 100 artist tents filled with orig-

inal artwork from throughout the U.S., experience live demonstrations, enjoy continuous live music, and sample food truck fare or relax in the beer and wine garden. Street performers will bring their playful artistry, children can dive into hands-on art activities, and visitors can cast their vote for the People's Choice Award on Saturday. Admission is free, ensuring this beloved event remains accessible to all.

"The Festival of the Arts is one of our signature events," says Festival Producer Deb Nissley, "It's where our mission to enhance and inspire every life through Arts and Culture truly comes alive."

### A Legacy Rooted in Community

The festival is inseparable from the story of the Mattie Kelly Arts Foundation itself. Founded in 1995 in honor of Destin matriarch Mattie May Kelly, the Foundation grew out of her vision that the cultural arts should be available to everyone. A pianist, organist, composer, poet and patron of the arts, Mattie dedicated her life to learning and to lifting others. Together with her husband, Coleman, she helped pioneer Destin's tourism and fishing industries while remaining a generous benefactor of culture and community.

Today, MKAF carries her legacy forward. Over the past three decades, the Foundation has delivered more than 160 ArtsReach programs, partnering with 100+ schools and agencies to bring the arts to students, veterans and individuals with special needs. Each year, more than 25,000 participants experience these programs—everything from music residencies in classrooms to therapeutic art sessions for military families. Since its founding, MKAF has touched more than 420,000 lives throughout Northwest Florida. And it's not just individualsmore than 500 business and individual patrons continue to fuel this work, proving that when a community invests in the arts, everyone benefits.

#### **A Showcase for Artists**

Hospitality is at the heart of the Festival of the Arts. Year after year, artists return not only for the opportunity of multi-year sales, but for the experience itself. Staff and volunteers work year-round to create a warm and welcoming environment where creativity thrives. Jurying is conducted by three art industry professionals, and awards totaling \$12,000 are distributed, including Best in Show, People's

## The Resting Tree Opens in Niceville:

## A Safe Haven for Adults with Special Needs

On September 15, 2025, The Ground Up Project officially opened the doors to The Resting Tree, an adult day program in Niceville designed to provide a safe, supportive and enriching space for individuals with autism and other special needs.

For families across Northwest Florida, the opening marked more than just a ribbon cutting—it answered a critical question: What happens when children with autism become adults? Too often, programs end at 18, leaving families scrambling for resources and support. The Resting Tree was created to change that, offering adults ages 16–55 opportunities to learn, connect and thrive long after traditional services end.

Inside the center, participants find dedicated spaces including a Technology Room, Activities Room, Reading Room, Skills Room and Sensory Room. Programming blends skill-building with joy—arts and crafts, physical fitness, life skills and social



interaction. Local businesses and volunteers enrich the curriculum with sessions in yoga, art and financial literacy. With both half-day and full-day options, caregivers can feel confident their loved ones are in a nurturing environment designed for growth and independence.

The Resting Tree also offers peace of mind through professional oversight. A medical professional is available on site five days a week to assist participants with limited medical needs, and the program operates within the best practices of the Agency for Persons with Disabilities.

"This is more than a day program—it's the beginning of something bigger," the Ground Up Project team shared. The day program represents Phase One of a broader vision: building a long-term residential community where adults with autism and special needs can live in a supportive, inclusive environment.

That vision wouldn't be possible without the community. Sponsors, families, and volunteers rallied around the mission, donating time, resources, and



expertise to bring The Resting Tree to life. As one parent put it, the program provides not only care for their child but also "a place where they can belong, build friendships, and feel valued."

Income from the day program will directly support this future growth, ensuring sustainability while meeting immediate needs. Families who attended the August 24 Open House described it as "a dream becoming reality" and emphasized the relief of having an option that nurtures their adult children



with dignity and purpose.

## Destin Charity Wine Auction Foundation Donates \$3 Million to Local Children's Charities

More than \$38 million donated to help children in need in Northwest Florida since 2005

The Destin Charity Wine Auction Foundation (DCWAF) recently donated \$3 million to 16 local children's charities following another successful year of fundraising. The funds were awarded at a private check presentation ceremony on Sept. 18 at the Hilton Sandestin Beach Golf Resort and Spa. Since its inception in 2005, the organization has given more than \$38 million to help children in need across Northwest Florida.

"As we bring our 20th anniversary to a close, I find myself reflecting on the extraordinary vision and dedication of our founders—the foundation upon which our success has been built," said DCWAF President Karah Fridley-Young. "Their legacy has carried us to this milestone, and it now falls to us to ensure that same spirit carries forward for the next 20 years and beyond. The continued success of DCWAF is not only vital to our mission, but also essential to the well-being of the partner charities we fund. As we look ahead, a steadfast focus on sustainability will be key to securing our future and deepening our impact."

#### **2025** Beneficiaries

Sixteen charities received funding to support programs that directly impact children and families in need:

**Ascension Sacred Heart Emerald Coast** – \$210,000 for fetal monitors, Giraffe warmers, and other NICU equipment.

Boys & Girls Clubs of the Emerald Coast – \$250,000 to provide access to a licensed mental health counselor and subsidize youth development programs benefiting more than 200 children annually.

Caring & Sharing of South Walton – \$200,000 to expand family counseling services and its Kids Specific Pantry with diapers, formula, and other essentials.

**Children in Crisis** – \$225,000 to provide housing, food, clothing, and care for abused, neglected, and abandoned children.

**Children's Home Society of Florida** (newest beneficiary) – \$150,000 to expand schoolbased services including tutoring, medical, and behavioral health care.

Children's Volunteer Health Network - \$175,000



to staff and maintain the Mobile Dental Clinic, serving uninsured and underinsured children.

Ellison McCraney Ingram Foundation – \$200,000 for scholarships for teens who have benefited from at least one DCWAF partner charity.

Emerald Coast Autism Center – \$200,000 to support the Phase II Learning Center, expanding programs for teens in the Transition to Work program.

Emerald Coast Children's Advocacy Center – \$225,000 to fund mental health therapy, case advocacy, and the CARES abuse-prevention program.

Habitat for Humanity of

**Walton County** – \$275,000 to build two new homes for local families.

Mental Health Association of Okaloosa and Walton Counties – \$137,000 to fund the Brain Health Program for uninsured students ages 12–21.

**Opportunity Place, Inc.** – \$175,000 to provide emergency housing and child-centered support for homeless families.

**Point Washington Medical Clinic** – \$150,000 for pediatric medications, nutrition programming, and family resources.

The Arc of the Emerald Coast – \$100,000 to renovate its children's daycare program facility for kids with developmental differences.

**Westonwood Ranch** – \$175,000 to provide scholar-ships and transportation support for students with developmental differences.

for program operations, teacher salaries, and scholarships for low-income children in VPK and after-school programs.


In addition to these grants, DCWAF contributed \$93,000 to the Jumonville Family Children's Fund, a reserve established to strengthen the organization's long-term sustainability and serve as a safety net for its partner charities during emergencies.



## A Beacon of Hope: Crossroads Center Expands with Spiritual Health and Wellness Building

On Tuesday, August 26th, 2025, Crossroads Center celebrated breaking ground for its new Spiritual Health and Wellness building. Cindy Bray summarizes what defines their growth.

"I may be the Executive Director, but really, Crossroads directs me."

Since 2007, Crossroads Cen-

ter has served our community faithfully, not only through the mission to provide spiritual, medical, and dental care through God's love, but in the unwavering dedication of its Board of Directors, administration, medical providers, counselors and volunteers. Cindy recalls how Crossroads got started.

"In 2005, a mobile dental ministry visited the area, orga-

nized by Dr. Herschel Adams, a pastor who has since passed. At that time, he knew he had availability for approximately 70 appointments. On the day he arrived, however, close to 200 people were there, hoping for help.

Knowing he didn't have enough appointments, he had to tell over a hundred people that they would not receive care that day, and it broke his heart."

Dr. Adams, acknowledging the need and determined not to ignore the call, spent the next two years partnering with medical and law professionals, business entities, churches and individuals who wanted to serve their communities.

Since Crossroads opened in 2007, they have served Okaloosa and Walton counties in a way that acknowledges all the different aspects of what it takes to truly feel well – having your medical, emotional, and spiritual needs met with compassionate care.

Three branches make up Crossroads' primary services, free of charge to qualifying patients: medical, dental, and counseling. First, the medical team addresses primary and



preventative care with a focus on the management of chronic disease and medication assistance. Select specialists are also available onsite and through referrals. Next, area dentists donate their time to administer initial and comprehensive exams, cleanings, and panoramic x-rays, as well as fillings and extractions. Finally, counselors and life coaches provide Christian counseling while offering spiritual, emotional, and mental health resources. While all these are available, the patient gets to decide what they need.

It is this last branch that will be most impacted by the new building and the rooms that it will provide.

"Crossroads Center is our name because we don't just care for physical needs. In 2022, we started our counseling services. We knew that for our patients to truly move toward healing, mental health and counseling



had to be addressed. Sometimes people just need some encouragement. We currently have a licensed clinical social worker who helps our patients connect to resources, and we also have a patient liaison who is a life coach. She is a big encourager and recently helped five people gain employment. That really is our goal – keep people working and participating in their lives."

The new expansion will offer rooms with more privacy and soundproofing for counseling sessions as well as spaces to meet and conduct classes for diabetes education, nutrition, and possibly cooking classes.


"We want to equip people to make better choices and know what to do with what they learn."

## **Post-Acute Care for Seniors:**

## The Critical Bridge After a Hospital Stay

The autumn season, with its rich colors and comforting traditions, offers a wonderful opportunity to enhance the postacute care and rehabilitation experience. The landscape of post-acute senior care is rapidly evolving, moving away from a one-size-fits-all approach toward personalized, technology-driven, and holistic models. As the senior population grows in our area, innovative ideas are being implemented to improve outcomes, enhance quality of life and address the complex needs of patients transitioning from acute care settings like hospitals.

Post-acute care (PAC) refers to a range of medical and supportive services provided to patients, particularly seniors, who are discharged from an acute care hospital, but aren't yet ready to return home and live independently. Following an illness, surgery or injury, a hospital stay can often be destabilizing for older adults, leading to a decline in their physical and mental functioning. PAC serves as

a critical transition to promote functional recovery, maximize independence and prevent unnecessary hospital readmissions. For seniors transitioning out of the hospital, whether to a PAC (Post Acute Care) facility or directly home, preparation and proactive management are vital for a successful recovery.

### Benefits and Challenges for Older Adults

Benefits of Post-Acute Care in a Skilled Nursing and Rehab Facility:

Increased Independence: The primary goal is to help seniors regain strength and functional abilities (like walking, dressing, and eating) to become more self-sufficient.

**Reduced Readmissions:** Close monitoring and ongoing medical support help to identify and address potential complications early, which significantly lowers the risk of the patient returning to the hospital within 30 days.

Access to Specialized Care: Patients receive care from a multidisciplinary team, including specialized 24/7 nursing

care (i.e. wound care, IV therapy, medication management), physical therapists, speech therapists, occupational therapists, and physicians who focus specifically on recovery. The goal is for the patient to regain strength and function and safely return home.

Understand the Discharge Plan: Meet with the hospital's discharge planner or case manager as early as possible. Get written clear instructions on all new or changed medications, wound care, activity restrictions, and signs of complications to watch for.

Complexity of Discharge Planning: The process of choosing the right setting, understanding insurance coverage, and coordinating care can be confusing and stressful. Carefully review what all post-acute hospital providers offer. It is your right to choose where you would like to go for post-hospital care. Make an informed choice.

**Insurance for Post-Acute Care:** Insurance coverage for this type of care is particularly through regular Medicare.

General overview of Medi-

care coverage for key post-acute care settings:

1. Skilled Nursing Facility (SNF) Care Insurance Coverage

**Coverage:** Medicare Part A (Hospital Insurance) covers skilled nursing care on a short-term basis for rehabilitation or skilled medical care.

#### **Conditions for Coverage:**

- You must have a qualifying inpatient hospital stay of at least three consecutive days (not counting the day of discharge).
- You must enter the SNF generally within 30 days of leaving the hospital.
- A doctor must certify that you need daily skilled nursing or rehabilitation services.
- The facility must be Medicare-certified.

Costs (in one benefit period):

**Days 1–20:** You pay \$0 for covered services (after meeting the Part A deductible for the hospital stay).

**Days 21–100:** You pay a daily coinsurance amount (which changes annually).

Days 101 and beyond: You

pay all costs.

**Limitation:** Coverage is limited to 100 days per benefit period and ends sooner if you no longer require skilled care. Medicare generally does not cover long-term or custodial care in a nursing home.

Medicare Advantage (Part C) Plans: These private plans must cover at least the same post-acute care benefits as original Medicare, but they may have different cost-sharing (copayments/deductibles) and may require you to use specific in-network providers. We often see a patient who has a MA (Part C) plan and still think they have regular Medicare. Be sure to check your plan as not all postacute providers are in network or accept Part C plans. Part C Plans (MA) require an authorization by your insurance company and your care is monitored by a caseworker at the insurance agency.

Medicare Supplement (Medigap) Plans: These plans work with Original Medicare and can help pay for out-of-

## Florida Approves \$83.3M Purchase to Expand Destin Beach Access

Florida's Cabinet, chaired by Gov. Ron DeSantis, has approved an \$83.3 million purchase of 4 acres on Destin Harbor to expand Norriego Point Beach Access and Park and block future high-density development. The Sept. 30 decision marks one of the most expensive land acquisitions in state history, aimed at both conservation and public recreation.

According to the Cabinet staff report, the newly acquired land directly abuts Norriego Point and will connect the park



to Gulf Shore Drive. While currently zoned for high-density residential use, the purchase preserves the site for public access and prevents construction of up to 80 luxury condominiums.

Once incorporated, the park will total nearly 16 acres and include over 100 parking spaces along with new opportunities for boating, fishing, and swimming. Okaloosa County will manage the property in partnership with the City of Destin and adiabased contributing up to

has discussed contributing up to \$5 million toward development.

The seller, Pointe Mezzanine

LLC and Pointe Resort LLC, is controlled by Louisiana businessman Robert Guidry, who purchased the parcels in 2016–17 for roughly \$8 million. The state's official purchase price of \$83,326,520 (about \$20.83 million per acre) is consistent with recent appraisals authorized by the Legislature.

Though Chief Financial Officer Blaise Ingoglia expressed concerns about the cost, he ultimately joined other Cabinet members in approving the acquisition as part of a bundled land-deals package. Local leaders applauded the decision, calling it a direct response to public demand for more beach access and parking.

"This is a tremendous asset," said Okaloosa County Commission Chairman Paul Mixon. "The state has answered that for us."

Next steps: Okaloosa County will coordinate with the state on operations, capital projects, and rule enforcement, while assuming the docking facility lease to operate a new public marina.

## **Destin's Memorial Reef Stands Apart**

Communities around the world have launched a range of memorials to honor Charlie Kirk, from statues on campuses to proposed coins and street-renaming efforts. In Florida, plans are underway to erect statues of Kirk on public grounds. In Utah, a fundraising campaign is underway to establish a memo-

rial on the Utah Valley University campus, where he was fatally shot. Meanwhile, efforts to erect a Kirk statue in the U.S. Capitol have also emerged, backed by members of Congress.

NFL teams across the country have observed moments of silence before games to mark his passing, while vigils, candlelight

services and campus gatherings have also become common.

These memorials share one common trait: they are static, symbolic structures on land. Destin's approach, by contrast, aims to be dynamic and life-giving.

A Charlie Kirk Memorial Reef will be constructed at Walter Marine in Orange Beach, Ala., and later deployed about two miles off Henderson Beach. Construction is scheduled to begin Oct. 14 — Kirk's birthday

— and local organizers are raising \$17,000 to fund materials, engineering and deployment.

When completed, the reef will stand 15 to 18 feet tall and weigh over 15 tons, making it far larger than typical memorial reefs, which often reach only around 8 feet in height. It will be inscribed with Kirk's name, the Turning Point USA logo and additional dedications.

Led by Capt. Mike Parker—founder of the Destin High School fishing class who launched the memorial reef idea—the project seeks to honor Kirk in a distinctly local, aquatic way. The reef will not only commemorate his life, but also serve as a functional marine structure, enhancing habitat and biodiversity.

By combining ecological value with remembrance, the Destin reef stands apart from more conventional memorials — a submerged monument intended to live and grow, not merely to be viewed.







## **Rotary Club of Destin Expands** Rescue Tube Project Across Okaloosa County

The Rotary Club of Destin has expanded its Public Rescue Tube (PRT) Project which began with installations in the City of Destin earlier this year,

cations throughout Okaloosa County beaches.

Phase 1 of this countywide expansion, which is being done

to now include additional lo- in partnership with the Rotary Club of Fort Walton Beach, will place 26 new rescue tubes at public beach access points. Already, 16 tubes are fully spon-



sored by local businesses and individuals, leaving only 10 sponsorship opportunities available at the time of this printing. Each \$500 sponsorship covers the cost of the rescue tube, installation and five years of maintenance, with the sponsor's name/logo featured on the tube's signage for that period.

"These tubes are already making a difference at Destin beach accesses," said Rotary project co-chairs Dion Moniz and Wayne Bernheisel. "Now, we are excited to expand this proven program across more parts of Okaloosa County, making our beaches even safer for residents and visitors."

#### **The Facts Behind Rescue Tubes**

- 600+ stations are already in place across the U.S. and Can-
- 200+ successful rescues have been made using these tubes.
- Every known rescue with a tube has been successful.
- No rescuer has ever been injured while using a Rescue Tube.

#### **Why Rescue Tubes Work**

According to the World Health Organization, drowning is the third leading cause of unintentional death worldwide, claiming approximately 236,000 lives each year. It is also the #1 cause of death for children ages 1-4. Florida recorded 465 accidental drowning deaths in 2023, many in areas without lifeguard protection.

Rescue tubes provide flotation for both the victim and the bystander attempting a rescue, dramatically reducing the risk of a double tragedy. A 25-year study by the Hawaii Department of Health found that rescuer deaths fell from 60% to

13% after PRTs were installed; in areas without tubes, there was no reduction in rescuer deaths. while in areas with tubes there was a 100% reduction in rescuer deaths.

#### **District-Wide Safety Effort**

The Destin initiative is part of a larger regional effort led by Rotary Clubs and partners to protect swimmers across Northwest Florida. Rescue tubes have already been installed or approved in the following areas: Navarre (16), Perdido Key (4), Pensacola Beach (5), Panama City Beach (10), Bay County (10), Destin (9), Freeport (2), Eglin AFB (2) and Walton County (58). With Okaloosa County's planned 26 new installations, the Emerald Coast is quickly becoming one of the most rescue-ready beach regions in the country.

#### **Affordable & Sustainable**

While each PRT station costs roughly \$245 to install (tube, signage, post, hardware), the \$500 sponsorship fee ensures long-term sustainability. Rotary members and volunteers inspect the stations every 4-6 weeks, before peak tourist seasons and after major storms. Annual community "work parties" handle larger repairs, and signage includes a public phone number for reporting damage or missing equipment.

"This is a hands-on way to save lives in our community," Moniz said. "We encourage local businesses and individuals to join us in this important effort."



## Golf Series: **Teeing It Up to Fight Cancer at The Raven Golf Club**

As I write columns about our area golf courses, often describing the physical challenges of the layout of the course itself, I am reminded that these acres of green represent more than opportunities to enjoy a sport. They are opportunities for the community to help non-profits and charities in a special way.

I have several friends who are fighting battles with cancer. I personally understand what it feels like to have the doctor tell you that you have cancer. I know what it's like to be hooked

up and injected with bags of chemical during chemotherapy. I know what it's like when the doctor tells you that you are in "remission." I know.

What I don't know is what a parent must feel when their precious child is diagnosed with cancer. How do they feel? How do they explain this to their child? What do they do? Where do they go?

So, when I read in Destin Life that there was a golf tournament to support this fight against cancer, I knew I had to learn more about this cause.

On Friday, September 12 at The Raven Golf Club over 70 golfers responded to play golf in the 2nd Annual Golf4The-Cure-Gulf Coast Tournament. I reached out to Scott Erby, co-sponsor with Kellyanne Bartleson to tell me more. Hosted at The Raven Golf Club at Sandestin in Miramar Beach, Florida, golfers were sure to enjoy the outing in perfect autumn weather.



Scott shared the background for this unique fundraiser that began with a devastating experience no parent should have to face.

In 2009. Scott's young son, Cooper, just 4 years old, was diagnosed with a rare brain stem tumor- Ependymoma. Over the next three years, thanks to groundbreaking research and care at St. Jude Children's Research Hospital, with 64 radiation treatments and 10 months of chemotherapy, Cooper was cured. Today, Cooper, 21 years old, is pursuing his undergrad-

uate degree at the Business School at the University of Tennessee in Knoxville.

Inspired by his journey, Scott and others founded Golf4The-Cure in the Westhaven community of Franklin, Tennessee. Did you know that September is Childhood Cancer Awareness Month? Yes, the focus every year in September is on curing childhood cancer. This golf nonprofit raised over \$1 million dollars from 2009-2016 for St. Jude. At St.Jude Children's Research Hospital families never receive a bill for treatment, travel housing or food.

To continue raising awareness and support, Golf4The-Cure Gulf Coast was launched in 2024 with the Sandestin community.

The tournament was organized in 2 person and 4 person teams. Winners of the two-person teams were as follows:


Make a Wish team: Raz Cuparencu and Shannon Merritt with a score of 71

wanted to use snarky words to put them in their place. Perhaps you wanted to justify your rightness and their wrongness. Or, you may have judged them from a place of self-righteousness. Maybe you labeled the person as bad and less valuable. And, maybe, most of all, you decided to see them as your enemy.

Labeling others as enemies is easy and comfortable, because it allows you to feel right and to avoid self-examination. When you label someone as "them" or your enemy, you view them as a villain and yourself as a victim; a victim of their behavior, a victim of their values, a victim of their decisions. Initially, labeling someone as an enemy feels intoxicating.

You feel justified, good, right and have the illusion of standing on higher moral ground. However, eventually, seeing yourself as a victim creates insidious results. You begin to feel resentful, bitter, vengeful, powerless, depressed and hateful.

In many cases, embracing victimhood results in you becoming a different version of a villain. You may find yourself feeling justified in "an eye for an eye" perspective toward your proclaimed enemies because,

after all, their bad behavior justifies your poor response. Labeling others as enemies gives a false sense of permission to treat others poorly without taking accountability for living out your own values. Making others into enemies most often stirs up fear, hatred and defensiveness, rather than stirring love, compassion, confidence and kindness.

While it's an undeniable reality you will encounter, people who challenge your values and sensibilities, ultimately you are responsible for how you show up in the world. Someone else's behavior or attitude does not determine yours, even when you see them as an enemy. You have the empowered ability to be in charge of your attitude and behavior regardless of how anyone else is showing up. So, how do you walk away from making enemies easily and lead with love instead?

## 7 Ways to Lead with Love Even When It's Hard

**Notice.** Notice who you see as an enemy. Who is hard for you to love? Why? Be curious within yourself about why you are bothered by the other person. Focus less on the other person's behavior and more on what is happening inside of you

in response to them.

**Self-examine.** Reflect on your own struggles. Where are you being unforgiving, unkind, judgmental, self-righteous, envious. Remember your own imperfection before you judge others harshly and label them as enemies. Imagine the grace you would like to receive from others in your areas of weakness when you consider your approach toward others.

**Remember our shared humanity.** Being human isn't easy and can be a painful struggle. Often those you see as enemies are hurt people struggling with wounds they don't know how to resolve. Try preceding your judgement with understanding and compassion.

Remember your values. Do you value love, forgiveness, justice, goodness, kindness? Consider how you can align your treatment of others with your values in the way you hope others would apply them to you.

Love anyway. Try walking in the way of love toward others, even those who feel like enemies. Do something kind when you want to retaliate. Be generous when you want to punish. Walk away when you want to say something unkind. Pray for people who challenge you. Practice radical love even when it is hard to do so. In loving this way, it will become more clear to you how loved you are by God. Also, it is hard to demonize others when you are busy loving them.

**Engage your power.** You are not a victim of anyone, no matter how difficult the other person is for you. You have been given the power to determine how you want to live and treat people. Use your power wisely and for the greater good.

**Release.** Release your perceived right to hold grudges and hatred toward others. Clinging to bitterness poisons you and the world around you.

We live in a cultural moment that encourages us to see enemies around every corner. Consider trying something different. Instead, remember the best chance of inspiring change in others and the world is to embody a loving, joyful approach to your values while inviting others to come along. 

## Caregiving for a Loved One with Alzheimer's:

## Tips for a Compassionate Journey

Brook Batson and her family recently moved to Freeport, FL from Tennessee to help take care of her Father-in-law who has Alzheimer's.

They moved in with her mother-in-law to assist her in taking care of her husband.

"He is mobile but gets very confused," Batson said. "Thankfully, he does remember myself, my husband, Danny and my kids. Once we knew what was going on, we wanted to come before there was a crisis."

Baton shares what she wants people to know about Alzheimer's and other dementia.

"This is a disease, not just age appropriate behavior, yes some behaviors are age appropriate but if they can't manage a majority of their daily activities on their own, it's more than aging," Baton said.

According to research from the Alzheimer's Association International Conference, more than 1,500 Walton County residents age 65 and up are living with the disease. Florida has the second highest prevalence of Alzheimer's in the U.S, with more than 580,000 Floridians living with the disease supported by 870,000 unpaid caregivers.

For more than 17 years Brook worked in senior care, both assisted living and memory care. Her passion for helping families through their journey with dementia has now hit her own family. She offers this advice.

"Find a support group, go to the alz.org website, call an



assisted living facility as some have memory care daycare, surround yourself with those who understand what you are going through," she said. "Manage it as a family, as it takes a village."

For many, caregiving can be overwhelming and individuals in the role often report experiencing higher rates of stress. According to the Alzheimer's Association 2025 Alzheimer's Disease Facts and Figures report, 66% of Florida caregivers

reported at least one chronic health condition, 29% reported having depression and 14% reported being in poor physical health.

Practicing self-care is vital to ensure both the caregiver and the person being cared for can have the best quality of life. Services like respite care, adult day care, and support groups can ease the challenges of caregiving. Many of these are available at low or no cost to Floridians through state and local programs. 
to uplifting music, or color like a kid again. Cooler evenings invite us to slow down and reflect.



### Pain in the Foot

Over the last couple months, I have talked to friends and acquaintances that have shared their struggle with Planter Fasciitis. Maybe you or someone you

know is dealing with this 'pain in the foot.'

The plantar fascia (noted as pf) if a fibrous tissue that connects the toes to the heel along the bottom of the foot. This thick band can become overstretched or have excess strain due to repetitive stress, which can lead to chronic degeneration or small tears in the fascia fibers where it connects to the heel bone. In addition, ultrasounds often show calcifications and a thickening of the pf.

The cause is not fully understood, but has been connected to activities such as running, ballet and other types of dance, age, weight or occupation.

The pain experienced most often shows up first thing in the morning when the foot first touches the floor and is localized in the heel. This is due to overnight inactivity and the pf stiffening (like a sore muscle). Choosing to avoid walking on the foot can eventually lead to problems in the foot, knee, hip or back.

## There are several therapies that can aid in the healing process:

- **Stretching:** Take time before letting your feet hit the floor to slowly stretch. Place your ankle over your knee, pull the toes up until you feel the stretch. Holding that position gently massage the pf for a few minutes. This will help the pf to relax relieving some of the sharp pain one experiences after a period of inactivity.
- Calf Stretch: Standing in front of a wall bend the knee on the good foot a step back on the affected foot. Slowly move the injured foot from the balls of the foot to placing the heel on the ground. This stretches both the calf and the pf. If you can't place your heel on the ground due to the pain, bring the leg in a bit to lessen the 'stretch.'
- Ice the foot after stretching or if your pf begins to act up

due to over-activity.

- **Athletic Tape:** Learn how to properly apply from a professional such as a physical therapist to support your pf during your active times.
- **Night Splints:** This over the counter product keeps the pf in a stretched position while you sleep which can lessen the pain experienced upon rising.
- **Orthotics:** These can support your pf during the day.
- **Boot, Cane, Crutches:** These can be helpful with severe cases or to allow the inflammation to decrease before adding other treatments.
- **Steroids:** The use of steroid injections can offer temporary relief. However, multiple shots are not recommended as they can weaken the pf and possibly cause it to rupture.
- Plasma Injections: Platelet rich plasma from your own blood can be injected to promote healing. An ultrasound is used to aid in precise needle placement.
- Extracorporeal Shock Wave Therapy: This is for chronic plantar fasciitis when other therapies have failed. Sound waves are directed at the area of the heal pain to stimu-

late healing. This therapy hasn't been shown to be consistently effective even though some studies have shown promising results.


- Ultrasonic Tissue Repair: A minimally invasive technology where ultrasound imaging is used to guide a needlelike probe into the damaged pf tissue. The probe tip vibrates rapidly to break up the damaged tissue which is then suctioned out.
- **Surgery:** When all else fails. The surgery entails detaching the pf from the heel bone.

There are so many fall festivals coming our way. If you don't want to miss your favorite ones, be sure to include breaks throughout your day to stretch and massage your pf and don't forget your orthotics. Taking care of our feet allows us to have a more active and fun life. Even if you have healthy feet, a good foot massage from time to time couldn't hurt.

# A Pastor's Ponderings: Paradise Found

One of the criminals who hung there hurled insults at him: "Aren't you the Christ? Save yourself and us!"

But the other criminal rebuked him. "Don't you fear God," he said, "since you are under the same sentence? We are punished justly, for we are getting what our deeds deserve. But this man has done nothing wrong."

Then he said, "Jesus, remember me when you come into your kingdom."

Jesus answered him, "I tell you the truth, today you will be with me in paradise." Luke 23:39-43

The girl's twisted posture revealed a lifelong struggle. A birth injury had left Sally with cerebral palsy, and she spent her days in a wheelchair. Yet, her radiant smile lit up every room she entered. The first time I met her at church, her head bobbed as she looked up at me, but her eyes sparkled like fireworks, and we became instant friends.

Sally came to worship whenever her health allowed. During her teen years, hospital stays became more frequent. We all celebrated when a young man invited her to the senior prom. She looked beautiful that night, her trademark smile shining in every photo. Not long after, her mother admitted her to the hospital for the last time.

I stood with her family around her bed in intensive care. We prayed, and I sensed something like the flutter of a butterfly pass near my shoulder. Sally slipped away. I believe Jesus welcomed her home that very moment—free at last to dance, her smile lighting up heaven.

Many people comfort themselves with the thought that everyone goes to a better place when they die. But Scripture tells a different story. Jesus was crucified between two criminals at Calvary. Both saw His grace as He prayed for those who nailed Him to the cross. Both heard His words to the Father. Yet their responses could not have been more different.

One thief hurled insults, demanding rescue. Suffering did not soften his heart, instead, it hardened his unbelief. He lost paradise.

The other thief recognized the truth. In his pain, he confessed his guilt and acknowledged Jesus' innocence: We are punished justly, for we are getting what our deeds deserve. But this man has done nothing wrong. His heart turned in repentance and faith. He understood that Christ's kingdom was not of this world and pleaded, Jesus, remember me when you come into your kingdom.

That simple prayer brought a breathtaking promise. Jesus replied, I tell you the truth, today you will be with me in paradise. Even in His agony, the Savior assured him of eternal life.

The Greek word for "paradise," paradeiso, carries the meaning of "garden." In Revelation 2:7, it describes the place where the tree of life grows in heaven. Humanity's story began in a garden and, through Christ, ends in a restored one.

The two criminals portray the choice every person faces. One rejected Christ and died in despair. The other believed, and God greeted him with eternal joy. Not everyone will respond with faith, but those who do receive the same promise: immediate fellowship with the Lord in a restored garden.

The astronomer Copernicus once prayed, "I do not ask for the grace you gave to St. Paul; nor can I dare ask for the grace that you granted to St. Peter; but the mercy which you did show to the dying robber, that mercy, show to me."

Like the repentant thief, we can find mercy, peace and assurance in Christ. Paradise lost in Eden is now paradise found in heaven—flung open by the Savior who died to bring us home.



One of the most under-rated investigative techniques but highly effective – is to canvass an area when a person is missing and murder is strongly suspected. The concept is to identify the perimeters of a neighborhood and then put that neighborhood under a dome of law enforcement supervision. Ideally, all entry and exit points are to be monitored until law enforcement checks the inner perimeter.

The neighborhood canvass and the roadblock canvass are two types of canvassing that work in tandem. The neighborhood canvass consists of several two-person law enforcement teams, armed with a customized questionnaire, and tasked to visit each residence in the neighborhood. The purpose of each team is to identify every person that resides in that household. All individuals eligible for interview complete the questionnaire as required by law enforcement authorities.

The customized questionnaire consists of questions to determine identifiers such as name and date of birth, and to determine if the resident has any knowledge about the missing person. This could be as simple

as a resident noting odd actions or behaviors in someone close to the missing person, or a car that seemed out of place. The questionnaire can also be to identify transient occupants such as overnight visitors, commercial or construction workers in the area, or even late party goers. Finally, the questions can help uncover anything out of the ordinary that occurred around the time of the disappearance.

The key to an effective and thorough neighborhood canvass is to assign a strict supervisor to oversee the operation. The supervisor inspects each team's results for thorough completion. If a listed resident was not interviewed, the team must return to interview everyone. Only when this occurs AND the residence is searched should the canvass supervisor accept the results of the team's efforts. The supervisor should read the answers to the questionnaire to note oddities and then can report final completion of the neighborhood canvass to the chain of command.

The purpose of a cursory search, which is conducted concurrently with the questionnaire, is to perform a visual inspection of all areas within a residence that could potentially serve as locations for concealing a body. When a murder occurs, how to dispose of a dead body can be problematic, especially if the neighborhood is swarming with law enforcement during a well conducted canvass. The offender may try to avoid a search or wait out the heat of the initial actions of law enforcement, hoping they will leave. However, if law enforcement is thorough, the body will be discovered.

The roadblock canvass happens once law enforcement has identified all entrance/exit points in an area of interest. As vehicles leave or enter, officers request consent to search the vehicle. They can also use a modified questionnaire to determine if the occupants are permanent or temporary residents or are in the neighborhood for work.

The canvass method is intrusive to the occupants of the neighborhood. However, if law enforcement can explain that the purpose of the canvass is to find the victim and to solve a major crime, most people will be understanding and gracious.

Life is complicated.

Most people abhor the thought of violent crimes in their neighborhood and want to cooperate with the police to solve these crimes.

For law enforcement, the thought of being on a canvass team sounds boring and rote. After all, they will be spending their time talking to innocent people who have no idea what occurred. However, a thorough and professional attitude towards accomplishing this seemingly dull directive gives the investigator valuable information as they rule out theories and focus on finding the victim and ultimately a killer.

If you are requested to respond to an inquiry from neighborhood canvassing teams, please be aware that your cooperation contributes to the effectiveness of law enforcement investigations. Your honest responses and openness to allow your residence to be searched may lead to solving a violent crime. Failure to cooperate may allow a murderer to remain at large and in your neighborhood.

I have personally witnessed the effectiveness of thorough canvassing operations. I have also witnessed information received during a canvass leading directly to the discovery of the victim and the identity of the killer. It works!

## **NWFSC Opens New School of Nursing**

## Ribbon Cutting Marks a Major Milestone for Healthcare Education

On September 4, Northwest Florida State College celebrated a proud new chapter with the ribbon cutting of its state-of-the-art School of Nursing building on the Niceville campus. Community leaders, alumni, and supporters joined NWFSC President Mel Ponder and Dean of Health Sciences Dr. Charlotte Kuss for tours of the new 64,000-square-foot facility.

"This expansion is more than bricks and mortar—it's a bold investment in the future of healthcare in our region," said President Mel Ponder. "With over \$34 million dedicated to growing our nursing program, we're doubling enrollment and equipping students with the most advanced technology available."

The project was made possi-



ble through \$13 million in state education construction funds and a \$21.8 million Triumph Gulf Coast grant awarded in 2023. Inside the new facility are immersive learning spaces, including virtual reality labs and high-fidelity simulation suites, giving students hands-on train-

ing in a safe, real-world environment.

"This new building is a reflection of the incredible caliber and vision that guides our nursing program," said Trustee Chair Rhea Goff. "This will allow our faculty to do even more for students' learning experienc-

es, ensuring they are prepared better than anyone for their field."

NWFSC's nursing program already outperforms state and national benchmarks. In 2024, the Associate Degree in Nursing (ADN) program achieved a 98.65% pass rate on the

NCLEX-RN exam, compared to Florida's average of 84.1% and the national average of 90.6%. Retention rates are also strong, with 94.3% of students completing the program, far above the statewide average of 77.2%.

With the new facility now open, the college is poised to double nursing enrollment by 2026, helping to meet the growing demand for skilled health-care professionals across Northwest Florida.


# Fragile Dreams, Heavy Expectations: Why The Glass Menagerie Still Speaks to Us Today

There's something about The Glass Menagerie that stays with you after the curtain falls.

Tennessee Williams' classic play feels both intimate and universal, showcasing the raw struggles of family, the reality of dreams, and the weight of expectations we all carry. It's a story that hits close to home, not through flashy moments, but through the honest feelings we usually bottle up to ourselves.

This is why The Glass Menagerie is such a powerful addition to ECTC's thirteenth season. It's not simply a play about a family in the height of the Great Depression; it's a reflection of the weight of societal pressures and expectations we all carry. Tom feels the pull between family obligations and his own ambitions, Amanda



shows the distance that parents go to protect and guide their families, even while wrestling with their own disappointments and "what ifs". These "what ifs" highlight the tragedy of Amanda's character but also a universal challenge of balancing love, guidance, and the limits of control as both a parent and a partner. Laura shows a univer-

sal vulnerability of not measuring up in a world that often feels overwhelming. For so many of us today, the path to success feels steeper than ever. College degrees are the expectation, yet the job market is tougher. Social media makes it feel like everyone else is thriving in extravagant cars and on vacation in the Maldives, adding a new layer of comparison. Many people feel like they're running out of time to "figure it out," and the weight of those expectations can be overwhelming in an everchanging world.

The characters feel trapped in their circumstances, but their aspirations for something greater is universal. We've all experienced moments where our dreams feel out of reach, where we're torn between what we owe to others and what we owe to ourselves. That's what makes The Glass Menagerie such a timeless piece of theatre. It's a story that mirrors our humanity, reminding us of both our fragility and our resilience even in the toughest of times. In recent years, we lived through COVID-19 lockdowns where the entire planet hit the pause button. It forced us to slow down, to reevaluate priorities, and to confront our own dreams and fears in a way we never expected. Like the characters on stage seeking escapism, we've experienced uncertainty, longing, and the quiet hope that something better lies ahead all while looking for outlets to make things feel as normal as we could. And it's why I think this season at ECTC is so special. Each show holds up a mirror to the human experience. The ups and downs,

the struggles and triumphs, the dreams and nightmares.

Here at ECTC, we believe storytelling is a bridge that connects us all, no matter where we come from or what we're going through. Just like Laura's glass menagerie, they reflect our vulnerabilities, our dreams, and the strength we find in community. That's why The Glass Menagerie isn't just another play on the ECTC stage, it's an invitation to see ourselves more clearly.



## From Pen and Paper to the Canvas of Life

When Bradley Vander Veen was a restless little boy, life didn't hand him the easiest beginning. With his father in prison and his mother working long hours to keep the family afloat, Bradley had energy to spare and nowhere to put it. Trouble found him often at school—until his second-grade substitute teacher had an idea.

Instead of discipline, she handed him a pen and paper. "Art was a way to express myself and have people focus positive attention on me," Vander Veen recalled. That small act of encouragement changed the trajectory of his life.

In third grade, Bradley won his first art competition with a self-portrait. In high school, he began leaving his mark on walls – through four murals. His favorite, a World War II D-Day tribute, tested his skill. "It challenged me using only gray scale and working on shadow placements," he said.

Now 32, Vander Veen's art has found a new home in Destin. His heavy acrylics and flow-







ing pours echo the rhythms of the sea. With several currently on display at the Destin Library, his paintings capture a world of marine life, landscapes, and playful perspectives.

"My work is a collection of places, animals, and experiences," he explained. "It's about understanding the planet's environments and transforming them into a unique outlook of fun and creativeness, giving people a reminder of life's simple pleasures that our planet offers daily."

One signature element of his work is the way he incorporates repurposed materials. Seashells, sand, and recyclables aren't just objects to him—they're textures, memories, and reminders of shared responsibility. "We're not the only animals using the water," he said. "I hope it inspires people to clean up after being at the beach."

While his canvases continue

to draw attention, Vander Veen also runs a full-time remodeling business—painting, power washing, and tackling nearly every task "except roofs and pools." Art, though, remains a passion. He welcomes commissions and is currently at work on a custom mural for Café Bienville in Niceville.

Vander Veen holds a bachelor's degree in Museum Studies and Gallery Practices from the University of Colorado, a pro-

gram steeped in the care, conservation, and curation of cultural works.

For Destin locals and visitors alike, his pieces can be viewed through the end of 2025.

Among the color, the grit, and the movement of the pieces lies something even more profound—the reminder that creativity can change a life.

Florida state legislators initiated a budget provision to consider spending \$84.5 million to purchase a waterfront parcel at the end of Gulf Shore Drive in Destin. The primary reason for the potential purchase was to preserve public access to the water and prevent the construction of a large, private condominium development.

As of late September 2025, Florida's state cabinet did approve purchasing about 4 acres of waterfront property in Destin for roughly \$84 million. The deal was bundled with other state land acquisitions, and one cabinet member expressed objections, but ultimately approved the package.

## Key reasons for the proposed purchase.

- Preventing development: According to State Senator Jay Trumbull, who requested the funding language, the purchase would block a planned 100-condo tower from being built on the site. The parcel is a desirable waterfront location, and the state would be preventing private development from consuming one of the last undeveloped parcels in the area.
- Expanding public access: Purchasing the land would create a new public park, ensuring that residents and tourists can continue to access the Gulf. Trumbull highlighted this goal, noting that the purchase would allow "300 families on it on any given Tuesday" versus a limited number of private condo owners.
- **Local support:** Okaloosa County has also voiced support for the project, though county officials reportedly did not re-

quest the specific budget language. The proposed purchase aligns with broader local efforts to expand and protect public beach access points.

## Budget process and next steps.

The \$84.5 million provision was included in the 2025-26 state budget by Senate negotiators

While Governor DeSantis did not initiate the request, the final budget, including this provision, was approved by the legislature and then signed by the governor.

## Some local resident, group member responses:


- 1. From what I understand, they couldn't get the permit to put a condo there because the ground would not support it. Why are we wasting this much money on that small piece of property?
- 2. I thought the condo project was canceled because the ground was too soft to build on. If that's the case we (taxpayers) are WAY over paying for this. Who else is the developer going to sell it to? I smell a rat in this deal.
- 3. Any chances they would turn it into paid public? Like a pay to park spot for that beach area or turn the point into a paid beach zone to make up for that 84.5 mil? How does Destin plan to get that money back; it's not common for Destin to spend without a certainty of a return. I'm all for no more condos being built, but I am curious how this may affect the locals in positive and negative ways.
- 4. It sounds a lot like a bailout to me.
- 5. How would 300 families

logistically enjoy this parcel? There isn't enough parking for 300 cars down there.

- 6. Yeah, I don't think anyone in Destin would want 300 cars down there but we do want the land
- 7. Waste of taxpayers' money with no parking.
- 8. Maybe but would rather have the state funds here versus spent in another location of Florida - also even though Holiday Isle is \*not\* a gated community they are letting the City know they are having trouble with getting to their homes (mostly summer & NYE) - so more parking might just jam up the area for both resident and "park goer"- not sure unless someone takes data of course & then that's still only a few months a year - maybe need volunteers to help manage parking & have an active readout near Gulf Shore Dr. & Hwy. 98 when parking is FULL.
