Freedom Houses Offer Hope, Healing and a Path Forward for Women in Need

Stephanie Fitzgerald, Founder of Freedom Life Compass, is on a mission to provide safe supportive housing for the residents who stay at the Freedom Houses located in Niceville, Fort Walton Beach, Crestview, and soon, Laurel Hill. “I want people to know change is possible. A community doesn’t always see what brings someone to homelessness. But, for moms who are living in a car with their children, a woman who is escaping domestic abuse, or any other countless circumstances women can find themselves in, we want our program to be a place of hope.”

By the age of 23, Stephanie had plenty of reasons to be hopeless. She grew up in a house with drugs, where teaching life skills to be a successful adult was not part of her training. Addiction was the norm in her home, and eventually, she became homeless. At 23, though, someone spoke words that would begin



the journey toward her calling, “You’re better than the life you’re living.”

“Not everybody ends up in homelessness, domestic violence, or addiction because of their own choices. Often, it is, but it can also be a generational issue. It’s the lifestyle we grew up in, and we don’t know any other way to live. Sometimes we end up in relationships that help our ruin. The Freedom Houses are about giving people who are ready to change the opportunity to

do so. Other people believed in me and encouraged me, and that is how we were able to open Freedom Houses, so that other women and, hopefully, one day men, will have that community around them to help them find and take their next right step.”

Each of the three homes has a different mission. Freedom House One is a transitional home for women only. It can house up to six women in a communal living space, and they are able to stay there



for a six to eighteen-month program. While there, in addition to housing, the women get training in life skills and help with clothing, food, medical needs, employment, and counseling. In turn, they are asked to adhere to the following guidelines:

Work Schedule/Rules

- Must be turned in at the weekly case plan or on the

Local Nonprofit Aims to Solve Youth Mental Health Crisis



Imagine receiving a call from your child’s school: your middle-schooler, diagnosed with ADD, lost his temper and screamed, “I wish I were dead.” Because the staff knows you, they give you the option to take him to the emergency room yourself, instead of calling law enforcement.

You arrive at the ER, but there’s no child psychologist. The ER doctor decides to send your child—seven hours away—to a facility in Orlando

day received


- Changes communicated to the program manager
- No working at restaurants that serve alcohol, convenience stores, clubs, or bars. No pet sitting or babysitting outside of regular working hours.

Daily Routines

- 7 a.m. Wake up, make your bed, get dressed, and have breakfast
- 8 a.m. Ready for Devotions
- Work - (If you do not have employment, start submitting at least 6-8 applications in a regular workday time frame, showing that you are actively seeking employment.)
- 2 hours a day on education/career goals
- Curfew 9 p.m. unless you're working or at other approved activity
- 10 p.m. Lights Out

House Rules

- Always speak from a place of love and encouragement. Let's lift one another up without judgment. We are all perfectly flawed!
 - When taking phone calls, be mindful of others and continue your call outside of the house.
 - Bring your belongings with you when taking showers, and take everything back to your room, including shampoos, conditioners, clothing, trash, etc.
 - We are all grown adults, so please pick up after yourselves. This includes washing any dishes you use and putting them away.
 - There will be no overnight stays unless we have the address and phone number and speak with the individual two weeks in advance. If we do not feel it's a safe place for you to take a home pass, we will deny it. This is for your safety and well-being.
- Freedom House Two is a short-term shelter for women until they can find a more per-



manent place to live. Freedom House Three houses women and children. Finally, Freedom House Four will be opening later this year in Laurel Hill for mothers and children. Plans are being made for animal therapy

and fostering dogs to use for rehabilitation. Those who would like to see if they qualify for housing can fill out an application at www.freedomlifecompass.org. It takes \$40 a day per person,

per night to house up to the 30 women and children the house can accommodate. This provides safe shelter, food, clothing, medications, and other daily needs. for evaluation. You object. Emotions rise. The doctor blames you and asks you to leave. Your child is transported anyway, placed in a holding area with wooden slab beds and other children in crisis, screaming. He's terrified.

Three days later, a tele-psychiatrist finds your child isn't a threat and should be released. But when you return from a brief trip home, you discover your child was already transferred to an inpatient facility in Pensacola—without your consent. He must now remain for another three days, all while you watch helplessly.

This is the true story a mother shared with me after a recent Bring Hope Now presentation. Though a few years have passed and improvements have been made—such as the addition of Mobile Response Teams that now evaluate students on campus—children in crisis in our area still face long waits in local ERs and may be transported hours away due to a lack of local facilities.

This is exactly why we founded Bring Hope Now.

A Growing Crisis

In 2019, two community leaders—David Triana, founder of United for a Good Cause, and myself, Peggy Brockman—joined forces to address a terrifying trend: Northwest Florida, particularly Okaloosa County, had one of the fastest-growing youth suicide rates in the state.

We set out to bring hope

through a national peer-to-peer suicide prevention program in local schools. Eglin Federal Credit Union kickstarted our mission with a \$50,000 donation. With support from Superintendent Marcus Chambers and the Okaloosa County School Board, the program launched in 2020. By

the end of 2022, every school in the district had the program in place. It became a model of success.

In 2024, Bring Hope Now officially separated from United for a Good Cause to pursue broader goals. We expanded into the military community with “Hope on the Line,” a peer-led suicide prevention initiative for active-duty personnel. But, another pressing need was calling us: a lack of local youth mental health facilities.

**By the Numbers:
Why Local Help Matters**

The data is staggering. In the 2022–2023 school year, 376 children under 18 in Okaloosa and Walton Counties were involuntarily Baker Acted. Of those, 76% were first-time cases, and 92 were repeat cases.

Statewide, 87% of youth Baker Acts are due to suicidality: 46% had suicidal thoughts, 28% had a plan, and 10% had made an attempt.

Children are typically taken to a local ER, where they wait for an inpatient bed to open in Pensacola or Panama City. Some

wait days. If extended treatment is needed, they’re sent even farther—to Jacksonville or Orlando—hours from family and support systems. Many families can’t even afford to retrieve their children afterward.

What if that Child Were Yours?

According to Florida Health Charts, 168 people in Okaloosa and Walton Counties went to an emergency room for self-harm injuries in 2023. Shockingly, 121 of them—72%—were children ages 5 to 19. Yes, even as young as five.

From the 2023 Florida Youth Survey:

- 22% of students said they almost always felt symptoms of stress, anxiety, or depression.
- 46% said these emotions stopped them from doing daily activities.
- 19% had seriously considered self-harm.
- Encouragingly, 31% sought help.

But we need more resources. And we need them here.

The Mission Ahead

With strong leadership from

Board Chair Kathy Houchins and a growing board of community advocates, Bring Hope Now’s next mission is clear: establish a youth mental health treatment facility for Okaloosa and Walton Counties.

We’re currently seeking a facility or land to build a welcoming, home-like inpatient center. Until that becomes a reality, we continue to train community members through QPR Gatekeeper Training—equipping everyday citizens with the tools to recognize suicide warning signs and how to respond.

We also aim to launch a local loss survivor program to support families who’ve lost loved ones to suicide.

A Community That Cares

We believe in this mission because we’ve lived it. I’ve personally experienced the pain of a suicide attempt and subsequent residential treatment with a grandson. I know what families are facing.

Bring Hope Now is not just one organization—it’s a movement of people, volunteers, educators, parents, and advocates committed to changing the story for our youth.

Top 5 Supplements to Spring into Health

Here along the Gulf Coast, the arrival of spring means longer days and a return to the outdoor living that defines our beach communities. For many, it feels like a natural inflection point of renewed momentum and a reminder to re-prioritize

energy, strength, and overall well-being. It's often during this season that people begin reaching for supplements and vitamins in hopes of supporting this shift.

At the Tortoise Clinic, I remind people that supplements are never a substitute for the fundamentals including bal-

anced, protein-forward meals made from real food, restorative sleep, building and maintaining muscle mass, hydration, and thoughtful stress management. Supplementation and targeted nutrient support are tools within a larger health strategy, most effective when guided by informed science and thoughtful clinical oversight.

Not every supplement is appropriate for every person. When selected strategically, with attention to quality, bioavailability, and individual physiology, they can support the systems that drive sustainable energy and resilience.

Here are five I commonly evaluate this time of year, and how I think about applying them.

Vitamin D - A Hormone with Broad Impact

Despite its name, Vitamin D functions as a hormone in the body. It plays a role in immune balance, bone strength, muscle function, and mood regulation. Vitamin D receptors are found throughout the body, which helps explain its wide-reaching influence.

Deficiency remains common, even living in Florida. Indoor work, sunscreen use, skin tone variability, and seasonal shifts all contribute. When levels are sub-optimal, people may notice fatigue, slower recovery, decreased muscle strength, or a subtle dip in mood.

When I look closer: recurrent illness, low energy that doesn't improve with rest, mood changes, bone or muscle con-

cerns, and limited sun exposure

Practical Tip: Vitamin D absorbs best when taken with food that contains healthy fats. Testing provides clarity — optimal levels are individualized, not guessed.

Magnesium - Calm Energy & Recovery

Magnesium supports muscle relaxation, sleep quality, blood sugar balance, and healthy stress response. It participates in hundreds of biochemical processes and is one of the most common nutrients I see run low.

Despite the beauty of coastal living, daily demands such as work, activity, travel, and stress still accumulate, and magnesium depletion is common.

Two forms I often consider:

Magnesium Glycinate: Supports relaxation and restorative sleep.

Magnesium Threonate: May support focus, cognitive clarity, and emotional steadiness.

When I look closer: muscle tension, poor sleep, stress reactivity, headaches, and difficulty focusing

Practical Tip: Magnesium glycinate is often best tolerated in the evening. Magnesium threonate can be used in the morning when focus support is desired. Some individuals divide doses based on response. Because magnesium influences muscle relaxation, higher amounts may also influence digestive rhythm. Gradual ad-

Where Strategy Meets Stillness: The Alice Expands Its Role in the Growing Corporate Retreat Economy

As corporate America continues to redefine workplace culture in the wake of remote and hybrid work models, executive retreats and board meetings are taking on renewed importance. Leadership teams are gathering less frequently, but with greater intention. Increasingly, the setting itself is viewed as a strategic variable, influencing the quality of discussion, collaboration and long-term planning.

That national shift is shaping business hospitality trends right here along Florida's Emerald Coast.

In Destin, we are positioning ourselves at The Alice within this evolving landscape, serving both traveling executive teams and companies based throughout the region seeking a nearby offsite environment that balances privacy, productivity and well-being.

Situated along the waterfront, the privately held property offers 18 individual guest accommodations and integrated meeting space overlooking the bay. Unlike large convention focused venues, The Alice was designed to host focused, small-group leadership gatherings, including board meetings, executive retreats and strategic planning sessions.

While destination retreats remain part of its business model, the property has seen growing demand from Emerald Coast companies looking to step away from their daily office environments without incurring the time and expense of air travel.

We are seeing more local businesses recognize the value of getting leadership teams out of the day-to-day setting. For organizations in Destin, Fort Walton Beach, Niceville, Crestview, Pensacola, and Panama City Beach,

we provide a local escape that still feels immersive and removed.

Midweek Activation and Year-Round Business Impact

At The Alice we host executive retreats and board meetings primarily Mondays through Wednesdays, a scheduling model that aligns with corporate calendars while activating the property during traditionally quieter midweek periods.

That structure not only serves leadership teams seeking uninterrupted time for strategy work, but also contributes to more consistent economic activity beyond peak tourism/wedding weekends.

Corporate retreats generate spending that extends beyond lodging. Catering services, audiovisual support, leadership facilitators, wellness instructors, marina operators and other regional vendors participate in each program. By hosting business gatherings during midweek windows, properties like ours help stabilize revenue streams for hospitality professionals and service providers throughout the year.

The Emerald Coast has long been known for leisure travel and seasonal tourism. However, steady growth in sectors such as

healthcare, professional services, finance, real estate development and technology has gradually diversified the regional economy. As these industries mature, so does demand for professional meeting environments capable of supporting governance responsibilities, investor reporting and executive-level planning.

A Shift in How Leaders Gather

Traditionally, board meetings and executive planning sessions were hosted in hotel conference rooms designed for scale rather than intimacy. Today, many organizations are prioritizing environments that foster focus, psychological safety and deeper meaningful conversation.

The Alice reflects that shift.

Meeting areas are designed with natural light and expansive waterfront views, complemented by outdoor decks and smaller lounge spaces that allow teams to move fluidly between structured presentations and informal breakout discussions. The absence of large crowds or shared convention traffic creates a contained environment conducive to confidentiality and sustained concentration.

Strategic conversations require more than an agenda; they



require presence. When leaders feel grounded and unhurried, the quality of key decisions making and thinking improves.

Wellness as a Leadership Strategy

One of the distinguishing features of our retreat model here at The Alice is the integration of wellness programming into the business agenda. As conversations around executive burnout and leadership sustainability gain traction, wellness is increasingly viewed not as a luxury, but as a performance strategy.

At The Alice, wellness components can be incorporated directly into meeting schedules. Morning yoga sessions, guided breathwork, stretching exercises and structured reflection periods are offered alongside traditional board reporting and strategic planning sessions.

Among the most requested programs is vision boarding; a facilitated workshop format that blends creative exercises with long-range strategic alignment. Participants are guided through exercises designed to clarify goals, values and organizational direction, encouraging discussion that extends beyond quarterly metrics.

Coaching and Creative Partnerships

To further deepen the leadership experience, The Alice works with a curated network of executive coaches and facilitators specializing in organizational strategy, governance, communication and performance development.

In addition, the property has established creative partnerships that offer story writing, song writing, and speech writing courses as part of select retreat programming. While unconventional in a corporate setting, these sessions are designed to engage different cognitive pathways and encourage personal reflection.

Leadership development experts increasingly note that creative outlets can strengthen executive resilience and communication skills. Writing, whether





This time, Mayor Bobby Wagner and I sat down and talked about his State of the City Address. He led with highlights from last year and finished with hope for this coming year.

TY: In previous years, you've touched upon resiliency, infrastructure and parks. Describe your SOCA theme that you recently shared on February 17, 2026.

BW: This year's theme is "Year of the Local." Bekah and I traveled through the North-

east on our honeymoon, and I got to walk places where the Revolutionary War era literally happened. It reminded me how much can change when everyday people decide to own their community. That is the spark behind this theme. While the City keeps pushing the big projects, I want to rally a grassroots spirit in Destin: small wins, cleaner corners, and more neighborly acts. A local renaissance, for locals, by locals, with locals.

TY: You referenced a number of impressive City wins in 2025, including departmental statistics, public projects, and behind-the-scenes work that most people never think about or realize. It boils down to high but realistic expectations and more action and less talk.

BW: I'm proud of the progress, and I'm even more focused on momentum. We are continuing to move the ball on the work residents care about most: mobility and safety, infrastructure like undergrounding where possible, parks and quality of life, and long-range planning like Town Center and Harbor priorities. But "action not talk" also applies outside City Hall. Some of the fastest wins come when neighbors decide, "Let's fix this," and they do it together.

TY: It was nice to see the City Annex full that night with interested residents listening to the State of the City Address. How would you categorize the crowd?

BW: It was a great crowd, but more importantly it was an engaged crowd. People were ask-



ing thoughtful questions, sharing ideas, and leaning in. That kind of participation is a really good sign because it shows Destin is not sitting on the sidelines. People want to help shape what's next.

TY: What takeaways are you hoping for?

BW: Two things. First, the City is working and the big projects are real, even when they take time. Second, you don't need a title to improve Destin. My hope is that this becomes a year where we all do something local every month: pick up litter, beautify a corner, improve the neighborhood sign, and support a local business. If enough of us do that, we'll feel the difference fast, and we'll be proud that we built it together.

narrative, lyrical or speech-focused requires clarity of thought, emotional intelligence and the ability to articulate vision. Engaging in creative expression can help leaders reconnect with purpose, refine messaging and approach complex challenges with renewed perspective.

By incorporating structured creative sessions into corporate retreats, The Alice aims to foster a healthier work mindset, one that balances analytical rigor with imaginative thinking. For some leadership teams, these programs serve as exercises in storytelling and brand articulation; for others, they provide a rare opportunity to step outside traditional corporate roles and reconnect with individual creativity.

The result, organizers say, is often greater cohesion and more authentic communication when leaders return to formal strategy discussions.

Business Infrastructure Without the Convention Atmosphere

Despite its emphasis on tranquility and well-being, The Alice maintains professional-grade audiovisual capabilities to support investor updates, financial reporting, board governance presentations and virtual conferencing when necessary.

Meeting technology is integrated into the space upon

request without creating the atmosphere of a large-scale conference center. Groups can transition from board-level reporting to smaller strategy discussions and reconvene for collective synthesis without leaving the property.

Meals are similarly integrated into the retreat structure. Custom culinary programming emphasizes fresh, coastal ingredients while accommodating dietary preferences. Rather than functioning as rushed intermissions between sessions, shared meals are designed to facilitate conversation and reflection.

The onsite marina also provides opportunities for kayaking, paddleboarding, fishing charters and sunset sails, which can be incorporated into retreat agendas as informal networking or structured team-building exercises.

Supporting a Diversifying Emerald Coast Economy

The Emerald Coast's economic landscape has evolved significantly over the past decade. While tourism remains a central pillar, the region has seen expansion in corporate offices, health-care systems, financial firms and entrepreneurial ventures.

As professional sectors expand, so does demand for environments capable of hosting executive governance work at a high level. Board meetings, leadership summits and strategic planning sessions require privacy, technological reliability and

gold and pure silver, ensuring that every piece is entirely unique," Deslonde says. "I sculpted the leaves to create a light, floating canopy suspended overhead that interacts with light and space, echoing the refinement, individuality, and material beauty found in fine jewelry."



preserving the historical contributions of African Americans in American military history within U.S. borders and overseas from the Revolutionary War to present day.

The mission of the AAMHS is to research, establish and continually develop a well-documented multi-visual educational timeline that can be used to educate on different historical platforms for future generations of the contributions and sacrifices.

The AAHMHS was formed in 2021 by Mr. Jonathan Holmes, Sr., who retired from the USAF in 2013 and then began working at the Armament Museum. Jonathan attended a Tuskegee Airmen event in 2019 and then, after a Juneteenth event in 2021 and the introduction of free-standing military Quonset huts at the Armament Museum, Jonathan asked permission to have one of these buildings dedicated to a project to preserve this legacy of the African American military.

This stand-alone African American Military History Exhibit Hall in the U.S. Air Force's

Heritage Program will be located at the Air Force Armament Museum. Contributions are still needed and appreciated for the displays, which are funded through contributions to the AAMHS. You can visit aamhsociety.org to donate.

The African American Military History Exhibition Hall is set to open in Spring/Summer 2026. This unique exhibition hall will feature interactive displays, artifacts, displays of military artwork, and more. Jonathan told me this is the only exhibit like this in the country! I think this is a project our community can truly be proud of as we share it with everyone who visits the Armament Museum.

I am honored to share this upcoming information with the public in this special year when we celebrate the 250th anniversary of the birth of our nation. During the Revolutionary War, African Americans fought as patriots in the Continental Army to secure our nation as an independent nation, the United States of America.



No More Property Tax for Florida's Homesteaded Residences

It's interesting timing. I've been talking about affordability and why lowering interest rates alone isn't the solution. Lower taxes and lower insurance—that's how you relieve pressure without pouring fuel on inflation. That's how you protect purchasing power the right way.

Right now, Florida Governor DeSantis is calling for the removal of property taxes for Florida's homesteaded residents, rooted in the belief that the American Dream was built on owning land free and clear. On the surface, that resonates. If you've paid off

your home, why should you continue paying on it? Fair question. But the deeper conversation isn't just about eliminating a tax, it's about how we maintain what protects and supports that property.

Property taxes currently fund public schools, law enforcement, fire departments and EMS, roads and drainage systems, hurricane and emergency management, parks and beach access, libraries, courts, planning and zoning, infrastructure maintenance, and in many areas, water and sewer systems. Especially here on the Emerald Coast, where resilience and public safety are not luxuries but necessities, those services are foundational. So, the real issue isn't simply removal; it's what replaces that revenue and how we continue funding the backbone of our communities.

If not us, then who will pay? If we're going to talk about removing property taxes, then we also need to have an honest conversation about who should car-



ry the weight. I'm comfortable saying it—the companies using our beautiful Emerald Coast to generate profit should be part of that solution. We're no longer just competing with local families building a life here. We're competing with investment funds, short-term rental operators, and out-of-state cash that view our community as a revenue stream. To them, these aren't homes, they're balance sheet assets. When properties are purchased as income vehicles instead of primary residences, supply tightens for the people who actually want to homestead, raise their kids, and plant roots. In a premier

destination market like ours, demand isn't just local, it's national and global. And when outside capital extracts profit without living here, prices rise and affordability becomes tougher for the very workforce that keeps this place running.

If we're going to restructure property taxes, let's be intentional. Protect the homeowners. Protect the workforce. And have the real conversation about how companies profiting from our paradise can help sustain the infrastructure, safety, and systems that make it valuable in the first place.

Let me be clear; this is not a done deal. It's still being worked through. Nothing has been finalized. But, this is the moment to keep your ears open and start paying attention. Because, if this moves forward, it will be up to us to get behind the wheel. This isn't a Democrat issue. It isn't a Republican issue. This is

a for-the-people, by-the-people moment. A chance for our community and our state to champion and pioneer what was once a cornerstone of the American Dream, affordable homeownership, and shape it in a way that truly works for the people who live here.

Home selling is not about a pretty picture, social media popularity, or being known as a Realtor. It's about being worth knowing. So, before buying or selling, when you ask the question, "How is the real estate market?" If the answer starts and ends with interest rates, you might want to find the person who has much more to say. I will continue to follow up to make sure our community is informed. 

Why Hiring a Licensed and Insured Contractor Protects More Than Your Project

Homeowners rarely intend to hire unlicensed or uninsured contractors. Often, it starts with a recommendation from a neighbor, a name shared at a gathering, or someone familiar with local projects. The price seems reasonable, the process feels informal, and the timeline promises efficiency—until something goes wrong.

Construction projects, especially those involving structural elements, utilities, or waterfront improvements, come with significant risks. When issues arise, many homeowners are surprised at how much responsibility can

fall back on them. Understanding contractor licensing and insurance isn't about being overly cautious; it's about protecting your home, investment, and peace of mind.

Licensing: Accountability and Protection

A licensed contractor meets state requirements to legally perform construction work—typically passing exams, demonstrating financial responsibility, complying with codes, and pulling necessary permits. Licensing creates accountability: if a licensed contractor violates building codes or cuts corners, a regulatory body

can intervene. There's no such oversight with unlicensed work.

Many routine projects—such as structural repairs, electrical work, plumbing, HVAC installation, roofing, major renovations, dock or seawall work—require a licensed contractor. Even straightforward jobs may trigger permitting and inspection requirements if they impact safety or infrastructure.

Homeowners should feel comfortable requesting a contractor's license number, which can be independently verified. In Florida, for example, the DBPR license portal allows users to review a contractor's status, classi-

fication, and disciplinary history. It's also important to confirm who will pull permits; a properly licensed contractor does this in their own name, not the homeowner's. Licensing is more than a formality—it proves the contractor is qualified, accountable, and legally authorized to protect your home.

Not all services need a specialty construction license. Routine tree trimming, landscaping, pressure washing, pool cleaning, and general maintenance usually do not. However, even if licensing isn't required, any provider should offer a current certificate of insurance and, if employing workers, proof of workers' compensation or a valid exemption. Verifying insurance is smart, even for basic services.

In Florida, hiring an unlicensed contractor for work requiring a license carries a major risk: the contract may be legally unenforceable. State courts have repeatedly held that such contracts are void, meaning the contractor generally cannot sue for unpaid fees or enforce payment provisions, even if the homeowner agreed to the terms. This law protects the public by discouraging unlicensed work and ensuring only qualified professionals handle critical projects.

If a dispute with an unlicensed contractor arises, homeowners may find themselves unable to enforce contract terms like completion deadlines, warranty obligations, payment schedules, or fixes for defective work. The law intends to discourage unlicensed activity but often leaves homeowners with fewer legal remedies when problems occur. Verifying licensure before work begins ensures the contract is valid and enforceable, giving homeowners clear legal protection if the work is delayed, substandard, or abandoned.

Insurance: Essential Safeguards

Insurance is just as critical as proper licensing—and in many ways, it is the homeowner's last line of protection when something goes wrong. An insured contractor carries coverage designed to protect you, not just their business. If a worker is injured on your property, a neigh-

boring home is damaged, or something fails after installation, insurance helps cover those costs and prevents the financial burden from falling back on the homeowner.

When a contractor is uninsured or underinsured, the risk shifts dramatically. Homeowners can be held personally responsible for injuries, property damage, or code-related issues, even if they had no direct involvement in the work. In some cases, a homeowner's own insurance policy may deny coverage if the contractor lacked proper insurance, leaving the homeowner exposed to lawsuits, medical claims, or repair costs that far exceed the original project price.

Before any work begins, homeowners should always request proof of insurance. Reputable contractors expect this request and provide it readily. At a minimum, homeowners should look for an active general liability policy, and when workers are present, workers' compensation coverage. Review the certificate carefully: confirm the policy is current, the coverage limits are appropriate for the scope of the project, and the business name exactly matches the contractor listed on the contract and any permit applications.

Taking a few minutes to verify insurance is not an inconvenience—it's a smart safeguard. Proper insurance helps ensure that if something unexpected happens, the financial and legal consequences do not land on the homeowner.

Choosing a licensed and insured contractor isn't about spending more—it's about protecting your home and your investment. Proper licensing and insurance help ensure the work can be permitted, inspected, insured, and defended if problems arise later. Spending a few minutes up front to verify credentials can prevent costly mistakes, unexpected liability, and long-term frustration. When you hire professionals who meet these standards, you're not just getting the job done—you're safeguarding your property, your financial security, and your peace of mind by doing it right the first time.

Inspiring Stewardship. Protecting Our Future. Choctawhatchee Basin Alliance 2025 Impact

For three decades, the Choctawhatchee Basin Alliance (CBA) has worked at the intersection of science, education, and restoration to protect one of Northwest Florida's most vital natural resources. Guided by data and powered by sustainable partnerships, CBA continues to advance meaningful, measurable conservation across the watershed.

Restoration

CBA's restoration work in 2025 focused on strengthening natural systems that protect water quality and coastal resilience.

- 140 vertical oyster gardens cultivated throughout the watershed

In 2025, CBA added 8 new sites for a total of 145 active water quality monitoring sites across the watershed, continuing to provide essential field expertise and data support for environmental monitoring and research throughout the region.

Working alongside university, county, state, and federal partners, CBA helped expand monitoring coverage, improve public access to data, and strengthen the scientific foundation for both coastal and freshwater protection. These collaborative efforts ensure that restoration and management decisions are guided by sound science and a long-term understanding of our waterways.

Sustainable Partnerships

CBA's impact is amplified through collaboration. Key partnerships in 2025 included:

- Northwest Florida Water Management District
- Oyster shell recycling restaurants
- Islanders Coastal Outfitter

- JW Couch Foundation
- Together, these partners help fund, expand, and sustain restoration and education initiatives throughout the Basin.



- 200+ tons of recycled oyster shells collected and returned to local waters for habitat creation
- 3.35 acres of salt marsh and oyster habitat restored
- 600+ tons of limestone placed at higher-energy shoreline sites to reduce erosion and support living shoreline development
- Seagrass restoration lab initiated, with pilot plantings launched to expand submerged aquatic vegetation recovery efforts

Education & Outreach

Environmental stewardship begins in the classroom. In 2025, CBA reached 3,000+ students across 20 public schools and five homeschool groups, delivering monthly hands-on lessons aligned with STEM skills and Florida science standards. Programs like Grasses in Classes and oyster gardening give students real-world environmental experience, connecting classroom learning to tangible restoration outcomes. Through immersive, standards-based curriculum, CBA is cultivating the next generation of scientists, conservationists, and informed citizens.

Monitoring & Research

As a leader in environmental monitoring, CBA places science-based conservation at the forefront of protecting the Choctawhatchee Basin.

Living Shoreline Enhances Choctawhatchee Bay

Okaloosa County has completed 2,000 feet of living shoreline along the Choctawhatchee Bay at Ross Marler Park on Okaloosa Island, marking a major milestone in shoreline protection and coastal restoration.

The multi-year project utilized a cost-effective, nature-based solution designed to mitigate erosion while enhancing the coastal ecosystem surrounding Veterans Park and Marler Park.

“This unique landscape is home to so many species that we need to protect,” said Okaloosa County Commissioner Carolyn Ketchel (District 2). “This living shoreline will supplement their success, the health of our bay and extend the life of these wonderful parks.”

Living shorelines are natural or nature-based solutions that protect coastal areas from erosion while supporting habitat and improving water quality. Unlike traditional hard structures such as seawalls or riprap, living shorelines use native vegetation, oyster reefs, coir logs,



and other natural materials to stabilize shorelines. These systems work with natural coastal processes by absorbing wave energy, trapping sediments, and providing essential habitat for fish, crabs, and birds, while also enhancing nutrient filtration, carbon storage, and overall ecological health.

The living shoreline approach was significantly more cost-effective than traditional shoreline barriers and aligned with the parks’ intended use by visitors while prioritizing preser-

vation of the surrounding natural environment.

“Projects like these involve a team from multiple departments in the County,” said Okaloosa County Vice Chairman Drew Palmer (District 5). “I want to thank the engineers, project managers, coastal scientists and grant specialists who worked together to complete this project and ensure that our shorelines are protected for the future enjoyment of the public.”

In addition to reducing long-term erosion maintenance costs,

the living shoreline is expected to grow and strengthen over time. Funding for the project included \$1.5 million in tourism bed tax revenue, a \$1.5 million grant from the National Fish and Wildlife Foundation, and \$1.6 million from the RESTORE Council through the Gulf Consortium.

“It’s never wrong to be good stewards of the blessings that surround us, and thankfully, this now includes our shoreline,” said Okaloosa County Commissioner Sherri Cox (District 3).

Residents can learn more about living shorelines, including local projects in Choctawhatchee Bay, through the UF/IFAS Okaloosa County Extension Sea Grant program, which works to educate the community on resilient, sustainable coastal solutions that balance shoreline protection with ecological function. Pine Pollen and Smilax: Ready for Spring?

Yes, we are! Winter has been cold and dreary, even though there was no snow this year. While wishing for warm weather, I read a book about Theodore Roosevelt and J.P. Morgan and their solution to the coal strike. I empathize with the cold, wet, mine workers. I am grateful that I am not a coal miner and I do not live in 1902.

In 1902, in the middle of the coal strike, Roosevelt had a state dinner for the King of Prussia to celebrate his new yacht. None

of them had any idea things were not going to end well for Prussia or Germany, so they all had a great time being rich and spending money. World War I dissolved Prussia and the poor king was not a king anymore, however the state dinner was a fabulous success. They ate terrapin and ice cream, and Edith Roosevelt decorated the dining room with Smilax species vines (those briar kind of vines that grow up trees and everywhere).

The Roosevelt dining room is minus Edith's Smilax, but complete with Theodore's moose and elk. Library of Congress. <https://www.whitehousehistory.org/white-house-tour/state-dining-room>.

Smilax is the reason they make those jeans with the extra layer of jean on the front legs so foresters, and other people who crash through the brambles, don't tear their jeans to shreds. Edith strung the vines from the chandeliers and light fixtures, and everywhere she could around her husband's stuffed bears, elk,

bison, and moose heads.

The state dinner was in February, so there was probably nothing else green in DC, however I think Edith is quite the genius, encouraging native plants in an environment of yachts and expensive cigars.

What's Blooming?

Southern wax myrtle is just starting to produce flowering parts. This evergreen shrub smells like bayberry. It is dioecious, with separate male and female plants. Fruit forms on female plants and is food for turkeys and other birds. Wax myrtle fixes nitrogen more efficiently than legumes.

Another dioecious, evergreen shrub that grows well in our sandy forests, **American olive** is just about ready to produce white, fragrant flowers, which will mature into blue black fruit in the fall.

It is the time of yellow pine pollen from all our pine trees, but especially from our native **Choctawhatchee sand pine**, which grows on marine, acid, sandy Entisol soils deposited during the Pleistocene.

Choctawhatchee sand pines grow only on the Panhandle between Pensacola and Panama City and nowhere else. All Choctawhatchee sand pines grow within one degree of latitude, on about 100,000 acres.

As with all pine trees, pollen forms on the male structures, which grow on the bottom half of the tree. Pollen is wind-blown

up to the female pinecones at the top of the tree. Each scale of the female cone contains a winged seed. The female cones open when mature, without fire, but stay on the tree for what seems like forever.

Sand pines provide food and cover for birds and small mammals and make great Christmas trees.

Pine pollen, like goldenrod pollen, is way too big and heavy to cause allergies. It is advertised on Amazon for men, and you are welcome to buy it, but I am quite sure it does nothing.

Embrace our Natives!

There are many other native trees, shrubs, and flowers getting ready to bloom as the weather warms. Here in the Panhandle, we are blessed with native plants and pleasant weather, dune lakes, and the Gulf of America, along with Smilax vines and pine pollen. Embrace nature and the natives. If Smilax is good enough for a White House state dinner for presidents and royalty, it is certainly good enough for us. Enjoy.

adjustments help the body adapt comfortably.

Omega-3 Fatty Acids - Inflammation & Heart Support

Omega-3 fats help regulate inflammation and support heart health, joint comfort, brain function, and mood stability. Even with access to fresh seafood, consistent intake of meaningful amounts of omega-3s is less common than many assume. Modern dietary patterns tend to favor inflammatory fats over anti-inflammatory ones. As activity increases and seasonal allergens rise, balanced inflammatory support becomes increasingly important.

When I look closer: joint stiffness, cardiovascular risk factors, brain fog, mood variability, and seasonal inflammatory symptoms

Practical Tip: If fish oil results in occasional upper digestive discomfort or burping freezing capsules may help. Those taking blood thinners should consult their provider. Wild-caught fatty fish remains an excellent whole-food option.

Probiotics + Prebiotic Fiber - Digestive Precision

The gut influences immune function, hormone balance, inflammation, and mood. Probiotics introduce beneficial bacteria, the “seeds,” while prebiotic fibers provide the nourishment that allows them to flourish. Together, they help shape digestive terrain.

Not all probiotics are the same. Strains and potencies vary, and prebiotic fibers can aggravate some digestive systems if introduced too quickly. Because not every gut responds the same way, they should be introduced thoughtfully and increased gradually.

It’s also important to recognize that not every digestive system benefits from supplemental probiotics or prebiotic fibers. Certain digestive patterns or underlying gut conditions may require a more targeted approach rather than broad supplementation.

When I look closer: bloating or irregular digestion, recent antibiotic use, immune imbalance, and skin or hormone concerns

Practical Tip: Start low. Increase gradually. Monitor response carefully. Individuals using GLP-1 medications may benefit from additional diges-

tive support due to slowed gastric emptying, but adjustments should always be gradual and individualized.

B-Complex Vitamins - Cellular Energy & Stress Support

B vitamins are essential for energy production, nervous system signaling, red blood cell formation, and stress adaptation. They are not stimulants. They support the body’s ability to generate steady, efficient energy. Stress, hormonal transitions, digestive variability, dietary restriction, or genetic factors can increase demand.

When I look closer: persistent fatigue, brain fog, elevated stress, hormonal shifts, and limited dietary variety

Practical Tip: Form matters. If B12 has not been helpful in the past, the issue may be the form rather than the dose.

Supplements are tools, not shortcuts. Quality matters. Formulation matters. Dosage matters. Context matters most. The goal is not to take more. The goal is to take what is appropriate for your body, your current

demands, and your season of life.

We don't notice it happening at first. Winter rarely announces itself all at once—it settles in quietly. Shorter days. Colder mornings. Longer evenings spent on the couch. Same house, same routine, but something feels different. There's less energy, less motivation, less desire to care.





How Are Your Quercetin Levels?

This little gem belongs to a group of plant compounds called flavonoids. It is found in fruits such as grapes, blueberries, strawberries, cherries, apples, grapefruit, cranberries, raspberries and blackberries; vegetables including onions, peppers and broccoli; and beverages like coffee, green tea and red wine.

fee, green tea and red wine.

Quercetin is one of the most abundant antioxidants, and its role is to fight free radical damage. Free radicals can damage our cells, which in turn can promote inflammation. Hippocrates is often quoted as saying, "All disease begins in the gut," and this is closely linked to inflammation.

In an eight-week study, 50 women with rheumatoid arthritis took 500 mg of quercetin daily. They experienced significantly reduced early morning stiffness, morning pain and after-activity pain. Quercetin has also been found to help protect against degenerative brain disorders such as Alzheimer's disease and dementia.

Quercetin offers cardiovascular benefits as well. It may help lower blood pressure and reduce



cholesterol levels by improving endothelial function. This makes it a promising candidate for supporting heart health and helping prevent cardiovascular disease.

 - Viral activity
 - Obesity-related effects
 - Diabetic complications
 - Hypertensive conditions
 - Allergic responses
 - Asthmatic responses

This is not an exhaustive list of its benefits, but they are certainly worth noting. Look up foods and herbs that contain

quercetin and begin incorporating them into your diet. Check your multivitamin to see whether it contains this antioxidant and in what quantity. A common supplemental target is 500 mg daily.

Quercetin is also available in supplement form; Solaray is one brand often recommended.



From Basement to Balcony: Helping Co-Workers Use Their Strengths at Work

Every team has them — the organized planner who keeps projects on track and the compassionate listener everyone turns to when things get tough.

But what happens when those very strengths start working against them?

As a strengths coach, I often talk about “balcony” and “basement” behaviors. In the balcony, our strengths shine. In the basement, those same strengths can become overused, stressed or misdirected. Two common examples I see in workplaces are Discipline and Empathy.

Unlocking Your Co-worker’s Discipline Superpower

Do you have a co-worker who’s usually the one to keep everything organized and on track, but every so often, they seem to get overwhelmed by the details? I’ve got one on my team who’s typically the epitome of structure, always keeping things running like clockwork. But recently, when faced with an unexpected project, they seemed bogged down by perfectionism, unable to make any progress. It was like watching a master planner stuck in the basement of over-analysis!

This is a classic case of “basement” behaviors for someone with the Discipline strength.

When things feel chaotic or off-track, they can get paralyzed by the need for order and control. But at their core, they have an incredible ability to create structure, stay focused, and make progress with precision.

How can we help them get back to their “balcony” and thrive? Here are 3 ideas:

Break Down the Tasks – Help them take things one step at a time. Simplifying complex tasks into smaller chunks can reduce the pressure to be perfect.

Celebrate Progress, Not Perfection – Encourage them to acknowledge progress over perfection. Small wins can help them stay motivated and remind them that good enough is often enough.

Reinforce Their Strength – Recognize their natural ability to bring order to chaos. Highlight how their structured approach keeps everything on track and is an invaluable asset to the team.

Unlocking Your Co-worker’s Empathy Superpower

Do you have a co-worker who’s usually amazing at understanding and connecting with others, but every so often, they seem overwhelmed by everyone else’s emotions? I’ve got one on my team who’s typically the go-to person for offering support and understanding. But recently, after hearing a few colleagues venting about their challenges, they became emotionally drained and started withdrawing. It was like watching someone with a superpower stuck in the basement of burnout!

This is a classic case of “basement” behaviors for someone with the Empathy strength. When they feel overwhelmed by others’ emotions, they can be



come too absorbed, losing their own sense of balance. But at their core, they have an amazing ability to sense the emotions of others, offering deep understanding and building meaningful connections.

How can we help them get

back to their “balcony” and shine? Here are 3 ideas:

Encourage Boundaries – Remind them to take time for themselves and set emotional boundaries. It’s okay to care, but they don’t have to carry everything.

Provide Positive Feedback – Acknowledge their incredible ability to connect with and support others. Highlight how much their empathy contributes to the team’s morale.

Help Them Recharge – Encourage them to take moments to recharge and focus on

their own well-being. A balanced Empathy strength will allow them to continue to offer support without burning out.

Fuel the Strength, Don’t Fight It

The key is not to “fix” the person — it’s to redirect the strength.

Discipline brings order to chaos. Empathy builds bridges between people. When supported well, both strengths elevate the entire workplace.

Stay strong. Fuel your strengths. Ignite your potential!

He paid the price.


That is why He is our Savior. That is how He is our Healer.



Ask Destinites: Neighborhoods & Code Compliance

In our Destinites local Facebook group (www.Facebook.com/groups/Destinites), there was discussion about code compliance taking place in neighborhoods. A member wrote: “Has

anyone else noticed Code Compliance starting to enforce rules that literally everyone is breaking? I live in a neighborhood off Azalea, and I see them giving warnings to cars parked on the curb. I think literally over half the houses in my neighborhood have a car parked on the curb. I've been here five years and they have never bothered me — now they want to suddenly start writing tickets for it. Anyone with eyes can see it's not feasible for everyone to have all their cars parked in the driveway.” Here are just some of the group member responses to the Code Compliance post:

- They literally allow it in my

neighborhood after I got a warning for the same thing. No consistency.

- I wonder if it could be due to all the utility work that's been going on lately? Maybe they complained that they couldn't access the parkway. Who knows.

- They do this every couple of years. They go around for a day or two issuing warnings, and then all goes back to normal for a couple years.

- Wish they would come to Crystal Beach and give tickets for garbage cans at the street for a week!

- Somebody in your neighborhood complained. Code Compliance isn't proactive right now; they're reactive, which means they're complaint-driven, so somebody complained about cars parked over sidewalks and whatnot.

- I didn't think they had enough people left in Code to be able to have anyone write warnings. That department has

a revolving door and can't seem to stay staffed. Thankless job for sure.

- Lol, that's why he passed my house like five times today, because me or my daughter park between the road and sidewalk. But there is still room to walk by on the sidewalk, and the vehicle is not on the white line. If they are going to give tickets, they can start cutting the grass.

- I live in the same area. Parking is a mess. The issue is that so many people have multiple cars and refuse to use their garage, so they park on the street. If one or two people do it, no big deal; however, so many people do it where I am that trash trucks can't even get down the street at times. Cars driving the road can't pass each other, and it is becoming a safety issue. Watching some of these bigger trucks trying to get down the street — and then back up because they can't turn around — makes me wonder how those drivers don't lose their

patience every day.

- Husband just got a ticket today, and he was servicing a yard — landscaping truck/trailer. Pretty ridiculous.

- Clean out your garage. I'm sure there is room for two cars there. Problem solved. Then emergency vehicles can get in and through.
